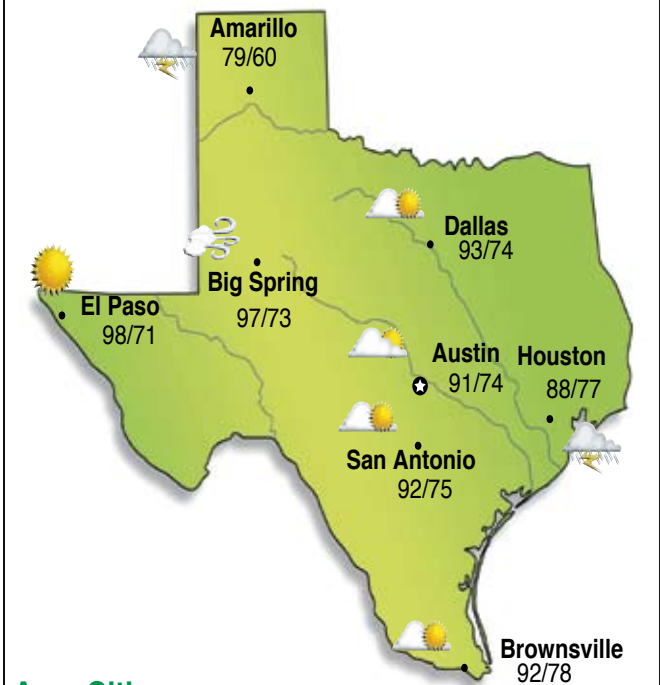

Also, the Big Spring campus has a daycare

facility on the site.

Once the regulations are created, Sparks said, they must be brought to board of trustees for approval. Trustees have at least 90 days to review

the regulations and make any changes or amendments. After implementation of the law, colleges and universities will have to submit biennial reports to the

legislature explaining the necessity for the regulations, Sparks said.

Once passed, the law will not go into effect for community colleges until August 2017. Four-year universities must be in compliance with the law by August 2016.

"That will give us some time to begin to work through this bill," Sparks said. "I know community colleges will work together. Obviously,

it will have to be tailored to every community college in the state and in our situation we have different sites and different situations that we will have to take into account. As it states, we will work with our faculty staff and students to come up with appro-

priate rules within the letter of the law."

In order to be licensed to carry a concealed handgun in Texas, the person must be 21 years of age or older, undergo a background check, take a written test and a range test.

Pew study: White-Native American adults largest multiracial group

WASHINGTON (AP) — Non-Hispanic whites with American Indian ancestry make up a full half of the current population of mixed-race Americans but are among the least likely to say that they are multiracial, according to a study released Thursday.

This population is also the more likely to be Republican-leaning and conservative than the rest of the multiracial population, finds the study by the Pew Research Center. But they may someday be eclipsed by other multiracial Americans, with the majority of mixed-race babies born in 2013 being either biracial white and black or biracial white and Asian.

The Census Bureau estimates the number of multiracial Americans at 2.1 percent of the adult population. During its survey, Pew asked people about their race, the race of their parents and the race of their grandparents. With those numbers, however, the "Multiracial in America" report finds that 6.9 percent of the population in the United States is of mixed race.

That's a big jump from the past and points to a population that is expected to grow, said Kim Parker, Pew's director of social trends research. In 1970, among babies living with two parents, only 1 percent had parents who were different races from each other. By 2013, that share had risen to 10 percent.

"From 2000-2010 that multiracial population grew three times as fast as the overall population," Parker said. "And when we look at the number of babies being born that are mixed race and the rise in interracial marriage, we can see that not only is it continuing to grow but the growth could accelerate in the future."

The largest group of multiracial adults is biracial white and Native American, the report said, with 50 percent of the multiracial adults claiming that dual ancestry. Black and American Indian adults make up 12 per-

cent of the multiracial population, while those with a white and black background make up 11 percent.

The biracial white and American Indians are also the one group "whose members are the least likely to consider themselves 'multiracial,'" the report said. Biracial white-Asian adults were the most likely to say they were multiracial and to consider themselves multiracial.

For many multiracial adults, their experiences are similar to those who identify themselves as single races. For example, 40 percent of mixed-race adults with a black background said they have been unfairly stopped by the police because of their racial background. However, only 6 percent of biracial white and Asian adults and 15 percent of white and American Indian adults said they have had this experience.

Racial identity can be fluid for some people and fixed for others, Parker said. Thirty percent of the multiracial adults said they had described themselves as something other than multiracial earlier in their lives, she said.

"Being multiracial is not just a sum of the races in your family tree," she said. "It's also part of experiences and upbringing and it also can be fluid and change over the life course or when an individual is in a certain set of circumstances."

Biracial white and American Indians are the only multiracial group that leans toward the GOP, with the Republican Party holding a 53-42 percent advantage over the Democrats, the report said. All of the other mixed-race groups — white-Asian, black-white, black-Native American, and black-white-Native American — favored the Democrats by large numbers.

Like the rest of the United States' demographics, the composition of the mixed-race Americans is changing, the report noted. Thirty-six percent of mixed race babies born in 2012 were biracial white and

black and 24 percent were biracial white and Asia. Only 12 percent were white and American Indian, Parker said.

"That doesn't necessarily dictate how they will identify when they grow up, but it's sort of an indicator of maybe a shifting composition," she said.

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UT officials investigating academic fraud allegations

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — Texas says it has contacted the NCAA as the school investigates allegations of academic misconduct in its men's basketball program.

The school issued a statement Wednesday following a report in The Chronicle of Higher Education that mentioned potential allegations from the tenure of former coach Rick Barnes, who is now at Tennessee.

In the statement, the university said it "has

no information that suggests" Barnes knew of or was involved in any academic improprieties.

The statement added that "we determined that the university had no knowledge of two former student-athletes allegedly receiving improper help with high school coursework before they enrolled." That stems from a December report by The Chronicle of Higher Education.

"We now are reviewing three other cases purported to have oc-

curred over a nine-year period since 2006 to determine if any university of NCAA rules were violated and if any action is needed," the school said.

Those three cases are detailed in Wednesday's report from The Chronicle of Higher Education.

In the article, Adam Creasy, a former academic counselor for the Texas football team, says that math instructor Pamela Powell told him she saw former bas-

ketball player Martez Walker cheating on an exam, and that Walker passed the class anyway.

Also in the article, a former academic mentor in the athletic department says he helped write papers for former Texas guard J'Covan Brown. Creasy, one of the tutors for former player P.J. Tucker, says he believes Tucker received impermissible help with a paper while preparing for the NBA draft.

Rangers waste big night from Gallardo

OAKLAND, Calif. (AP) — The Texas Rangers were riding Yovani Gallardo's overpowering right arm to what they thought would be another impressive road win.

Once he left the game, everything changed.

Sam Fuld slid into home to just beat the throw for the winning run with one out in the ninth, and the Oakland Athletics snapped a four-game losing streak with a 5-4 victory against the Rangers on Wednesday night.

Texas made costly mistakes late and squandered chances.

"It got a little tough for us. We put ourselves in a couple of tight spots," Rangers manager Jeff Banister said. "We ran into some bunts on the bases, we got picked off, we missed a cutoff. It wasn't the cleanest game but it was still one I thought we had a chance to win. More than anything, it was missed opportunities to add on."

Gallardo struck out 10 in seven innings before the bullpen took over.

He has never beaten the A's, though it appeared his fortunes would change Wednesday.

Gallardo overcame a 30-pitch first inning that put him in a 1-0

hole and got stronger late. He struck out the side in order in the sixth to give him four straight Ks. He reached double digit strikeouts for the 19th time in his career and first since Sept. 19 at Pittsburgh.

"I threw a lot of pitches in the first inning and had to figure out a way to stop that. I told myself to make them put the ball in play and I was able to get ahead of guys and pitch the way I wanted," he said. "It's always tough to lose when it happens like that. That's just the way the game is."

Mitch Moreland hit a pair of RBI singles and Leonys Martin had his 12th multi-hit game as Texas lost for only the 13th time on the road.

Fuld hit a one-out single off Keone Kela (4-3) for just his eighth hit in 80 at-bats and stole second. Fuld advanced on Billy Burns' infield single and shortstop Elvis Andrus held the ball rather than throwing to third.

Reddick followed with a sharp grounder that second baseman Adam Rosales fielded and threw home just barely too late. It marked Reddick's fifth career game-ending RBI, and he received a celebratory whipped cream pie

in the face afterward.

"We were long overdue for a walkoff," Fuld said. "Those are the best kinds of wins. Good teams get a lot of walkoff wins, and we were definitely in desperate need of one."

Billy Butler hit a tying single off Tanner Scheppers in the eighth after Oakland scored another run on third baseman Joey Gallo's throwing error.

Tyler Clippard (1-3) pitched a perfect ninth for the win.

Rangers right fielder Shin-Soo Choo caught Max Muncy's deep fly at the wall to end the eighth.

A's starter Jesse Hahn lasted just 3 2-3 innings and hit three batters.

Hahn plunked Choo in the right upper back to load the bases with none out in the third. Prince Fielder followed with a sacrifice fly.

Hahn also hit Martin in the third and Fielder in the fourth. The three hit batsmen matched an Oakland record done eight times.

Switch-pitcher Pat Venditte relieved after Moreland's fourth-inning single. Throwing left-handed, he struck out Gallo on three pitches.

Romo: No regrets about comments on NFL over fantasy event

IRVING, Texas (AP) — Tony Romo has no regrets about comments he has made about the NFL since the cancellation of a fantasy football-themed event where the Dallas Cowboys quarterback was to be a headliner.

But Romo refused Wednesday to elaborate on what he said during radio interviews the previous day.

"I said everything I was going to say. I said what I thought," said

Romo, who wore a blue cap with an NFL logo while surrounded by reporters at his locker after the latest offseason practice.

The National Fantasy Football Convention event scheduled for next month in Las Vegas was canceled last week after the NFL reiterated a policy banning appearances associated with casinos.

During an interview Tuesday on ESPN Radio, Romo indicated

that it could be an issue of money.

"We were just trying to get the fans to hang out with players," Romo said during the interview. "It seems like a no-brainer to me, especially because it really wasn't going to be something that I didn't think was going to break the NFL's heart money-wise."

Romo also said he was disappointed that the NFL waited until so close to the event before

voicing its concerns.

Asked Wednesday if he had heard from anyone from the league office since his interviews, Romo responded, "No. I have not had any contact, before or after," and then smiled.

Romo was aware of a tweet with his picture sent from the NFL's verified account Tuesday that was quickly deleted.

It was a picture of Romo waving at a practice, with the words "Hi

Tony!" followed by two emoticons representing a hand waving back.

"Obviously when someone takes it down after nine minutes, it tells you probably all you need to know," Romo said.

There was no immediate response Wednesday to an email to a league spokesman about Romo's comments and the tweet.

NFL spokesman Brian McCarthy, however, told The Associated

Press last weekend after the event's cancellation that the league's only concern was the location.

McCarthy told the Fort Worth Star-Telegram on Tuesday that the league only found out about the event two weeks ago.

Romo chuckled when asked if he was surprised to hear the NFL's claim that the league only recently found out about the event, which was announced in March.

The opportunity for an endplay arises in a surprisingly high number of deals. Sometimes the endplay offers declarer a sure way of making his contract; on other occasions, it merely increases his chances.

Whatever the circumstances, an endplay is usually relatively simple to execute. The secret lies in visualizing the desired end position at the outset of play and then setting the stage properly.

Here is a typical case. West leads a club against six diamonds, and declarer sees that his only possible losers are a heart and a spade. The heart loser is inevitable, so all of South's thoughts should be devoted to trying to avoid the spade loser.

But instead of relying entirely on a spade finesse by leading low to the jack at some point, it is better for South to try to force the defenders to break the spade suit for him.

So he wins the club lead with the ace, cashes the A-K of trumps, the king of clubs and the A-K of hearts, then exits with a heart.

If West wins the trick, South is certain to make the slam, since West would have to return a spade or yield a ruff-and-discard.

If East wins the heart lead, South's position is less secure, but he is still in very good shape. In the actual case, if East returns a low spade, South plays the five, trapping West's queen, while if East returns the ten of spades, South plays the jack and dummy's nine becomes a trick. Either way, his potential spade loser disappears.

The contract likewise succeeds if East has the queen of spades and West the ten. After West's ten forces dummy's ace, South takes a spade finesse on the way back.

The only time the contract fails on the recommended line of play is when West has both the queen and ten of spades, only a 1-in-4 probability.

Gamemanship in full bloom in Stanley Cup final

CHICAGO (AP) — Goaltender Ben Bishop participated in Tampa Bay's morning skate, and was missing when the Lightning warmed up for Game 4. The Chicago Blackhawks hid their completely different lines until the game started.

The race is on between coaches Jon Cooper of the Lightning and Joel Quenneville of the Blackhawks for every little inch in one of the tightest Stanley Cup Finals in decades.

"Whether it's the element of surprise, I mean, we expected the other goalie in the net tonight, too," Quenneville said with a grin. "So I guess it's 50-50."

The Blackhawks used 24 saves from Corey Crawford to edge the Lightning 2-1 for a series-tying victory in Game 4 on Wednesday night. Jonathan Toews and Brandon Saad scored, and Chicago survived a big push by Tampa Bay in the final moments while improving 8-2 at home in the playoffs.

Slugging away at each other for 12 periods, the Blackhawks and Lightning have been tied or separated by one goal for the entire series. The first four games of the final have been decided

by one goal for the first time since Montreal swept St. Louis in 1968.

"We could have won every game so far, and that's what you want to give yourself the chance to do," Lightning defenseman Anton Stralman said. "You don't want to come back into the dressing room and say 'Man, we let this one slip.' We don't have that feeling right now. We played some good hockey. Sometimes you play well and you don't get the results you want."

Alex Killorn scored for Tampa Bay in Game 4, and Andrei Vasilevskiy made 17 saves while subbing for the banged-

up Bishop. Captain Steven Stamkos had an assist for his first point since Game 5 of the Eastern Conference finals against the New York Rangers.

Tampa Bay said Bishop is day to day with an undisclosed injury. He appeared to be dealing with some sort of groin or leg problem while making 36 saves in a gutsy performance in Tampa Bay's 3-2 victory on Monday night. Game 5 is Saturday in Florida and Game 6 is in Chicago on Monday.

"Bish is going to play again in this series, there's no question," Cooper said. "I just don't

know which game."

KIMMO RETURNS: Veteran defenseman Kimmo Timonen played six minutes for the Blackhawks in his first appearance since Game 5 of the Western Conference finals against Anaheim. The 40-year-

old Timonen, who was acquired in a February trade with Philadelphia, missed most of the season while recovering from blood clots in his leg and lungs.

Timonen, who plans to retire after the playoffs, hit the crossbar with a shot in the third period.

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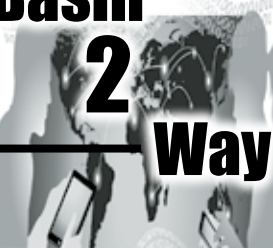
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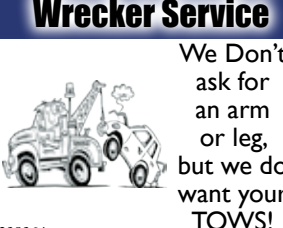
