CHINESE TROOPS ARE ALL SET FOR BATTLE

(By Associated Press) SHANGHAI, Feb. 4.—Conflicting reports have left Shanghai in doubt today as to the military situation south of here where Northern and Southern troops have taken positions for a battle which is expected to determine the possession of Shanghai, the control of the Yangtze valley and possibly the fate of the republican headquarters. Marshal Sun, defender of the city against the Cantonese advance, declared he was holding his own. Nationalist circles forecast his early collapse.

Publishing House for World's Blind

(By Associated Press) PARIS, Feb. 3.—Blind men and women at a publishing house for the blind here put out in Braille, books and magazines which bring together, in one written language, the sightless people of the world.

At the American Braille Press, housed in a mansion near the Trocadero, formerly occupied by the Duke of Clermont-Tonnerre, are edited monthly in English "The American Review for the Blind," and the "Interallied Braille Magazine."

In French twice a week "The Braille Courier," and once monthly "The Braille Magazine," and "The Musical and Literary Courier," are issued. "Il Progresso" is also published in Italian there, as well as various reviews in Serbian, Rumanian and Polish. Music for the blind is edited there. They are mailed throughout the world.

The patron and president of the house is William Nelson Cromwell, prominent American lawyer and world known philanthropist.

TWO M'ALESTER BANKS SUSPEND

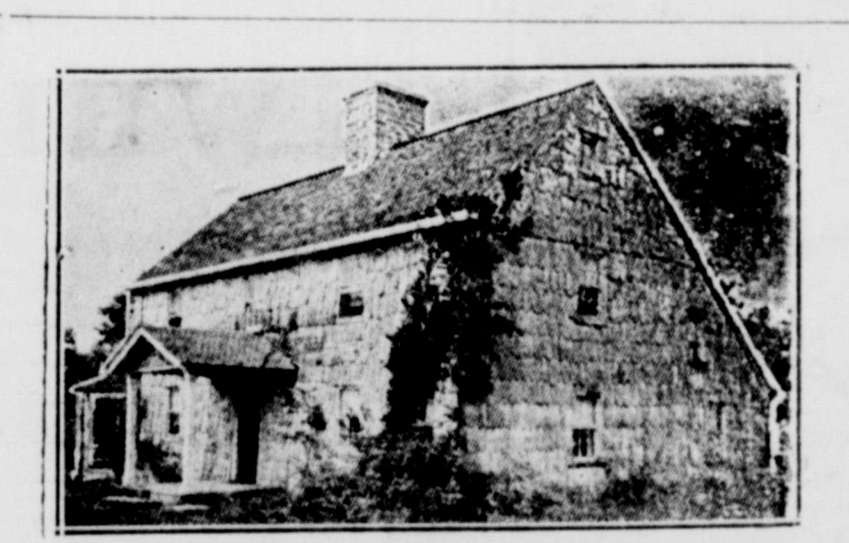

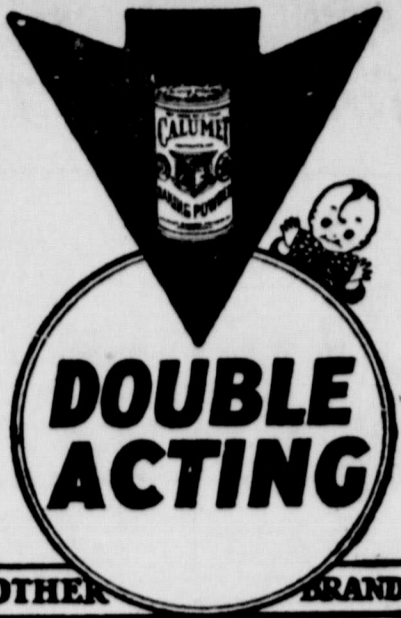

Iowa Women's Clubs Have 40,000 Members

The Iowa federation of women's clubs, headed by Mrs. Margaret M. Lake of Shenandoah, is the largest state group in the country. In its 942 clubs are 40,000 members. The federation wants women whose work is in the home counted as "employed women" by the census takers. Hitherto only salaried women have been enumerated as "employed." Woman's genius for order and detail, Mrs. Lake says, explains the rise of the sex in the business world.
