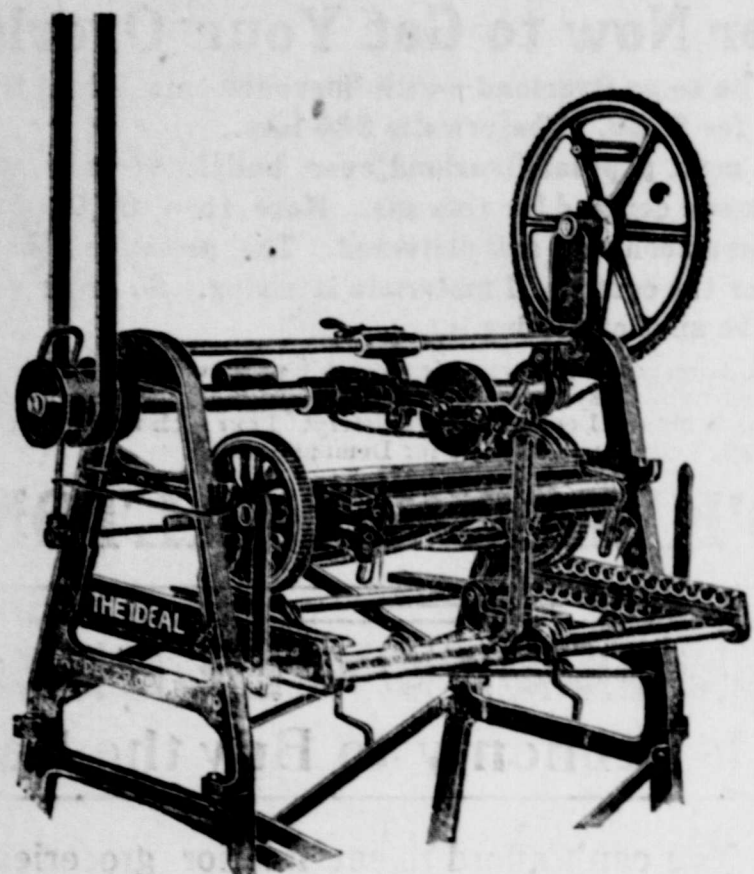

ATTACK ON EL PASO THREATENED

EL PASO, June 17.—Gen. Geo. Bell Jr., commander of the brigade stationed here for the protection of El Paso and the border in the immediate vicinity, issued orders at 5:30 p. m. Friday to assemble the entire force. The only explanation for the order was that unusual activity on the part of the Carranza garrison at Juarez had been noticed throughout the day.

Gen. Gonzales, the Juarez commander, has posted an order calling all Mexicans over 17 years of age to the quartel for military instruction. Five thousand additional Mexican troops have been brought to points along the Mexican Central railroad, north of Villa Ahumada, presumably as reinforcements for the Juarez garrison.

The total number of troops in General Bell's command is approximately 3,500, including several pieces of heavy artillery. He is satisfied the situation can be controlled without serious danger to life or property in El Paso.

Mexican troops crossed the border twelve miles west of El Paso Friday afternoon and raided the small town of Noria, New Mexico. Several Americans were reported killed but it is unknown whether they were civilians or troops.

SUFFRAGE PLANK IN PLATFORM

SUFFRAGE PLANK COLISEUM, St. Louis, June 17.—After an unsuccessful fight to throw out the suffrage plank in the democratic platform as approved by President Wilson, the democratic national convention at 3:09 o'clock yesterday afternoon, adopted the whole platform including the planks on suffrage and Americanism, by acclamation. The fight on the suffrage plank was the first row to ripple the harmony of the convention. The fight on it was led by Governor Ferguson of Texas and it seemed to have some chance until Senator Walsh of Montana told the convention that President Wilson considered the suffrage plank as written a necessity to the success of the party. Roll call vote by states following this speech showed 181 1-2 for and 888 1-2 against. Then the plank itself and the whole platform was adopted by a roaring chorus of approval. After some formality the convention adjourned at 3:11 o'clock. It was all over.

COPENHAGEN, Denmark, June 17.—Fishermen arriving here today report that two large German steamers were sunk in the Baltic Sea in a naval battle with enemy ships. The reports received here say that heavy cannonading continues.

WASHINGTON, June 17.—The war department was notified today that Americans are pouring out of Mexico, many coming thru Laredo and Eagle Pass. It is estimated that no more than one thousand Americans remain in Mexico City and possibly eighteen hundred in Tampico.

The state department is considering the advisability of calling home the remainder of the American consuls in the smaller towns in the interior of Mexico.

Gen. Bell reports to the war department through Gen. Funston, that he had been informed by mining men arriving at El Paso, that Gen. Trevino, of Chihuahua, had telegraphed to Gen. Pershing and warned Pershing that any movement on the part of the punitive expedition, or the sending of additional troops into Mexico, would be a signal for Mexican soldiers to attack Americans.

The Mexican embassy here brands the published text of the Trevino ultimatum as a "fake," and issued a statement that there would be no war with Mexico unless there was an overt act, such as an attack on United States troops by recognized Carranza soldiers.

CHIHUAHUA CITY, June 16.—to Mexico of American forces regardless of the cause.

Gen. Jacinto Trevino, commanding the Carranza army of the north, today advised Gen. J. J. Pershing, American expeditionary commander, that any movement of American troops from their present lines to the south, east or west, would be considered a hostile act and a signal to commence warfare. Gen. Trevino acted upon specific instructions from Gen. Carranza.

LAREDO, Tex., June 16.—Reports today that if American forces attempt to cross the Rio Grande in the Nevo Laredo district in pursuit of bandits they will meet with energetic resistance were confirmed here tonight on what is believed to be unimpeachable authority.

Carranza troops in Nuevo Laredo, it is said, have instructions to put up an energetic fight to resist any possible crossing into Mexico of American forces regardless of the cause.

WINTERS PEOPLE ARE
FIGHTING POOL HALLS

The Winters people seem to be determined to have a poolhall-less town, and succeeded in getting the commissioners' court to order an election this week in order that the people might express themselves on the proposition.

The fight started against pool halls for Winters early in the year when it was rumored around the city that a party would open a hall. The rumor soon developed into a reality, a building was rented and the fixtures shipped in. The proprietor of the hall was presented with a petition asking him that he not open. He told the signers that if they would buy his outfit, pay the expenses he had incurred in coming to Winters, he would not open the hall. The people declined to do this and the pool hall opened.

The second move to put the pool hall out of business was made last week when a petition asking for an election was circulated, signatures secured and the petition presented to the commissioners' court this week. The petition embraced the school district, and when presented to the court it developed that the court could not call an election defining such limits.

Those working to put the pool hall out returned to Winters and began at once to circulate another petition, fixing the city limits as their field. This petition was presented to the court and the court very promptly ordered an election, fixing July 8th as the day to settle the question, as far as the voting goes.

The trunk and contents were valued at \$200. —Miles Messenger.

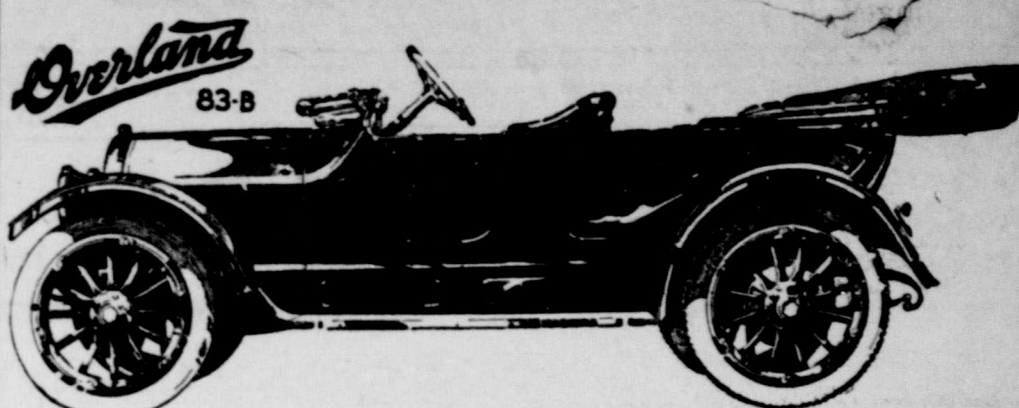

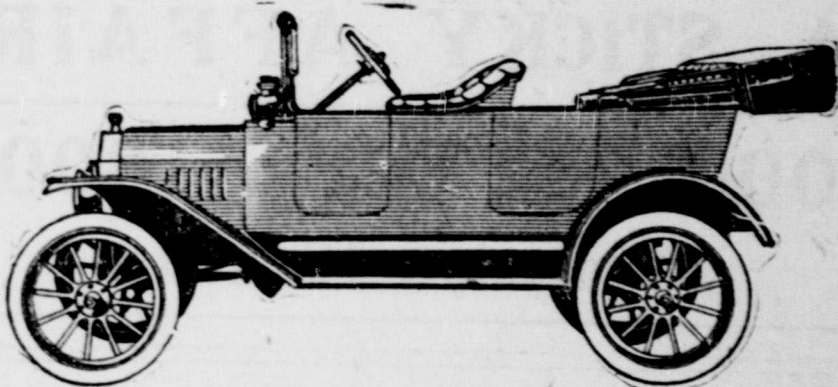

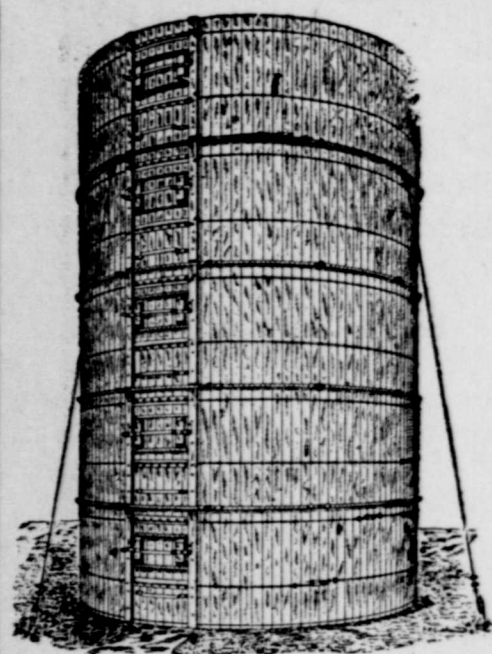

BALLINGER'S FIRST NEWS-PAPER MAN HERE ON BUSINESS.

Judge J. N. Winters of Fort Worth, was in Ballinger Saturday arriving here on a business trip Friday night. Mr. Winters spent a good part of the day in meeting old friends and talking over early times in Ballinger. Mr. Winters was one of the first to mark the beginning of progress in Ballinger. He established the first newspaper here thirty years ago, and we have on file in our office the copies of the first paper ever issued, as well as complete files for the years following, and they make interesting history. The first issue of the paper was printed in a tent near where the Santa Fe passenger station now stands, said Mr. Winters, and those were days never to be forgotten. It was a time when the editor used his six shooter for a paper weight, and kept the paper weight in a handy place on his writing desk, which was an ordinary goods box.

Mr. Winters published the paper and boosted the country and later engaged in the real estate business and brought many people to this county, who have prospered and made good citizens, many of whom are here today. The gentleman left Ballinger twenty-one years ago, and while he has visited here frequently he never comes but what he notes the rapid growth of the country and the wonderful progress being made.

Mr. Winters returned home on the afternoon train Saturday.
