Lease at airport draws protests

Because of some construction next to a taxiway, some new leases and a lease that is questionable, most of the lease holders of the Aransas County Airport held a meeting early Monday, Jan. 17, to discuss the problems — and most lease holders said they are very unhappy about some of the things happening at the airport.

Ron Crow, a principle owner of Rockport Aviation acted as chairman of the group and began the discussion by saying there is a concern by many lease holders at the airport about two new buildings that are being erected.

Crow explained that one of the buildings, a private hangar, was being constructed about 45 feet from the centerline of taxiway Alpha; he told the group that when the hangar is completed, several customers of the county airport will be unable to use the taxiway because of the wingspan of their planes.

After the meeting about a dozen people walked out to the construction site and after several of them stepped off the

distance from the concrete slab to the edge of the taxiway, they all agreed the hangar was being built too close to the taxiway.

"There is no way that the plane that will use that hangar can be taken out of the hangar without being on the taxiway before it clears the hangar. If the FAA (Federal Bureau of Aviation) knew about this I am sure they wouldn't approve it," said Crow.

A spokesman for Baker Aviation, a lease holder at the airport, said he felt the new hangar would definitely hinder the Baker planes from using the taxiway.

Crow said he couldn't be sure but he thought that the FAA withdraws from airports that don't use their guidelines and he added he felt this new hangar would not meet FAA guidelines.

Don Leach, Texas manager for ERA helicopter operations at the airport, and Neill Osborne, manager of PHI Helicopter, both agreed the new hangar was too close to the taxiway.

The two agreed the new hangar had little effect on their operation but said it did play a part in the safety of the airport.

The group then turned their attention to

a new lease at the airport that has many of them openly upset with the way county officials are conducting business at the airport.

Referring to the lease the Aransas County Commissions recently approved for Dr. J. Curtis Kovacs and Aransas County Justice of the Peace Bill Walston, Crow told the group, "The most recent lease is a little prejudicial, or at least it is in regards to my lease."

The group said they feel that Walston and Kovacs were given a long-term lease when none of the other lease holders have long-term leases.

The helicopter operations spokesman said they have annual leases that are renewable each year and they have made as much or more improvements as Walston and Kovacs say they are going to make.

Rip Collins of Rockport Aviation said he believes the lease to Walston and Kovacs with the first seven years free was approved because they plan on making improvements.

Collins said Rockport Aviation has made more than \$90,000 in improvements and

Rockport Aviation doesn't get a long-term lease or seven years free.

Neill Osborne of PHI helicopter operation said, "The best I can come up with is a five-year option and we have \$75,000 in land improvements. Maybe we didn't have

the right people negotiating for us," said Osborne.

Crow said he went to the Aransas County Courthouse and asked to see the lease and was told he could not.

Charter goes to city council

Rockport's proposed city charter will go before the city council Monday night, Jan. 24, with a request by the charter commission that an election date on the document be called for Saturday, April 2.

Thirteen members of the charter commission wrapped up the preparation phase of work that began last August with a meeting this past Monday, Jan. 17, with unanimous approval of the charter draft which they propose to present to city voters. Two commission members — Bill Walston and Iris Jenkins — were not present at that meeting.

Among those who did attend Monday's charter commission session were Rockport Mayor Burt Mills and Alderwoman Betty Jean Ward, both of whom commended the charter commission on their work.

Also attending was Simon Sorenson, a member of Rockport's first charter commission in 1979, who pledged, "I'll do everything I can" to help get this charter approved by city voters. "We need this (charter) and need it bad," Sorenson said.

Anticipating favorable action by the city council this coming Monday, charter commission members plan a public education program that will include making charter commission members available to

speak to various civic groups and organizations in Rockport.

Copies of the charter will also be mailed to all Rockport voters following council approval of the document. No date for mailing was announced at Monday's session.

In a letter that will be presented to the council next Monday along with the charter itself, charter commission members state, "We unanimously commend this charter to the voters of the City of Rockport and strongly recommend its adoption."

Under provisions written into the charter itself, if election is set for April 2 — coincident with regular city elections — and the charter is adopted, it will take effect immediately upon that adoption. At the next city election following the charter's adoption — April, 1984 — council members will be elected to the posts of mayor and councilmen from places two and four for two-year terms.

These provisions are in accordance with the current election procedures of the city.

If adopted, the charter will change Rockport's form of city government from mayor-council to council-city manager but

the policy-making body of the city will continue to be the five-member city council consisting of the mayor and four councilmen, two elected from each of the two city wards.

Charter Commission Chairman Ed Armstrong was optimistic about the charter's chance of success, saying, "I think it's going to pass this time."

Mills at one point during Monday's charter commission meeting said, "I would like to personally thank you (the commission) for the work you've done on this."

Alderwoman Ward later referred to the proposed charter as "fantastic! I think it's a masterpiece."

Commission member Tommy Griffith drew a laugh from those present, including Ward, by asking, "Will you vote for it?"

Other charter commission members present at Monday's meeting included Marty Dillon Renfro, Pat Brown, Gayle Atchley, Jerry Beattie, Ralph Winkelman, Eddie Ratliff, J.C. Harlan, Dick Lilly, Richard McMakin, Curtis Kovacs and Mary Lou Tyner.

Work on the city charter began last May when the city council appointed a steering committee whose task was to determine if Rockport had sufficient population — at least 5,000 — to become a home rule city.

In June, the steering committee reported Rockport's population was, according to their findings, in excess of 6,000 and the council called an election in August for the charter commission.

By an approximately 2-1 margin, Rockport voters cast ballots in favor of electing a charter commission and elected the 15 charter commission members who were sworn in later in the month and began a series of weekly meetings to write the proposed document.

Initial draft of the proposed 12 charter articles was completed in early December and the document turned over to a rewrite committee charged with putting the articles together, correcting any errors in spelling or punctuation and clarifying wording where necessary.

No substantive changes were made in the rewrite which was approved Monday on a motion by McMakin.

Funding assured for sanitary sewer project

Rockport's city council took the next step in seeking approval of a federal grant to expand the city's wastewater treatment plant Monday, with a 4-0 vote giving notice of the city's intention to issue \$600,000 in certificates of obligation.

On a motion by Alderman Richard Beck during a special meeting that began at 2 p.m. Monday, council members voted to adopt a resolution giving notice of the city's intention to authorize the certificate of obligation issue.

The motion was seconded by Alderwoman Betty Jean Ward.

This measure is to be followed on Feb. 14 by adoption of an ordinance actually authorizing issue of the bonds which will be used to pay the city's share of project costs if Rockport's application for federal funding assistance is approved.

Rockport and eight other Texas cities have applications pending for grant money under a program funded through the Environmental Protection Agency. In 1979-80, Rockport received funds for Step I of the project, a study to determine the feasibility and need for expansion of the city's wastewater treatment plant from its present one million gallons per day to two million gallons per day capacity.

When the first step of the project was completed, city officials applied for funds to

help pay for design and construction of the project.

Johnson told council members at Monday's meeting that if the city issued the certificates of obligation — which include funds for Rockport's 25 percent share of anticipated costs plus some contingency

That application is now pending before the Texas Department of Water Resources in Austin. A public hearing on the application — and others — is scheduled in Austin Thursday, Jan. 20, and will be attended by Mills and City Administrator Herman Johnson.

They started something

Following the offer last week of a bank building as their new City Hall, Rockport officials have received unofficial offers from several other sources — and one that's official.

Rockport Mayor Burt Mills received a letter Monday from Charles Fake, pastor of First Baptist Church, asking to discuss with the city the possibility of their facilities becoming a new City Hall.

First Baptist Church is planning to relocate on Enterprise where it has purchased a large tract. At the current church site, 902 Main, there are three buildings and a parking lot occupying a full city block.

In his letter to the city, Rev. Fake noted, "The buildings are large enough to accommodate future growth of city offices and have potential for other uses, such as a civic center."

The offer will be placed for consideration on next Monday's, Jan. 24, city council agenda, Mayor Mills said.

At the council's Jan. 10 meeting, the mayor read a letter from Allied Live Oak Bank offering the city the bank's real estate properties at its present location, including the bank proper and the adjacent community center. Council members are considering the proposal.

Rockport shows gain in sales tax collections

Going against a general statewide trend, Rockport's sales tax revenues for the first month of 1983 were ahead of January, 1982, sales tax collections by a healthy 23.90 percent.

Tax revenues in Fulton dropped — although the 7.75 percent decrease was not as great as in the majority of surrounding cities where sales tax revenues were off by anywhere from 16.36 to more than 79 percent.

State Comptroller Bob Bullock, who sent sales tax rebates of \$32 million to nearly 1,000 Texas cities last week, said overall tax collections are down 7.7 percent from January, 1982.

"Collections are down from every major city except Austin," Bullock said, adding, "It's affecting the financing of Texas cities even more drastically than the finances of the state."

Bullock figured state revenues are going to be affected about \$1.5 billion worth, dropping his estimates of available state revenues by that amount last week.

Rockport has received a check for \$12,819.75 from Bullock's office, the

returns for this month of the city's one percent city sales tax. The collections actually represent sales for the prior month, a collection period that ended on Jan. 1.

The city's sales tax revenues for the comparable period last year amounted to \$10,346.84.

The year's first sales tax check to Fulton was for \$1,657.75, a slight drop from the January, 1982 sales tax returns of \$1,797.01. Unlike other cities in the state who may be feeling a pinch this year if the downward trend continues, Fulton isn't going to be that affected in the opinion of Mayor L.E. Casterline.

"I'm sure sales are going to be down this year, but I think we're going to be all right," Casterline said when contacted Monday. "I think all the cities are finding we're not going to get quite the taxes we've been getting."

Only one other city in the Coastal Bend region showed a sizeable increase in sales tax collections for January, 1983, over January, '82. That was Sinton where the

Liability insurance law to be enforced

AUSTIN — The Texas Department of Public Safety will continue to enforce the current mandatory liability insurance law as enacted by the last session of the Texas Legislature. A recent Attorney General's opinion stated that failure to carry, produce or provide proof of insurance is not an offense. However, the opinion does not require DPS policy to be changed. The offense contained in the law is "failure to maintain financial responsibility," i.e., failure to maintain liability insurance.

Colonel Jim Adams, DPS director, said "the statute requires motorists to furnish information concern-

ing evidence of insurance to a police officer upon request. Failure to provide satisfactory information creates a rebuttable presumption under the statute that the motorist failed to maintain liability insurance. This presumption may be rebutted by presenting evidence to the judge that the motorist did in fact have insurance and the judge may dismiss the charge."

If the officer is not satisfied with the information provided, he can issue a citation. Adams said troopers will continue to issue citations when drivers are unable to furnish satisfactory information.

The Department of Public Safety issued rules when the law went into effect detailing examples of information which would be accepted as evidence of financial responsibility. The items include the insurance policy, insurance identification card or other information which confirms to the satisfaction of the officer that the operator is in compliance with the law.

In an opinion dated May 14, 1982, the Attorney General upheld these rules as binding on all law enforcement officers of the state.

"If a person is unable to furnish the information requested by the officer, the officer may issue a

citation even though the individual claims to have the required insurance," Adams said.

Colonel Adams said the law has produced positive results, and has resulted in an increase in the number of Texans who presently carry liability insurance.

"Before the law as passed, 74 percent of the Texas motorists involved in vehicle accidents did have insurance. However, 1982 accident reports indicate that 91 percent of the drivers involved in vehicle accidents have obtained and maintain insurance," he said.

Growing Child

The scribblers. They just can't help themselves, according to Growing Child, the monthly child development newsletter.

They've just got to close their fists around those fat black crayons — and scribble. Around and around they go, in huge arcs, angular zig-zags, blurs and blobs. Unfortunately, scribblers like to use walls for their canvases.

If you provide an alternative for a scribbler, like a large chalkboard and colored chalk, an easel with newspaper and paint, or lots of plain paper (the back of computer printouts or shelf paper in rolls make marvellous drawing pads) you'll have fewer pictures on your walls.

Scribbling may look like nonsense to adults, but there is some sense in it for a 3-year-old.

When children learn to stop their arm movements in time, those big circles become faces. Tight rough scribbles make eyes, looser ones make curly hair.

Sweeping lines stop short for arms, fingers, mouths, spiky hair. Pounding with the point of the crayon, when it becomes less violent, makes pretty dots of snow and gentle raindrops. Scribbling is necessary preparation for drawing — and writing, too.

But it's hard to know what to say to a youngster when you're presented with a work of art. "That's very nice" sounds as phony as it is. "What is it?" is embarrassing since the child probably doesn't know either.

"I really like purple scribbles" is probably the most honest, appreciative, and gracious thing you can say!

LPG storage rule changed

AUSTIN — The Railroad Commission has repealed a rule that in effect required consumers with leased LP-gas storage vessels to have the tanks filled by the LP-gas dealer who owns the tank.

The rule said that "containers shall be filled only upon the authorization of the owner of the container."

In recommending that the Commission repeal the rule, members of the RRC Liquefied Petroleum Gas Division said that repeal will remove the Commission from "matters of private contractual concern which in no way effect safety" and noted that LP-gas installations should be inspected each time they are served by a dealer.

"Familiarity with a particular LP-gas facility does not necessarily mean that a dealer is aware of a hazard without ongoing inspection of the facility," they added.

The Commission amended another LP-gas rule to upgrade construction and labeling of LP-gas hoses. The hoses must be designed for a working pressure of 350 pounds per square inch gauge and a bursting pressure of 1,750 psig. Previously, a 125 psig working pressure and a 1,250 psig bursting pressure were required.

The change also requires that the same or marking for the manufacturer appear with the words "LP-gas" or "LPG" on the hose.

In Texas, the Railroad Commission's Liquefied Petroleum Gas Division regulates the safe handling of LP-gas.

Bishop took the ball and tied the game, and then got control of the ball again. Rudy Soliz made two key defensive plays at the end of the first overtime to keep Bishop from getting the lead.

Bishop got the ball on the tip to start the second overtime, and they stalled the ball till the clock showed only 22 seconds remaining in the second overtime period. Bishop could not make anything of it, and the game remained at 41-41.

Things really got going in the third overtime period. Bishop got first chance with foul shots, but missed. Commander was then fouled, and that was followed by two technical fouls against Bishop. Rockport had a big chance, but Commander missed the front-end of a one-and-one, then Tim Redden hit the first two technical penalty shots, but missed the third, putting the Pirates ahead by 43-41.

Redden hit a shot to give the Pirates a four-point lead. Then the Pirates got the ball under the boards, and Mott missed a pair. Bishop meanwhile came back and not only caught

the Pirates, but went ahead at 48-47 with very little time remaining.

When the Pirates tried to score again, Longino was fouled with five seconds on the scoreboard clock. Longino canned the first shot, and after a short delay, he shot the next shot which missed. The ball kicked out deep to the corner and Commander chased it down, and with the eye of an eagle, he sited the basket and shot a long shot. The ball ripped the basket. Bishop tried a desperation shot, but the Pirates had pulled it out.

When the Pirates had hit the 50-point mark, Redden had accumulated half of them with a 25-point performance. He got help from Longino (9), Mott (8) and Commander (6).

Archeologist and whaling expert to head symposium

A renowned virologist, the deputy program manager for a billion dollar oil reserve effort, the head of the Institute of Nautical Archaeology and an expert on 19th Century whaling ships headline the fourth annual Marine Education Symposium at Texas A&M University. The Symposium, set for March 5, at the College Station campus, is co-sponsored by the Sea Grant College Program and the Department of Educational Curriculum and Instruction.

Noting that Symposium attendance has increased each year, marine education coordinator Dr. John Hunt said that the 1983 program has been expanded to cover an even broader range of topics.

"We emphasized the marine sciences the first year," Hunt said, "but we have added other topics each time since, until this year I believe we have an excellent balance among all subject areas. We still offer a number of presentations on the marine sciences, but we intend this to be a supplement to ongoing courses in science, social studies, literature, music and career counseling."

One noted newcomer to the 1983 program is Dr. Joseph Melnick, a distinguished service professor of virology and epidemiology at Baylor College of Medi-

cine. Melnick, a longtime Sea Grant researcher, will talk on the conquest of viral hepatitis and pollution-caused shellfish contamination.

Other additions to the program are Dr. Charles Giammona, deputy program manager for Texas A&M's work on the National Strategic Petroleum Reserve effort; Dr. Charles Schultz, Texas A&M archivist, who will combine his interest in history and shipping in a presentation on life on board 19th Century whaling ships; and marine biologist Dr. Mary Wicksten, who will talk on life in undersea caves. Ships of another era serve as the topic for Dr. George Bass, head of the Institute of Nautical Archaeology.

The Symposium is open to high school students and teachers and other interested adults from throughout Texas. The preregistration deadline is Feb. 1,

and the cost is \$2 per student or adult. Approximately 20 simultaneous presentations will be offered in three sessions, with the participant selecting the one that appears most interesting. Some sessions are limited because of room capacities, so early preregistration is encouraged.

All presentations are in the morning, followed by an afternoon of tours of various Texas A&M facilities and continuous showings of marine-related films. Eight teacher workshops also will take place during the afternoon, conducted by Department of Educational Curriculum and Instruction faculty.

Details of the Symposium are included in a printed program which is available by contacting the Marine Education Office, 317 Harrington Tower, Texas A&M University, College Station, Texas 77843.

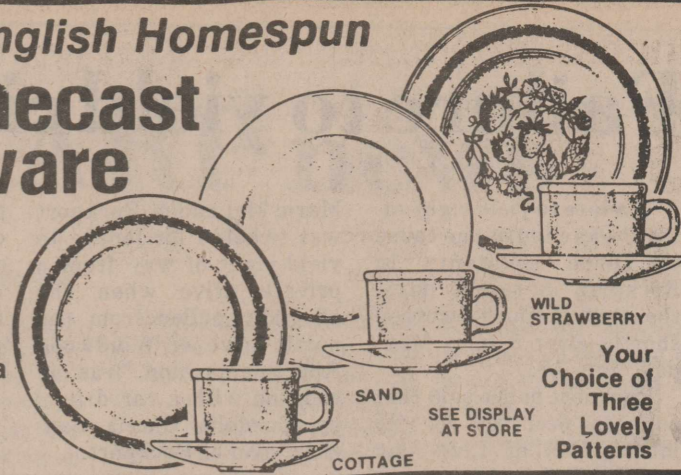

Clothes can cause an allergic skin rash

A particular garment can make you feel great when you put it on, but red areas of itching skin can change all that.

What you wear can cause an allergic reaction in the form of an itching, inflamed skin rash, says the Texas Medical Association. The rash is less often caused by the fabric itself than by the dye or other chemicals used to treat the fabric.

For instance, many people claim to be allergic to nylon. The allergic response often is not to the nylon, however, but to the nylon's keeping the skin too warm. Warm skin, in turn, contributes to the release of dyes in the fabric and to the skin's absorption of the dyes. In addition, nylon often is treated with an allergy-causing resin.

Any dyed or chemically treated fabric can produce an allergic skin rash. For this reason, finding the problem item of clothing in the patient's wardrobe can require more than a little detective work by the patient and the doctor. Besides dyes, a person may be allergic to elastic or stretch fibers, permanent press finishes on fabrics, fur trims or moth repellent used in storing clothing.

Women seem more prone than men to skin rash from clothing, and overweight women are particularly susceptible. In both sexes, inflammation occurs more often where clothing rubs skin, such as inner thighs, armpits, sides of the trunk and the waist. The typical allergic rash is red, swollen and itchy. It may be

blister-like and moist or scaly and dry.

A skin rash that develops from an allergic reaction may need medical attention. Treating the rash yourself with other chemicals — even mild lotions

normally considered soothing — could aggravate the allergic skin. The same can be true of preparations that customarily relieve itching.

The doctor's main objective is to identify the chemical causing the reac-

tion so you can avoid it. In most cases, the rash will subside once the cause is removed. Sometimes, however, the doctor may treat an uncomfortable and unsightly rash with cortisone-like drugs.

Sharp introduces veterans, charitable tax exempt bill

State Senator John Sharp of Victoria has introduced Senate Joint Resolution 6 into the Texas Senate which will allow local governments to exempt veterans and non-profit charitable organizations from property taxation. The measure is a constitutional amendment which must be passed by two-thirds of the Senate and House of Representatives and then must be approved by Texas voters at the next General Election.

"SRJ6 will allow local

governments to exempt from property taxation the property of veteran's organizations chartered by the United States Congress as well as fraternal organizations which perform charitable or benevolent functions," Sharp said.

Sharp pointed out that prior to passage of the new Property Tax Code, many of these organizations such as the VFW, American Legion, Masonic Lodges, Lions Clubs, etc. were not taxed. After passage of the new laws, many appraisal districts began taxing

these organizations' property.

"With the passage of SJR 6, we can return veterans and charitable organizations to the non-taxable status they once were. It makes no sense to tax the organizations that provide scholarships to our young people and aid to disabled and needy Texans," Sharp stated. "I hope all the taxpayers of Texas will join with us in seeing to it that the money raised by these organizations continues going to charity, not to government."

Marine education symposium set

The Symposium is open to high school students and teachers and other interested adults from throughout Texas. The preregistration deadline is Feb. 1, and the cost is \$2 per student or adult. Approximately 20 simultaneous

presentations will be offered in three sessions, with the participant selecting the one that appears most interesting. Some sessions are limited because of room capacities, so early preregistration is encouraged.

Fishing guide may be helpful

Anglers planning a coastal fishing trip for 1983 might do well to utilize the services of a fishing guide to improve their catch, according to biologist Larry McEachron of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

McEachron said creel survey data indicated guided bay fishing parties average between one and two fish per hour per angler. Speckled trout are the most commonly caught species, followed by redfish

and flounder. McEachron recommended contacting the Chamber of Commerce in the area you intend to fish for a list of guides. Marinas and tackle shops also may be able to provide names of guides as well.

Shade trees need little fertilization

Shade trees seldom need fertilization although fertilizer is sometimes needed when tree roots are confined by a street, curb or other structure. Tree fertilization isn't needed more than once every three years, except in extremely sandy soils.

Fertilize trees during the winter months. But when trees have a restricted root system, another application may be needed in early summer. Followed by adequate irrigation.

Broadcast fertilizer evenly beneath the branch spread of the tree and water thoroughly because roots can't use the nutrients without moisture.

Fertilizer recommendations are often based on a tree's trunk diameter without allowing for a confined or limited root zone. Following such recommendations can lead to over-fertilization. Over-fertilizing forces excessive top growth and makes the

tree more vulnerable to storm damage.

The safest method of deciding the amount of fertilizer needed is to determine the number of square feet included in the branch spread of the tree and use two pounds of nitrogen for each 1,000 square feet covered.

New radio sound is on air

KINGSVILLE — There's a new sound on the Kingsville airwaves — KTAI, Texas A&I University's FM station. And in case listeners haven't tuned it in yet at 91.1, it's not just the sound that's new, but the programming, philosophy and direction as well.

Established in 1969 with just 10 watts of power to serve the university and to provide a laboratory experience for students, the station had evolved until 1982, in the opinion of new faculty supervisor Khrosrow M Tadayon, into a kind of "private jukebox" for the students staffing it.

Two years ago the Federal Communications Commission authorized a boost in the station's power to 100 watts, enabling it to reach out 15 to 20 miles from its Manning Hall studios on the Texas A&I campus.

However, observes Dr. Tadayon, a no-nonsense broadcasting professional who came here last fall from New York City to teach and to serve as station manager, the facility seemed to have been just a jukebox and a go-between to promote private and personal social activity for its disc jockeys. "That," he declares firmly, "is not what a university radio station should be at all." In addition, the station was on the air just nine hours a day, playing mostly rock and roll.

Dr. Tadayon, whose doctorate from Columbia University is in communications backed by practical

experience from stations at Columbia and the University of Texas at Austin, sees clearly what he wants for KTAI.

"What I have in mind, quite in line with how all other well-run college radio stations operate," he says deliberately, "is to provide sophisticated alternative radio programming."

This he defines as a substitute choice for listeners who want something other than commercial radio in which the goal is to turn a profit.

"A radio station like ours," maintains Tadayon, "should be the voice of the university, representing it and what it stands for."

"It should provide," he continues, "a programming informational in nature, educational in a large sense, and be in the forefront of music entertainment by presenting the latest and the best."

Tadayon has clear, concise ideas on how to achieve the station's objectives.

"Our approach," he reflects, "has been to consider music — any kind — as an art form rather than as a matter of popular fad. We have tried to stay away from playing just the current hits, the so-called 'top 40,' — whatever comes and goes by the day or the night."

Under Tadayon's direction, and despite some resistance from some staff members "who have been used to doing it the old way," the revamped weekly program format offers something for everybody.

Lease

Osborne, in a reference to the Walston/Kovacs lease, said "I just want to be treated in a fair and like manner."

"We don't seem to get anything but the use of the airport," said Leach.

The piece of land in question on the Walston/Kovacs lease is near ERA Helicopters, and many of the people at the airport asked questions about the lease.

A lease on file at the Aransas County Courthouse shows the land was leased to Magnum Aviation on March 19, 1982. Magnum apparently poured a concrete slab on the site on June 23, 1982, but Dr. Kovacs has a lease on the same property signed and dated June 4, 1982. And now the Aransas County Commissioners have apparently approved a lease on the same property to Walston and Kovacs.

In three attempts to review the lease at the courthouse, Judge John Wendell said the lease was not available.

current January sales tax check of \$8,660.30 was 42.94 percent higher than the check received at this time last year.

Aransas Pass showed a 39.40 percent decrease in sales tax revenues, \$17,864.47 for January this year compared to \$29,481.25 in 1982, and Ingleside's January tax check of \$2,905.80 was 32.80 percent lower than last year's.

Sales tax collections were down more than 20 percent in Portland, \$13,572.06 for this January compared to \$17,033.48 in 1982. In Refugio, January, '83, collections of \$1,004.11 were down 79.57 percent from January, '82.

Bayside, which showed zero sales tax collections in January, 1982, also showed zero collections for the month this year.

MD battle continues

The term muscular dystrophy covers a group of inherited diseases characterized by muscle deterioration. An estimated 250,000 to 300,000 Americans suffer from it, with about two-thirds between the ages of 3 and 18.

Although no cure has been found, research continues. These disorders are usually genetically caused, but the specific defects have not been identified. When they

are, treatment perhaps could involve replacing missing substances in much the same way that insulin injections control diabetes. For now, respiratory exercises and antibiotics are extending the lives of many afflicted children. Exercises to stretch tendons also can help. Affected persons should remain as active as possible.

The Texas Medical Association says the most com-

mon forms of muscular dystrophy are Duchenne's, facioscapulohumeral, limb-girdle and myotonic.

Duchenne's, the most common and severe type of muscular dystrophy, is generally first noted in boys between ages 2 and 6. The child develops a waddling gait and has difficulty rising from the floor and climbing stairs. The disease progresses rapidly, and the patient seldom lives more than 15 years after the disease strikes.

Facioscapulohumeral affects males and females equally and appears in early adolescence or in their 20s. The most recognizable symptoms are loss of facial expression and difficulty in raising the arms over the head. This is the least threatening form of muscular dystrophy because it progresses slowly and rarely causes an early death. But considerable disability can result.

Limb-girdle can strike either sex in the first to third decades of life. Pelvic and shoulder muscles are involved, and deterioration varies from slow to rapid. Disability varies, but early death seldom occurs.

Myotonic may appear in early puberty but commonly arrives in early adulthood. Early signs include stiffness in the limbs, particularly in cold weather; inability to relax the grip after shaking hands; a tendency to trip or fall forward; and loss of facial expression. Patients rarely live out a normal life span.

money — the city will need to increase sewer rates to its customers.

No tax monies would be used to pay off the certificates; only revenue from the sanitary sewer system could be used for that purpose.

City officials are looking at the possibility that the certificate issue may not be necessary. In December, the city received an offer from Jerry Haldeman, managing partner of Baker-Haldeman Development Co., that included payment to the city of sufficient money to fund the city's share of the sewer expansion costs.

If Baker-Haldeman follow through on their offer, the city would be able to meet its share of project costs without needing the certificate issue.

In other action during Monday's special meeting, the council reviewed plans submitted by Delmar Hiller for street lighting in Rockport Country Club Estates Unit I. The plans, which include provision for underground utilities, were approved unanimously.

Trophy bass are beginning to stir

AUSTIN — The trophy-sized largemouth bass are beginning to stir in Texas reservoirs.

Reports from three of the state's premier big-bass lakes indicate the late winter-early spring big bass phenomenon is getting underway, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department said.

Ronald Waits of Longview set the pace last week with a 13-pound, 3-ounce bass he caught at Lake Welsh near Mount Pleasant in East Texas. At nearby Lake Monticello, catches of bass in the seven- to nine-pound range are becoming more frequent, with the best fishing expected to start in the next two weeks.

At Calaveras Lake near San Antonio, the concessionaire reported that a bass weighing 8½ pounds

was caught Jan. 2, along with two six-pounders. A five-fish string weighing 26½ pounds also was brought in Jan. 1.

Another big bass story came belatedly from Lake Murvaul near Carthage, where it was discovered that two largemouths over 12 pounds were caught during 1982.

Department officials received a tip last week that an angler had landed a 12-pound, 4-ounce largemouth at Murvaul.

Technician Wayne Griffing of Marshall was dispatched to the scene, and he found the already-mounted fish at Stan Ritter's residence near the lake. Ritter had caught the big bass during September on a black plastic worm.

The biggest surprise for Griffing, however, came when he visited Stovall's Marina at Murvaul. Proprietor Jim Walker showed Griffing his records on Murvaul-caught bass weighed there since 1980

and among the entries was a 12-pound, 8-ounce bass caught in March 1980. Other entries included bass of 11-10, 11-15 and 11-1 caught during that period.

The Murvaul discovery means there now are seven public reservoirs which produced bass 12 pounds and over during 1982. The others are Monticello, Welsh, Livingston, Fayette Power Project, Houston County and Calaveras.

Murvaul is by far the eldest of the seven lakes, making it an exception to

the general rule that lakes "peak out" in game fish production in less than a decade.

Murvaul has been a big-bass lake virtually throughout its life, yielding 8- to 10-pound bass during 1960s before Florida-strain bass were introduced into Texas. Rich water and other favorable habitat conditions were responsible for the lake's reputation as a home for large bass, biologists believe.

During 1972, the department stocked 10,000 fingerling-sized Florida bass in Murvaul. Griffing said a scale count on Ritter's fish led him to believe it was one of the original stocking or one of the first offspring of that group.

Revenue lower than expected

AUSTIN — State Comptroller Bob Bullock, warning that state tax revenue is running below earlier projections, Wednesday cautioned other state officials and administrators against trying to play Santa Claus with the state budget.

"The final figures aren't in, but revenue is definitely down from what we previously anticipated," Bullock said. "This should be no surprise to anyone who lives in, works in or is unemployed in our economy."

Bullock said that the so-called cash surplus expected in the current budget "is still intact, but the projected growth of new revenue is not coming in."

He said it will be sometime in January "before we know the bottom line."
