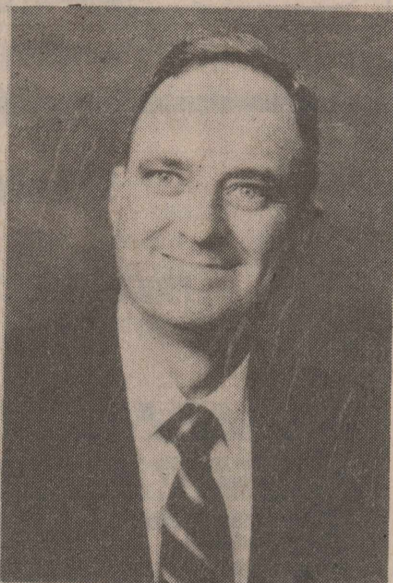
SCOT Tacky Party

Allison Cited For Distinguished Service

Jim Allison, a twenty year veteran with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and current Sherman County Extension Agent, has been named to receive the Distinguished Service Award, the highest recognition given by the National Association of County Agricultural Agents.

The award is presented annually to county agents nationwide who have made outstanding contributions to agriculture and related program

areas, according to Glenn Huddleston, County Extension agent and President of the Texas County Agricultural Agents Association.

Allison is one of seven county agents with the Texas Agriculture Extension Service, Texas A & M University System, to receive the award which will be presented at the NACAA meeting August 25-29, 1991 at Peoria, Illinois. He will also be given special recognition during the Texas County Agricultural Agents Association annual meeting August 4-7, 1991 at Waco, Texas.

Jim Allison provides educational leadership in Sherman County in the Panhandle of Texas in wheat, corn, grain sorghum and stocker cattle production. Organization of the Sherman County Agriculture Marketing club has helped producers become more aware of the importance of a sound marketing program in their farm and ranch enterprises. The Sherman County 4-H Cattle Company was the first stocker cattle cooperative organized for 4-H'ers in Texas.

Allison is a graduate of Texas Tech University with a B.S. degree in Animal Science and a M.S. in Swine Nutrition.

Tips & Topics

The Breast Cancer Screening Program of the Don & Sybil Harrington Cancer Center and High Plains Baptist Hospital of Amarillo will continue community outreach clinics for early detection of breast cancer.

Funding is available through the Texas Cancer Council for screening mammography for Texas residents qualifying for financial assistance.

Early detection of breast cancer is the major goal of cancer control for each woman seen in the clinic. The clinic provides low cost screening which includes a breast exam by a Registered Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self

examination and a mammogram.

Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer. The guidelines are:

1. Learn & perform breast self examination every month.
2. Have a physical examination every year.
3. Have a mammogram according to the recommendations by age.
 - Age-35 to 40 One baseline mammogram
 - 40 to 50 a mammogram every

to 2 years.

Over 50 yearly Mammograms.
