ABERNATHY ELEMENTARY AND JR. HIGH BANDS RECEIVE OUTSTANDING RATINGS

Top honors in twirling, solo and ensemble, concert playing and sight-reading were awarded the Elementary and Jr. High Bands this past Saturday May 9 at the Springlake Band Festival. The sixth grade band received a division III in concert playing and a division I in sight-reading. They played a warm-up march "Indian Dance" and two concert numbers "Southern Skies" and "Double Your Pleasure". The Jr. High band "Brought Home The Bacon" with the highest award of "Sweetest". The band won a division I in concert playing, and a division I in sight-reading. They played a march named "Zing-Boom" featuring bass drum and hand cymbals as well as two concert numbers "Little Irish Suite" and "Beau Galant". Concert judges were O. T. Ryan, Band Director from Canyon High School, the sight-reading judge was Phil Anthony, Band Director at Littlefield High School. Mr. Zook is quoted as saying, "This is probably the best Jr. High band at this contest".

In addition to the superior ratings captured by both bands 29 first place medals were won in twirling and playing solos and ensembles. In addition to the medals, band members won 34 second places and seven third place ratings. The sixth grade band, along with the tonette band and high school stage band will present a concert this Thursday, May 14, at 8:00 p. m. in the high school auditorium. Admission is free and the interested public is invited.

MAJOR PROJECTS ARE UNDERWAY AT C-CLUB HERE

Delton Stone, president, his fellow-officers and committees are working on major projects at Abernathy Country Club. The swimming pool is being completely re-built and new equipment for the pool is being installed and a new fence will be built around the pool. The small structure that served as a concession stand and dressing rooms at the pool has been torn down. Replacing this facility will be an attractive 40 x 72-ft. metal clubhouse. The building will house the pro shop, dressing rooms, rest rooms, a kitchen and a 41 x 40-ft. Teen Room.

Country Club officials Monday said the pool and the clubhouse would be ready by June 1. Workmen were scheduled to start erecting steel at the clubhouse site Wednesday. What effect the Lubbock storm Monday night will have on the June 1 timetable was not known at press time.

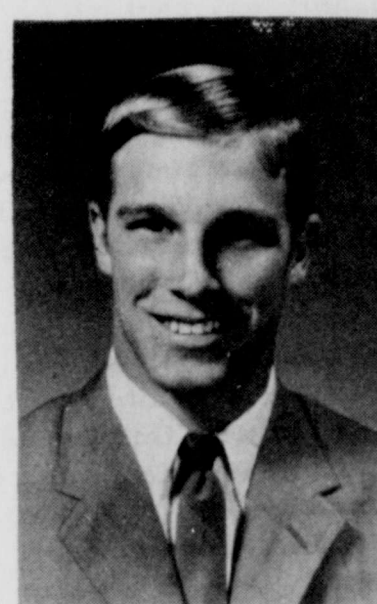

TORNADO

Some Abernathians were involved in one way or the other in the massive tornado storm that hit Lubbock Monday night. J. Pete Thompson of Abernathy sustained facial scratches when glass and splinters hit him when his car was hit by the storm while he was en route home from Lubbock. He was treated and released. Thompson, who handles oil properties, has an office in the Great Plains Life building, one of the tallest in Lubbock. That building was hit and badly damaged in the storm.

Three Abernathy women "rode out" the storm in the Gulf Service Station on the southwest corner of 4th Street and Ave. O. One of the hardest hit areas. Buildings across the street from the station were demolished but the station building sustained comparatively minor damage. The ladies are Mrs. F. B. Lovelace, Mrs. L. L. Kelly and Mrs. Hugh Pettit, who were attempting to return home from a meeting they had attended. Some of the glasses were blown out of the Pettit automobile. They remained in the station until 3 a. m. when they were taken to the home of Mrs. Pettit's aunt. They arrived back in Abernathy at 8 a. m. Tuesday. Pettit and Kelly went to Lubbock Monday night in a futile attempt to locate their wives and Mrs. Lovelace. A message over KFYO Tuesday morning informed their families that they were safe.

An Abernathy family, Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Givens and son, were in Lubbock when the storm hit. They spent the night with Mrs. Givens' parents, who reside in the vicinity of LCC, which escaped the storm. They returned home Tuesday morning.

A number of Abernathians and some of the local emergency equipment went to Lubbock after the storm to assist the storm-stricken city.

These are the Abernathians that we heard about being in Lubbock during and after the storm. More may have been in Lubbock.

A number of other local men who have sons and daughters in the apartments near Tech that were damaged went to Lubbock to check on them. Mr. and Mrs. Bid Torry, former Abernathians, are managers of one of the apartments that were damaged. They were not injured, reports said.

The storm will have a financial impact on a large number of Abernathians who work in Lubbock. The places where some work were completely destroyed or badly damaged by the storm.

A former Abernathy couple residing in the western section of Lubbock, did not watch television or listen to radio Monday night. The first they heard about the massive storm in the city was by a call from the woman's brother in California at 2 a. m. Tuesday.

STORM TOLL: 20 killed, hundreds injured, about \$100 million dollars damage. (These were the reports and estimates at press time Tuesday.)

Funeral rites were conducted Wednesday at 2 p. m. in Northside Baptist Church.

According to Chief of Police Franklin Russell, the Abernathy Police department handled the following cases during the last week:

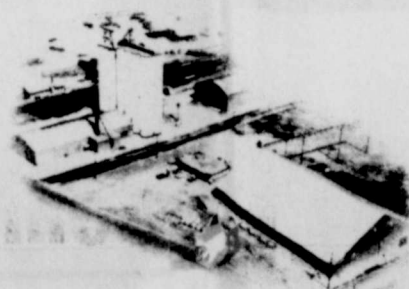

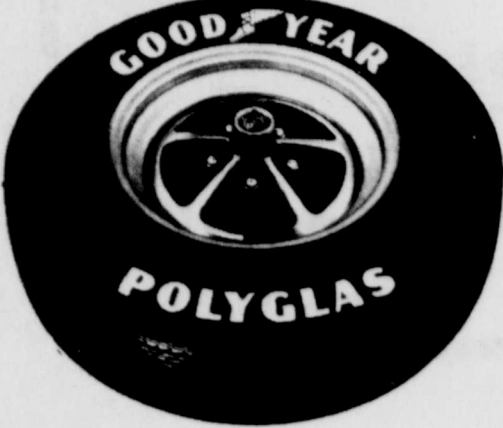
