worker's account are used to compute the amount of his benefits."

All employment except for specifically excluded types of work is covered under the old age and survivors insurance provisions of the Social Security Act, according to Mayne. For instance cooks, maids, butlers, chauffeurs and gardeners, who are employed by private families, are not covered. If these same workers should obtain jobs in hotels, restaurants, service stations or in other commercial or industrial establishments they would be covered by this Federal insurance system.

Covered employment, generally speaking, is a job in a factory, shop, mine, mill, store, office, American ship, national or state bank, building and loan associations, or other places of business.

Jobs not covered are in general, as follows: agricultural labor, domestic service, government work, work for educational, charitable or religious non-profit organization; work on railroads (this is covered by the railroad system); work in a fishing industry; work as a news boy; certain kind of professional work; work performed for a son, daughter, spouse, or for a parent, if the child is under 21.

Mr. Mayne pointed out that in order to qualify for monthly old-age primary insurance benefits a worker (a) must be under 65 years of age; (b) must have worked in covered employment for a certain number of years.
