Woman Suffrage Is Lost in the State of Delaware

DOVER, Del., April 1.—The Federal suffrage amendment was defeated in the House this afternoon by a 22 to 9 vote. Three members did not vote and one member was absent when the vote was taken.

Delaware was scheduled as the thirty-sixth state for the amendment, and the announcement of the final vote definitely removes this state as being a possibility for ratification.

SOME FOOL PULLS A FOOLISH PRANK

The fool who turned in the fire alarm shortly after noon Thursday did so perhaps to play April fool prank on the fire boys, but it was a prank for which the fool, whoever he might be, should be made to pay the maximum penalty.

The party turning in the alarm stated that the fire was the home of Malissa Thomas on Eighth Street. Thinking the fire was on North Eighth Street, the fire boys made the run to the extreme Western part of town.

Meeting a member of their company on North Eighth Street, the boys were told that Malissa Thomas was a negro, and lived on the opposite end of Eighth Street. The boys made a quick run back to the negro's house, and finding no fire, "took a tumble," remembering that it was April fool.

There is more or less danger in loss of life or in crippling some one for life every time the fire company is called out, and there is a penalty for turning in false fire alarms, and the fellow who turned in the fire alarm should congratulate himself that central cannot recall where the alarm was turned in from.

HARTFORD, Conn., April 1.—Gov. Holcomb stated today that he will not call a special session of the general assembly to take action on the woman suffrage amendment to the federal constitution.

JACKSON, Miss., April 1.—The Mississippi legislature late yesterday finally refused to ratify the Federal woman suffrage amendment. The action came in form of a motion to disagree with the senate resolution of Wednesday which favored ratification. The motion to disagree was carried 94 to 23.

WASHINGTON, April 1.—Suffrage forces will not slacken their efforts until 37 states have ratified the suffrage amendment, the national woman's party announced late yesterday, so that the coming into force of the amendment will not be delayed should the supreme court hold valid the provision of the Ohio state constitution permitting a referendum on the amendment.

UNCLE SAM IN CHARGE OF RED RIVER

WASHINGTON, Apr. 1.—The United States supreme court today appointed John M. Dickinson of Chicago, as receiver for the disputed oil lands in the Red River valley, over which Texas and Oklahoma have been threatening to clash for some time.

The court also granted an injunction against Texas and Oklahoma interfering with the receiver's control of the lands. Mr. Dickinson will have full authority of all property in question pending the determination of the boundary between the two states.

REPUBLICAN PEACE BILL FAVORABLE

MASHINGTON, Apr. 1.—The resolution introduced yesterday declaring the war between Germany and the United States at and end, and providing for immediate peace between the two nations, was favorably reported on by the House foreign affairs committee today.

WASHINGTON, April 1.—Peace with Germany through adoption of a joint resolution declaring the war at end was put squarely before congress yesterday afternoon by the republicans in control in the house.

Framed by republican members of the foreign affairs committee, and backed by party leaders, the measure was thrown into the hopper with as little ceremony as if it had been a bridge bill, but instantly there developed a demand for speedy action. A move to jam it through the house Friday took shape but democrats, outspoken in their opposition, obtained an agreement to postpone consideration until Monday.

While trying to work out a resolution calculated to suit all factions of their party, republican committeemen had arranged to call it up Friday, remembering that it was on Good Friday three years ago that war was declared.

The resolution was introduced by Chairman Porter of the foreign affairs committee, provides for "termination of a state of war, as soon as it becomes effective." It provides also for reciprocal trading with Germany and asks repeal of the president's war powers.

French and Germans Have Opened New Negotiations

Paris, April 1.—The direct negotiations between the French and German governments without participation of the other allies, developed in the exchange of communications today concerning the question of occupation of the Ruhr valley are regarded here as of extraordinary significance.

Governor to Discuss Pink Boll Worm at Washington

Austin, April 1.—Governor W. P. Hobby has announced that he will leave tomorrow for Washington to attend the hearing on the pink boll worm situation before the Federal horticultural board on April 6.

BANDITS GET \$45,000

PACKING HOUSE PAY

Kansas City, Kan., April 1.—Auto bandits robbed bank messengers today at the 23rd Street viaduct, and escaped with more than \$45,000 in cash.

The messengers were in a small sedan automobile when the bandits held up the car, halting all traffic until the sedan was looted, and the robbers escaped into Missouri.

The money represented the pay roll for Swift & Co., and was being sent to the company's office by the banks.

TURKS GO TO WAR AGAINST ENGLAND

LONDON, April 1.—Mustapha Kemal, leader of the Turkish nationalists, has declared war against Great Britain, according to dispatches received here this morning from Constantinople.

The news was received through the Constantinople correspondent of the London Morning Post.

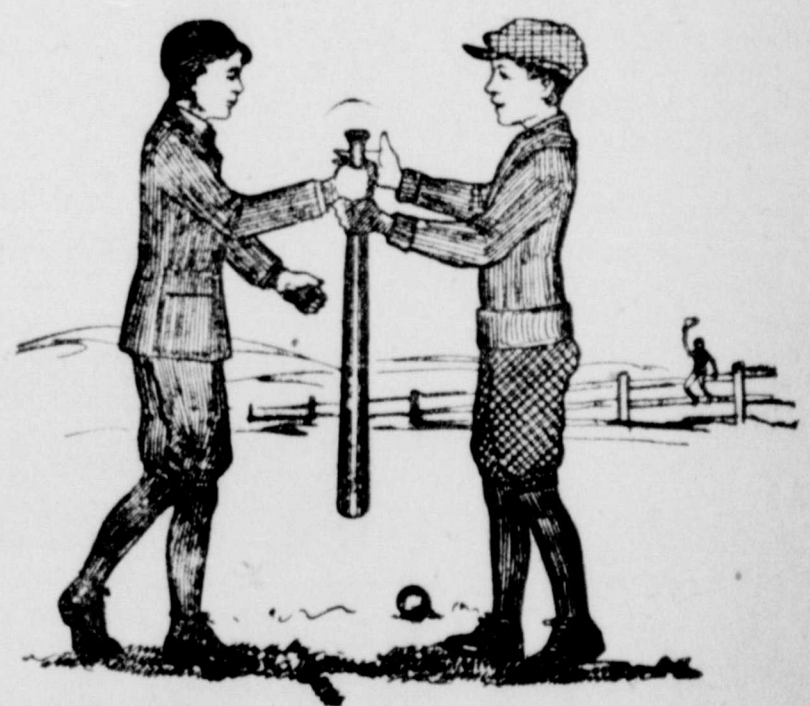

TRAFFIC INCREASE TREBLED SINCE 1898

Greater Efficiency Enabled Railroads to Meet Country's Growing Demands.

The American railroads are more than one-third of the railways of the world. The traffic hauled on the railways of the United States is now three times as great as it was twenty years ago. In four months now the railroads carry as much freight and as many passengers as they did then in a year. In the three months alone of the harvest movement in 1919 the traffic equaled that of the whole year of 1898.

In 1898 freight ton miles carried by the railroads of the country were more than 100,000,000,000 a year. In 1910 they were more than 250,000,000,000, in 1913 more than 300,000,000,000 and in 1918 more than 400,000,000,000. Although the railway mileage increased only about 65 per cent since 1890, improvements in tracks, terminals, equipment, etc., have been so marked that the volume of goods carried (measured in the number of freight tons carried one mile) increased more than five times from 1890 to 1917.

Increased Efficiency.

Taking account of both freight and passenger service, the railroads in 1900 hauled 180,000 traffic units (freight tons carried one mile, plus passengers carried one mile) for each railway employee. By 1917, the last year of private operation of the railroads prior to the entry of the United States into the war, that 180,000 had been increased to 290,000.

The following table shows the increase in efficiency of American railroads since 1900, which enabled the railroads to keep pace with the growth of the country:

Ton miles increased.....	100%
Passenger miles increased..	170%
Trackage increased.....	50%
Cars and engine increased..	75%
Workers increased.....	85%
Output per worker increased	60%
Average train load increased	130%

These figures show that the traffic hauled by the railroads of the country has increased more than three times as fast as the trackage, more than twice as fast as the equipment and more than twice as fast as the number of workers. This has been made possible by far-sighted investment of new capital to increase the efficiency of the transportation facilities and thereby enable the railroads to increase the amount of traffic handled and reduce the amount of labor required to handle it.

Urge Adequate Re-

In a resolution adopted by the Association of Life Insurance Presidents the heads of the country's large insurance companies express their attitude toward the railroad situation as follows:

"Rehabilitation of the railroads and establishment by law of rates adequate to provide for the present and future demands of our growing commerce and to stabilize the credit and securities of the roads."

Protection for Public.

The executive council of the National Association of Credit Men in a public statement on the credit situation of the country says:

"The council in its consideration of the transfer of the railways to private control felt that it is of the highest importance that the railways be protected from the dangers of receivership and the public assured against uninterrupted service."

Jones & Wood, who recently purchased the Queen Theatre and the White City Airdome, will begin the work of remodeling the White City Monday, and will have the open air amusement place ready for entertaining the show goers of this city within two weeks, or just as soon as the weather is favorable for an outdoor theatre.

The principal plank in the platform of the new party is "a little more kick in a great deal more liquor." There is nothing American about the liquor business, and just why the new party adopted the name "American" has not been explained.

In an interview given out by Richard Hudson, campaign manager for the American party, Mr. Hudson says, "the American party is going to the people with a platform of genuine Jeffersonian principles, and with a plan for light wines and plenty of beer, and with a proposal of sane regulatory law which will make it possible for legitimate druggists and reputable doctors to give a sick man whiskey before he dies."

"There is no other public official of so much importance in Texas as School Director or Trustee. Such men should be elected by a vigorous vote of all the citizens rather than by a baker's dozen as is ordinarily the case. And when elected they should be intelligently supported rather than criticized or forgotten.

"This interest is as vital to our lives, our homes and our country as life itself and yet not one in a hundred can tell when or where the Trustee's election will be held. Neither do they have the remotest idea as to who is best suitable to bear these heavy responsibilities. And all this in the face of the momentous money problem now facing our schools. Do we not need an educational campaign among our grown-ups?"

MORE SALT WATER IN HIGHTOWER WELL

A. G. Hazlett was here from Winters, Thursday, coming in from the Hightower well, where he has been drilling during the past week. "We got a good dose of salt water at a depth of 3125," said Mr. Hazlett, "and will wait until we can hear from Nelson before drilling deeper." Mr. Hazlett stated that prospects were good in the very best formation until they drilled into the salt water. He stated that they struck the sand at 3110 and fifteen feet in brought the water. If Nelson & Nelson will furnish the cash and assist in backing the proposition the well will be put down 4,000 feet. Mr. Hazlett stated that he was very anxious to see a 4,000 foot hole drilled in this county.

"The formation in this county is too good not to show up somewhere with a good well," said Mr. Hazlett, "and the geologists who made the survey of this county knew what they were doing when they made their report. Mr. Hazlett stated that the report of the geologists show that there is a dip of about 800 feet from the Russell well to the Hightower well and it works out almost to a foot. The same sand which was struck in Russell at 2290 was struck in Hightower at 3110.

Drilling at Safety First has been suspended while work on the Hightower well was underway to await repairs on a boiler which had given away. Mr. Hazlett stated that the drilling crew was now back on the Safety First well and would begin drilling again as soon as repairs underway could be completed.

"We are going to finish every well we have started in the country," said Mr. Hazlett, "but necessarily slowly on account of being

unable to get dependable drillers." Experienced drillers have much faith in the local field, and say that the formation here has every thing to be found in oil field formations.

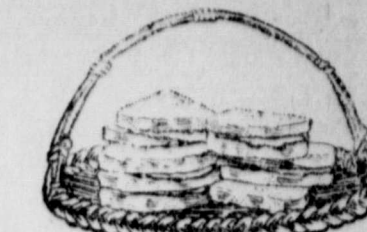

Limit Reached in Prices; Old Clothes Given Credit

WASHINGTON, April 1.—National wide reports from federal reserve bank officials made public today, disclose their opinion that the post war era of "extravagance and reckless buying" by the public is nearing its end.

"A hesitation, if not an actual recession" of prices is noted and the Federal Reserve Board's statement summarizes its advice as indicating a generally more hopeful view of the country's business condition than for several months.

While the price changes were shown by the board not to be universal, they were nevertheless regarded as positive and of importance as a basis for reckoning what the immediate future holds.

Relief from the high prices for the consumer will not be completely obtained until present stocks are absorbed in practically all lines, according to the board's review. Manufacturers everywhere, however, were shown to hold the view that the peak of high prices has been reached and to expect a gradual recession.

In the clothing trade, particularly, the board said, there was a marked tendency of the public to make old supplies last longer and to refuse to pay exorbitant prices. This phase can mean only that an awakening has come, the statement said and that many people have arrived at the conclusion that they are themselves responsible for a continuing high range of prices.

Wholesalers in the dry goods trade to some extent, have taken "a commendatory attitude," and are discouraging their customers from placing heavy fall orders. That has served to slacken demand and create a feeling that lower prices will follow.

The reports do not give encouragement concerning a price reduction in shoes. There was however, a wide divergence of opinion as to what shoe and leather prices will do.

Eastern seaboard cities reported a "piling up of commodities," on this side of the Atlantic. The exchange situation was beginning to reflect itself on the export market as well as through a general reduction by Europeans in their foreign buying, it was noted.

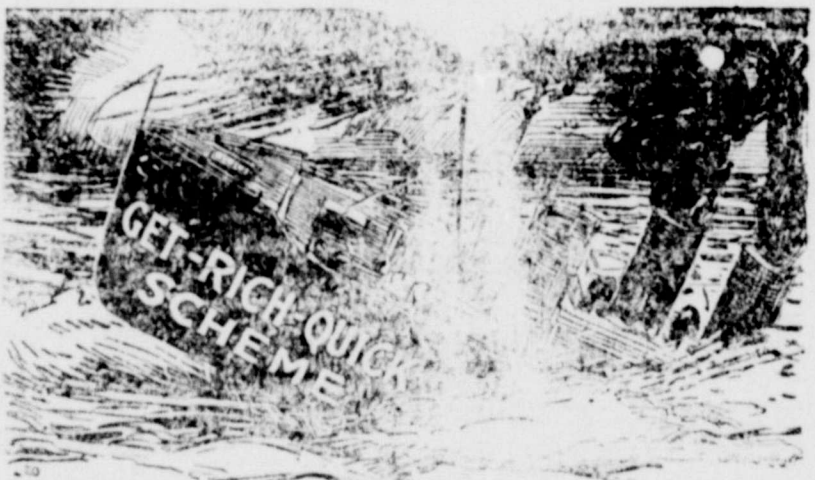
