**Gins Here To Join Compress And
Warehouse Deal At Sweetwater**

Members of the Cooperative Gin Association Friday night voted 50 to 15 to join with other gins of the area in building a compress and warehouses at Sweetwater. The meeting was held at the Lions Club building with approximately 50 in attendance. Cards had been mailed to all farmers in the area who had ginned cotton at either of the Co-op gins here with instructions to vote on the issue and leave the

card at one of the gin offices. Of the 235 cards sent out only 69 were returned with a vote.

The compress and warehouses were first scheduled to be placed at Roscoe but difficulties arose there and the site was moved to Sweetwater at the old Gulf Refinery site.

Gene Howard of Roscoe, manager of the newly organized association, was here to explain the deal to the farmers.

**A.S.C. Community Committeemen

ONIONS MAKE GOOD HERE

R. H. Phillips raises onions on a small plot of ground each year and this year was no exception. He had one-tenth of an acre planted to onions and harvested approximately 1500 pounds of nice large onions.

If Mr. Phillips had planted an acre to onions and his harvest had been as good he would have made 15,000 pounds to the acre, that's more than 7 tons.

**SouthernPartOfLoraine
Area Gets Rain**

The southern part of the Loraine territory received some rain last week measuring from a half inch up to 1.60, but the northern part of the territory did not fare so well. Cline Taylor reported .30 of an inch which was about as much as was received in that section. The central portion around Loraine remained bone dry.

**MAJOR PROVISIONS OF 1964
FEED GRAIN PROGRAM**

The 1964 feed grain program will be basically the same as the successful 1963 program, Curtis Latimer, Chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation County Committee, said today. The sign-up period for both fall and spring sown crops is planned for early 1964.

As recommended by producers, the Chairman pointed out, the Department of Agriculture has held changes to the "fewest consistent with law and economic circumstances." The major change in next year's feed grain program is an increase in the top limit on diversion from a farm's base acreage with an increase in the rate of payment for maximum diversion. This is intended to encourage producers to divert additional feed grain acreage and to increase their income.

In 1964, a producer may divert as much as 50 percent of his feed grain base acreage (in 1963 it was 40 percent), and those who divert from 40 to 50 percent will receive age payments at the maximum rate for all acres diverted. As before, the maximum acreage diversion will be 25 acres if this is more than 50 percent of the base. As in the 1963 program, two rates of diversion payment will be offered: (a) Producers who divert at least 20 percent of their base acres will be eligible for payments (based on the county price support rate for the feed grain diverted) on 20 percent of the normal yield of the diverted acres; (b) for diversions between 20 and 40 percent of their acreage, the payments on this part of the diversion will be at a rate of 50 percent of the farm's normal yield times the county support rate. Participants who divert 40 to 50 percent of the base (or 25 acres, if this is greater) will receive the 50 percent maximum rate of payment on all acres diverted. Under a new legal provision, payments may not exceed 20 percent of the value of the land diverted.

The total national average price support levels in 1964 will be the same as in 1963, but a slightly larger proportion of the support will be made available through loans. For the feed grains covered by the program, the loan rate, support payments, and total national average support are, respectively: Corn (per bu.), \$1.10, 84 cents, \$1.25; barley (per bu.), 84 cents, 12 cents, 96 cents; grain sorghum (per cwt.), \$1.77, 23 cents, \$2.00.

Payment-in-kind for both diversion and the non-loan part of the price support will again be made in the form of negotiable certificates with which the producer may receive grain from CCC stocks or cash at the ASCS County Office if he wishes CCC to help in marketing the certificates.

As in the past, eligibility for payments and price support will be conditional upon maintenance of normal acreage (1959-60 average) in soil-conserving crops or practices, including summer fallow and idle land. Also as in the past, a producer who owns or operates more than one farm will be eligible to participate in the program on one farm only if, on each of his other farms, the feed grain base is not exceeded.

The first bale of cotton for the season was ginned late Monday, August 12, by Coop Gin No. 2. The bale was brought in by Eugene Smith and was gathered from irrigated cotton. He brought in 1670 pounds of seed cotton and got a 435 pound bale.

We ask Joyce Lynn Furlow to tell us about her trip to Hawaii this summer and in the following article she has done a good job giving us the highlights of the 7 weeks she spent on the island.

With Joyce's pleasing personality and varied talents we know she must have crowded a lot into those 7 weeks, an educational and pleasure trip one dreams of, but come true for Joyce.

Thank you Joyce for sharing some of the highlights with us, we know others will enjoy your report as we did.

I left Dallas Love Field on June 21 for Kapaia, Kaula, Hawaii for 7 fascinating weeks of fun and education.

Enrolled in the school were 150 boys and girls from Texas and 14 other states.

The first week was spent getting settled, meeting everyone, getting use to being away from home and getting back in the swing of school.

Besides the regular school day from 8 a.m. to 12:30 we spent the other half of the day among Kaula's friendly people, taking courses in hula, ukelele, surfing, skindiving and fishing.

During the week we toured the island, visited plantations, sugar mills, museums, went to the Lava Tube Slide, went shopping and spent much time on the beach.

On weekends the islanders has luau's for us and had entertainment for their clubs.

Two weekends we went to a carnival in Lihue. They were very much like ours on the mainland.

During our stay we were privileged to see a most unusual group of entertainers, Merchant Marine cadets from the Japanese training ship Kaiwo Maru, put on a program featuring judo and Karate. We had a fine time at the luau that the community had for all of us trying to talk to them.

One weekend we had much excitement at the arrival of the sailing yachts in their completion of the Trans-Pacific Yacht Race and submarine Star Lance into Nawiliwili Harbor where we sunned and surfed.

Our fourth weekend we took a tour of two other islands. We took off by plane Friday afternoon as soon as school was out. We arrived at Maui, were met with leis and music, then we toured Lahaina, ancient capital of the Hawaiian Islands. That night we returned to the Hakilau Hotel for dinner. Saturday morning we visited the Haleakala crater, largest extinct volcano in the world. Then we went to the airport for our flight to Kona, Hawaii. Here we toured the Black Sand Beach, Hawaii National Park with a stop at Volcano House, Rainbow Falls and the orchid and anthurium gardens. Couldn't resist sending some orchid leis home. We flew back to our island Sunday night, and were met by a royal welcome from the ones that were left behind. This was the highlight of the whole trip.

Soon we realized it was time for our return to the mainland and leave all our fun and friends. It took much maneuvering to get everything we had collected into our bags.

We left at 2 a.m. Saturday morning after the islanders had had a farewell party for us. We landed in Honolulu very early and had the whole day there. We visited Pearl Harbor, Diamond Head and spent the afternoon at Waikiki Beach.

Saturday night we boarded the plane at 11 o'clock very tired but also excited realizing we would soon be home.

**People Warned Against Abuse
Of Higher Speed Limits**

Austin-The director of the Texas Department of Public Safety warned motorists today "not to" the new, higher speed limits too literally" when they go into effect August 23.

Col. Homer Garrison Jr. reminded that "there are a multitude of circumstances and situations under which even the old limits were too fast for safety."

"With more than two-thirds of the highway system under a 70 mile-per-hour daytime maximum speed for passenger cars and 65 miles per hour at night, we wish to appeal to all Texans to exercise keen judgement and drive reasonably and prudently regardless of what the signs say. The law prohibits driving a vehicle too fast for existing conditions."

"The Department of Public Safety believes that the objective of speed legislation is to contribute to the efficient movement of traffic on the highways. We feel the new law will help to accomplish this, and our objective of enforcement is to secure substantial compliance with the speed law by all users of the rural highways."

"The prima facie speed limits fixed by the Legislature or established by zoning authority will be construed to be the maximum permissible speeds under normal conditions, and speeds in excess of such limits will be considered illegal."

"Our enforcement personnel will stop and initiate appropriate enforcement action against all persons observed by them to be committing clearcut and substantial violations of the speed law."

Garrison urged motorists to be particularly cautious in assuming the higher night speed limit of 65 miles per hour. He said research by the U. S. Bureau of Public Roads shows that increasing night speeds from 55 MPH to 70 MPH doubles the accident involvement rate, and that the severity of accidents increases rapidly at speeds over 70 MPH.

"We repeat that serious problems may develop with the new speed laws unless the driving public accepts and applies them with a high degree of responsibility to themselves and their families and others," he said.

"And we would like to emphasize at this time that traffic deaths are running far ahead of last year already, with an increase of about 100 deaths. Unless we can hold the line against this trend, we will wind up with an all-time high traffic death toll in 1963."

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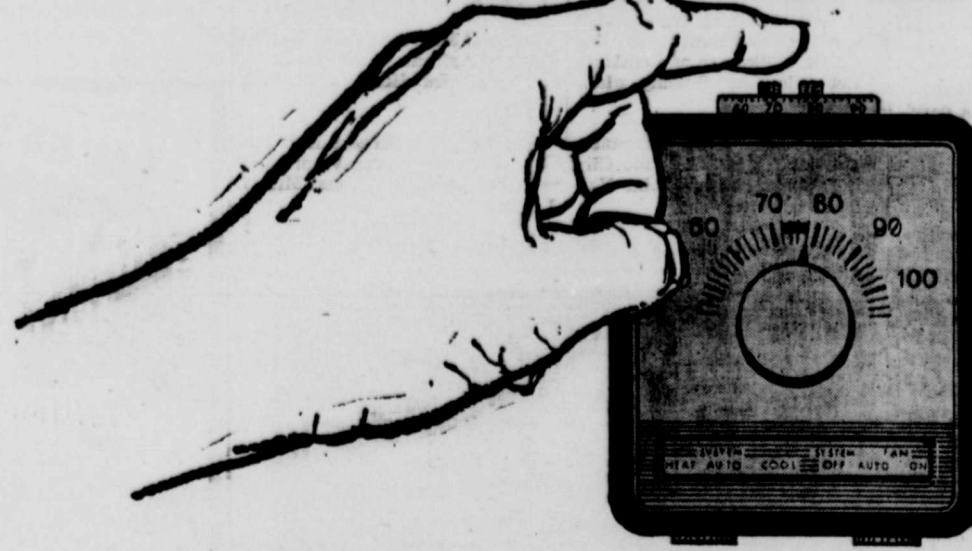

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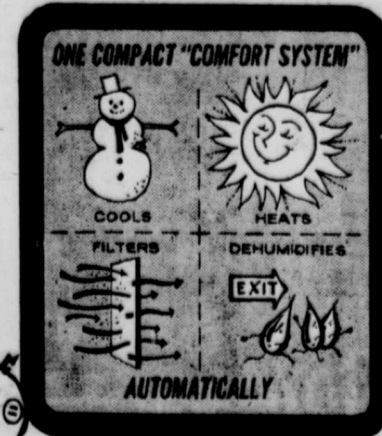
