Stardom In Films Has Its Price

NEW YORK (AP)—Hollywood stardom has its price.

The price for Glenn Ford has been broken-bones. Perhaps no other durable star of his stature— he has made more than 100 pictures— has had his ribs snapped more often in the service of the cinema.

"I love Western roles," he said, "but every year I've had a couple of dozen bones broken in them. Somehow I never get hurt in anything except Westerns.

"A horse is the most dangerous animal there is."

Glenn could avoid equestrian perils by hiring a double. It is a point of pride with him that he never has.

"I like to do my own riding," he said. "I used to work as an express boy when I was 16 or 17 for Will Rogers. He sensed that I loved horses, and he taught me to ride by letting me warm up his polo ponies."

"I have no patience with actors who deny the odds to perform dangerous feats. They cheat the audience," Ford said.

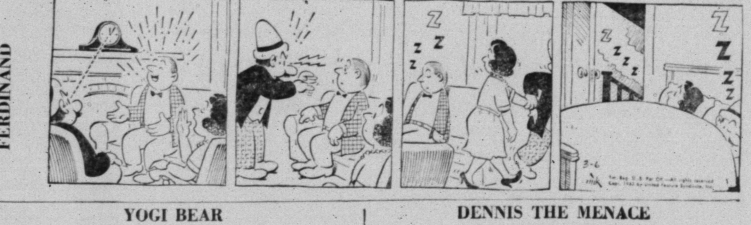
"I think if you can't do what the role calls for, then you ought to turn it down. If you're going to play the part of a man, then be a man."

Ford is an acknowledged master rider. The Rodeo Cowboys Association voted him the best horseman in pictures in 1959 and 1960, and he is prouder of this honor than any other he has ever won.

Glenn, who came to Santa Monica from Canada during his boyhood, started acting in high school. After some stage experience and 2½ years in the U.S. Marines during World War II, he rose rapidly in the film world.

In recent years he has been something of a perennial among the nation's 10 top-ranked stars at the box office. Unlike some stellar performers, Ford sees no danger in appearing in two or even three pictures a year.

"I don't believe you run the risk of overexposure if you have good material," he said. "If a good story comes along, I'm glad to make it."

NEW YORK (AP)—The competition for worst show of the season is flourishing.

Add now "A Wide Evening With Shaw" that blundered forth Tuesday night on the stage of the 41st Street Playhouse.

Richard Gray and Mayo Lel-seau, a youthful pair who have been junketing the hinterlands in tandem theatricals for several seasons, take turns delivering rants about the careers of Oscar Wilde and Bernard Shaw, and reciting excerpts from their works.

What they haven't done is attain any measure of artistry beyond pursing lips, grimacing archly and declaiming, artificially. Gedric Hardwicke's name appears on the program as co-director. Poor man.

The week is turning out to be a sorry one for literary immortals. The Monday production of Gertrude Stein's "Yes Is For a Very Young Man" succumbed after one performance. "A Wide Evening With Shaw" squashes its 19th century giants almost beyond recognition.

ANSWER: Van Gogh was a Dutch artist, born in 1853, who fell under the influence of a group of French painters using light, airy, outdoor colors. He began painting with even more fiery and brilliant colors as well as with swirling, agitated brush strokes. But the picture buyers of the time found these paintings too strange to suit their taste. He tried hard to sell his pictures, failed completely, and went on painting for the love of it. When he settled in the southern French town of Arles, his paintings became so brilliant they almost burst into flame. Many people feel that since Van Gogh had to be taken to a hospital several times his pictures should be regarded as the work of a lunatic. Most feel that his illnesses had little to do with the beauty of his work. They regard the rhythmic forms and sparkling colors in his pictures as adding an extra sense of the fun and excitement of being alive; and it is this point of view which has made Van Gogh's painting so much appreciated today.

# Snyder Man Slated To Head West Texas Teachers Assn.

A Snyder school man, who for the past nine years has been coordinator of Industrial Cooperative Training in Snyder Public Schools, is expected to be elected president of the big West Texas Teachers Association when it convenes in Odessa Thursday and Friday.

J. C. Jackson, who is presently vice president of the association, will likely be elected during the House of Delegates meeting in Odessa High School cafeteria Thursday night, and his election will be announced to the 3,900 members of the organization during a general session meeting in the Odessa High School gymnasium at 10 a. m. Friday morning.

Setron Williams, Big Spring school administrator and president of the association, said no other person has been nominated for the office, and that the association has, by long standing custom, always elected, vice presidents to the presidency Jackson will be the first president from Snyder since the organization was formed in 1926.

Few teachers in the 15-county district which comprises the association can claim active participation in as many civic, religious, and professional organizations.

In Snyder, Jackson is a member of a Masonic lodge, a Boy Scout cub master, Sunday School class teacher, chairman of the adult council and member of the official board of the First Methodist Church, and is a former vice-president of the Evening Lions Club and former district commissioner for Boy Scouts.

Officers he has held in professional organizations include being treasurer and vice-president of the Snyder Classroom Teachers Association, president of the Sigma chapter of Iota Lambda Sigma, chairman of the credit committee of the Scurry County Federated Credit Union, and vice president of the Scurry County unit of Texas State Teachers Association.

He holds membership in the National Education Association, American Vocational Association, Texas State Teachers Association, Texas Industrial Vocational Association, Industrial Arts Association, as well as all local teachers associations.

Born in Bechtolt, Okla., in 1924, Jackson attended public schools in LeFors, Tex., later attending the John Dewey Vocational School in Long Beach, Calif. During World War II he served with the U. S. Army 57th Division and with the 322nd Central Postal Directory in Europe and the Pacific. After honorable discharge from military service he attended West Texas State College and received a bachelor of science degree in 1952. He taught woodshop at West Texas State College for one year before coming to Snyder Public Schools.

Jackson and his wife, Mary, have two children, Mary Kathleen, 16 years old, and Ronnie Lee, 11, both of whom attend Snyder Public Schools. During summers Jackson does post-graduate work at A & M College.

While Jackson has worked closely with association president Williams in planning the convention, a particular phase of his work in the convention has been planning the big commercial exhibits, which will be set up in the Odessa High School. Here teachers will see teaching materials and aids distributed by approximately 20 firms.

Counties from which teachers will come to the convention are Scurry, Garza, Dawson, Borden, Andrews, Martin, Howard, Mitchell, Winkler, Ector, Midland, Glasscock, Crane, Upton and Reagan. In all these counties, students in public schools will have a holiday Friday.

## Traffic In Mexican Cotton Shows Decline

MEXICO CITY (AP)—Officials report trans-shipment of Mexican cotton through United States ports decreased drastically last year. Brownsville, Tex., continues to be the U. S. port handling the largest amount of Mexican cotton.

Most of the decrease was due to improved facilities at the Pacific ports of Guaymas and Ensenada, which now handle much of the cotton that previously went through San Diego and Los Angeles.

The Pacific-bound shipments account for the largest part of Mexico's cotton exports because Japan is its leading cotton customer.

# Slaying Suspect Nabbed In Laredo

LAREDO (AP)—Capture of a 19-year-old cafe cook late Tuesday night ended a statewide search for a suspect in the slaying of a young Dallas mother.

City Detective Randall Smith said the prisoner, Carl Hackathorn, signed a statement early today admitting he fired the fatal shot. He was charged with murder.

Hackathorn claimed "I didn't know what I was doing," the detective said, when Mrs. Bobbie Jewel Smith, 20, was shot and dumped from her car in Dallas early Tuesday. She was the wife of a Dallas trucker.

A workman discovered the blood-spattered body in an alley behind a new house project in a quiet Northeast Dallas neighborhood several hours after the slaying. Police said Mrs. Smith was shot three times about the left ear.

Efforts to identify the dead woman were unavailing until Tuesday night when Mrs. Smith's stepfather, James Clayton, told police who she was. Her husband, James F. Smith, was reported on a trucking run to Lubbock.

Concern arose by Mrs. Smith's 26-month-old daughter Teresa Ann after identification of the mother. Police learned a passerby found the lot weeping and hungry in a parked truck where she apparently had spent the night.

Three Dallas officers were en route here to take custody of the prisoner.

Detective Capt. Will Fritz filed the murder charge in Dallas after Hackathorn wrecked Mrs. Smith's car and was captured in Laredo.

Fritz said officers had determined that a jacket partly covering the body of Mrs. Smith belonged to Hackathorn. At his home, Hackathorn's wife told Dallas police her husband had picked up some clothing and left, telling her only:

"When they catch me they'll electrocute me."

Rooster-patrolmen spotted Mrs. Smith's car on a highway outside Laredo, where Hackathorn raced away from a roadblock established in a routine check of immigration papers.

A high speed chase ended in Laredo, where Hackathorn tried to drive over a railroad track wrecked the car and fled on foot. He was picked up a block distant with blood streaming from a nose-cut, suffered as he was hurled against the wrecked car's steering wheel.

Police said he told of crossing the border and spending about two hours in Mexico before starting back here.

## Federal Aid Gets Voters' Approval

MARSHALL (AP)—Marshall residents approved by a 1,945 to 896 vote Tuesday a city commission request for \$263,000 federal aid for street improvements.

The referendum was asked by petitioners after some criticism was made of the commission's applying for federal funds under the Public Works Acceleration Act.

The federal funds will be matched with municipal bonds approved 4 years ago.

## Mistrial In Murder Case

FORT STOCKTON (AP)—A mistrial was declared Tuesday in the murder trial of Bill McKnight. Efforts to obtain a jury failed.

Dist. Judge C. E. Patterson said he would meet with lawyers today to determine if the case would be reset here or transferred to another county.

McKnight, 21, once a University of Texas honor student, is

accused of killing Kelly Parker, 21, of Harpe at Bandera, last May, in a rivalry over the affections of a 19-year-old girl, McNaught, formerly of Kerrville, now lives in San Antonio.

The case was transferred here from Bandera. Judge Patterson declared the mistrial after more than 40 prospects had been questioned in two days without a jury being accepted.
