JAMES B. ANDERSON SERVED ABOARD U. S. S. ALKES

PEARL HARBOR—James B. Anderson, fireman, first class, Abernathy, served aboard a cargo ship of the U. S. Pacific fleet which highlighted a stormy career with an outstanding achievement, Navy records now reveal.

His ship, the USS Alkes, part of the service forces, set a record by unloading 1,200 tons in small boats during a hectic 24-hour period just before the end of the war.

The ship was commissioned in October of 1943, and vivid in his memory was the craft's first Christmas present two months later. On her maiden voyage the Alkes arrived at Makin Island, which had been secured a week before. On arrival day, the Japs held a premature Yuletide celebration, welcoming the newcomer with five strikes by Bettys and Zeiros.

After Makin, the ports of call were Majuro, Engebi, Eniwetok, Kwajalein and Tarawa, and as her last wartime duty, was chosen to carry Seabees to Guam early in August to aid in the development of the then headquarters of Fleet Admiral Chester Nimitz.

Some Victory Loan Facts

Washington, D. C.—Victory Loan facts, honoring the men and women who won the war, are as follows:
Dates: October 29 through December 8.
Quotas: \$11,000,000,000; 4 billion in individual sales, 2 billion in Series E sales, 7 billion from other non-bank investors.
Reason: Treasury balance will be drained by December. Money is vitally needed for hospitalization, rehabilitation, retraining, feeding and clothing men overseas, transportation home, payment of munitions already used.

Walter Struve, lifetime Hale county resident and nephew of Fritz W. Ben F. and Tom Struve, and Mmes. Minna Goebel and Charles Goeth of Abernathy, was elected president of the Hale County Co-Operative Hospital corporation in the first meeting of the permanent board of directors Monday night at Hale Center. Other members of the permanent board, named last week in the first membership meeting, are Clayton Eiring, Plainview, re-elected in precinct 1; John Hughes, elected in precinct 2 to succeed R. E. Wilson; L. M. Anderson, precinct 3, succeeding Alfred Ebeling, and Orval Boyd, re-elected from precinct 4. Struve is a board of director member from the county at large.

The hospital corporation now has 600 family members. Construction is planned to begin before the end of 1945.
