PRODUCING OIL WELL NEAR SANTA ANNA

The latest report from Santa Anna today says that the Gladys-Belle well is flowing by heads every three hour periods with a daily estimated output of 400 barrels. The well flows five minutes each time, throwing a solid stream of oil a distance of 150 feet. Many people are flocking to the well and excitement is greatly revived.

The Gladys Belle well, known as the "deep test" on the Pope farm, three and a half miles southeast of Santa Anna, struck a good sand at 1575 feet Friday evening, and drilled five feet into the formation with a ten inch hole. The oil rose 75 feet in the well within twenty minutes, and shortly after work was stopped made a head that threw oil higher than the derrick. The intermittent flows continued throughout the night, according to reliable information received from Santa Anna.

The well is the twelfth test on the Pope farm, eleven other wells being on the pump at this time. The excitement occasioned by the unusual showing made by the well is intense in Santa Anna today, and there is a strong demand for acreage in vicinity of the Pope farm. The production of the well is problematical, but is variously estimated from 100 to 1,000 barrels.

DATE FIXED AND COMMITTEE NAMED

A revival under the direction of the Presbyterian and Methodist churches, with probably other churches co-operating, will begin in Ballinger on Sunday, May 23, according to announcement made by Revs. J. B. Curry and R. T. Phillips.

Dr. Phillips and Rev. Curry have been working out plans for the union revival which was agreed upon by the congregations some time ago, and the work of perfecting the plans is now in the hands of committees which were announced by the pastors Saturday morning.

Evangelist F. M. Neal and Mr. Cunningham, singer, will have charge of the revival, supported by the local pastors and committees and all those who will assist in making the revival a success.

It was decided not to go to the expense of building a tabernacle this year, and the revival will be held in the Methodist church. The date of the revival will be a time when the weather will not be at the highest temperature, and with electric fans for emergency, and the large auditorium of the Methodist church made comfortable and additional seats installed to handle large crowds at each service.

Daniels Answers Charges

WASHINGTON, May 10.—Secretary of the Navy Daniels went before the senate investigating committee today and answered all charges made by Admiral Wm. S. Sims and which called for a naval investigation some time ago.

Mr. Daniels' answers include charges that Sims lacked a vision and belittled the work of the United States in contrast with the British and coveted British decorations and aspired to become an honorary member of the British admiralty.

Secretary Daniels declared that the officers of the navy who have been supporting Sims' charges "were largely people with a grievance." Testimony of other officers in possession of first hand knowledge, Mr. Daniels testified, "should be accepted by all open-minded men as absolute refutation of practically all of Admiral Sims' charges."

Secretary Daniels stated that if he had known in October 1918, that Sims had made statements reflecting upon the contributions of the United States army and navy in winning the war, to members of congress who were visiting aboard, he never would have recommended his promotion.

"I thought that he had only defended American sailors, the proper thing for him to do when attacked unjustly by what he called a lawless element of Cork," declared Daniels.

TRINITY RIVER AT DANGEROUS STAGE

DALLAS, May 10.—Trinity river is above flood stage in the low lands, and bottoms are flooded, with the river still rapidly rising this afternoon.

Service on the Ft. Worth and Dallas interurban trolley has been suspended on account of the high water, and rains in the upper reaches are expected to swell the river to the danger point before night.

SECOND RAIN BEST RAIN

Nearly one inch of rain fell at Ballinger Sunday night, the rain falling in such a way which will be of more benefit than the hard rain which fell Thursday afternoon.

Partial reports from over the county also indicate the rain was more general than the rain of a few days ago, extending farther West and covering a larger territory.

Farmers are ready to begin planting with a rush, and there will be no idle hours on the farm until planting season is over. Most land is ready to plant and planters will be running on full time as soon as the ground is dry enough.

Destroyers Rushing to Mexico to Aid in Rescuing Americans Troops Escorting Carranza in Flight Suffer Heavy Loss

HOUSTON, May 10.—Tampico, largest Mexican oil city, has fallen into the hands of General Obregon, according to radio messages received here. The wireless dispatches were filed on the United States gunboat Sacramento by an official of the Mexican Gulf Oil Co., to the Gulf Refining Company at Houston, and said that the city of Tampico capitulated to revolutionists under leadership of Obregon yesterday.

Messages here stated that the revolutionary troops entered the customs house at four-thirty Sunday afternoon, after the Carranza military commander had escaped on the Mexican government's steamer Jalisco, with files and records of the Carranza government.

"The city is entirely quiet this morning and well policed by military and municipal authorities," said the message, "and the Mexican citizens and other nationalities have not been molested, with all operations in the oil fields and at Tampico continuing without trouble."

CALLAN TRIAL IS CALLED AT LLANO

LLANO, Tex., May 10.—The case of James Callan, prominent Menard county ranchman, charged with killing Vernon R. Billings, a DeWitt county stockman, four miles Northeast of Menard on Nov. 12, will be called in the county court here today. It was brought to Llano county on a change of venue.

Callan, who is a former president of the Texas Cattle Raisers' Association, was released on \$20,000 bail at the conclusion of his examining trial at Menard on Nov. 23. He testified that he never had seen Billings before the time of the shooting and that he fired in the belief that his own life was in danger.

Billings was shot on the Callan ranch through which he was driving a herd of horses. Witnesses at the examining trial testified that Callan overtook Billings and upbraided him for leaving open many gates on the ranch.

Billings was shot from his horse, the only bullet fired penetrating his heart. Witnesses at Callan's examination supporting a defense contention of self-defense told of the alleged sudden shifting of reins by Billings and maneuvering of his horse during the quarrel.

CHECK CROOKS WORK AT PAINT ROCK.

Two bad checks were attempted to be passed last Saturday in this section. One came from the Millersville section and one from the Concho section. Both were checks for one dollar and were raised to ten dollars. In three hours after the Millersville check was presented at a local store in Millersville, the man raising the check was apprehended. Also in a short while the would-be forger at Concho was in the custody of officers. Their quick apprehension speaks well for the alertness of our officers and for the detection of the bogus checks when first presented.—Paint Rock Herald.

WASHINGTON, May 10.—With Mexico City, Vera Cruz and Tampico now under control of the revolutionists, American destroyers are en route today to Mexican waters to protect Americans and United States interests.

The dreadnaught Oklahoma has been ordered from New York to Key West, Fla., for possible duty in Mexican waters. The Oklahoma will stop at Philadelphia, where it will pick up a company of marines for duty in case the United States is forced to make a landing.

Estimates of the state department place the number of Americans in Mexico at between six and seven thousand. This number includes all radicals and draft evaders who left this country, but who will appeal to America for protection in case they become imperiled in Mexico.

FIXING LAW FOR BOLL WORM BILL

AUSTIN, May 10.—If the legislature adopts the plan now being put into form of the bill dealing with the farmers included in the "non-cotton zones," it is expected that the legislature will establish at the session beginning March 20th; farmers who will not be allowed to grow cotton, will be reimbursed only for the difference between the price received for the substitute crops and the price they would have received for a cotton crop grown on the same land.

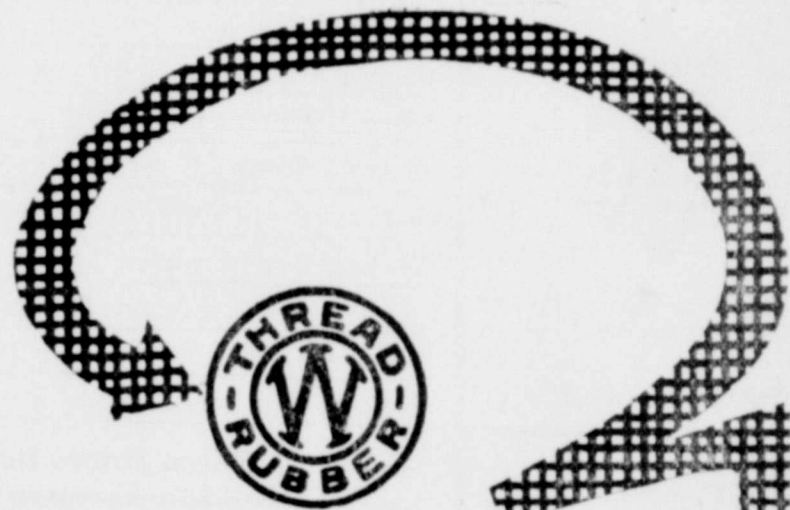

AUSTIN, May 10.—An organization of the Texas Nut Growers' Association will be perfected at the state convention to be held in Brownwood, May 20 and 21, according to Col. J. H. 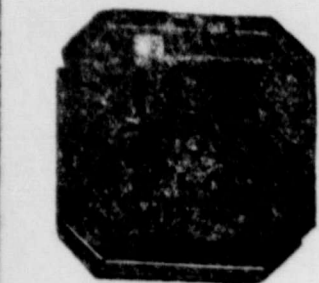

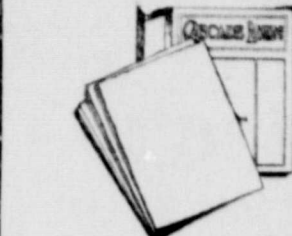

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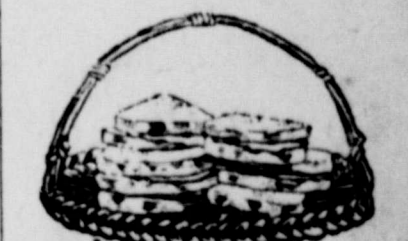
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
