Homecoming at Lakeview

Boat Ramps Approved

The Texas Highway Commission has approved the 1968 Boat Ramp Program, calling for the construction of 58 projects in 42 counties.

Two of these items are in Donley County, and call for constructing a Boat Ramp, Parking Area and Access Road on the north side of Greenbelt Reservoir Dam two tenths of a mile west of Highway 70, and another on the south side of the reservoir three tenths of a mile west of Highway 70.

Clarendon College Aggie Club Rodeo

The Aggie Club is conducting its fourth annual Clarendon College Rodeo April 12-13th at the Donley County Fairgrounds. Events for boys will include bare-back broncs, bulls, tie-down calf roping and ribbon roping. Barrel racing competition will be open to girls, and a queen contest will be held following the Saturday afternoon performance.

The show promises to be the biggest and best ever held. Contestants have entered from a large number of area high schools and colleges over the Panhandle and South Plains regions. Lawrence Overcast will serve as rodeo announcer.

The winner of each event will receive a buckle award, as will the three top averaged winners of each event for two performances. The best all-around cowboy will also be awarded a buckle. Contestants are limited to two performances in each event. The all-around cowboy contestants must qualify in both a riding and a roping event.

The evening performance on April 12th will begin at 8:00 p. m. Two performances are slated for April 13th at 2:00 and 8:00 p. m. Admission charges are \$1.00 for adults and fifty cents for children.

Easter Seal Appeal

Because of the steady growth in numbers of crippled children and adults in Texas, the Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults of Texas has stepped up its rehabilitation services.

According to Mr Wesley Knorpp who is the Easter Seal Representative for Donley County, a total of 17,622 handicapped Texans received Easter Seal treatments during 1967.

The largest group served include those with major deformities of bones and joints, severe speech defects cerebral palsy, arthritis, muscular dystrophy and multiple sclerosis and stroke. The Easter Seal Campaign which provides funds for continuation for these

services began March 1 and continues through April 14, Easter Sunday.

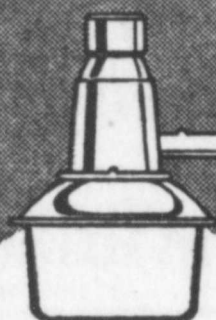

Since 1928 the Texas Forest Service has produced 415 million one-year old baby seedlings in its nurseries for reforestation purposes by Texas landowners. Set out with a spacing of 6 by 8 feet this number would be sufficient to plant 457,000 acres, an entire county the size of Trinity or Wood. He will be available to help on any matters relating to Social Security.

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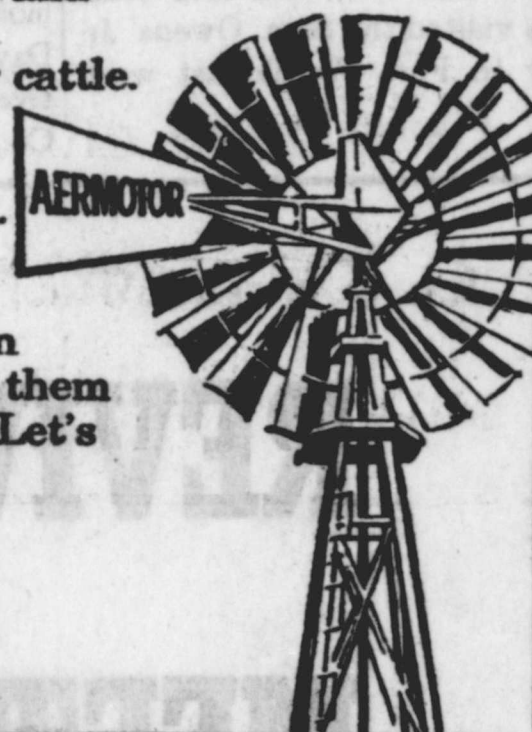
