HOME BOARD LOSS IS LARGELY RESTORED

Contributions of Churches, Bond and Estate of Defaulting Treasurer Will Net Nearly \$700,000.

From information presented to the Executive Committee of the Southern Baptist Convention by the Joint Committee of Six, which has been handling the financial affairs of the Home Mission Board, following the discovery of the defalcations of its recent treasurer, C. S. Carnes, it appears that all but approximately \$225,000 of the loss sustained by these defalcations will soon have been restored to the Board.

The restorations that have been made to date are as follows:

Special emergency fund from certain churches that came in last September \$28,518.79.

Receipts from Honor Day, November 11 \$389,164.00.

Christmas Offering, up to March 1st, \$10,877.00.

Payment of bond by bonding company \$50,000.00.

Total \$468,559.79.

Carnes Estate Turned Over to Board

Since the meeting of the Executive Committee the Carnes estate, appraised at \$225,000, has become the property of the Home Mission Board, and additional receipts have come in from the Christmas Thank Offering. It is hoped that at least \$200,000 may be realized from the Carnes estate, which consists chiefly of Atlanta real estate. The final estimate of the Carnes defalcations was given by the auditors as \$909,000.

The proceeds of all these funds except the emergency ones, have been applied on the reduction of the indebtedness of the Board and the payment of accumulated interest. The emergency funds were designated by the donors for meeting missionary emergencies on the field, and were thus applied.

Despite the financial handicaps under which the Home Board is laboring, it has been enabled to carry on since last September, when the defalcation was discovered, on its own receipts and resources, and the officers of the Board hope to be able to continue this record until the meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention at Memphis in May.
