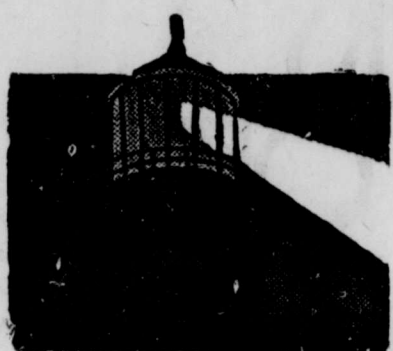

The contractor on the water improvement program for Lorraine has finished his job except for some cleanup work. The water has been turned into the mains and in some places the pressure has been improved but it others it has not. So the city will have to do some changing of service lines in those places. Those where the water pressure is not as great as they want should have patience. The work of providing more water for them will be done as rapidly as possible.

The contractor on the storage tank is having the concrete poured this week and his job will be finished within a short time. That will give the city 100,000 gallons more water in storage which should be enough for most any emergency.

Besides putting more water into the mains the insurance rate should be lowered quite a bit. That will be a help to all who pay insurance premiums on their property in the city limits.

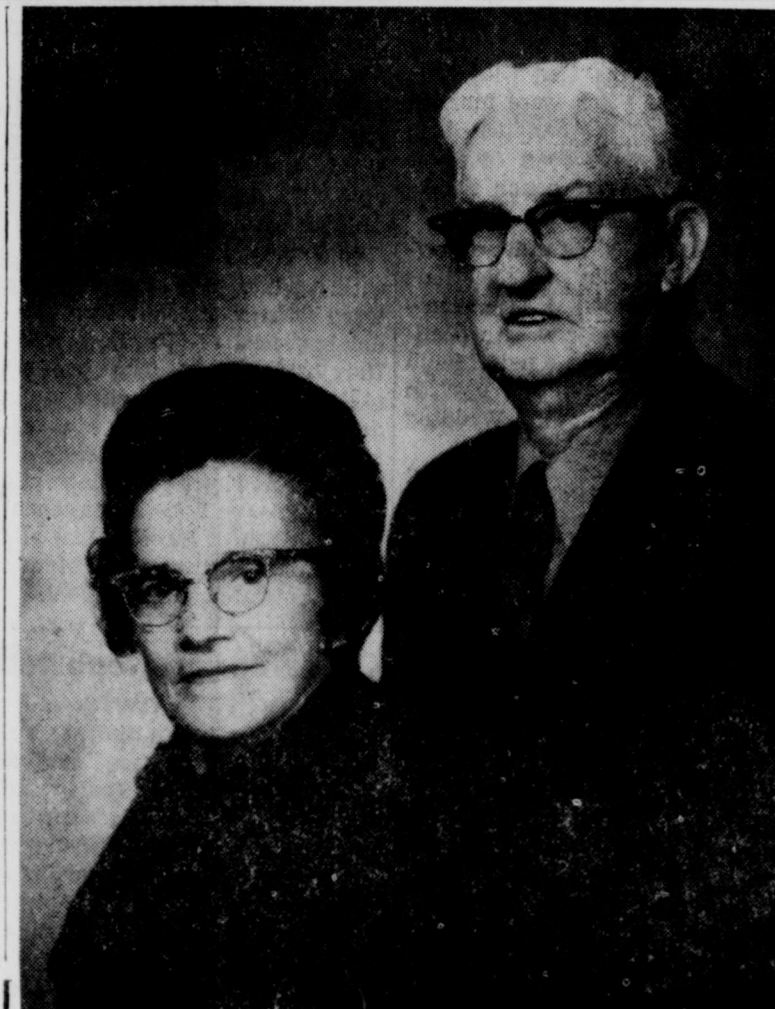
Born in Little Rock, Ark., he was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. N. J. Brians of Lorraine. He was a graduate of Lorraine High School.

LORRAINE SCHOOL ANNOUNCES NEW LUNCHROOM POLICY

Lorraine Public School has long recognized the need for helping meet the nutritional needs of its students. The school serves a well-balanced nutritious lunch each school day for a very nominal price. However, since some families find it difficult to pay this full price, the school will provide these lunches free of charge or a reduced price to those children, deter-

mined by the Principal, to be unable to pay the full price for their lunches.

Families who feel that their children may be eligible for free or reduced price lunches are urged to apply. Applications may be obtained at school. The completed application, signed by an adult member of the family should be sent to Lorraine school. Such application will be reviewed promptly and within three days the family will be notified in writing as to the decision made. All information provided on the application will be held in the strictest confidence. Decisions for approval will be based on family income.
