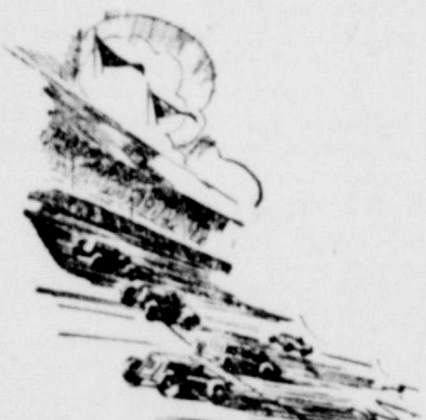

12 MEN WILL HANG IN 2 DAYS

CHICAGO, Sept. 3.—All records for legal executions in Cook county and possibly in the state of Illinois, will be broken here October 14 and 15, county officials believe when twelve men are sentenced to be hanged for murder.

Eight of the men are under sentence to die October 14th and 4 on the following day. In addition two other slayers who have been convicted are awaiting sentence and it is possible that they also may hang on one of the other two days.

Chicago has had several wholesale executions in the past, the last notable on Nov. 11, 1887, when four of the Haymarket anarchists were hanged, but nothing in the memory of jail officials approaches a death list of 12 in two days.

Hangings in the Cook county jail take place in the corridor of one of the main cell blocks. There is just room for a double gallows, so it is probable, according to George F. Lee, the jailer, that the men will be executed in pairs. The hangings will cost the state approximately \$3,000 including a \$100 fee for the sheriff for each man hung.

Those to be hanged October 14 are Sam Cardinella, leader of a blackhand gang whose members confessed several murders; Nick Jami, Thomas Errieo, Frank Camprose, Sam Lopez, Sam Ferrera and Henry Reese, the latter a negro.

The October 15 list includes: Arthur Haensel, Richard Wilson, Harry Andre and Frank Zager. Haensel, who killed his wife, was to have been executed last spring but was granted a reprieve five minutes before he was to have marched to the gallows. Andre was convicted of killing a watchman while robbing a factory safe. Wilson was found guilty in the same case, although he was on another floor of the building when Andre, his partner, killed the man. The jury decided that as an accomplice he was equally guilty.

ALL STATES TO BE REPRESENTED AT COTTON PALACE

Governor's Daughter and Other Prominent Women To Attend

Practically every state in the union will be represented by one of its fair daughters at the Texas Cotton Palace, Waco, which opens its eleventh annual consecutive state-wide exposition October 30 and closes November 14.

Following recent invitations to all state executives from Governor W. P. Hobby, to select a belle to represent that particular province at the queen's ball as a princess, letters have been flooding into the governor's office. He has forwarded the replies to President W. V. Crawford of the Texas Cotton Palace and some of them have been made public.

Lowden's Daughter Coming Governor Frank O. Lowden, of Illinois, and a candidate for the republican nomination for president of the United States, replied that he would send one of his daughters to the exposition.

In his letter to Governor Hobby the Illinois executive recalled his visit to Texas during the war, saying: "Having so pleasant a memory of my own visit to Houston during the war, when I was so tremendously impressed with the hospitality of your people, I have decided to designate one of my own daughters, either Miss Florence or Miss Harriet Lowden to represent Illinois at the Texas Cotton Palace."

Dorsey to Send Niece.

Governor Hugh M. Dorsey, of Georgia wrote that he "took great pleasure in replying with this request." He named his niece, Miss Mary Faith Yow, of Lavonia, Ga., who has also accepted to represent that state.

Through the participation of these princesses from practically all the forty-eight states, the queen's ball this year will be even a more brilliant and important social function that it has been in the past.

For ten years now this social affair has drawn fair damsels and their proud parents from all parts of Texas. And this year it will draw them from all parts of the country, as it is quite probable that the distinguished mothers and fathers of the charming princesses will act as their chaperones on their trip to the Lone Star state.

DEMPSEY FIGHT RAIN OR SHINE

BENTON HARBOR, Sept. 3.—A big old fashioned farm house situated on the outskirts of Benton Harbor, and within a block of the arena in which he will face Billy Miske on Labor Day, is the training camp of Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion.

The house is spacious and well equipped for the needs of the champion and his training force. A rubbing room has been furnished adjacent to the champion's bedroom and there is plenty of space for the rest of the training party, which consists of Manager Jack Kearns, Ben Smith, the trainer, "Big Bill" Tate and "Panama" Joe Gans, negro sparring partner a cook and two other men who are solicitous for the heavyweight champion.

Dempsey is a heavy drinker of the fine artesian water that he pumps from the yard. When he gets through with his daily workout and has been cooled thoroughly after a rubdown, he lies down for half an hour to get rid of all heat in his system. Then his handlers bring him a pitcher of water right out of the pump and he drinks it slowly and with evident relish. Dempsey is a firm believer in drinking plenty of water.

In the back yard of the Champion's training camp is a fine plum orchard and Dempsey seems to enjoy picking the fruit off the trees and eating a half dozen or more plums between meals. He likes all kinds of fruit and as the Michigan fruit season is at its height now, Jack is having his appetite gratified.

Miske, the challenger, is splendidly located at a training camp about a mile south of Dempsey's quarters. It is the same camp at which Benny Leonard, the lightweight toiled for his championship contest with Charlie White of Chicago here last July 5th. The Miske camp is situated on the edge of a beautiful wooded ravine. The house is a huge two-story structure formerly used as a club. It is roomy and excellently equipped for training purposes.

The ring in which the challenger faces his sparring partners every afternoon is pitched in the wooded ravine. Miske has arranged to do his boxing an hour earlier than the champion so as to give the crowds an opportunity to see both men in action on the same day. Miske usually starts his daily program at 2:30 p. m.

and Dempsey an hour later. Flocks of motor busses rush the crowds from the Miske camp to the training quarters of the champion.

BENTON HARBOR, Sept. 3.—Rain will not cause postponement of the heavy weight championship contest between Jack Dempsey and Billy Miske, Monday afternoon promoter Fitzsimmons announced today. The ring and a large part of the seats in the open air are to be covered with huge canvases, if the weather is threatening, and the heavy weight rivals will go into the ring on scheduled time no matter if there is a downpour. Promoters said that the advance sale had reached fifty thousand dollars and that the indications were favorable for the total gate receipts to be one hundred and fifty thousand. He announced that more than seven thousand dollars worth of seats were sold yesterday. Only a few scattering wagers made on the outcome of the fight, plenty of Dempsey money but Miske dollars. One bet nineteen thousand to eight thousand was recorded that Dempsey would win.
