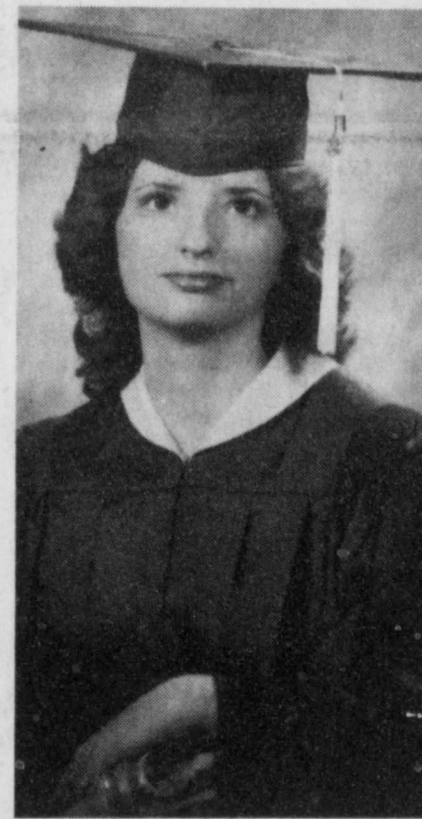

### "Just Talk," Says Sheriff ...

## Former Prisoner Wants \$10-Million

Red River County Sheriff Bob Storey says a \$10-million lawsuit filed by a former inmate of the county jail, naming Storey and Clarksville Police Chief Roger Stell as responsible for violating his rights, "is all just talk."

Audie Reginald (Ricky) Pearson, 29, in a 12-page petition he reportedly prepared and filed through Federal channels himself, claims his rights were violated while he was held in county jail following the May 16, 1981 stabbing death of his wife, Lois, in a Clarksville apartment.

Pearson is now serving a 15-year term in state prison at Huntsville after pleading guilty last September to manslaughter charges in his wife's death.

Pearson is asking for damages for what he alleges as medical neglect and mental anguish while confined to the Red River County Jail. He asks \$5-million on one count and an additional \$5-million on another.

The prisoner alleges he was beaten by officers at the jail, denied proper medical treatment, jailed with several Hispanics whom he claims were planning to kill him and later placed in the same area of the jail with relatives of his wife, who he

alleges, were intending to do him bodily harm.

He also claims authorities permitted relatives of his wife to remove personal belongings from the apartment that rightfully belonged to him.

"It's all just talk," Sheriff Storey told The Bogata News. "We got along just fine with him (Pearson). He received everything he needed in the way of medical attention and protection."

"Perhaps we treated him too good," the sheriff added.

Apparently the next step will be for Sheriff Storey and Chief Stell to file an answer, through their attorneys, to Pearson's charges. The attorneys will probably request a dismissal of the suit.

A hearing, if any is held, will probably be in the court of U.S. District Judge William Wayne Justice of Tyler.

Sheriff Storey said he transported Pearson to Huntsville following his sentence by District Judge Leon Pesek.

"We got along just fine. In fact, I've received a nice letter from him since he has been in prison," the sheriff says.

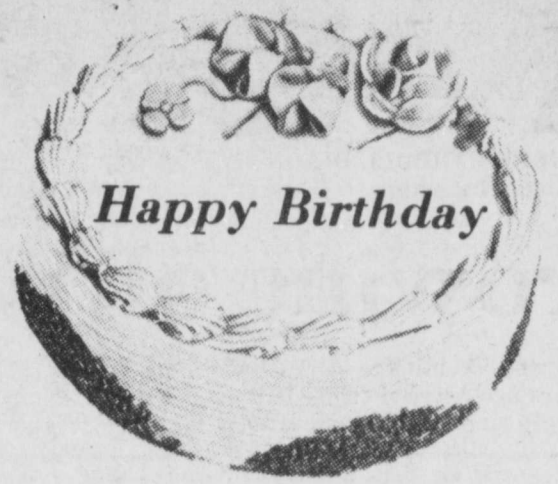
### Hidden Name \$ Claimed By Mrs. W. E. Henderson

### Rules For Youth Swine Show

Rules and regulations for the annual Red River County Barrow and Breeding Swine Show have been announced by County Agent Chris Bull.

All exhibitors must with the county extension agent no later than next Tuesday, June 1, at which time barrows must be on feed, Bull says.

The complete rules for the show are listed as follows: 1. All exhibitors must be enrolled in public schools by June 1 and either reside in Red River County, attend schools therein or be a member in 4-H or FFA in the county.

2. Barrows only will be allowed in the market show.

3. All barrows will be on feed by June 1, 1982. Exhibitors must register at the County Extension Office by this date.

4. Barrows must weigh between 200 & 270 lbs. at the weigh-in date on Wednesday, Sept. 22. There will be no reweighs; if they do not meet this weight requirement, barrows will be shown in the open show and not permitted to sell in the premium auction.

5. All barrows will be sold at the fair, either by auction or shipped directly to slaughter after the fair.

6. The weigh-in will begin at 8 p.m. Sept. 22, unless special permission is obtained from the swine superintendent. All swine should be in the barn by this time.

7. There will be no breed division in the swine show or barrow show.

8. Barrows will be divided into three weight classes: 200-223 lbs., 224-247 lbs. and 248-270 lbs.

9. One grand champion and one reserve grand champion will be from the barrow show.

10. There will be a showmanship class among Junior swine exhibitors.

11. All breeding swine and barrows are subject to Texas Animal Health Commission Rules which includes valid health papers.

12. Breeding swine classes will be determined by the swine superintendent after all breeding swine are in the barn.

13. All decisions of the judge and swine superintendent will be final.

14. The barrow show will be limited to two barrows per exhibitor.

15. The top 20 barrows in the show will sell at the auction.

16. The judge will set the sale order beginning with the number 3 barrow to number 20, followed by the reserve grand champion and finishing with the grand champion.

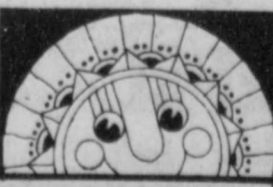
