The child was born March 23, 1965, in Rising Star and the family has lived here for the past four months.

Only One New County Official This Year

Incoming County Commissioner Dick Foster of Gorman will be the only "new" county official participating when swearing-in time comes on Monday, Jan. 2.

The other nine have "been there before." These include District Judge Frank Sparks, County School Superintendent O. L. Stamey, County Judge Scott Bailey, District Clerk Roy Lane, County Clerk Johnson Smith, C. J. Treas. Ellen Justice Commissioners C. B. Dill and Foster, and three justices of the peace — Wells Dalton of Eastland, M. L. Underwood of Ranger and W. L. Lewis of Cisco. (None were elected at Rising Star and Gorman, so the commissioners court apparently will make JP selections for those towns.)

Foster, 45, defeated incumbent Glenn Justice in the May Primary to become commissioner of Precinct Two, which includes the Carbon, Gorman and Desdemona area.

Other members of the court are Judge Bailey, who was re-elected; C. B. Dill, who defeated an opponent to return as commissioner for the Cisco area, Precinct Four; Danny Wood of the Eastland - Ranger, Precinct One; and Buck Collins, Rising Star commissioner, Precinct Three.

Olden Boys and Carbon Girls Win Basketball Tournament

In the High School Basketball tournament held here last weekend the Olden boys defeated Desdemona 35 to 38 and the Carbon girls defeated Gorman 47 to 42 to take first place trophies. Peanut Growers Assn. To Get New Building

A contract was let in Dallas Thursday for a new headquarters office building for the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association. Manager Ross Wilson reported in Eastland Friday.

The new building will be located in Gorman, about a block and a half west of the present office site.

President of the growers group is D. B. Warren of Gorman. Vice president is Jesse Leach of Holdenville, Okla. Secretary - treasurer is B. D. Green of Gorman.

Others on the board of directors Roy Gentry of Shawnee, Okla., Barton Scott of Binger, Okla., Cecil M. Bynum of Pleasanton, Tex., Jo-

hnnie Rollins of Granbury and E. A. Walker of De Leon.

The association, formed in 1937, has as its primary role the operation of the peanut support program for the U.S. Department of Agriculture in the peanut areas west of the Mississippi River.

In addition, it fosters research, promotional and educational activities relating to the peanut industry in this area.

This work all is headquartered at Gorman.

The new office building, Wilson said, will provide about 8,000 square feet of floor space. Architect for it is Richard Buzard of Abilene.

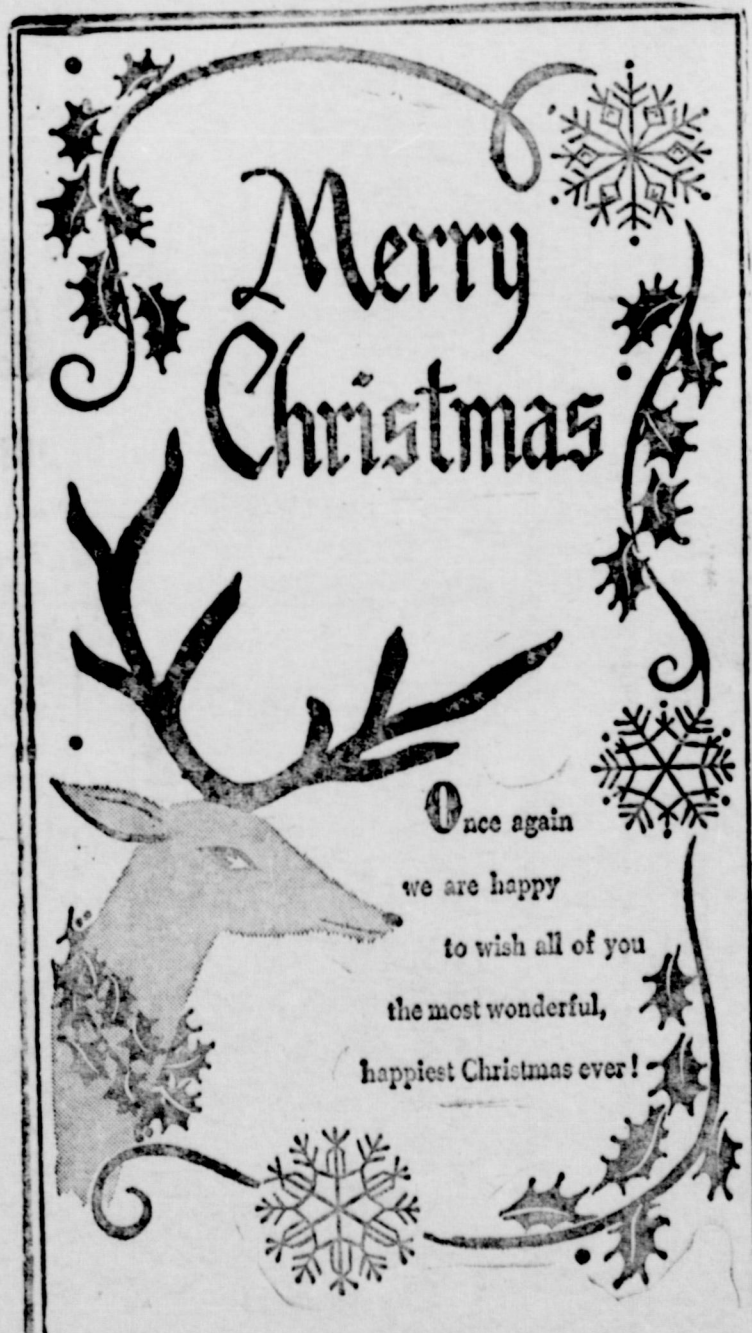
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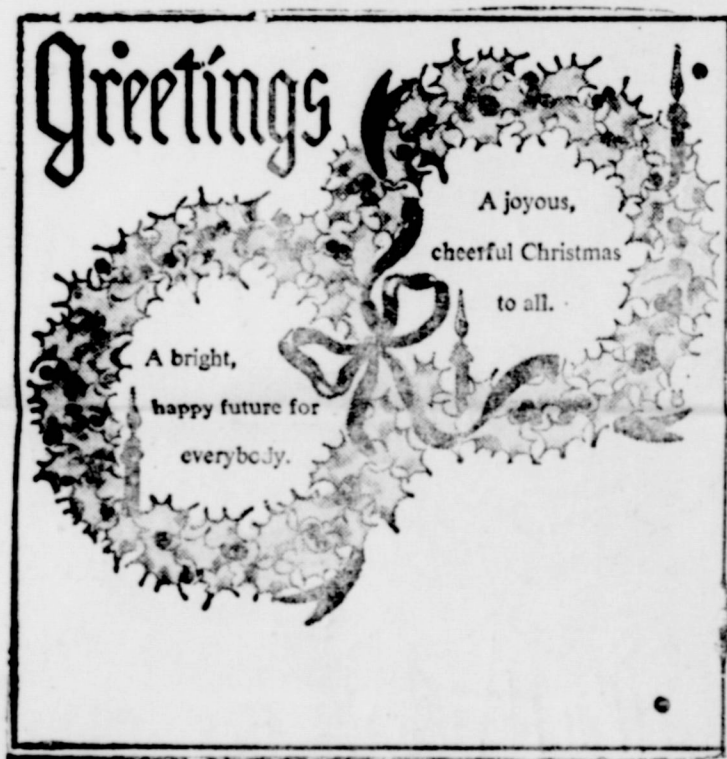
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HOMEMAKERS HINTS

Eastland County Home Demonstration Agent

Fruit cakes need time to age and develop the right flavor and texture. There are many modifications of the old fashioned fruit cake because of greater selection of fruits and nuts. Research has developed improved preservation methods for the fruit.

Choose fresh ingredients and high quality when preparing your cake. To cut the cost of the cake, you can add inexpensive raisins and currants for part of the candied fruit. Remember, though, that too many raisins and currants will give your cake a bitter or scorched flavor.

Assorted ready cut candied fruits may be a better choice than buying several different kinds of candied fruits which you have to cut. Compare the cost of shelled and unshelled nuts to find which is the best buy — considering the time needed for shelling, too. If you make your fruit cake, a six pound standard recipe will cost you about \$4.50. You can buy some fruit cakes which are quite well filled with fruits and nuts for \$4. Remember that there is always a good amount of pride and satisfaction in making your own cake.

Be sure to make the best possible use of any leftovers from your holiday feasts in

order to keep the food budget in balance. Beef prices remain about the same with a little less demand the past week. Best beef values may be found on chuck roasts and steaks, round steaks and roasts and ground beef.

Some markets are featuring pork loins (half or whole) at attractive prices. Fresh picnics, Boston butt roasts, shoulder steaks, bacon and sausage are worthy of your consideration.
