

Armed Robbery Suspect Surrenders

A twenty-four year old Talco area man, Ronnie Stephen Clements, was arrested Saturday at 5:45 p.m. and charged with the Wednesday morning armed robbery of the Deport Shamrock Station, is a suspect in the armed robbery of Francis Food Store and the Enloe State Bank.

The Francis Food Store robbery was expected to go before the Grand Jury on Wednesday, December 5 and charges of aggravated bank robbery were filed in Eighth Judicial District

Court on Tuesday, December 4 by the District Attorney's office for the Friday night armed robbery of the Enloe State Bank.

The apparent end to what appeared to be a crime spree came when Clements surrendered to Lamar County Deputy B.J. McCoy and Texas Ranger Eddie Almond in Bogata on Saturday. The suspect's father of Blossom, called the Lamar County Sheriff's Office and said his son would give himself up, but didn't want a lot of police cars converging

on him. Law officers then went to Bogata and arrested Ronnie Clements.

The first armed robbery occurred on Thursday, when a small, thin man in a ski mask and armed with a rifle or shotgun entered Francis Food Store and demanded the money.

Just after this paper's release last Wednesday, November 28, the Shamrock Station west of Deport on Highway 271, and operated by Edith Mitchell, was held up in almost the same fashion. Mrs. Mitchell iden-

tified a black Chevrolet Luv pickup fleeing the scene, and a small black pickup was seen at the Francis Food Store robbery scene.

Mrs. Mitchell said, too, that the suspect was small, thin and wearing a ski mask and armed with what she thought was a shotgun.

On November 30 at around 7 p.m. the Enloe State Bank, located in Delta County, was held up, and again the black Chevrolet Luv pickup was identified.

Delta County law officers pursued the bank robbery suspect, and more law officers picked up the trail, with roadblocks being set up all over the area around Cunningham.

The driver of the black truck made a "U" turn and attempted to flee back west, but law officers shot the tires on the vehicle out.

The suspect then fled through a pasture and into some woods on foot. Reportedly around \$9,000 was found scattered in the cab of the truck, plus

a weapon.

The search for the robber went on until 2 a.m. Saturday morning, but dogs apparently lost the trail and could not pick it up again.

Law enforcement officers worked on the case all day Saturday, and then the call to the Sheriff's Department from the suspect's father was received.

The truck has been impounded by Lamar County Sheriff's deputies, and bond was set at \$50,000 by Justice of the Peace Chester Oakes.

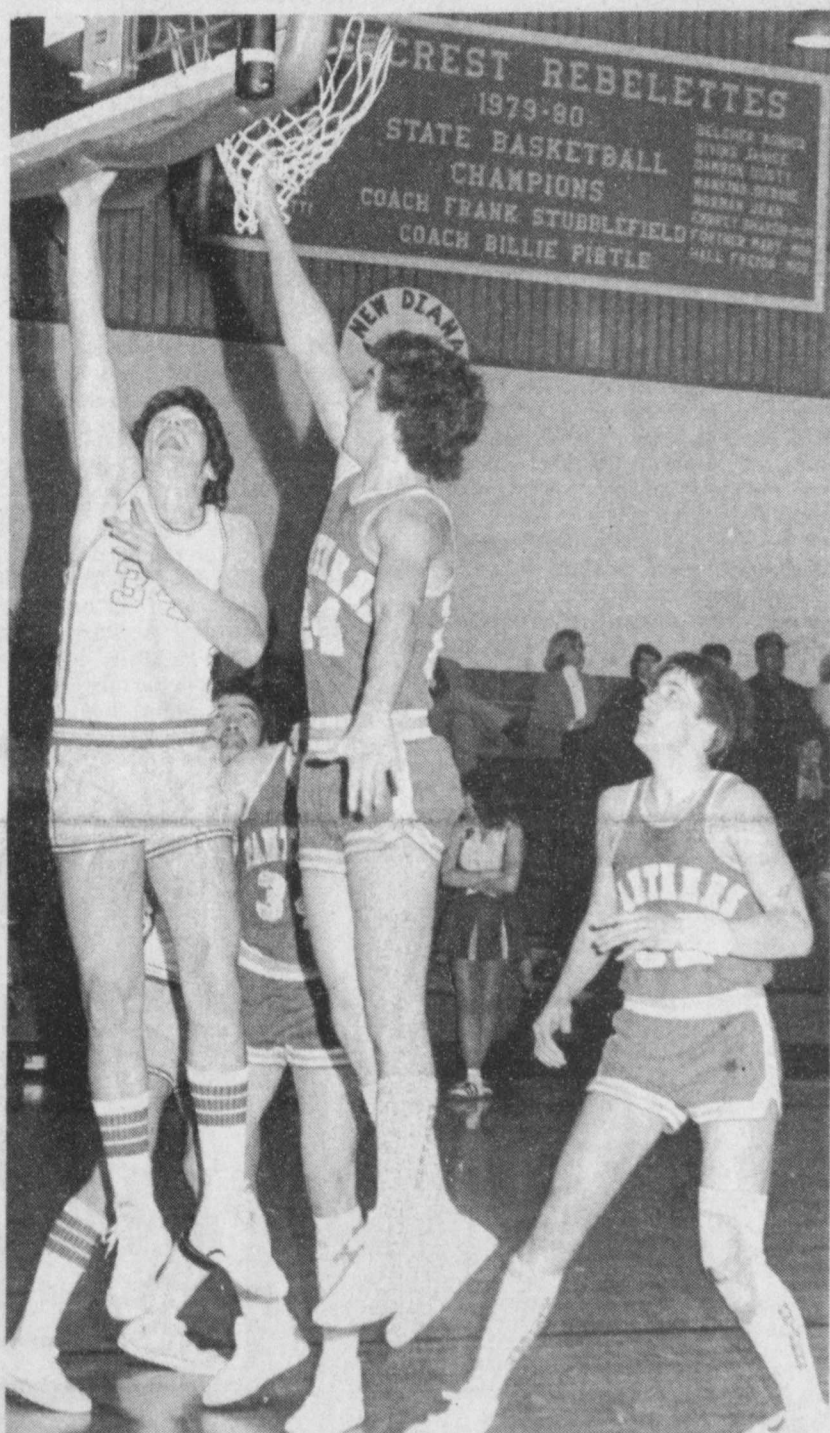

The boys championship game was

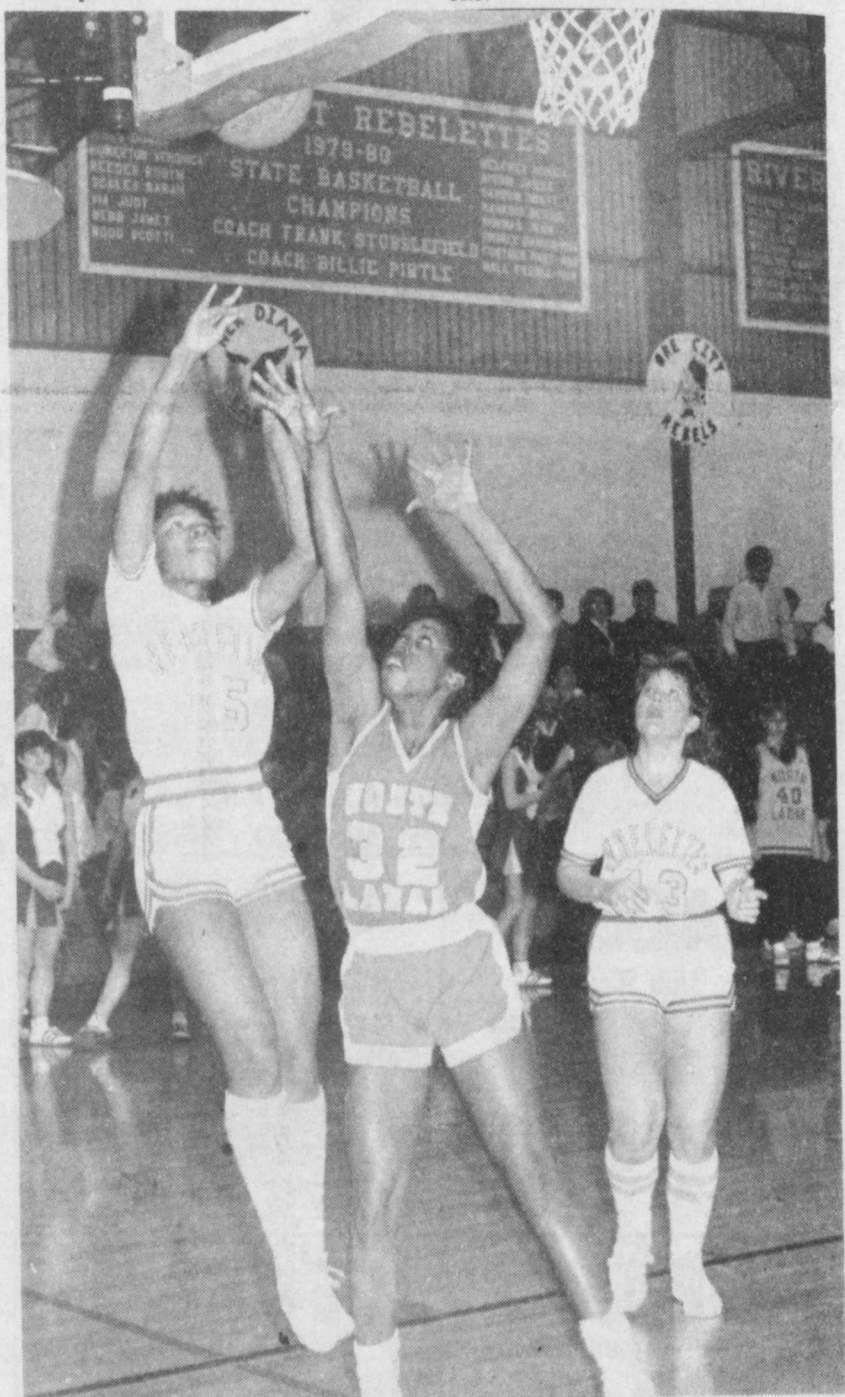
a match-up of area rivals, Rivercrest and Prairiland. The battle was hard fought but the Rebels captured the first place title with a 57-52 victory.

Cattlemen Should Be Aware Of New Vaccination Requirement

Livestock producers in the Class C Area of Texas should be making plans now to have their 1985 calf crop vaccinated in order to comply with a new vaccination regulation for brucellosis.

The regulation applies to heifers born after January 1, 1985, changing ownership within the Class C Area of Texas. State funds are available for vaccinations. Contact your veterinarian or area Texas Animal Health Commission office for details.

The regulation requires that heifers born after Jan. 1, 1985 between four and 12 months of age which are acquired and used for breeding, grazing, dairying or confinement in a nonquarantined feedlot must be vaccinated or be subject to these restrictions: heifers born after Jan. 1, 1985, which are over 12 months of age and are unvaccinated can only legally change ownership after being spayed, or

moved to a livestock market and S branded prior to sale, or consigned direct to slaughter, quarantined feedlot or quarantined pasture.

The regulation applies to 113 counties in the Class C area of Texas including Cass, Camp, Delta, Fannin, Franklin, Lamar, and Red River.

Tips On Pecan Freshness

By purchasing a new crop of Texas pecans right after harvest, it's possible to preserve their freshness through proper storage. Dr. Dymple Cooksey, a Food and Nutrition Specialist with Texas A&M University has researched suggestions for maintaining a fresh pecan flavor by using correct storage methods for maximum flavor and nutrient retention, pecans should be stored in a cool dry place. The fat in pecans can become rancid very quickly if they are not properly stored.

Pecans in the shell will keep at room temperature for about six months without becoming rancid. Shelled pecans become rancid quickly when stored at room temperature. In the refrigerator they will keep for six months to a year and in the freezer even longer. Frozen nuts defrost quickly and only need to be removed from the freezer a few minutes before using.

Nutmeats can pick up odors from other foods very easily. To guard against off flavors, store shelled pecans in tightly sealed containers, such as plastic food storage containers or cans with tight fitting covers.

Some moisture in pecans makes them easier to shell and increases the number of perfect halves. Nuts just harvested may have enough moisture. If they have been stored for some time, soak the pecans in cold water overnight or cover with water and bring to a boil. Drain and crack. Pecans treated in one of these ways may need to dry slightly to restore crispness.

High in energy because of their high fat content, pecans also furnish calcium, phosphorus, iron, potassium and magnesium. They are a good source of B vitamins like thiamine, riboflavin and niacin. Do not forget to try Dr. Cooksey's storage suggestions for pecans.



Here's A Pig Tale!

Old Scrub was a sow pig. She was a potbellied little runt that had always been pushed to the end of the show line by her more healthy brothers and sisters, and she usually got her part last, if at all. Because of her dim prospect for survival, Uncle George gave her to me. I took her home and put her on a diet of buttermilk and kitchen scraps. She soon got on her feet and grew into a fat and sassy shoat.

That year my Dad and some of the nearby neighbors all planted patches of sorghum cain to make syrup. When the cain was ready, a syrup maker moved his mill and pan on to our place and set up business near the stock pond so that he would have wash water.

The mill consisted of three cast iron rollers in an iron frame, set up in a vertical position on top of four large posts. A long pole, about seven inches in diameter at the butt was bolted to an iron plate at the top of the shaft of the largest roller. A mule was hitched to the other end of the pole, and as he traveled round and round, cain was fed in between the rollers and the juice mashed out run into a barrel as the cain passed through. The copper pan was about four feet wide by ten feet long by six inches deep and was placed on two brice walls about eighteen inches high. The pan was divided by partitions some six inches apart and with gated openings at alternate ends. The whole assembly formed a furnace with one end open to receive fire wood as needed, and the other ended in a smokestack.

The raw juice was taken from the barrel and poured in one end of the pan and slowly chased to the other, cooking along the way. During the cooking process foam and scum would form on top of the boiling juice. The foam would be skimmed off from time to time, with a perforated skimming scoop, and dumped in the skimming hole which was dug in the ground a few feet from the furnace.

As the cooking process was completed, the finished syrup would be drawn off from a spigot at the end of the pan and run through a cloth strainer into buckets.

After a few days, the skimming hole contents fermented and was about as potent as some of the home brew that was made in those days.

One Sunday, while the mill was shut down, and the skimming hole slop was at its best, Old Scrub and her associates in the barn yard made
