MAN STABBED WHILE ASLEEP

(San Angelo Standard)
While he slept near a window in a west room at his home at 9 East College avenue Wednesday night, John Poreh, janitor at the federal building, was stabbed with a knife, but was not seriously injured.

Poreh was awakened about midnight by a stinging sensation in his left side. Getting up and turning on the light, he found that he was bleeding and summoned assistance.

The midnight assailant made two slashes at Poreh through a screen and only one thrust reached the sleeping man. The wound inflicted was only an inch or two long and did not penetrate to the abdomen.

Ira C. Green, deputy chief of police, investigated the case with Ben Teague, night patrolman, and they found tracks in the yard leading from the back of the house toward Poreh's west window, which opens on a vacant lot at the corner of College avenue and Chadbourne street.

At noon Thursday no arrests had been made. Poreh has suspicions as to who his assailant might have been and the officers are working on the information furnished them along this line.

About two years ago, Poreh narrowly escaped fatal injury when he fell down the iron stair leading from the loft of the federal building onto the roof. He was going up to raise the flag over Uncle Sam's property when a trap door struck him on the head and rendered him unconscious.

The janitor is a widower and has seven children, most of them small.

READY TO WEAR PRICES DECLINE

CHICAGO, July 30.—Prices of ready-to-wear garments have reached the peak, and have started to decline, according to the Ready-to-wear Dealers Association, which began a ten days exhibition here today.

FINDS CROPS SPOTTED

W. T. Nichols returned home Thursday from a visit to Milam county. Mr. Nichols says that Milam county has spotted crops, and is feeling the effects of the drouth and boll weevil. He said he saw cotton waist high with three or four good bolls on the bottom limbs while the weevils had cleaned up everything else. Mr. Nichols says taking the country as a whole this county averages up with the best of them.

NO END TO WAR IN MEXICO SEEN

MEXICALI, Lower Calif., July 30.—Esteban Cantu, governor of the Northern district of lower California, is preparing a defense region against the federal troops. Eight men who ranked high in army circles under President Carranza, have volunteered for service under Gov. Cantu.

The Mexican consul here announced that the lives of Americans and their property on both sides of the border would be protected as fully as possible by the provisional government now under President de la Huerta.

A small force of United States troops are stationed here and are ready to protect the interests of Americans.

EL PASO, July 30.—Mexican federal forces numbering several thousand men, are being mobilized and moved to fight against Lower California, and put down the rebellion started in that state. General Valles, Mexican minister, announced that the men would be sent to the Lower California border at once.

\$115,000 WORTH WHISKEY SEIZED

NEW YORK, July 30.—Extensive liquor raids made yesterday in Newark and Jersey City by nearly one hundred Federal agents was followed today by the seizure of more than \$115,000 worth of whiskey in the Bronx.

W. A. Forgey, nominee for county clerk, was in the city Thursday. Mr. Forgey says that he feels proud of the good vote the people gave him and appreciates the nomination.

BAILEY'S LEAD IS CUT AGAIN

DALLAS, July 30.—Two hundred and forty-six counties have made reports on the election and of this number 131 are complete. The vote up to noon today places Bailey's lead at 4,407.

A total of 417,107 votes have been accounted for in the governor's race, and the standing of the candidates is as follows: Bailey 141,233; Neff 136,827; Thomson 92,460; and Looney 46,589.

TEXAS GETS MORE CARS THIS YEAR

DALLAS, July 30.—Diversion of 2,500 grain cars to the Texas grain belt before August 3rd, followed by the rushing of cars to the Texas shipping points from the trunk line terminals of the East and North is promised by the Interstate Commerce Commission for the relief of Texas grain growers and shippers, according to a wire received from James Z. George, vice president and general manager of the Texas Chamber of Commerce, who is in Washington, in company with J. S. Cullinan of Houston, president of the state chamber, and others, on behalf of Texas grain growers and shippers.

The Texas delegation was given assurance that everything possible would be done and that more cars would be allocated to Texas this year than last year at the close of a session which lasted several hours during which the problems of the Texas grain men were discussed in great detail.

A conference of Texas grain shippers and carriers has been called by the state chamber to meet in Dallas early next week for the purpose of discussing means of moving empty cars into the grain belt with all possible dispatch.

BABY SHOW TO BE HELD AT GALVESTON BEACH

GALVESTON, July 30.—Registration for the first annual baby parade of the Galveston Beach association, to be held August 15th, is flooding offices of that organization, it is announced. The first pair of twins already has been entered.

The Seawall boulevard will be roped off for a distance of four blocks, according to present plans and the decorated go-carts will pass in double file.

AWARDS SCHOLARSHIP IN HONOR DAUGHTER

AUSTIN, July 30.—It is announced by Dean W. H. Maves, of the Department of Journalism of the University of Texas, that Dr. and Mrs. F. S. Love of Geneva, Texas, offer a scholarship of \$150 a year as a memorial to their daughter, Miss "Billie" Love, a former student of journalism, who was killed in an automobile accident on her way home from the University, December 21, 1917. This scholarship fund will be awarded year by year to some deserving young woman preparing for work in journalism.

BAILEY CLUB IS ORGANIZED HERE

A number of Bailey men met Thursday night and organized a "Runnels County Bailey Club." E. V. Bateman was elected chairman and Dr. S. B. Raby, secretary, and the statement given out that committees would be named later and their names furnished to The Ledger.

"We have more than one hundred members," said one of the leaders of the Bailey forces, "and will get others as soon as we perfect the permanent organization."

Mr. Bailey only received 347 votes in the county, and the claim is made that the large charter membership of the Bailey Club at Ballinger is due to the men who voted for other candidates now coming to Bailey.

The first hard work of the Bailey club will be to put over successfully the big Bailey rally here next Tuesday. The country is being covered with circulars, and efforts being made to bring people here to hear Bailey. After the speaking a campaign of publicity will be carried on, and Bailey's cause pushed as fast as work and money will do it.

The Bailey committee has contracted for space in The Ledger and an advertising campaign will be launched for Mr. Bailey.

NEW CHAPTER IN POLES TO FIGHT TRUNK MURDER

NEW YORK, July 30.—Eugene Leroy, who is being sought in old Mexico in connection with the murder of his wife and the shipping of her body in a trunk from Detroit to New York city, may be in this city, according to a clue picked up by the police and which is being followed successfully.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., July 30.—First trace of a second trunk sought by the police in their investigation of the Detroit murder mystery was found here today when police learned that a trunk shipped from Detroit was received at 800 Twelfth avenue, but was sent back by Mrs. C. L. Johnson, the tenant.

Mrs. Johnson said the trunk was delivered to her home about June 15 by the American Railway Express company. The charges were prepaid, she said, but she refused to accept the shipment because there was no name on the tag. She said the label on the trunk showed it had been shipped first to Fort Myer, Va., and then to Birmingham.

"I told the expressman I would not accept the trunk," said Mrs. Johnson, "because it might have a dead body in it."

Officials of the American Railway Express company here said they had no record of the receipt of a trunk addressed to the 12th avenue house and a search of the express office was made without result.

Notwithstanding the statement of the company officials, two negro employees at the receiving depot declared they remembered such a trunk as described by Mrs. Johnson and said they detected an odor from it. Two negroes delivered the trunk, according to Mrs. Johnson, but the manager of the express office said no negroes were employed as drivers.

Rev. R. M. Hall of Houston, will preach at the First Presbyterian church Sunday at the morning and evening hour. Rev. Hall formerly pastor of this church, will be kindly remembered by many Ballinger people.

THIRD DEATH IN COAL STRIKE

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., July 30. Emil Hicks, coal miner, died as the result of a pistol fight between union and non-union coal miners.

Hicks is the third death following the employment of non-union miners by a coal company at Carbon Hill. Recognition of the union is the only issue involved in the strike.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., July 30.—Eight thousand striking Illinois coal miners today drew two weeks back pay. Some of the miners were penalized as much as \$14.

NEFF AND BAILEY MEET IN COLEMAN

Ex-Senator Jos. W. Bailey and Hon. Pat M. Neff, candidates for the Democratic nomination for Governor of Texas, will speak in Coleman next Wednesday, August 4th, which is the first day of the American Legion Picnic and Barbecue to be held at Pecan Park.

Both candidates have confirmed the appointment by telegram since the primary July 24th determined that Mr. Bailey and Mr. Neff would be in the run-off. The speaking will be conducted in the afternoon beginning at 1:30 o'clock.

From ten to fifteen thousand people are expected to be in Coleman during the two days celebration of the American Legion, August 4th and 5th.

WARSAW, Poland, July 30.—

There is much uncertainty and suspense in Warsaw over the question of whether the Reds plan to cross the border fixed by the supreme council and continue to march on Warsaw. From intercepted wireless messages, it is understood that the Bolsheviks intend to play for time.

The Baranovitch armistice meeting, according to some reports, the Reds set on August 4, as the earliest date which they are willing to cease hostilities. It is considered apparent that the Reds are determined to capture Lemberg as a prize during the last days of the battle.

The Poles will defend Lemberg to the last, and if it falls, it will be the greatest battle conflict as all Lemberg is prepared to support the soldiers who will fight to a finish.

2 DEAD; 20 HURT IN CAR COLLISION

DENISON, Texas, July 30.—C. E. Hamilton, of Dallas, driver of a Frisco motor car, died today as the result of a collision with a gasoline tank exploded. The motor car collided with a truck loaded with gasoline yesterday, at Dorchester, near here. The truck driver was killed instantly. About twenty passengers on the motor car were burned as a result of the wreck. Some of the passengers were seriously burned and may die.

PASS LAW TO CONTROL DISORDER IN IRELAND

LONDON, July 30.—A bill to deal with disorders in Ireland, will be introduced next week in the House of Commons and passed in all its stages, according to Andrew Bonar Law.

WAR VETERAN REDS TO FINISH KILLED BY GUARD

GALVESTON, July 30.—Herbert Robertson, a veteran of the world war, and a captain of a local company of National Guardsmen, when the local company was organized here, was shot and killed by a sentry of the National Guard on duty here, as Robertson was passing a local camp in an automobile.

Robertson either failed to hear or disregarded the command of the sentry to halt, and the sentry fired upon the man. Private J. C. Pyer, whose home is at Center, Texas, a sentry in the guard on duty here, is said to have fired the shot.

BREAKS RECORD IN HIGH FINANCE

BOSTON, July 30.—Charles Ponzi claims to have amassed millions of dollars within a few months here, and paid the public large profits on investments in deals with international exchange, appearing to almost have satisfied his investors as to his solvency.

Clerks are paying off nearly as much on notes matured for fifty per cent profit in forty-five days as they were returning to the frightened investors in principal without interest on notes surrendered on short maturity.

Amounts paid out by Ponzi since the run began on his bank last Monday are estimated by his manager to total more than one million five hundred thousand dollars. Ponzi announced a few days ago that his liabilities were about three million dollars. He agreed with the authorities that he would accept no more funds from the public until an investigation of his accounts had been completed.

ICE MAN MAKES STATEMENT

S. W. Wright, local manager of the ice plant, has a statement in this issue of The Ledger in which he makes it clear that it is the desire of the company to give full weights in ice and that drivers of ice wagons are instructed to give full weights.

In conversation with the editor of The Ledger, Mr. Wright stated that it was absolutely false that the men were charged up with any shrinkage in ice. He says that the ice is not weighed out to the drivers, but so many bars of ice are counted out and the men are credited with whatever the ice weighs out, or for whatever the drivers turn in tickets.

"Our drivers are instructed to give full weights and the scales are tested every two or three days," said Mr. Wright, "and we will assist in prosecuting any driver charged with short weighting."

When asked whether the company or the driver paid the fine where conviction was had against the driver for short weighting, Mr. Wright stated that the driver had the fine to pay, and the company would not stand behind any
