



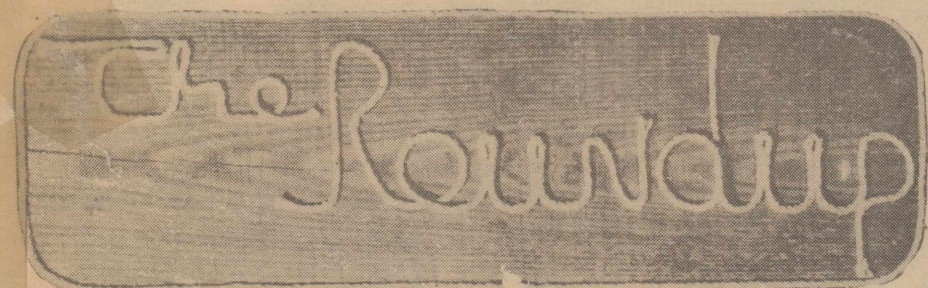

## 75-04 gets silver wings for Christmas

Thirty-eight members of the 75-04 Wing Class will be pinning silver wings on the wings of the Air Force pilot in graduation ceremonies at 10:30 a.m. today in Simler Theater.

The ceremonies will mark the end of an intense year of physical and mental training. From Reese, the 38 new pilots will travel to assignments throughout the world.

Guest speaker at the event will be Maj. Gen. Bryan M. Shotts, commander of the Keesler Technical Training Center at Keesler AFB, Miss., the electronics training center of the Air Force.

Commissioned as a second lieutenant in December 1942, General Shotts served as an instructor pilot and flew combat missions in the European Theater during World War II. After the war he went on to many assignments, both in the States and England, Japan and Turkey.

In February 1973 he assumed his present post as Commander of the Keesler Technical Training Center.

His military honors include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit with one oak leaf cluster, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star Medal, Air Medal with four oak leaf clusters, Air Force Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters and the Purple Heart.

### Assignments

**Kenneth E. Trammel Jr.** will fly the RC-135 variation of the Stratotanker at Eielson AFB, Alaska.

The McDonnell F-4 Phantom will seat five of the class' members. They are **Captains Dale A. Fiala** and **Andrew P. Medler** at MacDill AFB, Fla. and **Second Lieutenants Laird R. Johnson**, Glyn D. Martin and **Robert E. Plaag** at Luke AFB, Ariz.

Three of the new pilots will fly the Boing B-52 Stratofortress at their next base. **Capt. Thomas G. Sullivan** will fly the "Buff" at Griffiss AFB and **2nd Lieutenants Craig C. Warner** and **John J. Wright** will fly it at Kinchloe AFB, Mich. and Carswell AFB, respectively.

### Lots of Tweets

Assignments to fly the Cessna T-37 Tweety Bird were also plentiful. **Second Lt. Richard W. Angerer** will fly it at Sheppard AFB, Tex. and **2nd Lieutenants Robert M. Brand**, **William E. Fox Jr.** and **Dennis M. Royer** will return to Reese to pilot the Tweet.

Also returning here, but scheduled to

instruct in the Northrop T-38 Talon, are **2nd Lieutenants Leon R. Casaubon**, **Gregory R. Fonner** and **Robert D. Hall**.

Two of the graduates will go to Clark AB in the Philippines. **Second Lt. Robert L. Starr** will pilot the Lockheed C-130 Hercules and **2nd Lt. John C. Sand** will fly the HC-130 there.

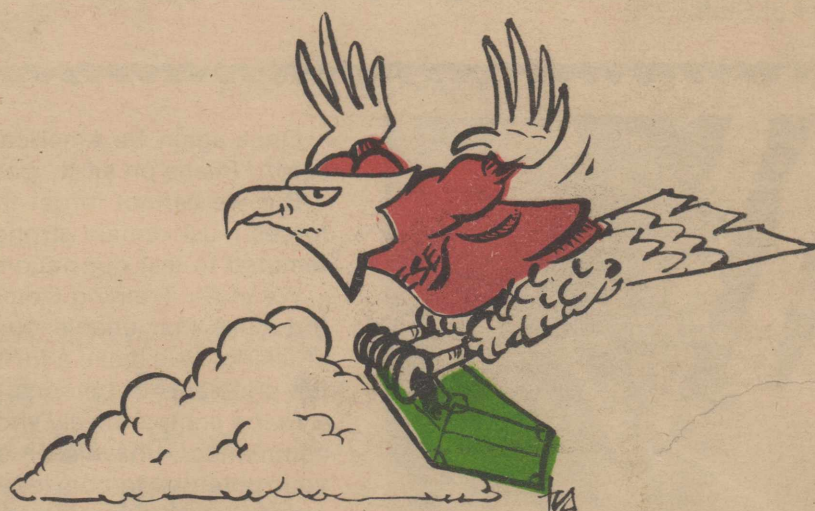

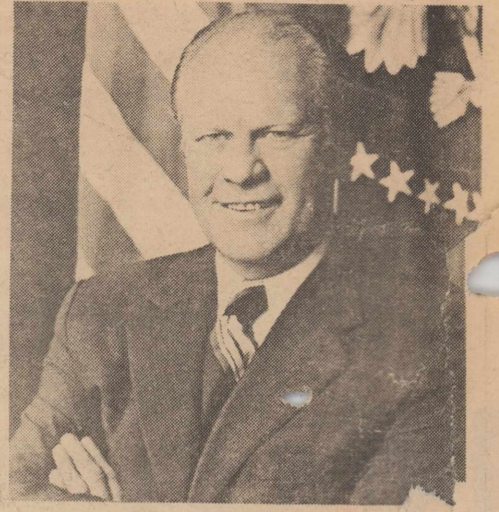

# President, top officials offer Christmas greetings

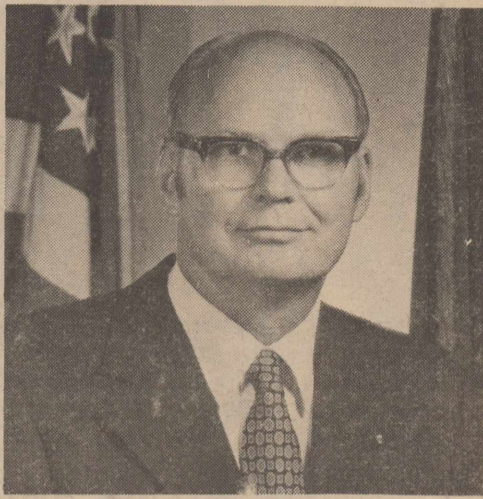
To the men and women of our Armed Forces:

Once again we Americans can celebrate Christmas joyfully in its true spirit, "Peace on earth, good will toward men." Our country is at peace.

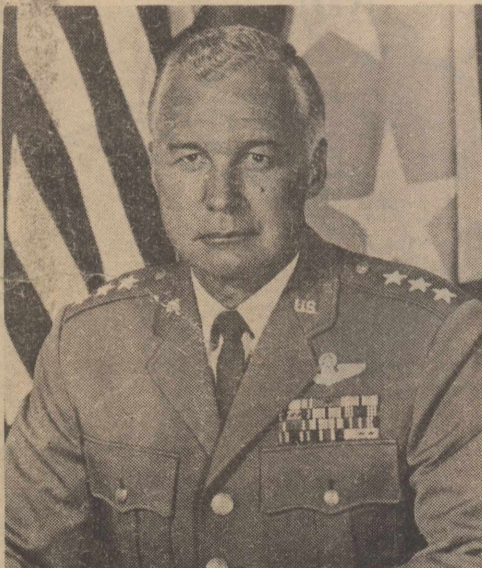
But we cannot forget that peace is fragile; to maintain it our armed forces must remain strong enough to give pause to any who might be tempted to test our national and strength.

Capt. James W. Twaddell has been named 54th Flying Training Squadron Instructor Pilot of the Month.

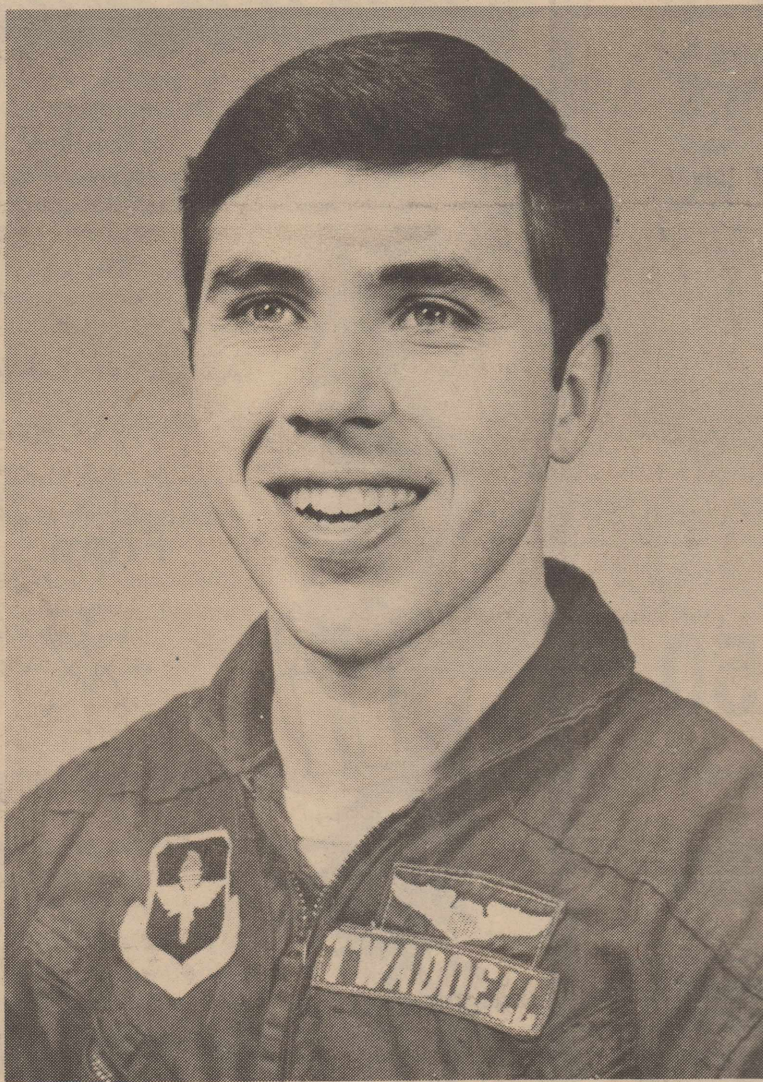

# Top ATC enlisted man visits with Reese NCOs

CMSgt. Thomas F. Silk, Air Training Command senior airman advisor, answered questions from Reese's senior NCOs Dec. 12 ending a three-day visit here.

Chief Silk's prime concern was improved job and career satisfaction for the enlisted force. He questioned Reese's senior NCOs on their ideas on how to keep high quality NCOs past the 20-year point.

Chief Silk thought our Saturday morning Air Force Manual 35-10 Dress and Personal Appearance school was an effective method of bringing standards up to an acceptable level.

All present agreed that maximum effort should be made to inform newer NCOs of the advantages of attending a base Leadership School, the Command NCO Academy or the Air Force Senior NCO Academy.

He was enthused over a proposed top-three NCO meeting with Col. Schuyler Bissell, wing commander, and his deputies on a monthly basis. This program has his highest support as a direct line of communication to the highest level of command.

Along these lines, Chief Silk said there is concern that some supervisors may not be giving their people complete and true descriptions on their Airman Performance Reports. Items most often missed included additional duties, civic activities and very often referring to an individual as a technician when in reality he is a supervisor.

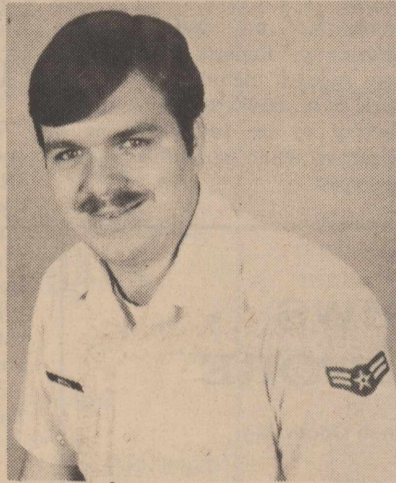

On Dec. 12 the Red Cross held a Christmas party for the USAF Hospital personnel. Everyone was invited for punch and a lot of homemade goodies.

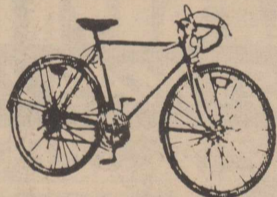

## Christmas OPLAN predicts elf's visit to Reese on holiday

(Editor's note: The following OPLAN, drawn up by Margie Negri, secretary to the Base Civil Engineer, has become rather a "standard operating procedure" as traditions fill the air this time of year at Reese.)

HEADQUARTERS 64TH Flying Training Wing  
Reese AFB, Tex.  
December, 1974

### 64TH FLYING TRAINING WING OPLAN 12-24-74 OPERATION - SANTA CLAUS

1. GENERAL: An official visit by Major General S. Calus is expected at this station 25 December 1974.

2. SITUATION:

a. Not a creature will stir without permission. This will include indigenous mice. Special stirring permits for necessary administrative action will be obtained through normal channels. Mice-stirring permits will be secured through Base Personnel, with prior coordination through SP.

b. Personnel will settle their brains for a long winter nap prior to 2200 hours, 24 December 1974. Uniform for nap: pajamas, cotton, light, drowsing, with kerchief, general purpose, OK and/or cap, fatigue with ear flaps. Equipment will be drawn from LGSE prior to 1900 hours.

3. ASSUMPTION: Personnel will utilize standard ration sugar plums or appropriate beverages for visions to dance in their heads. These items will be drawn from the wing dining hall, Officers' Open Mess or NCO Open Mess.

4. General Instructions: Stocking, wool, cushion sole, will be hung by chimneys with care. Necessary precautions will be taken to avoid chimney fires caused by carelessly hung stockings. Squadron Safety officials will submit stocking hanging plans to this Headquarters prior to 0800 hours, 21 December 1974.

5. COMMAND AND SIGNAL: At first sign of clatter from lawn, all troops will spring from bed to investigate and evaluate cause. Immediate action will be taken to tear open shutters and throw open window sashes. OPS PLAN "Saint Nick," dated 12 December 1974, supporting document to this plan, will be in effect to facilitate shutter tearing and sash throwing. Section chiefs will be appointed for Reese Village and will familiarize all personnel with procedures and will be responsible for seeing that no shutters are torn or sashes thrown prior to start of official clatter.

6. EXECUTION:

a. Prior to 2400 hours, date of visit, all personnel will be assigned "Wondering Eyes" stations. After shutters are torn and sashes thrown, these stations will be manned.

b. The Base Transportation Officer will assign one sleigh, miniature, M-63, and eight (8) deer, rein, tiny, for use of General Claus' visit. He will insure that the driver assigned to accompany General Claus has a current rooftop license and less than four points assessed from driving violations. Applications for drivers are being taken now; but all Student Squadron personnel are automatically eliminated by the overmaximum assessment of driving violation points. All "Wondering Eyes" stations will automatically disregard the haircut sideburns stipulations of AFR 30-1 and AFM 35-10 when General Claus arrives for visit. The driver will accommodate General Claus in shouting clearly, "On Dasher, on Dancer, on Prancer and Vixen; up Comet, up Cupid, on Donder and Blitzen." CE Division will have one each skycrane available as backup transportation in the event of faulty sleigh ride.

c. General Claus will enter Reese Village and Base Quarters through chimneys. All housing units, barracks and BOQs without chimneys will draw Chimney Simulator, M-6, for use during the operation. Chimneys will be drawn on Reese Form 555 and will be submitted to LGSE in seven (7) copies prior to 21 December 1974.

d. Personnel will be well-rehearsed in the shouting of "Happy Christmas to all and to all a good night." This shout will be given on the termination of General Claus' visit. Uniformity of shouting is the responsibility of Squadron Commanders. SPECIAL NOTE: All personnel are also reminded to refrain from the slang version - "Sock it to 'em Santa."

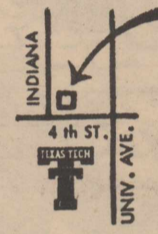

# Reese suggestors earn \$\$\$ while saving base, AF same

In a recent Suggestion Awards Committee meeting, 17 Reese people had ideas approved.

Many ideas paying high benefits to both suggestors and Air Force are not complex. 1st Lt. Lafayette P. Temple III submitted a suggestion to let each flight crew member maintain his own water bottle. Prior to that, more than \$5,135 was being spent yearly by the base for their issue and upkeep. Lieutenant Temple, 35th Flying Training Squadron, was awarded \$310.

### Ease the Job

Making one's job easier is a sure way of earning extra money. James E. Whitehead, Transportation, noted that the reel rewind cables on refuelers had to be constantly repaired or replaced. With a little ingenuity he devised a rod which extended the cable's life. This afforded annual savings of \$4,524.15 for the base and Whitehead earned himself \$280, just in time for Christmas.

Not all suggestions have tangible benefits; many have benefits in which safety, moral, working conditions or methods are improved. Some suggestions warrant cash awards and some noncash awards.

Shirley E. Hall, Personnel Division, suggested a procedure of mailing Field Personnel Records. It was approved by the Air Force Military Personnel Center. The scope of the idea helped make a change in personnel processing procedures. Intangible benefits are evident in the simplification of work. For her efforts, a \$50 award was granted.

An example of a noncash award for an approved suggestion with intangible benefits would be that of Capt. Lamar C. Smith of the 54th FTS. His idea to publish the operating hours of base facilities occasionally in the base newspaper is a good idea. Captain Smith was awarded a certificate for his suggestion.

Suggestion awards are also

earned by just being observant. Sammie S. Johnson, Transportation Division, noticed that the "Serv-o-plate" (AF Form 1252) was wearing out prematurely. By suggesting that a holder be used to protect the plate, \$320 will be saved annually. An award of \$35 was granted.

### Reduced Listings

Norma L. Thompson, 64th Supply Sq. earned \$25 for her idea to reduce and separate due-out revalidation listings. The procedure was partially adopted with intangible benefits.

Making our job easier is further emphasized by Harold D. Haskell, 64th Field Maintenance Sq. (FMS). His fabrication of an instrument to inspect bleed valves on the J-85 engine was approved by Air Training Command with a savings of \$362.40 for the base.

An idea to bulk purchase liquid nitrogen for the Reese USAF Hospital earned Sgt. Andrew Cox, Procurement Division, \$25.

### Other Action

Other committee action granted TSgt. Gerald J. Dee, 64th Civil Engineering Sq., a \$25 award and 1st Lt. Robert E. LeCount, 64th FMS, a \$75 award, while saving the base \$782.54.

SSgt. David Leach, formerly of 64th FMS, earned \$50 for improving administrative procedures. A1C Michael R. Terre, 64th Organizational Maintenance Sq., earned a total of \$75 for two suggestions which improved working conditions. Suggestion

were given to MSgt. Herman E. Robinson Jr., 2053rd Communications Sq., and TSgt. Charles W. Carson, A1C Richard D. Huff and A1C Thomas J. LaFaver, all of 64th FMS.

• Time: 6:30 p.m. Christmas Eve; Place: On city streets of North Central Texas metropolis; What: Three-vehicle collision at intersection when one driver failed to yield right-of-way to another car; Toll: Passenger in one car killed.

• Time: 8:48 p.m. Christmas Eve; Place: City streets of growing medium sized North Texas city; What: Two-car broadside collision

with one of the drivers speeding and under the influence of alcohol and one of whom ran a stop sign; Toll: One woman and unborn child killed.

• Time: 9:15 p.m. Christmas Eve; Place: City streets of large Gulf Coastal city; What: Drinking pedestrian walking in roadway against traffic and was struck by on-coming drinking driver; Toll: One killed.

• Time 10 p.m. Christmas Eve; Place: On streets of far West Texas city; What: Hit-and-run; Toll: One killed.

• Time: 2 a.m. Christmas Day; Place: Straight stretch of rural farm to market road in Central Texas; What: Speeding driver under influence of alcohol ran off roadway on right side, crossed ditch and hit culvert abutment; Toll: One dead.

• Time: 3:50 a.m. Christmas Day; Place: Nine miles north of a Northeast Texas city; What: Speeding pickup ran off roadway on west side, side-swiped tree and slid broadside into another tree; Toll: One killed.

• Time: 9:37 a.m. Christmas Day; Place: City streets of spreading Gulf Coast city; What: Two-car broadside accident in which one driver was attempting a left turn in front of an on-coming vehicle and failed to yield the right-of-way; Toll: One passenger in vehicle killed.

• Time: 11:45 a.m. Christmas Day; Place: Highway intersection south of busy Central Texas county seat city; What: Two-car broadside collision with one driver failing to

yield the right of way and a second driver apparently speeding over the limit. Toll: One passenger in one vehicle killed.

• Time: 1:39 p.m. Christmas Day; Place: City streets of West Texas oil and gas town; What: One drinking driver, who was speeding, lost control of his automobile, hit street curb, flipped over and skidded upside down. Toll: One killed.

• Time: 6:05 p.m. Christmas Day; Place: City streets of a Panhandle grain producing city; What: Two-car broadside collision when one driver attempted a left-turn in front of approaching vehicle. Toll: One driver killed.

• Time: 6:30 p.m. Christmas Day; Place: City street intersection in Gulf Coast city; What: Drinking pedestrian departed night club on side of road and attempted to cross in front of approaching vehicle, which was unable to stop in time. Toll: One dead.

• Time: 9:05 p.m. Christmas Day; Place: Highway intersection in another Gulf Coastal town; What: Hit-and-run accident involving unknown auto which cut corner at intersection and struck pedestrian as he attempted to cross thoroughfare; Toll: One killed.

• Time: 11:30 p.m. Christmas Day; Place: Six miles north of East Texas fishing & hunting town; What: Drinking driver lost control of his vehicle, crossed the highway and slid sideways, hit tree and overturned with the impact throwing the victim from his car; Toll: One killed.

The 14 separate mishaps thumbnailed above actually occurred at Christmas last year and accounted for the deaths of 14 persons during a 30-hour period. Twelve died during the observance and two died several weeks later.

Col. Wilson E. Speir, Texas Department of Public Safety director, said drinking or speeding were major contributing factors in 10 of the deaths last year. Four of the dead were auto-pedestrian mishaps, he noted.

Five of the toll killed during the 30-hour period were claimed during the first six hours of the holiday period.

This year, Speir estimates that 14 persons will be killed on the state's streets and highways during a comparable 30-hour period starting at 6 p.m., Tuesday and continuing through midnight Christmas Day.

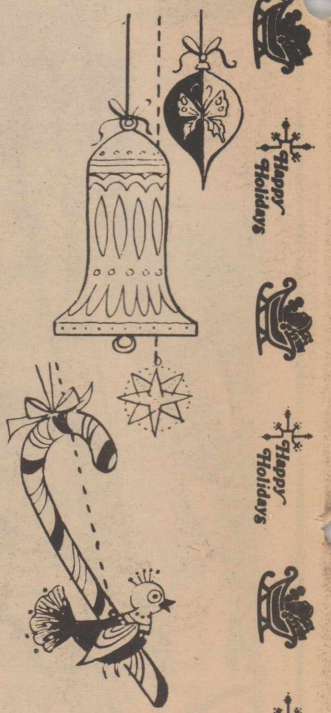

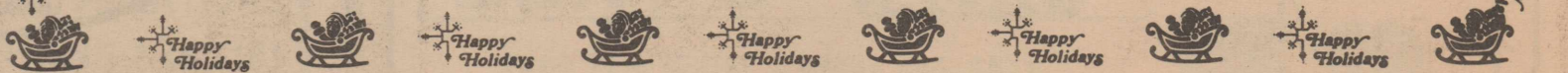

Besides having a great evening of fun with your family and friends, your purchase of tickets will help provide a home for needy youngsters here in our own community.

Texas Boys Ranch was organized in January of 1973. A group of Christian men met and saw a need for a home for boys who were homeless, neglected, dependant and predelinquent.

According to the Juvenile Probation authorities in Lubbock County, 899 boys were handled by their office in 1971. The local welfare offices say that they are working with 35 to 55 boys on a given day. Most of the boys do not need the restrictions of a penal institution. Instead they need a place where they will have firm supervision and control, tempered with affection and guidance.

This problem of innocent boys being sent to reformatories, simply because there just is not any place else to send them, grows in magnitude each year.

Texas Boys Ranch will provide a home for boys who may remain at the Ranch until they finish high school, master a trade or until their home situation becomes such that they may return to it.

The basic concept of the Ranch is to house 10 to 12 boys in each

cottage, along with a couple, who serve as Cottage Parents.

The original program call for 10 boys (first cottage will be completed in March 1975) with expansion up to 100 boys within five years.

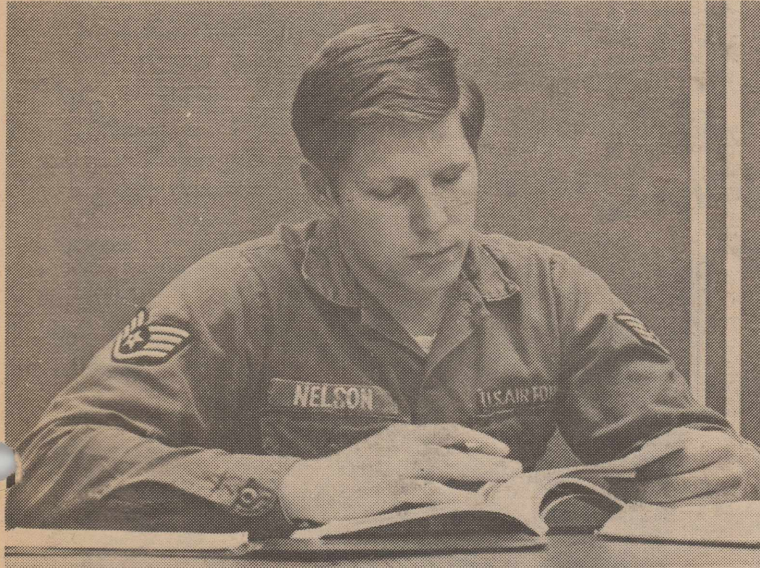
### New Degree

**SOUTH PLAINS COLLEGE** in Levelland is a two-year SOC school which gives Reese excellent cooperation. Daily counseling is available.

**LUBBOCK CHRISTIAN COLLEGE** is a new four-year SOC school which has issued some contracts for degree, an excellent opportunity to guarantee a bachelor's degree.

**WAYLAND BAPTIST COLLEGE** in Plainview was the first four-year SOC officially in this area. WBC also developed two bachelor of science occupational studies this summer. Wayland has three self-paced courses on base: attractive mini-terms; a Lubbock police program and a new program at Sheppard AFB, Tex. is attractive to military students.

These three local schools evaluate CCAF as it applies to a degree.

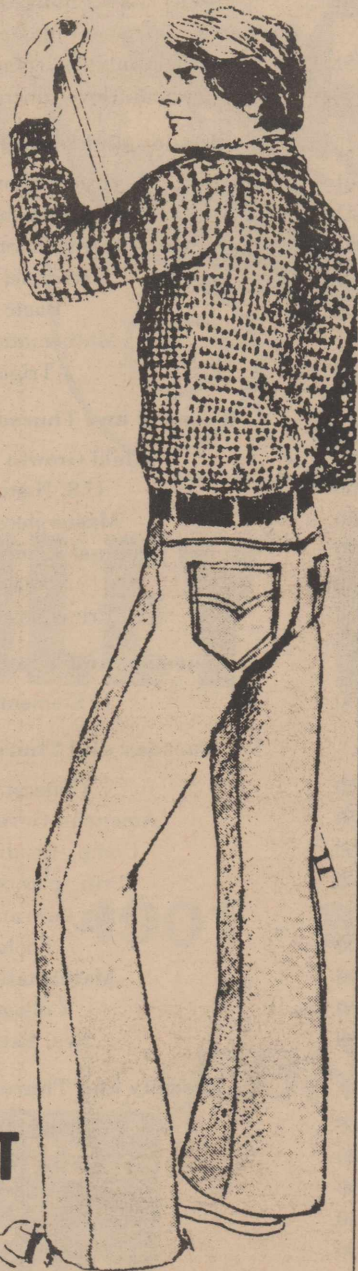

Commissary  
explains new  
price policy

The Commissary Sales Store has a new pricing policy, and I would like to explain it.

When the invoice cost price or current Federal Consolidated Price List requires that the selling price be increased, items already on the shelves will not be affected. They will continue to be sold at the old price until those shelf stocks are depleted.

Items in the new shipments and unmarked warehouse stock from any previous shipment will be sold at the new price. Items being placed on the shelves at higher prices will be put behind the items still marked with the old prices.

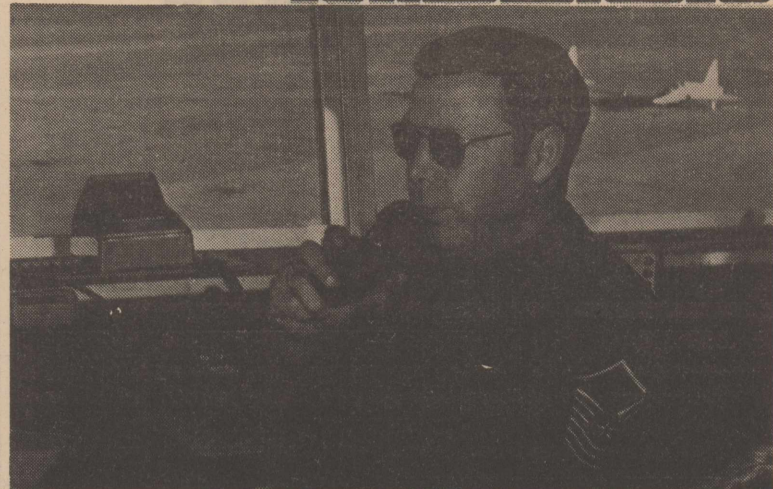
Also, where prices are displayed on shelf moldings, that price will be changed to reflect the new price at the time merchandise is placed on the shelves at the newer prices.

Price changes will be made before the store opens for business and not during operating hours.

This pricing policy is being started to reduce the workload involved with price changing in the store. Under this policy, items may appear on the shelves at different prices, in which case they will be sold as marked.

**Remember:** When the price goes up, items already on the shelves will stay at the old price. When the price goes down, stock on the shelves will be reduced to reflect the new price.

DoD still encouraging  
participation in carpools

Earlier this year the Department of Defense started a rather strong Carpool Program to reduce the use of gas.

During the summer, the crisis was reduced and DoD was able to relax the earlier carpooling policy. Many of our personnel thought the entire policy was withdrawn, but it was not. It was simply put onto a voluntary basis instead of being required.

The need to conserve fuel will exist for the foreseeable future and DoD policy is still in support of that program. Reese people who form a carpool will be assigned the parking space of their choice, within reason. Others may use any space not officially reserved or assigned to a carpool.

To make the Carpool Program as simple as possible, each parking lot and each parking space will be assigned a number. The carpool number, then, will be a combination of the lot and space numbers. For instance, the carpool using Lot 81, Space 4 will be numbered 81-04.

Spaces bearing the earlier style of carpool marking, "CP-00", are no longer valid and are open parking.

People in carpools who have not recently revalidated their pool, as well as people wishing to form a new one, may do so by sending a letter to Maj. Charles E. Hart, wing executive officer, at CCE/Stop 47. The letter must include each carpool member's name, grade, Social Security Number, duty section and phone, as well as the lot and space number of the space desired.

The letter will also state that the people listed are using a carpool and be signed by each member. Questions should be directed to Major Hart at Ext. 2411.

A carpool is defined as two or more people riding together, eliminating the use of at least one car. There are no provisions for people who cannot form a carpool due to lack of people who want to join. However, as stated, there are no restrictions on where anyone may park, except in the marked spaces.
