Recipes are shared this week with a relatively new resident of Hart, Diana Long, who moved here last summer to teach in Hart Junior High and High School.

LASAGNE

2 lbs hamburger
1 clove garlic, minced
3 1/2 t salt
2 c canned tomatoes
2 6 oz cans tomato paste
1 10 oz pkg lasagne noodles
3 c cottage cheese
1/2 c Parmesan or Romano cheese
2 eggs, beaten
1/2 t pepper
8 thin slices cheese

Brown meat slowly; spoon off excess fat. Add garlic, 1 1/2 t

noodles in baking dish. Alternate layers of noodles, meat sauce and cheese mixture. Top with sliced cheese. Bake in 375 degree oven 30 mins. Let stand 10 mins. before cutting.

APPLESAUCE CAKE

1/2 c shortening
2 c sugar

Beat two minutes at #7 speed on electric mixer. Add: 1 large egg, beaten, and 1 1/2 c thick applesauce. Beat one minute on #8 speed. Add: 2 t soda in 1/2 c boiling water in separate cup. Sift together: 2 1/2 c flour, 1/2 t salt, 1/2 t cinnamon, 1/2 t cloves, 1/2 t allspice. Add dry ingredients alternately with water, beating on #1 speed. Continue to beat and add 1 c raisins and 1/2 c nuts. Bake in greased, floured tube pan 1 hour in 350 degree oven. (May be baked in two loaf pans)

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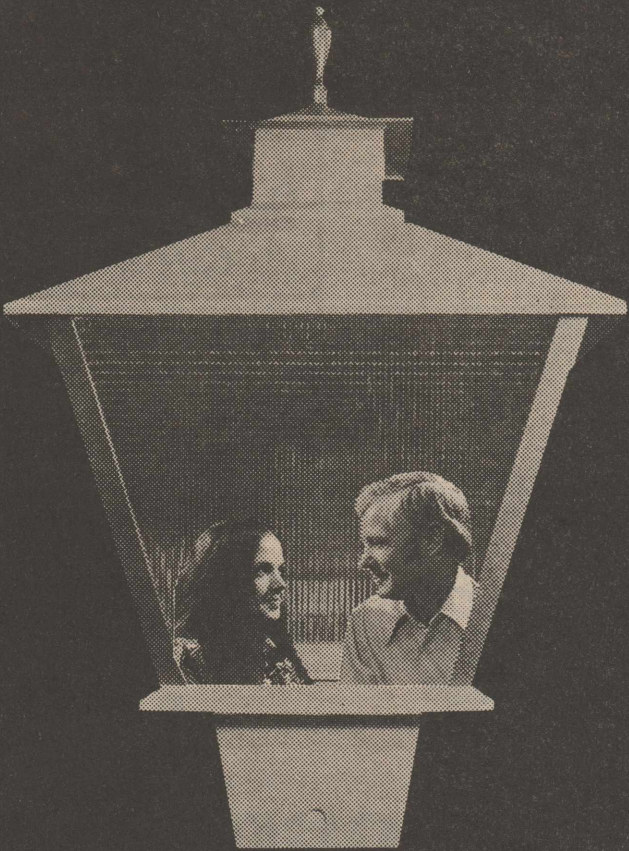
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GA's This Week

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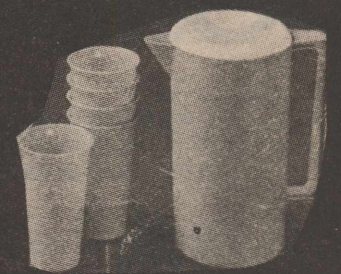

Bill Taylor, 31, has been named as Hart's new Athletic Director and head coach, following the resignation of Lonnie Phillips. Phillips has accepted an offer from Friona High School to serve as Athletic Director and head coach for that AA school.

Taylor, who moved here with Phillips from Fritch, has been serving as varsity line coach for the past four years at Hart as well as head junior varsity coach. He coached JV boys and girls basketball and also junior high basketball girls.

He served as assistant track coach for high school boys and girls.

Prior to moving to Hart, Taylor coached five years at Fritch as assistant coach and head junior high coach. He teaches history and civics.

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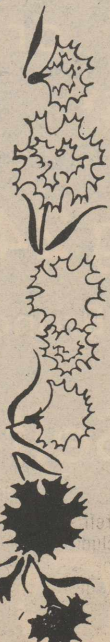

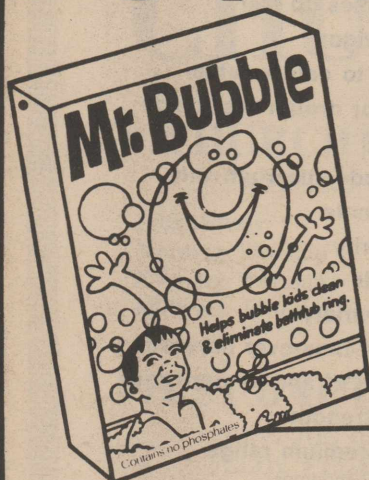
