INJURED WHEN CARS COLLIDE

Turberville of Mangum, Oklahoma and Lester Osborn were very nearly injured last Tuesday night when the Ford car which they were driving met in a head on collision on the big Kelley-Springfield highway. The car driven by R. V. Swaine and belonging to Allen M. Wilbanks, Jr. was driven by the J. J. Swaine. The accident occurred near the J. J. Swaine place about four miles west of Perryton on the D-C-D highway. The young men who were driving with a threshing outfit in the evening and were on their way back to the place where they were working. From what we have been able to learn the boys were driving without lights but this has not caused the accident. It was a moon light night. The car on the truck were of the kero-sene type. It seems as though the car who were injured attempted to turn to the left and give the bet-ter to the heavily loaded truck. It is the custom that many people follow but the driver of the truck failed to the right and was giving the car which resulted in them being head-on. Both young men were in a very serious condition. They were brought to town and taken to the office of Dr. Harp who with Dr. Swaine have done everything pos-sible to alleviate their sufferings. According to the latest reports Mr. Turberville has a slight chance for recovery, his back and hips are badly mangled and he has serious in-ternal injuries. His brother at Man-gum, Okla. has been notified, he has been notified for Perryton. Mr. Osborn lives at Paris, Texas is not in as good a condition as his compan-ion. He is suffering from a badly mangled and crushed arm and a wound on the leg with symp-toms of internal injuries. His re-covery has been notified but no word has been received from them. The Ford car is a total wreck but no damage was done to the truck.

SECOND PRIMARY FOR DISTRICT STATE OFFICERS

The citizens of the two voting precincts in which the town of Perryton is included have decided that they want to hold a second primary to decide the contest between the various state and district officers. There are no funds provided to hold this second run-off primary but if the people of each precinct desire to hold same they may do so if they care to put up the necessary expense. If the voters of any precinct decide in favor of holding the run-off primary they should get in touch with the County Chairman, Van W. Stewart, at once. The date for this primary is Saturday, August 26.

A district race in which much interest is being taken in this county is that of Representative to the Texas Legislature from the 124th District. The run off in this race is between Judge J. L. Jennings of Canadian and Lawrence Ashby of Dalhart. Judge Jennings of Canadian was high man in the first primary and will no doubt carry this county by a big vote in the run-off.

He is a worthy man for this office and if elected he will serve the district with much honor. We have no doubt but what that he will carry this county by a good majority for his interests are our interests.

NEW ICE PLANT NOW IN OPERATION

The new ice plant which has recently been installed by the Shearer Produce Co. is now in operation and is running at it's full capacity. They are making a very high grade of ice which meets with a ready sale. This is the most modern plant in this section of the country and is also of sufficient size to serve our needs. The ice making machinery was furnished by the Baker Ice Co. of Omaha, Nebraska and this firm had an experienced man here to oversee the installation of same. It is a 15 ton plant but at present they are equipped to turn out 6 tons of ice every 24 hours while the remainder of the refrigeration goes into the cold storage rooms. They have three storage rooms, one for ice, one for eggs and the other for dressed poultry. Each of the rooms has a capacity of two car loads. Citizens of Perryton should visit this new industry. It is a model plant.

CHRISTIAN MINISTER ARRIVES

Rev. D. P. Harriman, wife and baby arrived Tuesday from Eugene, Ore. to assume his duties as Minister of the Perryton and Booker Christian Churches. 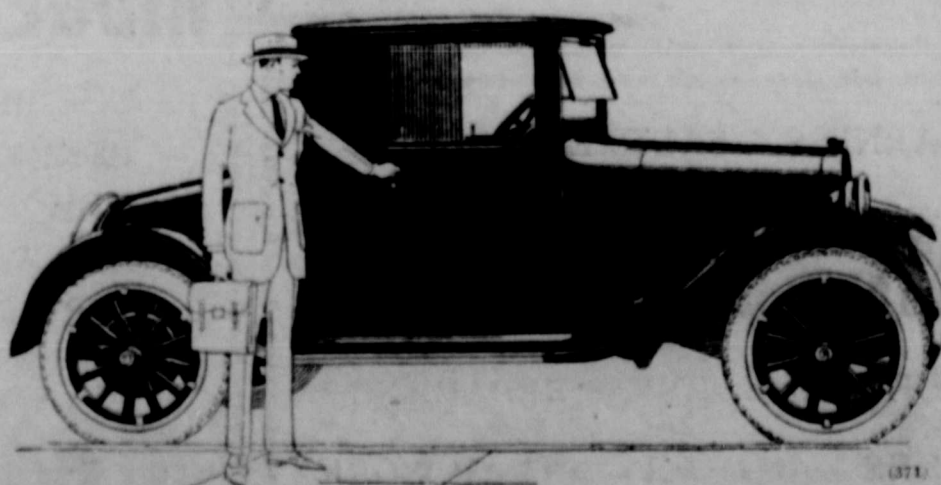

It is hard to believe the recent
statement that Colonel Roosevelt
never used a more vigorous word
than "darn," though the statement
is very probably three-fourths cor-
rect.

The highest point in the United
States, Mount Whitney, is not an
isolated mountain peak like Mount
St. Helens or Mount Rainier, which are
old volcanoes, but is a summit in
the great tilted block of the earth's
crust, forming California's sawtooth
range, the Sierra Nevada. The top of
Mt. Whitney stands 14,501 feet
above sea level.

A Democratic Senator has pro-
posed an investigation of the Sen-
ate by its own committees for the
purpose of unearthing Senators
"financially interested in the pro-
duction, manufacture or sale of any
articles in and of said tariff bills."
The resolution isn't taken seriously
because the spotlight of pitiless pub-
licity is shining on every phase of
tariff proposals. An investigation

paper mill stocks, 8 days; fine pa-
per mill stocks, 36 days; tissue pa-
per mill stocks, 22 days; hanging
paper mill stocks, 26 days; felts
and building paper mill stocks, 9
days; miscellaneous paper mill
stocks, 25 days.

Great Britain offers to wipe the
slate clean of all war debts owed it
by foreign countries, provided the
United States will cancel the \$4,500-
000,000 debt owed to us by Britain.
The position of the British Govern-
ment is that it can afford to be
"father bountiful" to the other Na-
tions providing it does not have to
go back to its own taxpayers to
raise the money with which to pay
what it owes the United States.

This proposal is not entirely un-
expected at Washington, although
Secretary Hughes and his advisors
find the suggestion very unwelcome.
It is said that Lloyd George original-
ly made this proposal to former
President Wilson, and that the sug-
gestion has been constantly kept a-
live in the diplomatic world.

There have been a good many sug-
gestions by leaders in American
thought that harmonize with the
British proposal. One after an-
other of the financial wizards who
have carried personally-conducted
and personally-exploited expedi-
tions into Europe have returned to
counsel the cancellation of all the
war debts. But the American Gov-
ernment has not been sympathetic
with the altruism of those who
would again "save humanity" by for-
giving the European Governments
of their debts.

The Republicans of the Senate

and the fulfillment of it before the
Fall elections will only be possible in
the event that Congress succeeds in
shifting its gears from intermediate
to high speed.

The country has been facing "eco-
nomic upsets for several years. The
rail and coal strikes have present-
ed disputes in the economic game
that called for decisions by the um-
pire. But the rail and coal men
have been too much like the old
"bush-league-teams" that fought for
supremacy on the base ball lots
and defied the umpire when he
gave adverse decisions. President
Harding has asserted that he will
enforce his decisions, and the coun-

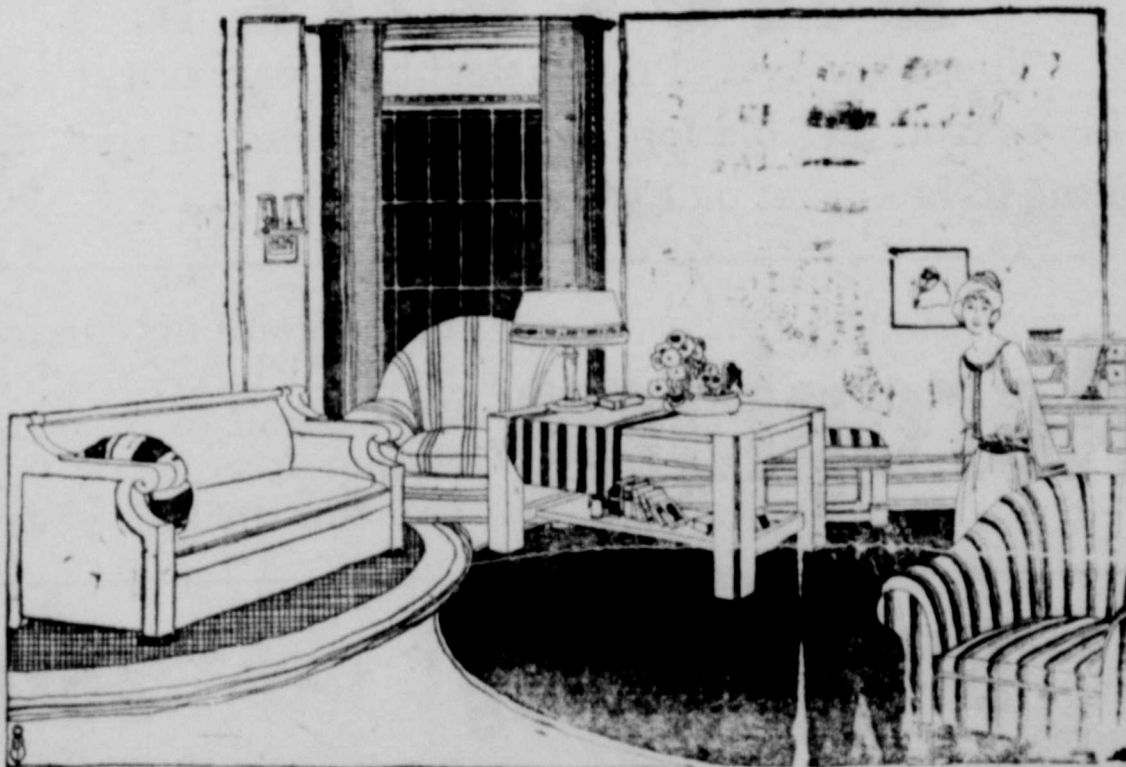

Of these States Oregon, New Mexico, Colorado, Kentucky had such a tax on January 1, 1921. The tax has been adopted during the year and several other States considering such a tax."
