

# Airport public hearing set

The new airport is about to become an operating reality despite some "bad weather" that has developed in the last stages of getting it in "flight."

In order to give any dissidents opportunity to use the courage of their convictions and come forward, the Municipal Airport Zoning Commission has scheduled a PUBLIC HEARING for the city council chambers at 2 p. m., Jan. 6, 1981.

Apparently, some area aircraft owners are of the two-fisted "barnstorming" genre of flyer in favor of whatever shelter a man is able to afford or feels he needs for his aircraft.

Aware that age and health impairments making a pilot fall short of the next licensing physical requirements and removing the flyer from actual concern with airport use and that a new group of pilots would have, possibly, a set preferences of their own, city and county leaders in the construction and administration of the facility are trying to structure an airport in compliance with regulations for a long time to come.

This is NOT to say the knowledge and experience of pilots who no longer fly will be ignored. Their sincere opinions will be welcomed, according to members of the Municipal Airport Zoning Commission which has the burden of getting the new flying act together.

It DOES mean that self-serving interests of critics who want the privilege of nailing some corrugated tin over a frame of thin dimension lumber to shelter their aircraft cannot be considered -- especially when it has been impossible to establish the identity of most of these critics beyond an oft-repeated phrase from others who speak up: "-- A lot of people object to . . ."

At issue is a uniform standard of construction and appearance for all structures at the airport while restricting "goat-grazing" and other unauthorized use of the grounds that has nothing to do with flying and -- in fact -- endangers operation of aircraft in and out of the new facility. Since many do not read legal notices, this is an urgent appeal for all interested persons to take part in this public hearing at 2 p. m. this Jan. 8.

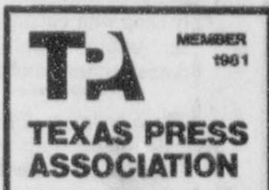

## Christmas without tragedy here

### LION news and notes

Last year, more than 10,000 people had their sight partially or fully restored in corneal-transplant operations using eyes provided by eye banks throughout the world sponsored or supported by Lions Clubs.

In the United States alone, 65 Lions eye banks reported a total of 10,176 transplants. In this operation, clouded corneas are replaced with clear ones taken from eyes donated by concerned individuals.

Eye banks are usually supported by a group of Lions Clubs in a locality, state or region. Lions ask their neighbors to sign a donor card that will ensure that their eyes, upon death, will be available for transplant, research or other uses.

Lions Clubs have long been known for their assistance to the blind and sight-impaired. At their 1925 Convention, Helen Keller urged the Lions to become



"Knights of the Blind in the Crusade against darkness."

They responded with enthusiasm and today--in addition to operating eye banks--Lions support glaucoma screening units, dog guide training, eye research and treatment centers, used eyeglass collection and distribution facilities and a wide variety of other sight-related activities.

Abner Drew Gressett of Stamford, Texas, father of Ray D. Gressett of Spearman, passed away Dec. 22, 1980. He was 88 years old. Funeral Services are pending.

With the general public almost taking the services of law enforcement officers and -- particularly -- volunteer fire fighters and emergency medical personnel for granted, most almost fail to note that, in our community, tragic Holiday fires have almost disappeared from the Christmas-New Year's scene.

This is not a hapstance. It is the result of the work of those men who earn a living for their families at their respective trades and fight fires when there is an outbreak.

This work is in two areas: weeding out the danger spots in the community and educating the public to use extra caution in setting up all decorations for the holidays.

It is a very strong editorial feeling that it is not amiss when writing the "thank you" notes for various gifts and gracious thoughts expressed, that the sheriff's people, the members of the police department and certainly, the volunteer fire fighters be included.

It is a part of our strong editorial feeling a very unusual precedent will be set right here in our community if these people who worked while we played over the holidays, get notes saying:

"Thank you for a safe Christmas Season!"

### N O W ACCOUNTS TO BE OFFERED LOCALLY

Technically it is called "The Depository Institutions Deregulation and Monetary Control Act of 1980 (P.L. 96-221)" and it becomes effective December 31.

But what is that? It means that as of January 1, banking customers will be able to earn interest on checking accounts.

It is a service consumers have sought for several years, but apparently checking with interest, commonly known as NOW Accounts, is a complex concept not wholly supported by banking institutions.

The FIRST STATE BANK of Spearman's Negotiable Order of Withdrawal (NOW) Accounts hold these requirements: to qualify for the 5% interest an account must maintain a minimum balance of \$1,000.00. If the balance falls below this level, interest for the month will be forfeited. If the account balance drops below \$2,000.00, a small maintenance fee of \$4.00 per month will be charged.

**FACTS & FIGURES**

To hold oil imports to 1978's 8.5 million barrels a day means holding domestic conventional oil and gas production at current or higher levels--which will cost about \$40 billion per year by 1990.



A cumulative investment of \$60 to \$70 billion is needed for synfuel plants capable of producing a million barrels a day by 1990, say experts at Gulf Oil Corporation. The need for capital is intensified by inflation: drilling rigs, offshore leases, etc., have gone up more rapidly than the Consumer Price Index.

Enhanced recovery techniques designed to squeeze more oil out of older fields have added about 385,000 barrels a day to U.S. oil production.

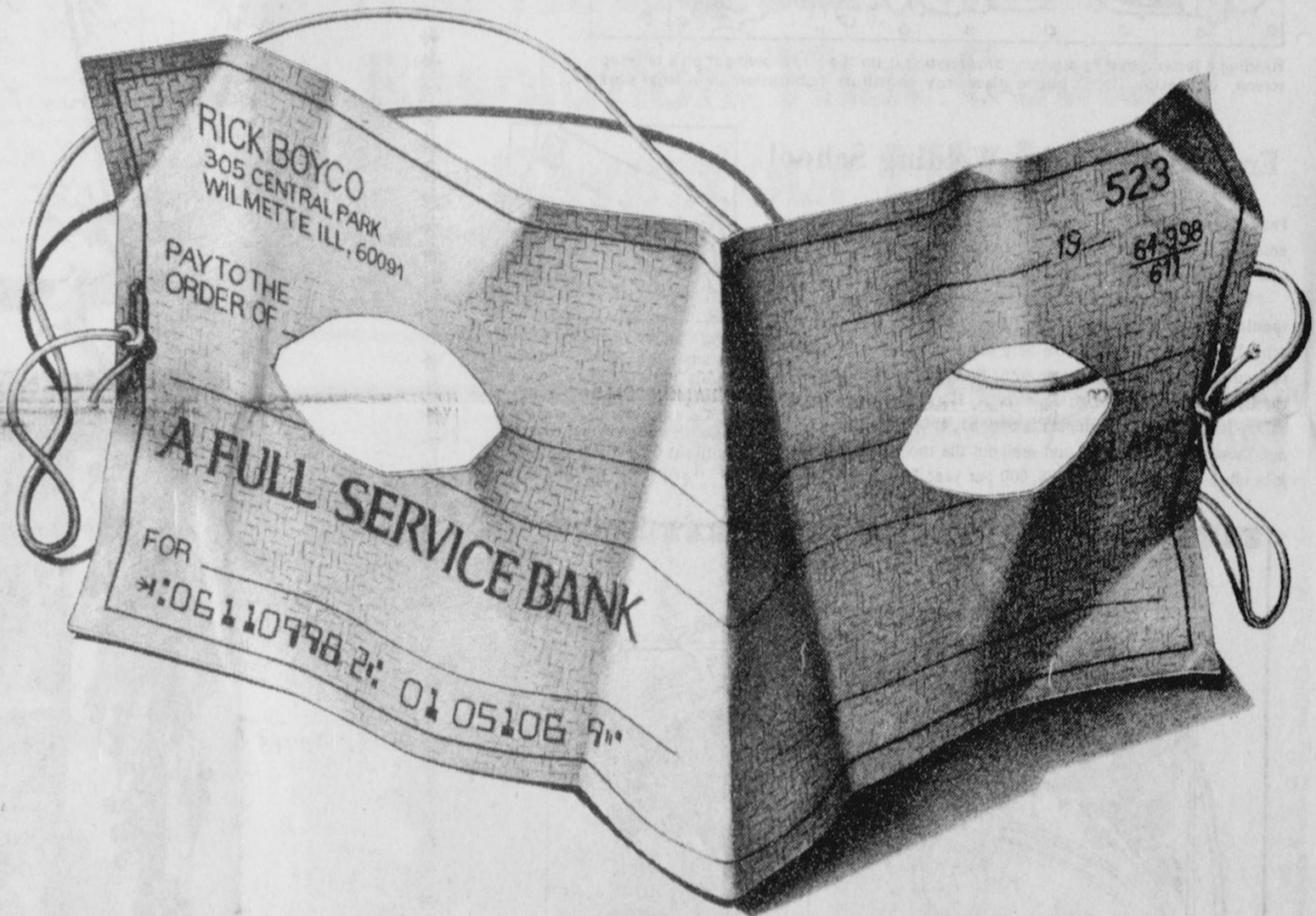

## Fairchild is Queen of 'Flamingo Road'

Westwood—Perhaps I have my head up in the clouds a bit, but Morgan Fairchild strongly resembles one of Hollywood's nostalgic glamour girls. Somehow this enchantingly beautiful actress conjures up notions of sinking into a key scene in a gangster movie circa 1940, with some ruggedly handsome actor uttering something like, "Hey Slim, who's the dame with the poison dollface?"

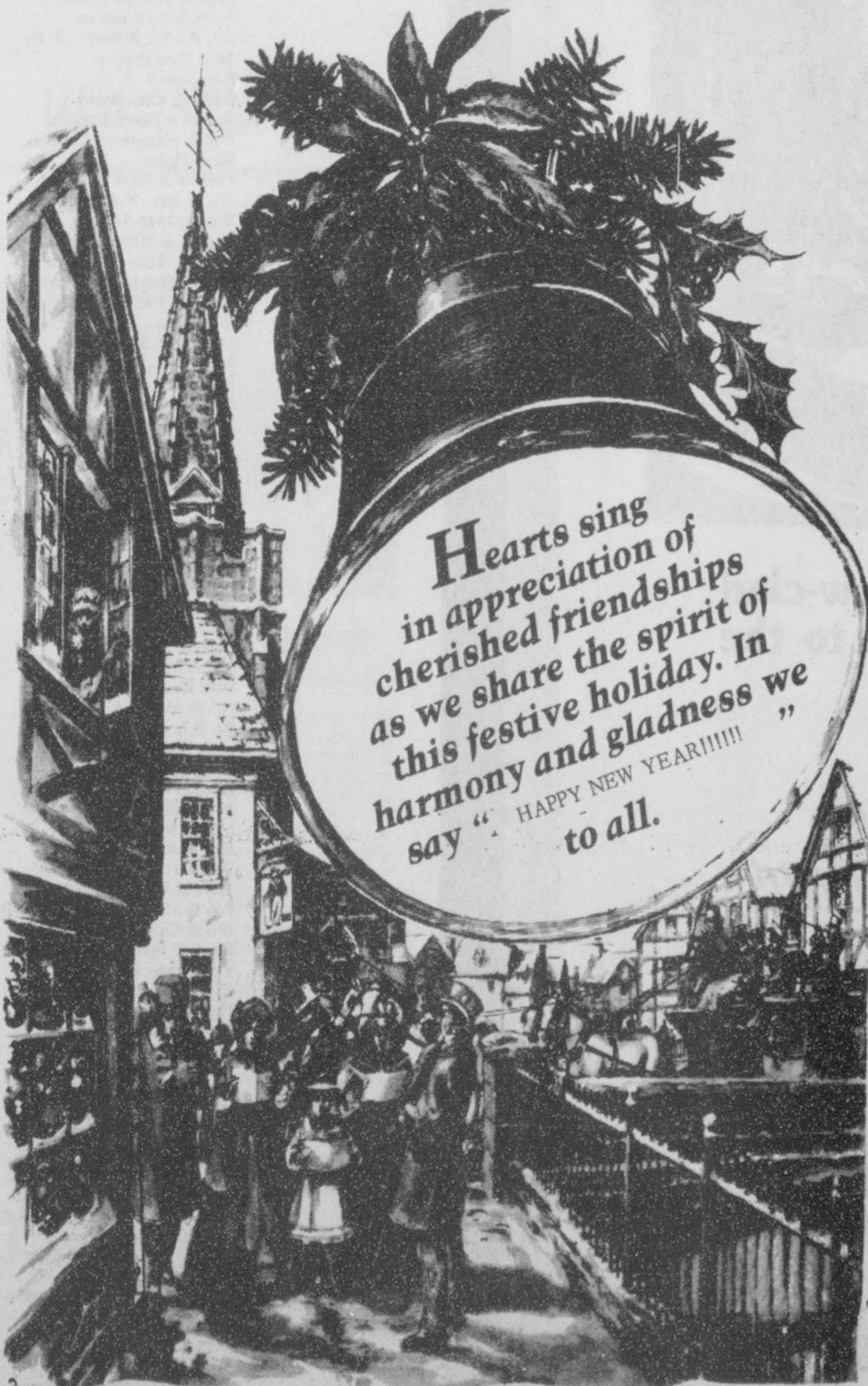

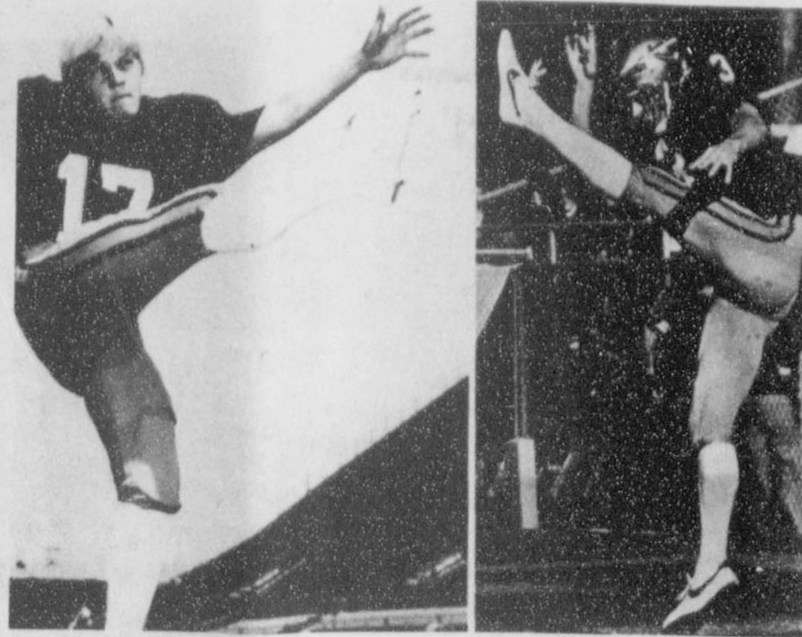

Unfortunately, everything beyond the opening sequence is boring.

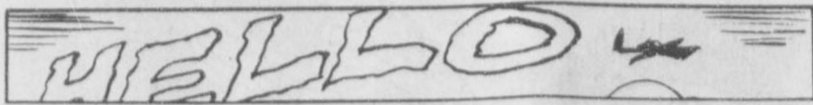

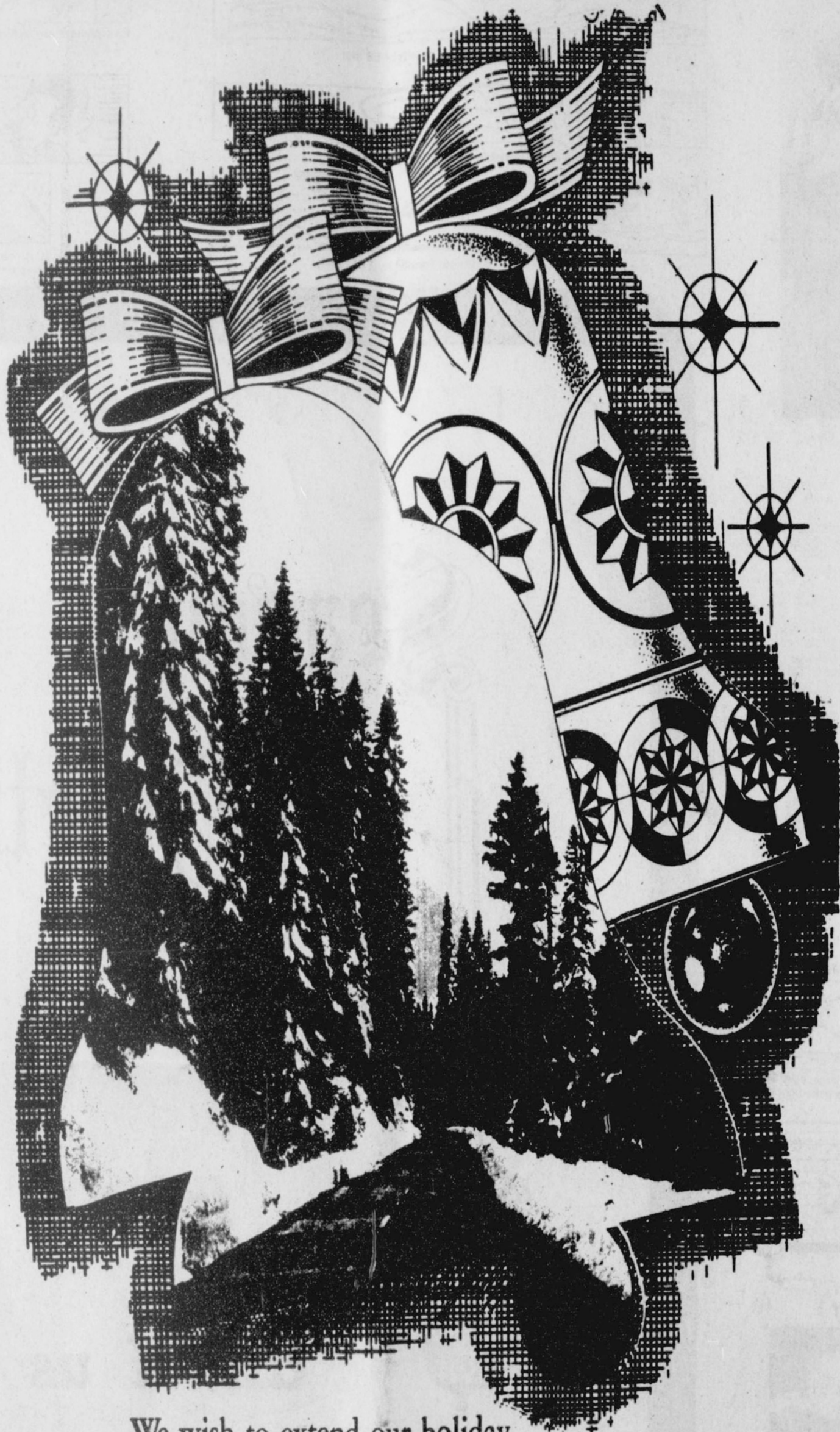

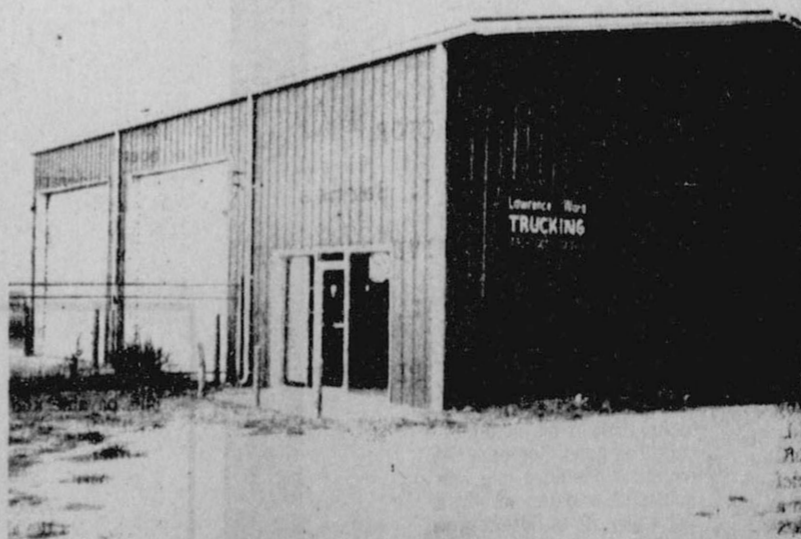
