 December the 5th, 1921 the Pampa Chamber of Commerce has elected a locating party to mark and layout Highway No. 33-B. known as the Doby Walls Highway crossing the Canadian River at the Coble Crossing right in front of Doby Walls old fighting grounds.

Mr. W. T. Coble has agreed to make a straw bridge for the present winter, and we expect to have dinner there, and Amarillo has become interested and have agreed to furnish the beef and have a barbecue while we are at it. This will be a fore runner of a bridge across the Canadian which divides the distance half way between the Canadian Bridge and the Amarillo bridge and will be of interest to Perryton as well as other towns, and we extend an invitation to your business men to meet us at the river Monday, December 5th if weather permits, if you have some good speakers bring one or two along.

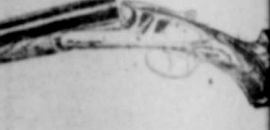

**SIXTY DAY REPRIEVE GRANTED WILL TAIT BY GOV. ROBERTSON**  
Lawton, Oklahoma, Nov. 26.—A new lease on life was given Will Tait Wednesday, when Governor J. B. A. Robertson granted a 60 day reprieve from his death sentence, which was to have been executed Friday.  
The reprieve followed an order by the criminal court of appeals, granting a new trial to Cleo Gobin, who with Tait, was alleged to have slain Russell Sprague, a Lawton taxicab driver.  
Tait pleaded guilty, Gobin pleaded not guilty; he was put on trial and convicted. Both men were sentenced to death.  
Gobin was granted a retrial, upon the grounds that he was allowed but one day to get witnesses. The reprieve, it is believed, will mean that Tait will be needed as a witness.

County Health Notes

(November 21, 1921)

The Monday Class at Perryton was devoted to a talk to the girls. The children in Mrs. Wingham's room were weighed on the new scales and all the children had gained some and some had gained from the mal-nutritive class up to normal or above. Every pound above the average, is their stored up bank account in pounds, and which will be useful for extra hard days of work or play. Some of the children in the other grades had lost weight on account of sickness. A child is not classed as over weight unless they average more than 30 per cent above the average weight for their age and height, and there are a very few in the school who reach that.

The children in the Perryton Schools have taken a good deal of interest in fixing the wash stands and putting up the muslin curtains. The children in all the schools should be encouraged to make their school housekeeping a part of their interest for most of their wake time is spent in the school for the greater part of the habit forming period of life. The brain grows during the first eighteen years of life and is then is most plastic. The adolescent period of a child is the most unstable period and the most important period, and probably the most neglected by the public in general. Between the ages of 12 and 20 the youths are forming the paths of their life road.

"The adolescent period is one of unequal growth. It is the age of awkwardness, because the nerves and the brain do not keep up with the growth of muscle and bone tissue. The one organ in particular which develops more slowly than others at that time is the heart, and all medical books speak of the narrow heart of adolescence. The child faints rather easily, and blushes at nothing, due to the instability of his circulatory system. The fact that we are not properly conserving our adolescent children can easily be seen by observing a number of them. The per cent of undernourished, the number with bad posture, and the number who are over working outside of school hours, easily shows that we have no standard of health for our adolescents."

The one third of our men who were found to be physically unfit in the draft, did not become unfit after 21, but most of their conditions dated back to their younger years. Every school wishes to have sturdy athletes, but do not always consider how much health training done in the grades is going to help produce those sturdy athletes whom they will be cheering for, when a school game is won.

The Nurse spent Tuesday at the Prairies School. Miss Van Kirk teacher. Mr. George came in after her in the morning and Mrs. Layton came down to town after school. Thelma Layton and Robert Roberts had a stored up bank account in pounds and Edna Layton and Frank Roberts were the only two who weighed up to normal. The children had a Hot Lunch demonstration at noon. Mrs. George having furnished a kettle of vegetable soup. They had the Home Nursing demonstration in the afternoon. The school is decorated to look very home like and has drape curtains on the windows and in front of the book case. The patrons who came and spent the day at the school were Mr. and Mrs. T. D. Layton, Mr. and Mrs. E. L. George and Mrs. R. S. Roberts. Mr. and Mrs. A. A. Johnson from Tevis School came over for the afternoon.

The teachers who wish to have the hot lunches in their school should not feel that they must wait for all the parents in their district to favor it. There is nothing compulsory about the matter, but nothing should stand in the way of the children having it whose parents are interested in their welfare.

On Thursday night the Huntoon School gave a chicken supper to the Lone Tree School, the latter having been the winners in the chicken contest which was held the Saturday previous.
