Cafe Owner Jim Scott Assists In Disarming Runaway

Police Officer Held At Gunpoint By 14-Year Old

A 14-year old runaway from Virginia held Colorado City Patrolman Wendell Bryant at gunpoint with a loaded .22 automatic pistol for four or five minutes at Jim's Cafe on I-20 Friday morning.

The boy was driving a car reported stolen in Abilene and had picked up a hitchhiker, 22-year old Jack Ivester Jr. of 1716 Crownover in Houston, informing him he had a gun but it was never visible to Ivester.

When the two stopped at Jim's Cafe, Ivester told cafe owner Jim Scott that the 14-year old had a gun. Scott called the police department at 7:04 a.m., saying that someone there had a gun. Scott said later that he did

not call the police right away because "just as Ivester told me about the kid having a gun, a bus stopped out front and about 60 high school kids from Midland came in. I told him I couldn't take a chance on getting anyone hurt and to go back and keep the boy occupied, which he did by getting him involved in a game."

"Then when the kids left, we hurried them out as quick as we could, I phoned the police and told them about a boy being there and a hitchhiker with him said he had a gun but had not seen it," Scott said.

Patrolman Bryant went to the cafe but "It was crowded and I wanted to get him out of the cafe, there were too many people inside." He took him outside where the boy pointed the gun at him. Bryant said he tried to talk the boy into giving up the gun, pointing out the consequences of shooting a police officer.

In the meantime, Scott saw what was happening and got his own gun and slipped around the outside of the cafe to a point where he could see what was going on.

Scott said that he could see the boy clearly at the corner of the building but "he had an automatic and I was afraid if I hollered at him he might pull the trigger so I went back inside through the kitchen door where the boy could see I had a gun through the window. When he saw me with the gun, he gave up his gun to Bryant."

Bryant said when the boy saw that Scott had a gun pointed at him, he surrendered his gun to Bryant.

"He had his gun pointed at Bryant's stomach. They were just outside the cafe at the northeast corner of the windowed entrance," Scott said. "I told everybody to get down when I saw him pull the gun on Bryant. I

could have shot him but then, he was just a kid and I was still afraid that a reflex would cause his gun to go off."

Scott said, "I told him later after he handed over his gun, Son, if you'd shot this police officer, I'd have had to shoot you. The boy told me, 'Yeah, I know it.'"

"The hitchhiker was pretty cool in all this," Scott said. "He wanted to get away from him and had brought his bag in with the two, telling the kid that they'd look like hitchhikers. When it was all over, Ives-

ter was going to leave and I asked him to wait to speak to the police officers."

Police are holding the boy in custody at the advice of Mitchell County Judge Bill Carter and are still investigating details of the case.

According to preliminary information, he was on his way to California to see his mother in Longbeach. Sgt. Pat Fuller said that the police do not know who has custody of the boy but are making efforts to contact his parents.

The boy told local police officers that he stole the gun

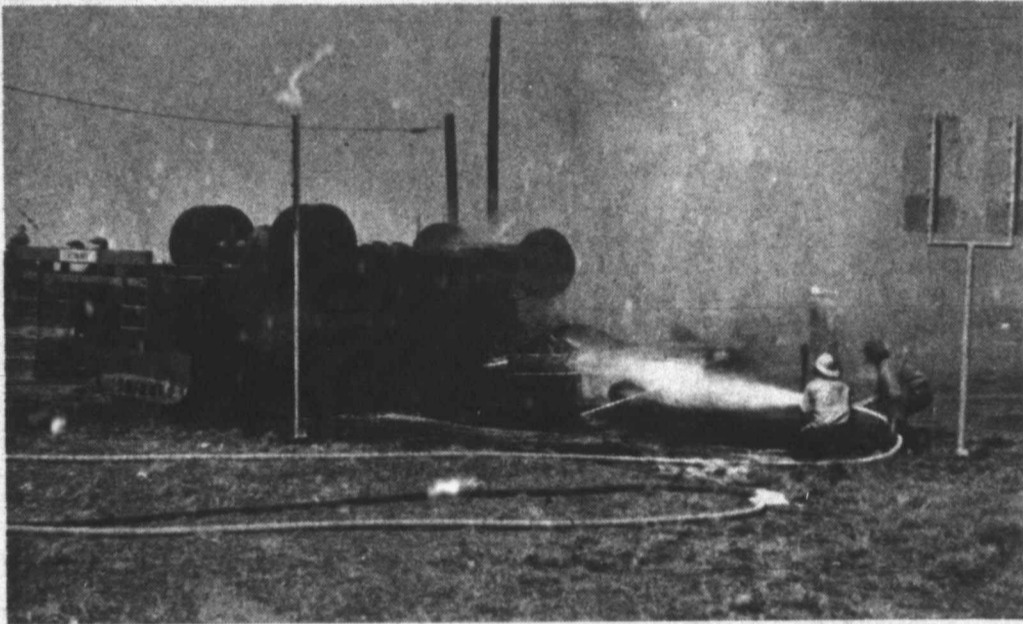
from his father in Dublin, Va. before leaving for California.

He had an identification card from Pulaski County High School in Dublin, Va.

He was driving an automobile stolen in Abilene about 5 a.m. Friday, a white 1961 Pontiac with license number CCU971.

Bryant was the only officer on duty at the time the call was made to the police station.

A hearing will be held before District Judge Weldon Kirk as soon as possible, possibly Monday morning.

Man Burned To Death In Car-Truck Wreck

A 76-year old San Antonio man, Frank Newman Griffith, was burned to death Thursday afternoon in a truck-car crash at the intersection of West Highway 80 and Highway 208.

The Farrington diesel truck was headed west on U.S. 80 and Griffith was driving the automobile south on Hwy. 208, followed by his wife in an automobile just behind him. According to investigating officer Sgt. Pat Fuller, the two vehicles collided about the center of the intersection, flipping the truck onto the back part of the car.

Driver of the truck, Ernie Joe Luna, 37, of Abilene and his 11-year old stepson, Lawrence Hufford, escaped from the truck just as the car's gasoline tank ignited. Luna said he tried to get the man out of the car but could not break out the windshield and when he got a tire tool from the rear of the truck, the heat from the fire was already too great to get near enough to try to get the man out.

Mrs. Griffith, who was right behind her husband in their automobile, was taken to Root Memorial Hospital and treated for shock. She told Fuller that they had been in Lockney to attend a funeral of her husband's nephew and were returning to San Antonio, driving the two cars. The car her husband was driving was registered to a Lockney address and Fuller speculated that someone had given the car to the couple.

Sentenced In County Court

Johnnie Mae Hardin, also known as Johnnie Mae Jackson, was tried in county court Thursday on charges of obtaining assistance by false statement, the complaint filed March 17.

She was found guilty and fined \$100, paying \$46 court costs, sentenced to six months probation for two years and will pay restitution of \$10 per week for two years.

The case was heard before Mitchell County Judge Bill Carter.

6-Year Old Drowns In Creek

Six-year old Charles Dwane Hockett of Odessa drowned Saturday afternoon when he fell into the creek under the Morgan Creek Bridge over Interstate 20 while on a camping trip with relatives.

The boy fell into the creek from the bank on the east side of the creek while playing with young cousins six and three years old. He fell in about 2:15. Deputy Sheriff Jim Reynaud was notified at 2:27 and the body was recovered by Reynaud and Sheriff Bill McGuire at 2:50 p.m.

His aunt and two uncles were fishing about 50 yards north of where he fell in and shouts of the young cousins brought them running but they could not find the boy.

The aunt and uncle, Dorothy and John Horrell of Rt. 5, Box 3005 Bell St., Odessa, and another uncle, Jerry Horrell of 611 N. Kelly, Odessa, were on the camping trip to Lake Colorado City.

The boy's parents are Jim and Sheria Hockett of 611 N. Kelley, Odessa.

The boy's body was brought to Kiker-Seale Funeral Home in Colorado City for transfer to Odessa.

Gail Davis Found Dead

Gail Marie Davis, 27, was found dead in the bathroom of her home at the Davis Courts Thursday morning.

Colorado City police were called at 9:54 a.m. to investigate and Justice of the Peace Mary Lee Moore ruled death by self inflicted gunshot wound.

She was shot once in the right temple.

A .22 rifle was found beside the body with one spent shell.

Miss Davis had returned to Colorado City after living in Dallas. She was an artist and had fixed up one of the rooms of the courts for a studio. The courts are located behind the bus terminal and are owned by her parents.

Investigating officer Sgt. Pat Fuller said that no note was found on the premises. He and Patrolman Wendell Bryant, along with Dr. Kenneth Cowan and Mary Lee Moore were called to the scene.

Services will be at 4 p.m. today (Sunday) in Trinidad Baptist Church with burial to follow in Trinidad Cemetery, directed by Kiker-Seale Funeral Home.

Born April 1, 1947 in Lubbock, she had lived here with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas J. Davis, for the past 18 months. She had attended Colorado Junior High and Colorado High School. She was a Baptist. Survivors include her parents; and two brothers, Robert F. Davis of Waco and William H. Davis of Lubbock.

Six Jurors Deadlock In Case

Macario Gomez, 1220 Oak, was tried in county court March 22 but the six jurors deadlocked at 4-2 for two hours of deliberation, declaring they were unable to reach a verdict.

Gomez was tried on a charge of possession of alcoholic beverages (beer) for sale in a dry area. The complaint was filed Dec. 9 stating the offense occurred Dec. 5.

Gomez was represented by Dell Barber and county attorney Perry Barber tried the case against Gomez.

Trial started at 9 a.m. and the jury began deliberation about 5 p.m. but were deadlocked at 4-2 about 15 minutes after deliberation began. A poll was taken five more times, the vote still the same and then they informed Mitchell County Judge Bill Carter they were unable to reach a verdict.

Charged In County Court

Identification Made Of Body Found Here

Identification of the skeleton found Tuesday in western Mitchell County was made about 4 p.m. Wednesday through the wallet found on the body and opened in the DPS lab in Austin.

The body has been identified as James Peter Smith, 23, of Pierre, South Dakota.

Sheriff Bill McGuire, who took the remains to the Austin lab, was returning to the county when a phone call was made from the lab to Chief Deputy L. M. Newby. Sheriff's deputies then contacted South Dakota authorities and the family.

"The unusual belt buckle helped in the identification," McGuire said. "It was made by his sister of heavy metal decorated with some kind of heavy screws at each corner and the middle upper and lower part."

The body was found Tuesday morning under a bridge on the Iatan Road, 1/2 mile north of I-20.

The body will be transferred to a forensic pathologist in either Dallas or Houston to determine cause of death, the sheriff said.

Smith was last heard from in July when he phoned his sister from Abilene. He was reportedly hitchhiking to California at that time.

No details have been discovered as to how he got to Mitchell County.

"He had been a patient in South Dakota State Hospital," McGuire said, "and had a history of suffering from depression."

McGuire also said he had a criminal record in South Dakota but "I'm not at liberty to divulge any information about that at this time."

"He did odd jobs, like dishwashing or working in a service station," the sheriff said.

Also in the wallet, McGuire said, giving his address as 125 No. Popular, Pierre, S.D., was a South Dakota driver license, a student identification card for South Dakota State College in Vermillion, S.D., and \$36 in cash.

The drivers license listed his height at 6'2" and weight at 175 lbs.

He was last seen by people who knew him in Vermillion, S. D. in July, 1975.

McGuire credited his entire staff as responsible for making an identification in such a short time.

"The deputies, L. M. Newby, Ann Martin, Jim Reynaud and Mike Stutts, all did a fine job of handling the remains so that the lab could make an identification," he said. "Also, they did good work in contacting the South Dakota family and

authorities, staying late and working hard."

The following report on CHS tennis was written by Tennis Coach Ken Burnam.

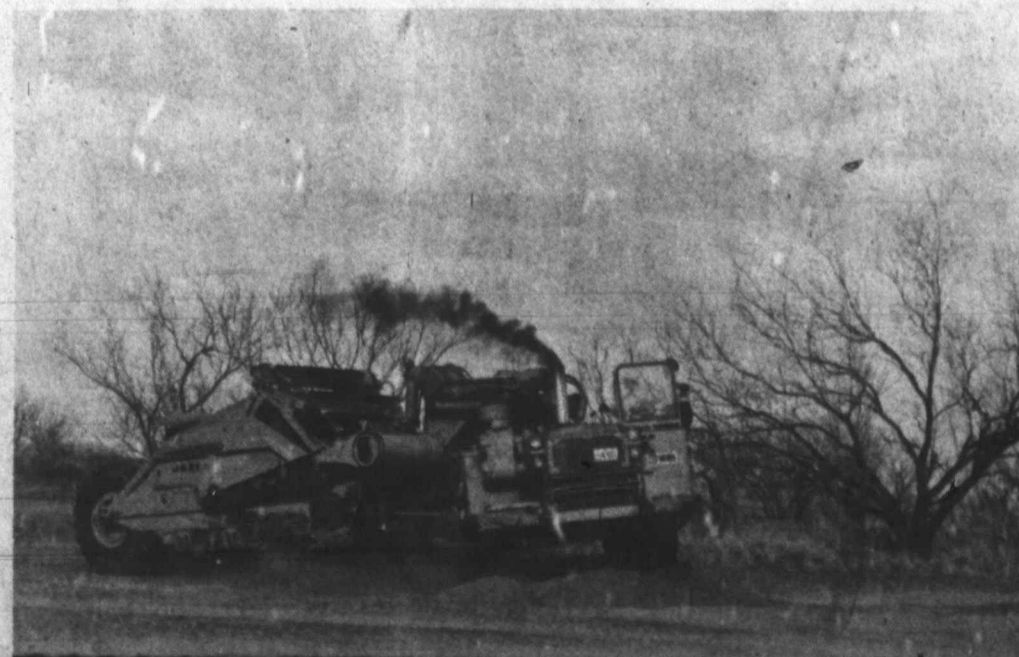

This is the Bicentennial year of our nation. Many celebrations are planned and the emphasis is upon remembering how this great nation was born and how it has grown to be two hundred years old.

To see the United States of America apart from God's Word is to be blind to the facts of our history and shortsighted to the meaning of life. Patriotism apart from faith in Jesus Christ is lacking at best. Therefore, in this Bicentennial year, remember that the most patriotic things you can do is to build your life upon God's Word and teach it to your family. For we are only one generation away from atheism, immorality, corruption and destruction, and we may be closer than that because of the lives of the Americans of this generation. Let us not forget our history, but let us take action to guarantee our future. As truly patriotic citizens during this year of our nation's two hundredth birthday, let us take every opportunity to hear, read, study, memorize, and meditate upon God's Word.

Colorado City really benefits by its location near 3-AAA tennis powerhouses in Sweetwater, Snyder and Big Spring, as we get to play these teams every year. Hill graduated from Colorado High School and later attended Tarleton State University in Stephenville. He is employed by Freeway Farming in Galloway, Arkansas.

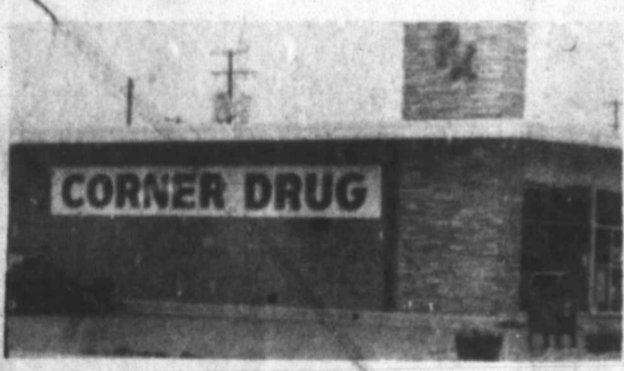
Presbyterians To Have Bicentennial Program
