Accidental shooting kills man

A 21-year-old Colorado City resident was accidentally shot and killed Thursday night at a home on Cypress Street. Officers arrived on the scene to find Kevin Dewayne Green shot in the right temple. According to the police report the accident occurred at approximately 6:05 p.m. Green was transported by ambulance to the Mitchell County Hospital and was then Care-Flighted to Lubbock Methodist Hospital where he was pronounced

dead at 9:35 p.m. Witnesses to the shooting told police that several people were in the living room of the residence talking and drinking. According to the report it was at that time that Green took a pistol, loaded it with one bullet, put it to his head and pulled the trigger. Green stopped after several of

the witnesses asked him to, but then picked up the pistol again, pulling the trigger twice more before the gun went off. Police Chief David Montgomery said Green appeared to be playing a game of Russian Roulette. He stated that the shooting is being investigated as an accidental

shooting and not a suicide. Montgomery added that Green was well liked in the community and gifted as an athlete. "He was a very personable, very intelligent young man," Montgomery said. "The tragedy of Kevin is he never came close to living up to his potential."

ACTION ITEMS:

- Approval to amend an agreement with the City of Colorado City for water and sewer project on the recommendation of the Mitchell County Board of Economic Development and in consideration of the water and sewer rates charged to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice and on trying to hold that rate in line with the state average, the county will release \$200 thousand of the City/County's Interlocal Governmental Agreement of \$800 thousand on the water line to the prison and renegotiate that agreement. In return the county will receive free water and sewer services for county facilities for the next 20 years;

- approved the renewal of a contract with Taylor County for the detention of juvenile offenders at a cost of \$75 per night.

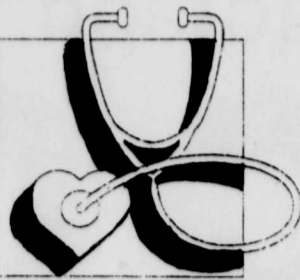

FOR YOUR HEALTH

Substance abuse affects many

It's no secret that substance abuse, whether it be drugs or alcohol, is one of America's most urgent health problems and it affects the lives of everyone, including the citizens of Mitchell County.

There is no perfect profile for a substance abuser or alcoholic. Anybody can develop a dependency be it man or woman, young or old, rich or poor. It crosses all racial boundaries and can affect people in any job or profession.

Dr. James Flack, medical director of the new Chemical Dependency program at The Methodist Hospital of Houston, said individuals can stop the destructive cycle of substance abuse by first admitting that they have a problem.

"The key to successful treatment is for the affected person to admit they have a drug or alcohol problem and then seek treatment," Flack said. "Willpower or self-control is almost never successful when attempted alone."

Methodist's new chemical dependency treatment program expands the hospital's existing program to treat adults for most types of drug and alcohol addictions and includes day hospital stays, outpatient care and appropriate follow-up beyond hospitalization.

Any treatment for substance abuse must include a look beyond the addiction, Flack said.

"It's important to get to the real reason for a person's addiction," he said. "When people suffer a loss or a traumatic event, or if they simply feel they don't measure up some way in life, they often try to self-medicate their problem away."

According to Flack, the addiction is treated first and patients are supported as they adjust to sobriety. Afterwards the patient may enter therapy for the problems or issues that contributed to the addiction process.

"For treatment to be successful on both fronts the patient must accept that there's a problem and be willing to confront it," he said. "The entire process could take a long time but the end result is worth it."

Compost unit sale set

The SoilSave Home Composter has been selected by the Texas Department of Agriculture in conjunction with the Don't Bag It program.

Truckload sales of these home compost units will be conducted in six area towns in an effort to encourage citizens to begin composting. The units will be provided at a reasonable cost of \$40.
