Justin Garrison, a senior, is the son of Larry and Melissa Garrison. He attends Central Baptist Church.

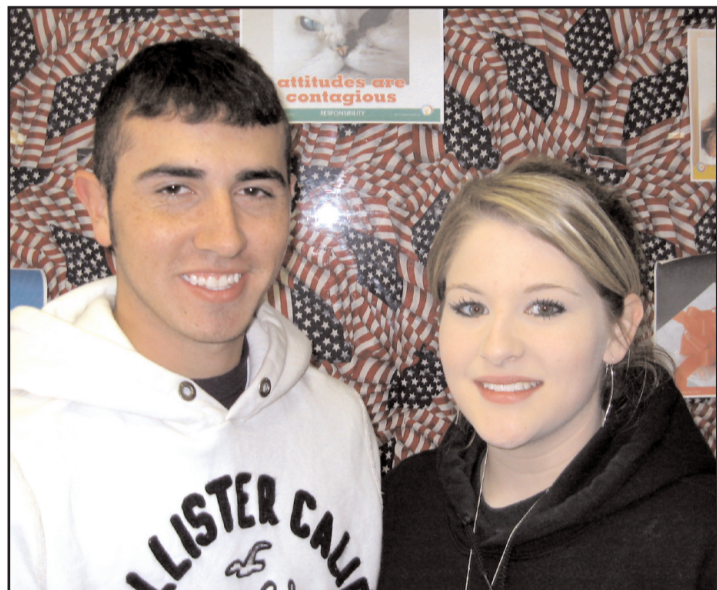
His activities include playing football and running track, spending time with his little brother, enjoying family activities, and playing color fall with Leslie.

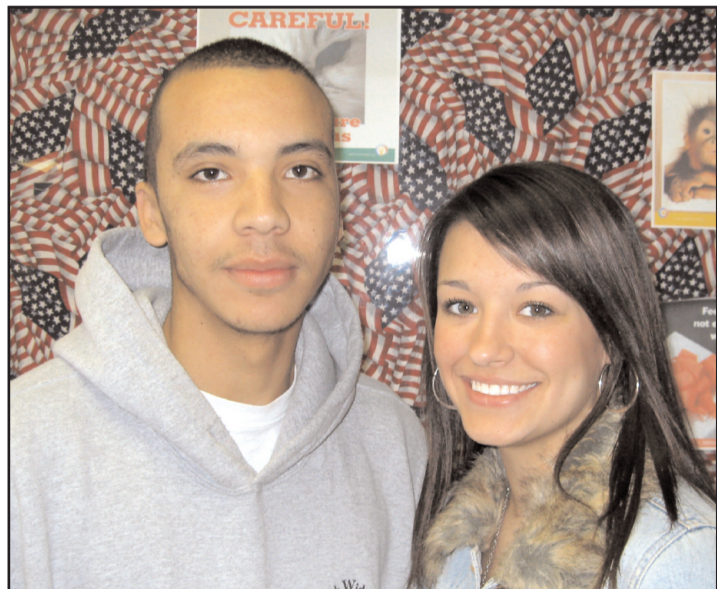

Man charged in copper wire theft

Parmer County chief deputy sheriff Wayne Gruben has announced an arrest in a case involving stolen copper wire.

Gruben said the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railroad recently has had between \$8,000 and \$14,000 worth of copper wire stolen from their area locations.

The sheriff's office, railroad police and Farwell city police have been working surveillance of some vehicles.

Shortly after noon on Dec. 11, a Farwell area man spotted some copper wire in open view in the back of a pickup at the edge of Farwell, on County Road 2, said Gruben.

The man called the sheriff's office and it turned out that the vehicle was on the list of those being watched by police.

Gruben said the pickup went to a Farwell residence. A search warrant was obtained,

The Farwell champion was Lauren Beaubien, who won the tie breaker over Brett Howard.

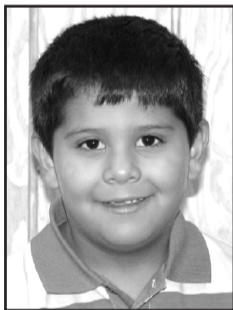
The Rotary club combined for a total of 20 of the 32 games correct, which wouldn't have competed with the winners from either school.

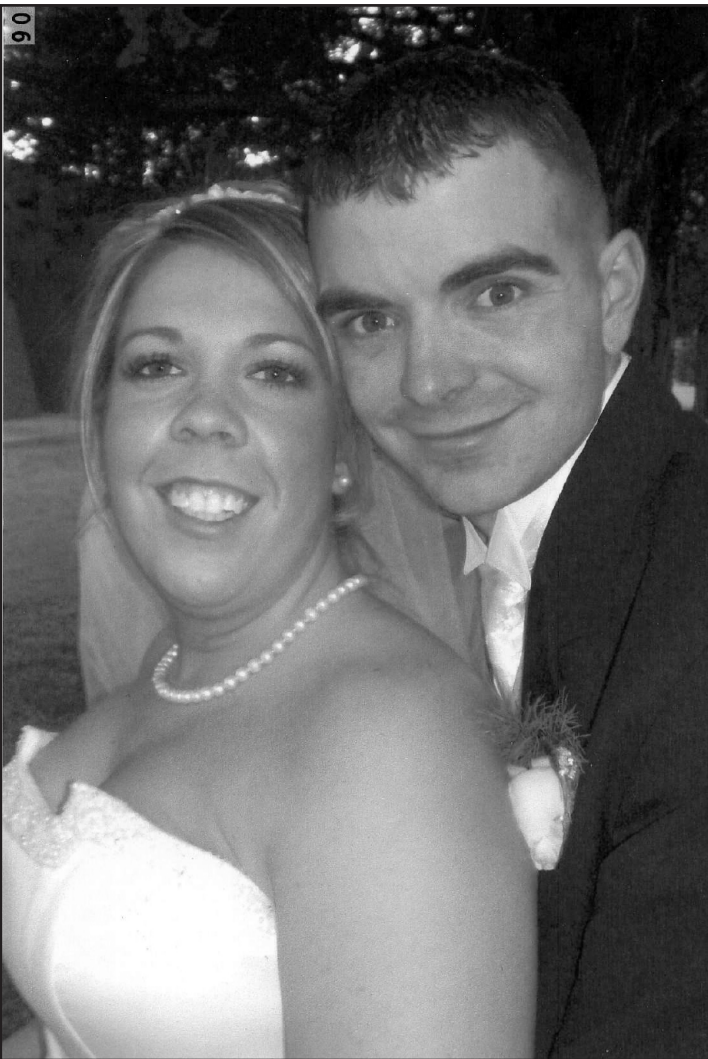

Farwell schools to use drug dogs this year

The Farwell School Board on Dec. 11 heard Supt. Larry Gregory report that drug dogs will be used this semester in the schools.

The board has had a policy of allowing the use of drug dogs for some time, but they haven't been used in awhile.

In other business, the board:
-- Extended Gregory's contract for another year, maintaining his normal two-year renewals. He has served as Farwell superintendent for 11 years.

-- Heard that the current student population is 517.
-- Passed a resolution to Security State Bank that will allow the school to get a loan at a low interest rate for the elementary school construction project.

Four classrooms will be added to the elementary school, and it's hoped that the work will be done before the start of the 2007-2008 school year.

-- Was told that the 2007-2008 school calendar will be ready for presentation at the Feb. 13 meeting.

-- Will have an "early out" for students at 2 p.m. on Jan. 24 so staff can get TAKS test training.

-- Heard that the high school will host its first invitational track meet using the new track on March 30.

-- Heard that the district CX Debate will be hosted on Feb. 8 at Farwell for the first time ever.

The Lazbuddie School Board on Dec. 11 received the resignations of board members Daniel Schacher and Donnie Coker.

They had agreed to serve six-month terms and have done so.

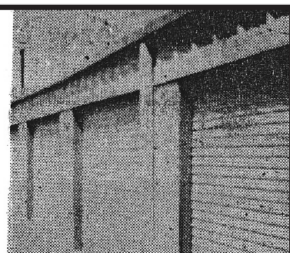

Farwell opposes 'quiet zone' due to liability problem

Don Gunter, representing Citizens Against Train Noise, appeared at Tuesday's Farwell City Council meeting to seek support for establishing a "quiet zone" here, meaning trains wouldn't honk as much.

But as the council emphasized at its November meeting, this is a no-go due to liability issues.

Mayor Jimmie Mace said he had visited with the Texico mayor and some councilmen who also opposed Gunter's request for the same liability problem.

Mace said at night truck brake lights can sometimes be confused with railroad lights, for example. He noted an incident where train horns prevented a serious accident.

He also said Texas highway officials are working on more specific overpass plans and plan to lobby New Mexico soon.

In other business, the council:

-- Noted that Farwell is down to one police officer, chief Scott Burton. Anthony Raney is no longer a city police officer.

-- Appointed Joe Servin, who has worked for the city for 16 years, as new water/sewer superintendent. Mario Vidaurri will be his top assistant.

-- Hired GrantWorks as consultant on the state project to build five homes for low-income families here, if enough qualified persons apply.

-- Set the city election for May 12. On the ballot will be the mayoral post (incumbent is Mace) and two council posts, held by Joe Stanton and Tim Kasel.









NOTICE to Parmer County Taxpayers

January 31, 2007, is the deadline to pay all personal and property taxes in Parmer County.

Checks must be postmarked by January 31, 2007, or penalty and interest will occur.

If you turned 65 years old as of January 1, 2007, then you need to sign up for the "65 and older" Homestead Exemption. This is a permanent exemption so if you already have signed up for it, you don't have to re-apply.

If you have purchased a home since you signed up for the Homestead Exemption, you need to re-apply for this exemption.

Agricultural use exemptions are available for all who have purchased agricultural property. If you purchased ag property during the past year, you need to apply for this exemption.
