## Local Farmers Attend Farmers Union Convention

Delegates and members of the Texas Farmers Union have again given full support to re-adoption of 100 percent parity farm prices and have urged all farmers and ranchers in the state to unite their numbers and harmonize their opinions in the coming months' efforts in Washington.

The convention was filled with little controversy even though coincidentally timed with a caravan of tractors which left the convention center parking lot on their way to Washington.

In fact, the most heated session was not one of internal issues but rather one in which a top economist from the Carter Administration spoke. Dr. J.B. Penn, Dpty. Admin. of ESCS in the the Dept. of Agriculture, was booed loudly and repeatedly in a question session after a speech in which he rather unsympathetically told farmers that 1979 farm income would be little above last year's, "or down slightly."

As one official stated, "Our

sole interest at present is to change the poor and inadequate federal farm law. When we witness an unconcerned attitude like this from one of Carter's chief brain trusts in charge of farm policy, we're disposed to raise Cain. I think it's important that large numbers of farmers follow Penn back to Washington and dedicate themselves to bringing lawmakers to pass emergency legislation that even the Administration could not water down. I'd predict from the viewpoint here that President Carter couldn't carry enough farm votes in Texas to sneeze at.

In other sessions earlier, Farmers Union members heard from a panel of Tax experts on the issues of government spending and taxation and their effects on family farmers.

Texas Commissioner of Agriculture Reagan Brown, Attorney General Mark White and North Dakota Farmers Union President Stanley Moore

also addressed the three-day convention. Moore was especially received with serious attention as he delineated the serious problems farmers face in the areas of inflation, energy, transportation and representation.

Delegates attending the Texas Farmers Union convention from Castro County included Vic Nelson, Harold Bennett and Doug Higgins.

## Contract Let

School board members awarded a contract for a new migrant remedial reading building Monday night to Holley's Gym Specialists. Contracted for \$19,999.85, the building will be paid for by Federal funds.

Meeting in regular session, board members also approved a new three year contract for Superintendent Ted Averitt to extend to July 1, 1982. Approval was given for all

employees on hourly wages to draw minimum wage of \$2.90 per hour, effective Jan. 1.

Resignation of elementary secretary Kay Berry was accepted effective Jan. 19. Paula Rush was employed to replace Mrs. Berry.

The board voted to purchase a 53-passenger diesel activity bus from Army surplus for \$2,000.

Superintendent Averitt reported an enrollment of 611.

## Bargaining Organization Seeks Food Corn Contracts

Local farmers and producers of Castro County and seven other counties in the High Plains have organized a cooperative group to negotiate for better prices for the products grown in this area.

Texas Corn Growers Association sponsored the organizational meeting Jan. 3 in Dimmitt with farmers attending from Hart, Nazareth, Dimmitt, Friona, Bovina, Springlake, Lazbuddie, Muleshoe, Earth, Olton, Kress and Dumas.

Weldon Davis was elected president of the association. Vice president is Kenneth

Christie of Hereford with Floyd Light of Olton serving as secretary-treasurer.

Immediate concern of the group is the arrangement of food corn contracts although the group plans to be active in marketing of other grains.

Representatives of High Plains Farm Bargaining Association, the name chosen for the organization, met Thursday afternoon with agents for Frito-Lay Grain Handling Division, major buyer of food corn in the area. Negotiations are underway.

Davis urges other grain producers to become involved in the bargaining group.

## Seniors Slate Fund Project

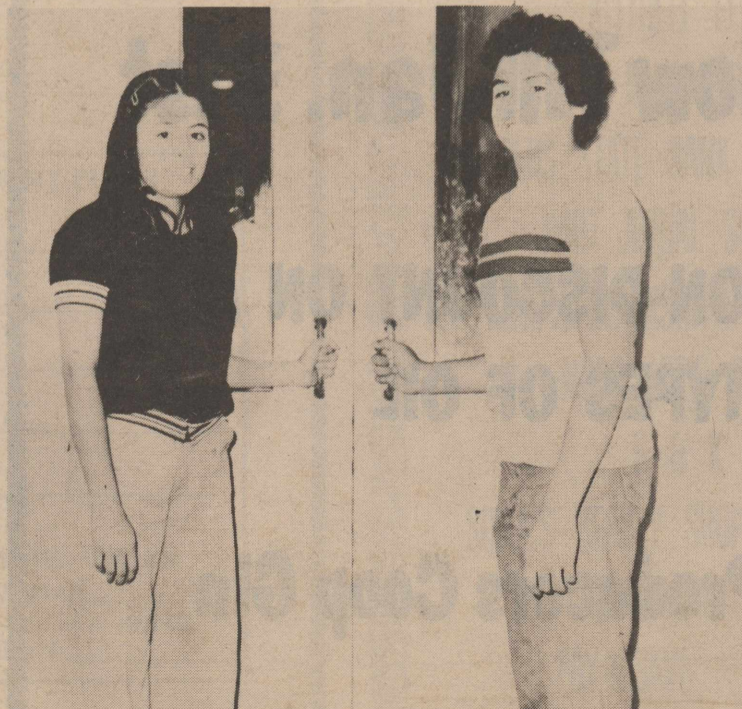

Persons interested in making a contribution may see any member of the senior class or by stopping in at Hart High School.

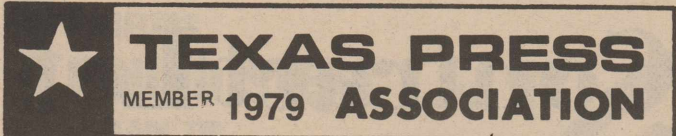

**APRICOT COCONUT BALLS**  
2 lbs. dried apricots  
1 can Eagle Brand milk  
3 cans moist coconut  
Powdered sugar

Grind apricots in food chopper. Add coconut and Eagle Brand milk. Mix well. Refrigerate overnight. Form into balls and roll in powdered sugar. Do not cook. These will keep indefinitely in a closed container in refrigerator.

**BAKED BEANS**  
1/4 c shortening  
1 c chopped onion  
1 lb hamburger  
1 t salt  
1 c catsup  
2 T mustard  
2 t vinegar  
1 lg can pork and beans  
1 lg can kidney beans

Melt shortening in skillet and brown onion. Add meat and cook until done. Add all other ingredients. Bake in casserole 30 mins in 400° oven.

**REFRIGERATOR COOKIES**

1/2 c butter  
1/2 c brown sugar  
2 t Sweet 'N Low  
1 egg  
1 1/2 c flour  
1/2 t baking soda  
1/4 t salt  
1 t vanilla

Cream butter, sugar and Sweet 'N Low. Beat in egg. Gradually add flour, sifted with soda and salt. When blended,

beat in vanilla. Mix well. Shape in 2 or 3 rolls. Roll in waxed paper and store in freezer until ready to bake. When ready to bake, remove from freezer and allow to thaw enough to slice thin. Bake on ungreased cookie sheet 7 to 8 mins. in 400° oven.

You may add 2 sqs. melted unsweetened chocolate, pkg chocolate chips, 1/2 c chopped nuts, raisins or coconut for variations.

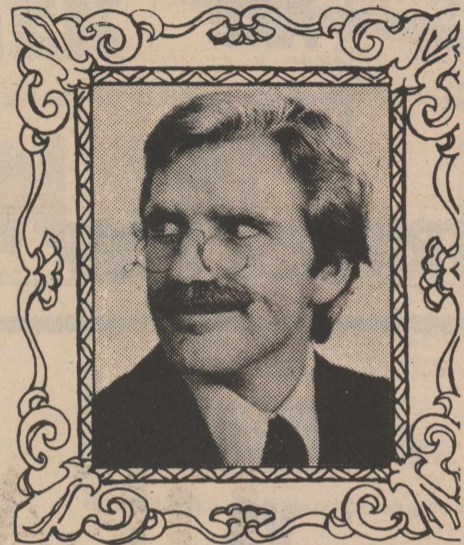
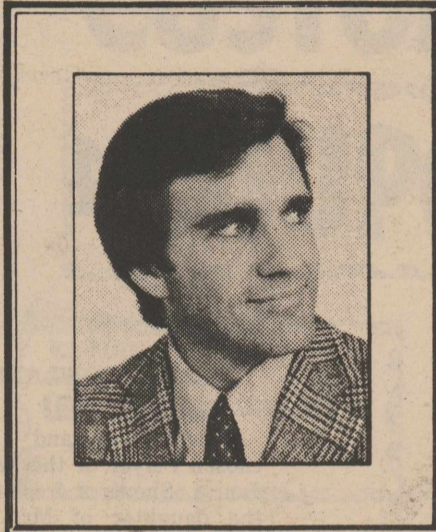
