

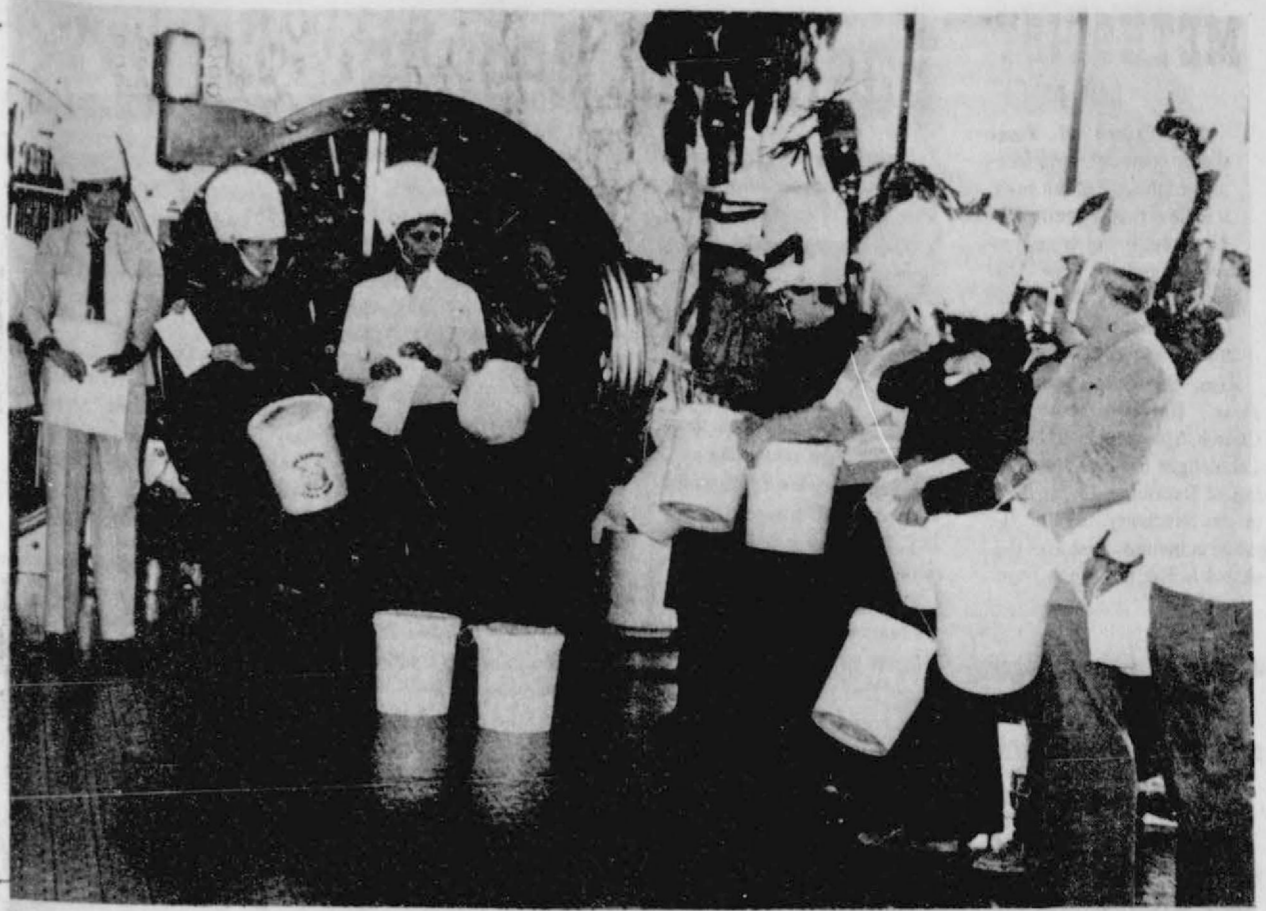

Spearman council hires new city secretary

Spearman City Council formally appointed a new city secretary, re-appointed a H&S EMS Medical Service director, and selected a new member for the city development board during a regular meeting of the councilmen Tuesday night.

Charlotte Sheets was approved as the new city secretary, assuming the duties being performed temporarily by City Manager Jim Murray since the resignation of former City Secretary Donna Thomas. Mrs. Sheets is a longtime Spearman resident and was graduated from Spearman High School.

She attended West Texas State University in Canyon for a year-and-a-half majoring in secretarial skills and special education. She worked as a secretary in Amarillo before returning to Spearman to work as a secretary in the ASCS office before taking the job as city secretary.

Her husband is a mechanic at Hergert Motors. Although she was officially appointed as city secretary Tuesday night, Mrs. Sheets has been working on the job for the past couple of weeks, "learning the ropes." This is her first employment with the City of Spearman.

Commenting on her new job, Mrs. Sheets said, "I like it—it's certainly different—one thing I enjoy, I get to meet a lot of different people."

Ed Williamson was re-appointed as H&S EMS Medical Service for 1984-85, and the aldermen appointed Martha Boyd to a three-year term on the Board of City Development, an appointment that also automatically makes her a Spearman Chamber of Commerce director.

The councilmen discussed the city's application for a Texas Parks and Wildlife Department grant to fund remodeling and enlargement of local softball facilities.

Texas Parks and Wildlife has scheduled an on-site inspection for the proposed softball complex in late December or early January required before a decision is made on whether or not to grant Spearman's application for \$75,533 in funds.

The city has applied for the grant to improve the existing softball park and expand the current Little League Park adjacent to the softball

park into a second softball park. Spearman's Jaycees have agreed to deed the property over to the city so it can be used as an in-kind match for the requested grant. The Jaycees also plan to rebuild the Little League park on the YMCA grounds, providing the grant for the softball facilities is granted.

After inspecting the local site, Parks and Wildlife officials will report to their state board in late February or early March, according to Murray. Sometime after that, the board will decide which of 76 applicants competing for the grant program money will be awarded the

grants, according to Murray.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department officially has \$14.5 million budgeted for the program, but only \$4 million of this is actually available, and there is statewide competition for the grants, Murray said.

The councilmen also decided by consensus to hold the next City Council meeting on Jan. 17, 1984 beginning at 7:30 p.m., approved payment of monthly bills and accepted the monthly fire, ambulance, police, municipal court and animal control reports.

But until He comes again and establishes peace, another kind of peace is available to those who put their trust in Him: peace of mind and heart.

With the onslaught of nativity scenes in stores and homes around the Christmas season, it is hard to imagine Mary and Joseph as real, living people with feelings and emotions similar to those we have. It seems to go unnoticed that these were two young people in love and engaged to be married. Joseph, thinking he was betrayed by Mary, had to make what was probably the biggest decision of his life: should he leave her to be scorned by those around

her or trust the angel Gabriel's words? His faith and his heart won out and he became a guardian of God's only Son.

Following the opening theme, this work presents a simple love song from Joseph to Mary, telling of his thoughts and emotions surrounding his encounter with the angel and his decision to take Mary as his wife "Joseph's Song" is followed by a duet between Mary and Joseph as a commitment to each other. **Prince of Peace** also includes a tender (and surprising) setting of Isaiah 9:6; a beautifully orchestrated lullaby; a "Glory to God" chorus that is sure to get every foot tapping; a wise men theme direct from Italy, and a song of rejoicing depicting the joy and excitement the wise men felt as they left the manger to tell the world the Messiah had come.

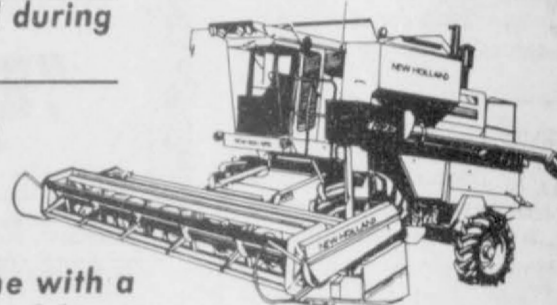

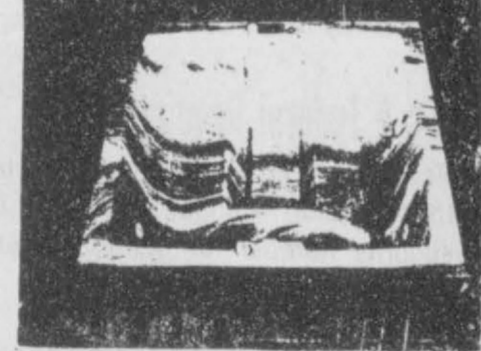

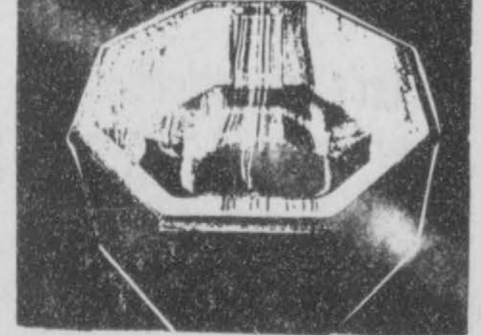

Activities Brisk At Police Department

On December 7, 1983 at approximately 11:00 p.m. the Spearman Police Department contacted the owner of an abandoned vehicle. Owner advised the Police Department that the vehicle was sold to a person in Lubbock, Texas approximately 2 1/2 years ago and could not recall the person's name. Since the subject who bought the vehicle could not be located, the vehicle was towed away.

Upon arrival, the officer observed a set of tire tracks leading from the gas meter and running towards the residence at 108 Wanda Drive. These tracks appeared to be made by a dual tire vehicle. The officer knew by personal knowledge that a tractor trailer vehicle has been parked in this yard on several occasions. Nothing further at this time.

On December 14, 1983, at approximately 9:10 a.m., a Spearman Police Officer was advised of a hit and run accident at Earl's T.V. The officer arrived and observed a blue 1981 Chevrolet Chevette 4 door parked in the parking lot of Earl's T.V. Also the officer observed scratches in the paint but could not find any paint from the other vehicle. The officer then proceeded to speak with the complainant, who advised that she believed the damage was done Tuesday, December 13, 1983. She stated that about 1:00 p.m. she observed an elderly man drive what she believed to be a light tan pickup into the parking space to the right of the vehicle. She then observed the man examining the vehicles and drive away slowly,

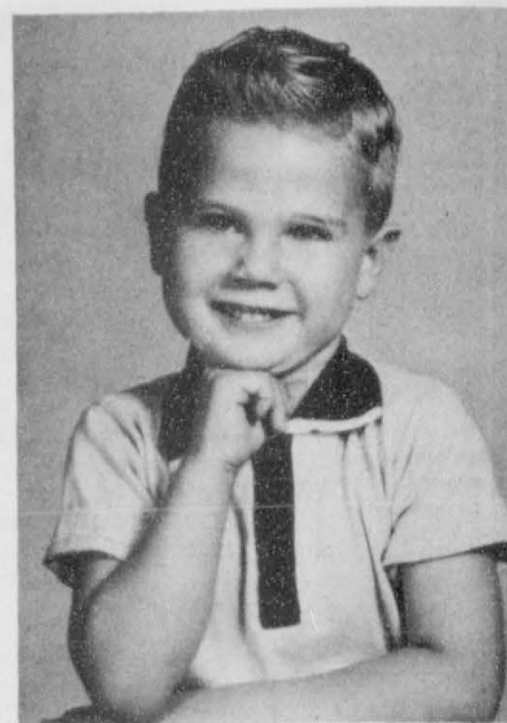
looking back at her vehicle.

At this time he was released to go to his parents home. The complainant then signed a complaint against him for assault and was advised to appear before the judge Monday, December 19, 1983 at 10:00 a.m.

On December 14, 1983, a Spearman Police Officer was dispatched to a Spearman Business in reference to an attempted burglary. The officer arrived and spoke with the complainant. The complainant pointed out the damage done to the South door of the business where someone had attempted to pry the lock, as well as a bar to protect the lock bolt with what appeared to be a screw driver, however, entry was not gained into the business.

Spearman teams swept four games in Sunray Tuesday night.

Donahue with 15 and Mark Pearson with 11 hit in double figures for the Lynx. Billy Ray Haden added 9, Buddy Pool 6, and Thad Reid, Byron Sutterfield, and Jeff Graves 2 each.

Sunray was led by 10 points from Charles Morales and 8 by Cary Cooper.

The game marked the brief return of Byron Sutterfield. Sutterfield was a starting Lynx guard when the season opened, but missed several games as the result of a shoulder separation suffered in a motorcycle accident. He only played a few minutes and appeared to be "rusty" from the injury-forced layoff.

The Lynxette, Bobkitten game was a real battle all the way. The teams dueled to a 10-10 draw in the first quarter, but the Sunray girls gradually pulled away for a 28-20

halftime lead.

The Lynxettes only managed to shave two points off the Sunray lead by the end of the third quarter, and the Bobkittens started the final period of play with a 42-36 advantage.

In rolling to their lopsided win, the Lynx JV outscored the Bobcat JV's by quarters 9-6, 6-4, 12-4 and 15-11. At halftime they led 15-10, and it was 27-14 at the end of three quarters.

By contrast, the junior varsity girls game was much closer. The Lynxette JV worked up an 8-2 first quarter lead and took a 14-8 lead off court at halftime. But the Bobkitten JV outscored the Lynxette JV's 14-8 in the third quarter to rally within one point of Spearman, 21-20.

The Lynxette JV's countered with a fourth quarter rally of their own to gain the 3 point, 33-30 victory. Carlee Dixon with 8 points led the Spearman JV girls, with Karrie Holt adding 6, Kayla Eaton and Teresa Tindell 5, Donda Pool and Dana Irlbeck 3 each, Coria Vela 2, and Jennifer Yarbrough 1.

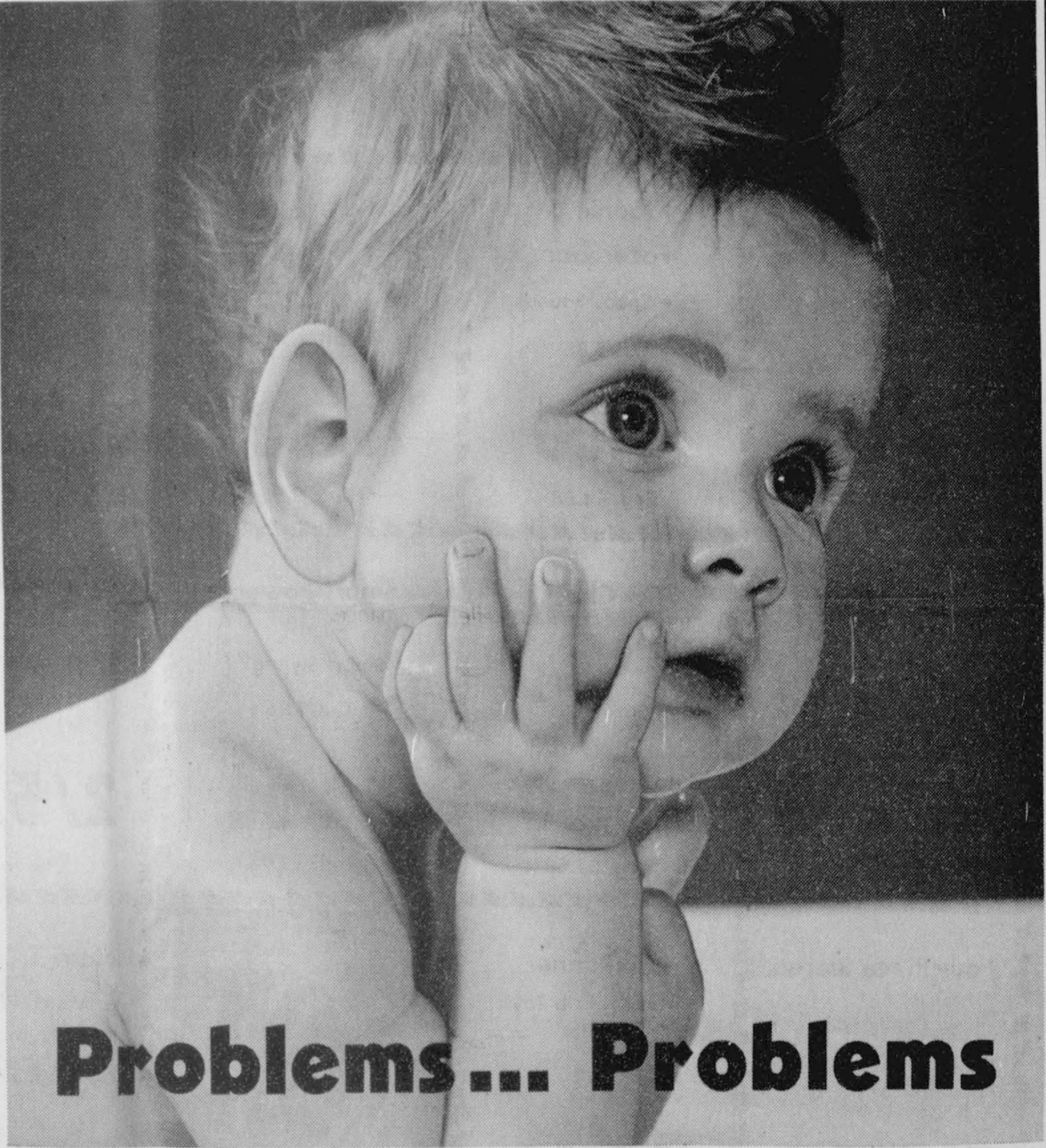
