## Last Rites Held For Bill Lacy

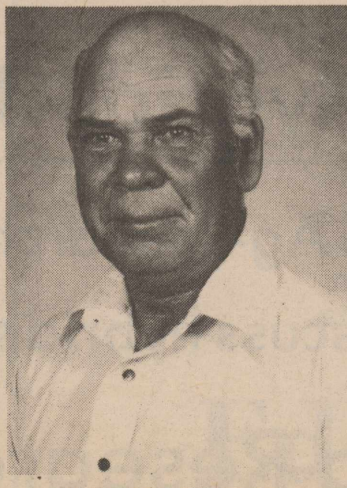

## Grid Guessing Gets Started

Guessing begins this week in the annual Hart Beat football prediction contest with the deadline for entering at noon Friday. The first contest entry blanks and the games to be considered are in last week's issue (Aug. 26) of the Hart Beat.

The contest is fun and costs nothing to enter. Contestants need not be "football experts" in order to compete. Anyone may enter and all members of a family may have fun competing with one another. Friend can challenge friend.

Only one entry is allowed per person. Contestants should be careful to complete the entry according to rules. Each year a number of contestants lose points by failing to mark a winner in every contest, forgetting to pick a tie-breaker score and even neglecting to fill in the entry blank with their name and address. Careless mistakes can cost a contestant the grand prize.

Grand prize in the contest is \$50. That goes to the contestant with the most correct picks for the entire season. There are three prizes each week. Best guesser for the week receives \$5 with second and third places earning \$3 and \$2, respectively.

In case of ties, the tie-breaker score is used to determine the winner. The tie-breaker is also counted in

the week's total games. If there is still a tie after counting the tie-breaker prediction, contestants will divide winnings.

The contest is made possible by the local merchants whose ads appear in the contest pages. A game is listed in each ad and contests should pick a winner in each game. That team's number should be circled on the entry blank.

The entry blank only should be deposited with any of the sponsoring merchants prior to noon Friday. Late entries will not be counted.

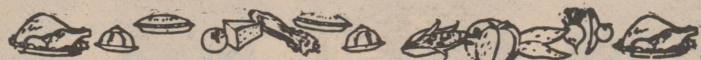

### MAGIC CARMEL PIE

Cover one (unopened) can of Eagle Brand milk with water and boil for three hours. Be sure to keep can covered with water while cooking. Cool in can one hour. Add  $\frac{3}{4}$  c pecans and pour into baked pie shell. Top with Cool Whip.

### SOUR CREAM FUDGE

2 c sugar  
1 c sour cream  
dash of salt  
1 t vanilla  
2 T butter or oleo  
1 c pecan pieces

Cook sugar, sour cream and salt over low heat to soft-ball stage; stir occasionally. Remove from heat; stir in vanilla and butter. Cool to lukewarm; beat until candy loses gloss.

### LICKITY QUICK LEMON-ADE BREAD

$\frac{1}{2}$  c shortening  
1 c sugar

2 eggs  
 $1\frac{1}{2}$  c flour  
2 t baking powder  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  c milk  
 $\frac{1}{3}$  c plus 1 T frozen lemonade (thawed)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine all ingredients except lemonade concentrate in large mixing bowl. Blend well and beat for 3 minutes in electric mixer at medium speed. Pour batter into greased 9 x 5 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 50-60 minutes. Loosen bread from edge of pan. Pour lemonade concentrate over bread. Cool; remove from pan.

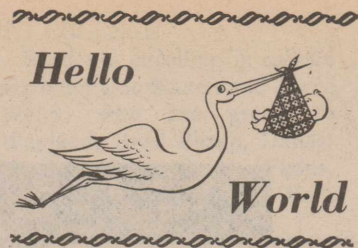

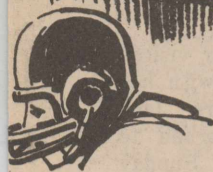

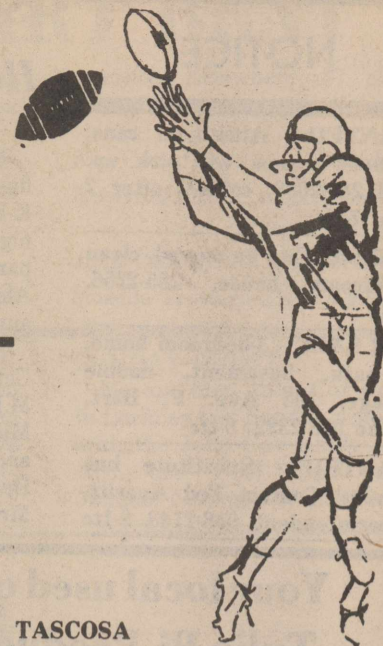

An error was made in last week's Cook of the Week column. The recipe for Caramel Nut Ice Cream was not complete. The corrected recipe is:

**CARAMEL NUT ICE CREAM**  
For 5 qt ice cream freezer:

Caramelize 2 c sugar in large cast iron skillet or very heavy utensil. (Use med. low heat and stir to prevent scorching). When melted, stir in 1 tall can evaporated milk. To avoid lumping, pour very slowly and stir rapidly. Add second can evaporated milk and set aside to cool. Beat 5 eggs till lemony and gradually add 2 additional c sugar. Mix with caramelized sugar and milk. Place in freezer bucket and finish filling with whole milk. Add finely chopped pecans (the more the better). Freeze.

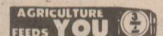

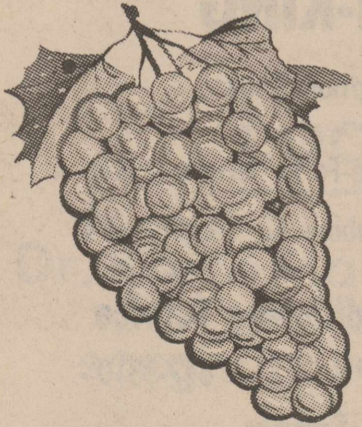
