The Cochran County appreciation will be Saturday, Feb. 2, in Morton at the high school cafeteria.

Both Deaf Smith and Oldham county committees are working the Monday, Feb. 11 event in Hereford at the Community Center.

Parmer and Bailey county committees will hold their affair in Friona Monday, Feb. 18, in the high school cafeteria.

The final event will be for Lamb County Saturday, Feb. 23 in Olton at

the high school cafeteria.

"Bill Clayton has touched every citizen in every one of these seven counties at one time or another. He has always been a staunch defender of our rights and the number of people he has helped directly can't be accurately measured.

"He will be serving the district only one more two year term and there has been an overwhelming desire from throughout the district to show their appreciation for the 20 years of his life he has given to us all," Armistead added.

New Testament History Course Begins Thursday In Olton

A continuing education course in New Testament History offering three hours college credit is being offered to residents of Olton and the surrounding area beginning Thursday, Jan. 10, by Wayland Baptist College.

The course, open to adults, regular college students and high school students who have completed their junior year, will be taught each Thursday evening from 6:30-10 p.m. in the Education Building of Olton's First Baptist Church. Dr. Dan Kent, associate professor of religion at Wayland, will serve as instructor.

A study and application of the New Testament stressing the Gospels, the Acts, and the letters of Paul, the course

is threefold in purpose, according to Kent. "It will provide an opportunity for persons of the Olton area to take a regular course for credit close to home, as well as offer in-depth Bible study opportunities for pastors, church workers, laymen and young people. In addition, it offers a method for starting, continuing or resuming study on an advanced degree."

Cost for the class is \$135, plus a \$15 application fee for admission to Wayland (for first-time students only). The textbook, available for \$8.95, and any version of the New Testament will be additional.

Registration for the course will be conducted by Kent on the first night of

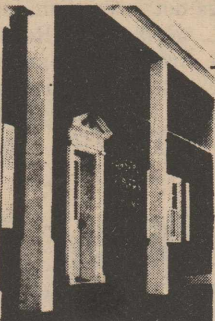

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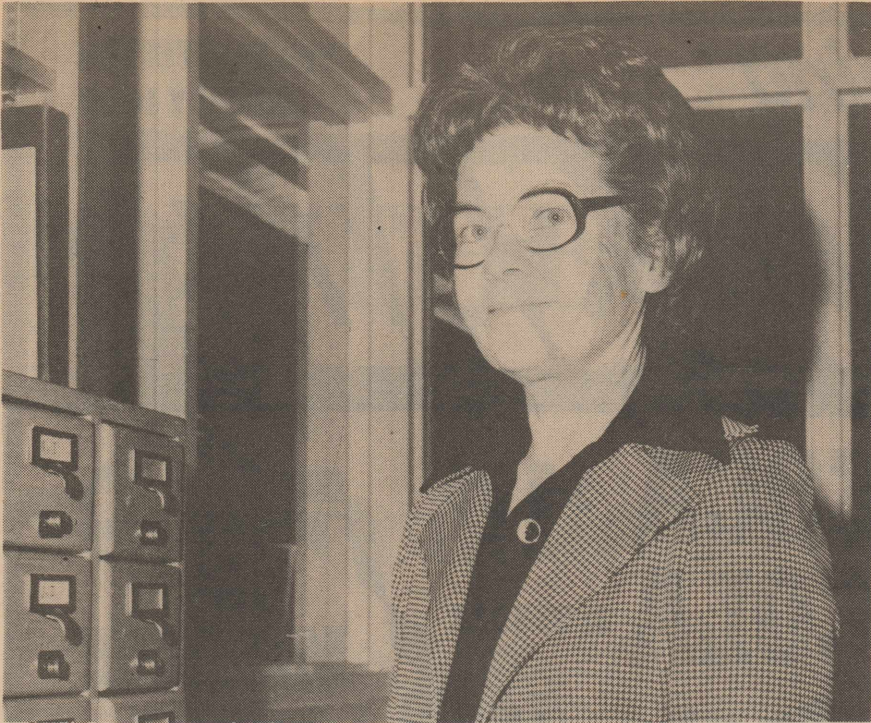
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MRS. LULA MAE HANES

SLAW (will keep several weeks)

3 lb. cabbage
1 green pepper
1 med onion
Bring to boil:
2 c sugar
1 c oil
1 c vinegar
2 T celery seed
2 T salt

Cool and pour over shredded cabbage and chopped onion and pepper. Put in container with lid, keep covered with liquid.

LEMON PIE

1 can Eagle Brand Milk

1 6 oz can frozen lemonade
1 9 oz carton Cool Whip
Mix Eagle Brand milk and lemonade. Add Cool Whip, mix and put into 2 baked pie crusts.
Chill and serve.

GRIDIRON CASSEROLE

1/2 lb spaghetti
1/4 c oil
2 lbs ground round
2 med onions
1 1/2 green peppers
1 T chili powder
2 t salt
2 T Worcestershire sauce
1 can tomato soup
1 can corn
1 1/4 lb sharp cheese (grated)
1 clove garlic (cut fine)
Cook spaghetti, add 1 t salt and 1 T oil; drain and rinse. Brown meat in skillet - brown onions, pepper and garlic in oil and add chili powder, salt and Worcestershire sauce. Add other ingredients and heat, pour mixture in casserole and sprinkle with grated cheese. Bake at 400° 20 mins.

Note; Better if made day before serving. Add extra can of tomato soup and more cheese before reheating.

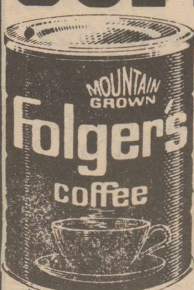
