If you are approached by anyone, offering repairs to home, roofs asphalt on driveways, lightning rods, or any other type of service, to please refrain from contracting with these people, attempt to obtain a license plate number, description of the vehicle or both, that the subjects are operating at the time. Please contact the sheriffs office or city police, if approached by any of this type of subject. Nurse trained in breast cancer detection, teaching of breast self examination, and a mammogram.

Currently, the most effective method known to win the battle against breast cancer is early detection. Early detection is best done by following the guidelines recommended by the American Cancer Society for breast cancer screening for women who have no signs or symptoms of breast cancer. The guidelines are:

1. Learn and perform breast self examination every month.

2. Have a physical examination every year.

3. Have a mammogram according to the recommendations by age.

40 to 50 a mammogram every 1 to years.
