## Corps puts \$125-million tag on lake

long before the Corps is ready.

--And this would be a blessing because the Authority knows it can be quality constructed for much, much less than \$100-million-plus. Also, there would be no seven-year interval before start of construction.

The great confidence in this other funding stems from the fact that the lake is practically "sold out" already -- so far as commitment to buy water is concerned. The city of Lubbock has informally declared willingness to purchase all the water the Authority will sell it once the lake is completed.

The Corps, at the workshop, announced a potential of more than a quarter-million dollars annually from recreation alone.

It is believed this recreational income could double the Corps figure if the lake is built with private or state funds which will not impose the stringent restrictions practiced by the Corps.

U.S. Army Engineers do not allow private boat houses nor private docks on the shores of a Corps lake. A public marina and certain other facilities are authorized -- even to location -- by the Corps and that is all.

This policy makes the potential income from lake shore property leasing almost nil. So, members of the Palo Duro Authority are pursuing every avenue to make early construction possible and they have been given the total confidence of area people.

The Spearman city council will conduct its first regular May session, May 17, instead of the usual second Tuesday in the month.

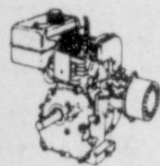

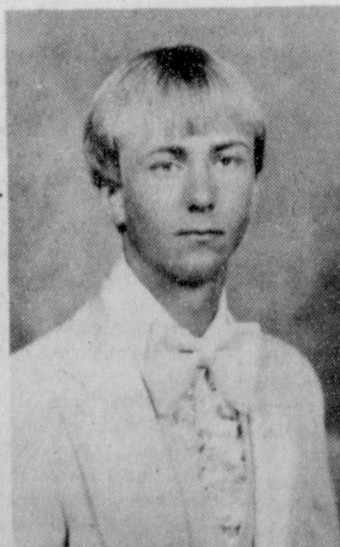

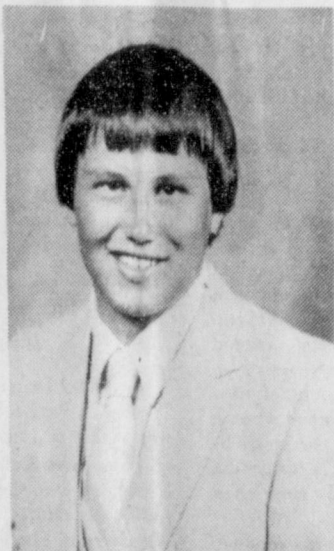

Cook macaroni, drain. In large skillet, saute bacon until lightly browned; drain on paper towels. Pour off all but 2 tablespoons drippings. Sprinkle liver with flour and salt; saute in drippings until well browned; add onion and cook until just tender.

Pour undiluted soup into 1 1/2-quart casserole; slowly stir in milk and meat sauce; fold in macaroni, liver mixture and corn.

Top with bacon; cover and refrigerate. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Uncover casserole, bake 50 minutes or until bubbly.

Serve, sprinkled with parsley. Makes 4 servings.

"If our water management practices in the past have been adequate, we may ignore the rising population, the increased industrialization, and expanded irrigation, all of which require more water from our reservoirs," cites NACD in the 16-page Soil Stewardship Week booklet. "One of our more compelling social and economic needs is for a full appreciation of the true value of our abundant supply of

water. It is time to think seriously about conservation, pollution, priority usage and our dependence upon it."

Informative material on the Soil Stewardship Week theme is distributed each year through local conservation districts to clergymen, lay leaders, and churches.

"If we are to make certain that supplies will be adequate for present and future needs, we are obligated to abide by the universal laws and to help, rather than hinder, the process by which the constant supply of water is recycled and repurified," according to NACD.

The Hansford SWCD will again be sponsoring their Annual Minister's Tour on May 5th. This tour enables the county's religious leaders to view conservation practices recently completed, which aid in the protection of our natural resources.

# Plains Bluestem Speaks for Itself



Above picture shows Plains Bluestem September 1982 that was planted April 1982 on the Larry Jeffus Farm two miles west of Guymon. Seed production can be a very profitable bonus but should not be counted on, nor overshadow the forage value of the grass.

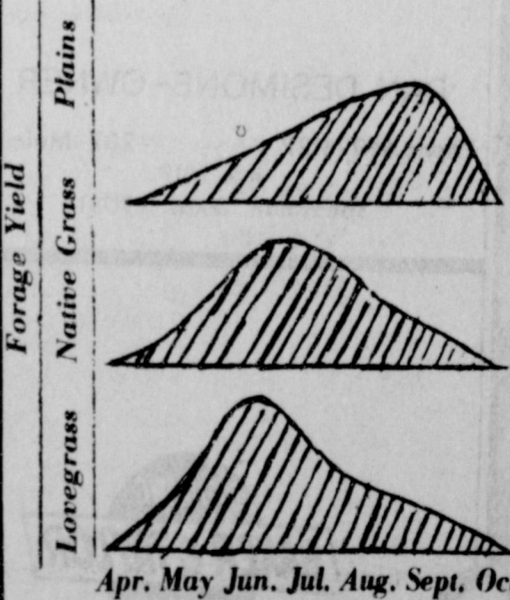
