GTE Customers To See Change

Changes approved by the Federal Communications Commission on May 25 will affect General Telephone Customers using interstate long distance directory assistance, customers using AT&T to make long distance calls and businesses with more than one line.

An interstate directory assistance charge of 50 cents

per call with a two call allowance for each billing period was approved for AT&T the nation's only provider of interstate directory assistance service. To obtain the two call directory assistance allowance, the customer must make at least two interstate calls during each billing period. If the customer makes one or no

interstate calls, the allowance would be one or zero respectively.

The FCC also ordered AT&T to reduce its interstate long distance rates by approximately 6.1 percent.

At the same time, the FCC approved interstate and end user access charges of \$6 per line for businesses with more than one line.

All of the changes became effective May 25.

A Reminder Long-Distance Direct Dialing Change Affects

214/817 Area Codes

Beginning June 3, it will be mandatory for all customers in the 214 Area Code, and for those customers in the Fort Worth Metro Calling Area, to dial the Area Code when dialing all long-distance calls, including calls within their own Area Code. Prior to the mandatory change, customers have the option of dialing as usual or using the new method that will be required beginning June 3.

There will not be any change in the way local, toll-free Extended Area Service, Metro or Expanded Metro Service calls are dialed.

Customers with Speed Calling Service or telephones that store frequently called telephone numbers to allow dialing of those numbers by using a code should reprogram long-distance numbers affected by the change.

Businesses with special features in electronic PABX (Private Automatic Branch Exchange) switching systems should ensure modifications have been made to long-distance tables in the system.

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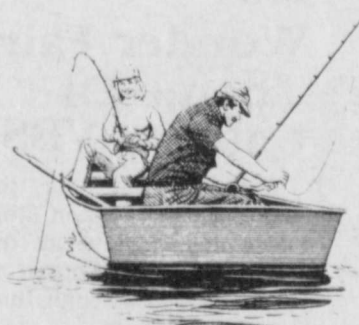

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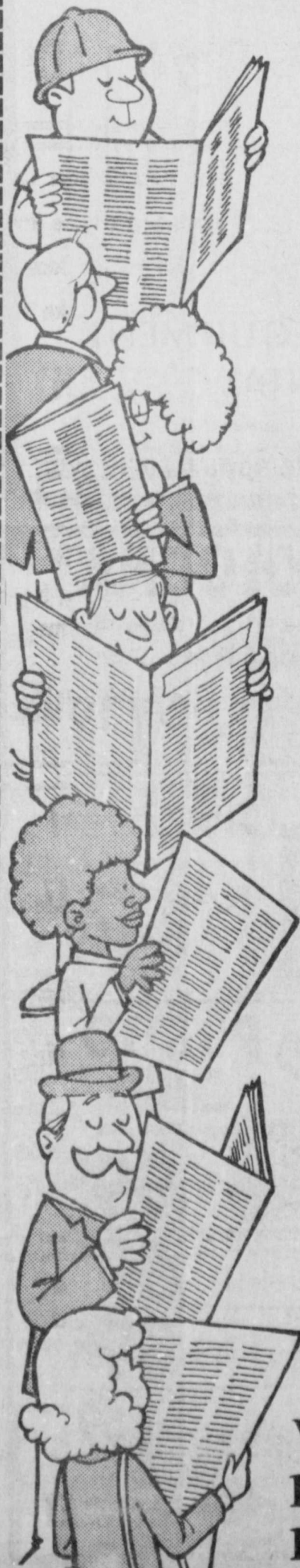

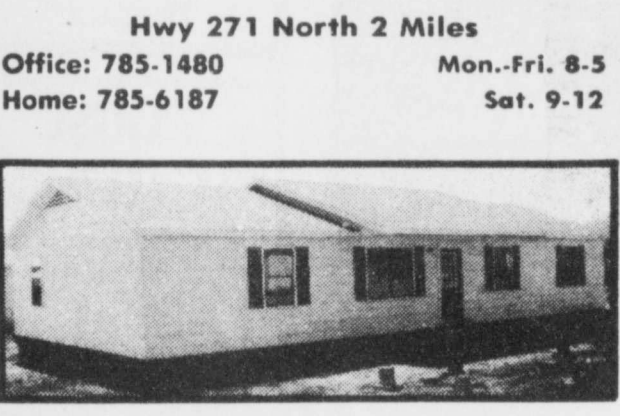
The Bogata Pipeliners, coached by Dennis Martin and Lindy Guest had their season going. The minor league team, ages 9 and 10, has played some tough teams.
