On Tuesday, November 27th, the Executive Board of the San Antonio District W. M. U. of Texas met in the parlors of the First Baptist Church in all day session. The morning hour, following the devotional which was led by Mrs. D. S. Miller, who read as the basis of her talk on thanksgiving, the 100th Psalm, was spent in conference of the various departments of work, after which the meeting came together and heard reports from the conference leaders. At the noon hour, lunch was served by members of the T. E. L. class of the First Baptist Church.

Roll call at the afternoon session showed four out of the seven associations represented. After such business matters as were to be taken up had been disposed of, a report of the convention was given by Mrs. O. L. Smith, of Gonzales.

While the attendance at this meeting was not as good as we had hoped, we feel that such meetings, where district and associational chairman may meet and discuss their plans, will be of distinct benefit to the work. It was voted that this would be the plan of the two yearly Board meetings following the State and Southern Baptist Convention and that more publicity would be given in future.

Mrs. E. M. Townsend, Chairman of Journalism in the State Federated Clubs, is trying to secure information as to the number of scholarships given by the women of Texas to

students in denominational and state colleges. There are many scholarships given by individuals who are solicited by some of our women, and Mrs. Townsend is anxious to know what is being done by the Baptist women in their local, associational and district organizations.

Any reader of this request will greatly oblige this editor if they will send in the name of any girl or boy receiving such scholarship, and of the donor of same. And if any local society, or association, should be giving a scholarship to schools as stated above, that information would also be appreciated. Please get this information in at the earliest possible date.

The Treasurer's report from June 16th to Nov. 26th shows that \$200.00 has been sent in on the two District Scholarship during that time. The new plan for the scholarships was explained at the Board Meeting, and will be found in the minutes of the convention. One of the Scholarships of this district is a service scholarship, given to Miss Alma West, who was also the recipient of our loan scholarship last year. Other items noticed on the Treasurer's report showed that \$46.00 of the \$56.00 for the Ruby honor gift to Missions in the name of our State President had been sent in to date; one amount of \$33.00 on the Executive Board pledge for Baylor Memorial Entrance; \$85.68 on Expense Fund, and other small items. This was a very good report and the writer appreciates the very prompt and generous response that has been made to all special requests.

All Associational Presidents and their Corresponding Secretary's, and all District Chairman of Committees, will receive this paper in the future, and they are asked to consider requests which apply to them as being
