The Salvation Army Service Unit's annual fund raising drive is now in progress.

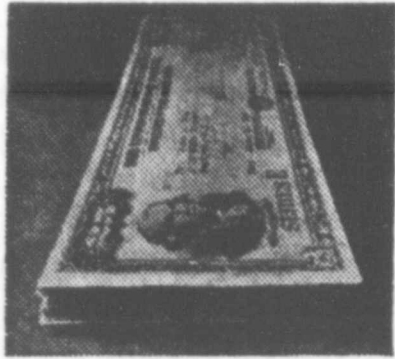
