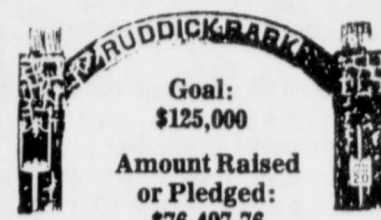

## Trustees OK performance report

The Colorado Independent School District board of trustees Monday night approved an annual performance report to be sent to the Texas Education Agency.

Assistant Superintendent Dr. Walter Bingham explained that the report is designed to point out the strong points as well as the weak points in any school system. This is the first year the state agency has required the

report.

"In the future, this report will probably be used as a basis for accreditation," explained Bingham.

Included in the report are sections on student performance; program offerings; staff quality; facility adequacy; financial condition; impact of 1984 reform legislation; impact of curriculum requirements; and impact of other significant changes.

Other areas covered include measures of educational achievement; classroom exceeding specified sizes; career ladder information by sex and ethnicity; pupil-teacher ratios by program; attendance ratios; test scores; dropouts; compensatory education; bilingual education; disciplinary activities; distribution of school year 1984-85 teachers by prior year's employment; and general fund expenditures.

The report notes that the essential elements "are an integral part of the curriculum in the Colorado Independent School District." Curriculum documents such as the essential elements mastery chart on individual students and teacher grade books verify mastery of the elements. Lesson plans, scope and sequence and essential elements check sheets for each course and each teacher reflect coverage of each element.

Test scores verify that students are making progress in several areas. From 1983-84 to 1984-85, grades 4, 6, 7 and 8 showed increases of 7 percent, 3 percent, 9 percent and 5 percent

over the prior year on the Comprehensive Test of Basic Skills. Grades 3 and 5 showed decreases of 9 percent and 1 percent on the test. The test showed an average increase of 2.36 percent in test scores in 1984-85 compared to the previous year.

TABS test scores in mathematics from 1983-84 to 1984-85 showed a 2 percent and 3 percent decrease in third and fifth grade, but a 16 percent increase in

## Boy dies in shooting accident

Funeral services were held Tuesday for seven-year-old Tyler Rand (Ty) Forbes who died Sunday as the result of an accidental shooting at his home.

The youngster, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Forbes of Colorado City, died at 11:05 a.m. in Root Memorial Hospital Sunday from a gunshot wound to his midsection.

Reports indicate that the boy and several other children were playing in the living room, a short distance from where a hunting rifle had been placed. The rifle apparently fell to the floor, causing a single shot to be fired. The mishap happened about 10 a.m.

Services were at 2 p.m. Tuesday at Kiker-Seale Funeral Home. Gary Dennis, minister of 22nd and Austin Street Church of Christ, officiated. Burial was in Colorado City Cemetery.

He was born June 22, 1978 in Dallas and had been a resident of Colorado City for five years. He was a student at Kelley Elementary School.

Survivors include his parents; two brothers, Johnny Jr. and Samuel Wiley, both of the home; paternal grandmother, Dorothy Forbes of Colorado City; maternal grandmother, Mary Melo of Dallas; and maternal grandfather, Preston Wiley of Grand Saline.

Although individual contributions to the Pool and Park Fund for Ruddick Park have declined, the fund continues to grow through various other fund-raising events.

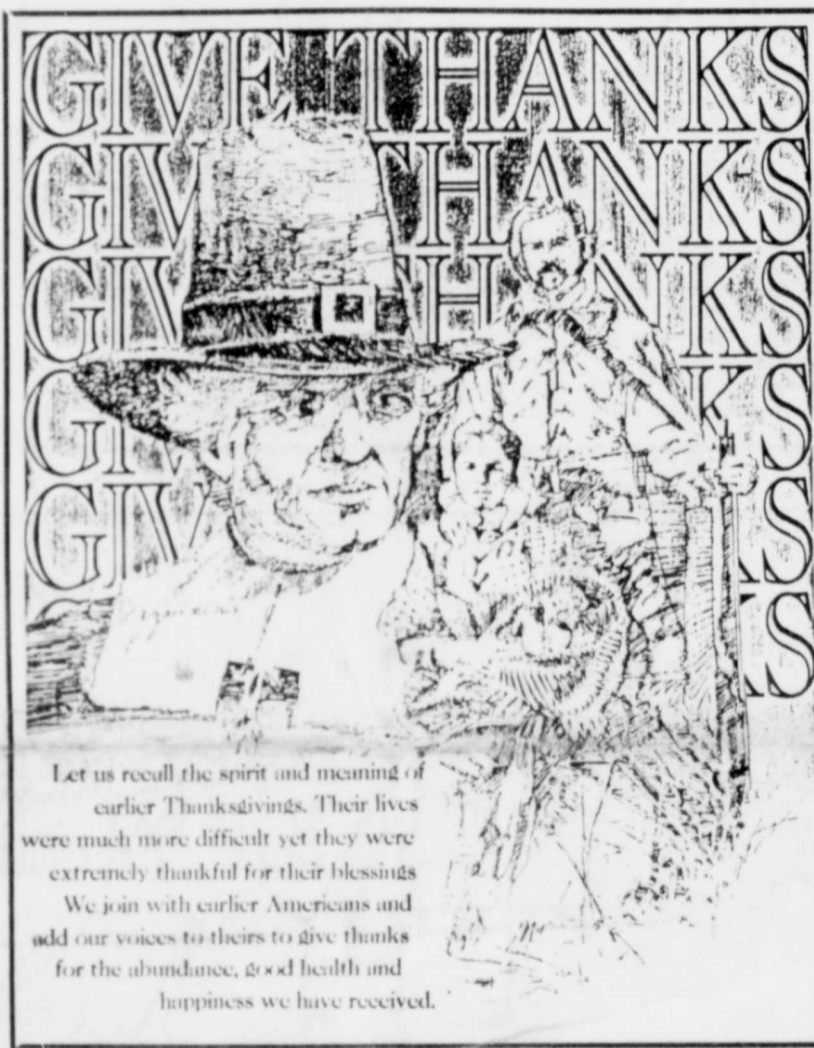

the ninth grade, for an overall average increase of 2.66 percent.

TABS scores in reading from 1983-84 to 1984-85 were down from 96 percent to 86 percent at third grade and down from 75 percent to 71 percent at the fifth grade. Ninth grade showed 1 percent increase from 71 percent to 72 percent.

TABS scores for writing were down for third grade by 22 percent from 56 percent to 34 percent, down by 27 percent from 63 percent to 36 percent at the fifth grade, and down 24 percent from 76 percent to 52 percent at the ninth grade.

Scholastic Aptitude Test averages for 1984-85 were 759.08 and ACT test averages stood at 15.4. Areas in need of improvement are in language arts at grades 3 and 5 at the elementary level. Needs are being addressed by an improved sequence of skills and by the tutorial program, the report notes.

The financial section of the report shows that the district has total expenditures of \$5,207,897 for the 1984-85 school year with a cost per student of \$3,340.40.

"House Bill 72 has brought about the same changes in this district as in other districts across Texas," the report states. "The policies of the local board have been changed to

include the new requirements. The absence policy has been changed to meet new state requirements regarding absences. Also, policies have been implemented to meet requirements regarding participation in extracurricular activities."

The new curriculum and program requirements did not necessitate the addition of any courses at the high school because all courses required were already in place, the report states.

In other business Monday, the trustees accepted Superintendent Charlie Uselton's recommendation to purchase a new phone system for the various campuses from Executone for \$19,385. Bids from nine companies were opened at a previous meeting. Uselton had narrowed the nine bids down to four including Executone, AT&T, Ad-

vanced Telephone Systems and Harris-Lanier. Executone, AT&T and Advance had representatives at Monday night's meeting.

Uselton said that after studying the bids, the Executone seemed to be "the best buy for the money."

The board also approved the annual audit report as presented by Joe Morren.

In presenting the report, Morren said he had made several recommendations concerning the handling of student activity funds and ticket sales at football games.

"The financial portion does look good and you should be commended on this," said Morren, adding that the school district's computer system was "very helpful this year" in preparing the audit report.

# Assembly of God pastors named

The First Assembly of God church in Colorado City has new pastors, Rev. and Mrs. Fred Johnson from Midland.

Rev. Johnson is an ordained minister and his wife Erma is a licensed minister with the Assemblies of God. They have three daughters, Anna Caudle, who lives in Barnhart, Mary Johnson who lives in St. Louis and Becky Johnson who is going to college in Houston. They have three granddaughters and one grandson.

The Johnsons come to Colorado City with 25 years experience in the ministry. They started their ministry in June 1960 when Rev. Johnson graduated from Southwestern Assemblies of God College, in Waxahachie. They have pastored churches in Texas, New York and Missouri for 12 years. Rev. Johnson headed a prison evangelism ministry in St. Louis, Mo., for five years.

They both worked in the teen challenge ministry for seven years, five years in St. Louis and two years in Midland.

Teen challenge is a Christian drug and alcohol rehabilitation program. It has the highest cure rate for drug addicts and alcoholics in America.

When they returned home about 10 a.m. Saturday, they discovered most of the possessions they had moved into the house had been taken. The items included appliances, blankets, pictures, household goods, toys and baby blankets.

Sparks said Birmingham was arrested Saturday afternoon and a small portion of the merchandise has been recovered.

## Literary Society meets

The VIL Literary Society met recently in Lorraine with Ann R. Gregory bringing the program on Pictorial Painting in Signcraft. Ms. Gregory told the club that although sign lettering is a semimechanical trade, pictorial work is also an outlet for this talent. The old saying that one picture is worth a thousand words can be demonstrated by this method. Four types of picture painting are used in pictorials:

1. The graphic symbol, sometimes done impressionistically.
2. Posterized pictures done with solid colors and usually outlined.
3. The simple pictorial, usually done with one basic color with a highlight in white and shadowed with a dark color.
4. The high picture, which is blended well to give it a realistic look.

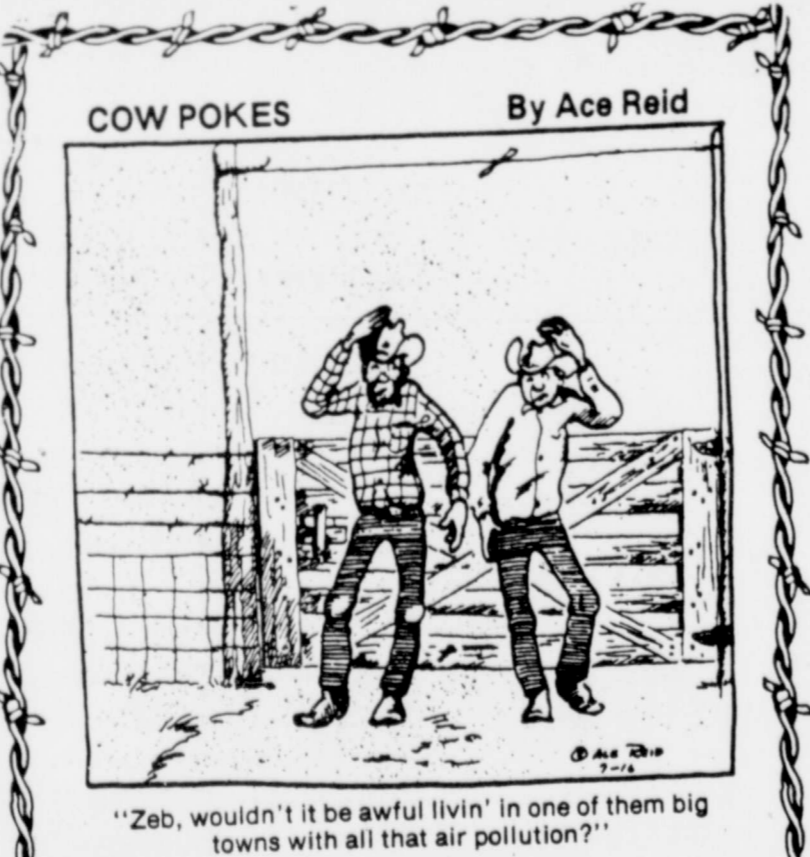
Ms. Gregory then showed those present some of her pictorials.
