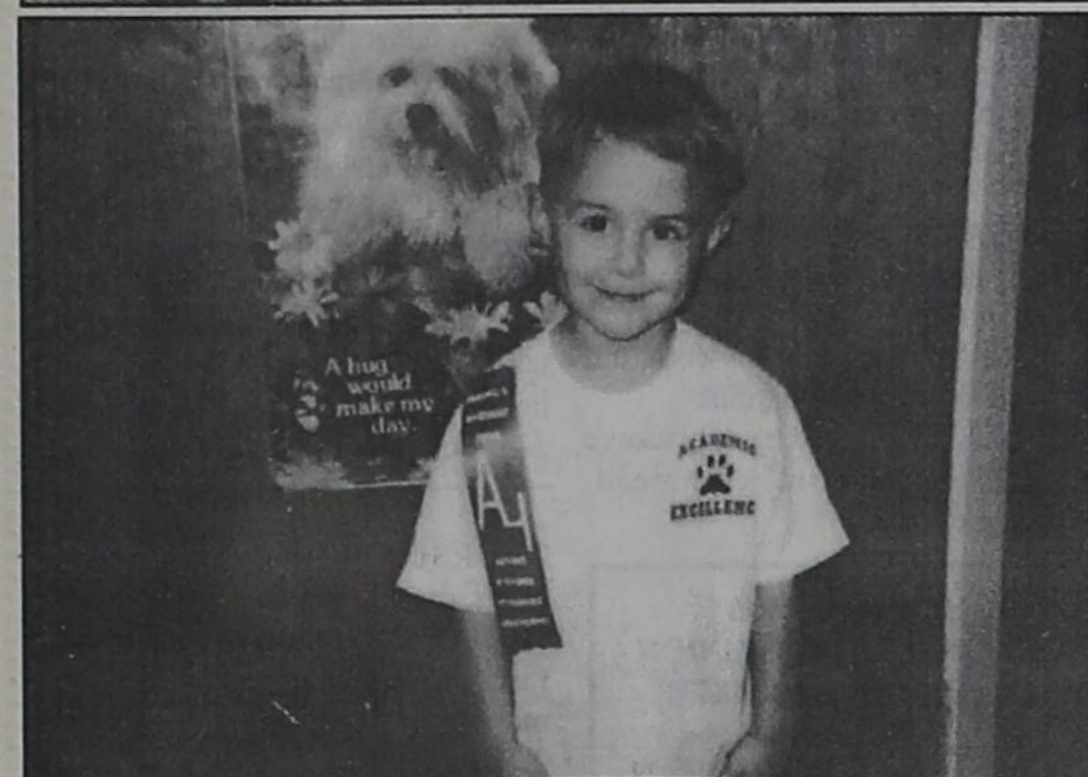

Panthers Edged By Buffs Go To Lometa Friday

The Panthers hosted the Cross Plains Buffaloes, favored to win the District 8-A race and ranked 8th in the State and came close to a tie or victory, but being edged 14 to 6.

Gorman held the Buffs on their first possession, but couldn't move the ball against the tough Buffs defense.

The Panthers were forced to punt to the Buffs and they started a drive at their own 27 and scored in 9 plays with the help of 2 Panther penalties. Quarterback Justin Hopkins got the score from 1 yard out with 4:00 left in the period. The kick for point failed and the Buffs were up 6-0.

On the following kickoff the Panthers couldn't cover the onside kick and the Buffs had the ball on the Gorman 44. From there they scored in 8 plays with Zack Elington catching a 22 yard pass from Justin Hopkins for the score with 9 seconds left in the period. Jody Fortune ran for 2 points and the score was 14-0.

The Buffs had a couple of more long drives before the half ended but the Panthers defense kept them from scoring and the half ended 14-0.

The Panther Marching Band and the Cross Plains Band both did a great job of entertaining the fans during the intermission.

Gorman received the kickoff for the last half and started a good drive before being stopped by the strong Buff defense.

The Buffs were held on the defense by the Big Red and were forced to punt. The Panthers got the ball on their own 42 and begun a scoring drive. They scored in 7 plays with Margarito Sanchez getting the final 3 yards with 11:35 left in the game. The kick try failed and the score was 14-6.

The teams played of fairly even terms until the Panthers came back with a drive. They took the ball on their own 46 and moved 39 yards in just 4 plays but came up about 1 yard shy on a fourth down try at the Cross Plains 15 with the pass being caught by Blake Guthery but he was unable to get to the end of the chain and the Buffs took over to remain undefeated and give them a 2-0 record in District. The Panthers are 1-1 in district.

With just a little more offense and less penalties that hurt the Panthers, they could have had a victory. They have come a long way since the first game and have a 2-3 record.

Sanchez led the Panthers with 121 yards on 20 carries. Blake Guthery had 53 yards on 10 carries. Clay Sandlin ran for 29 yards on 5 tries and Cody Foster had 17 on 1 carry.

This week the Big Red travel to Lometa (ugh) for another District 8A battle. They will have to play a very good game and overcome some mistakes to win this one. But I believe they will get a win this week. Game time is 7:30 p.m.

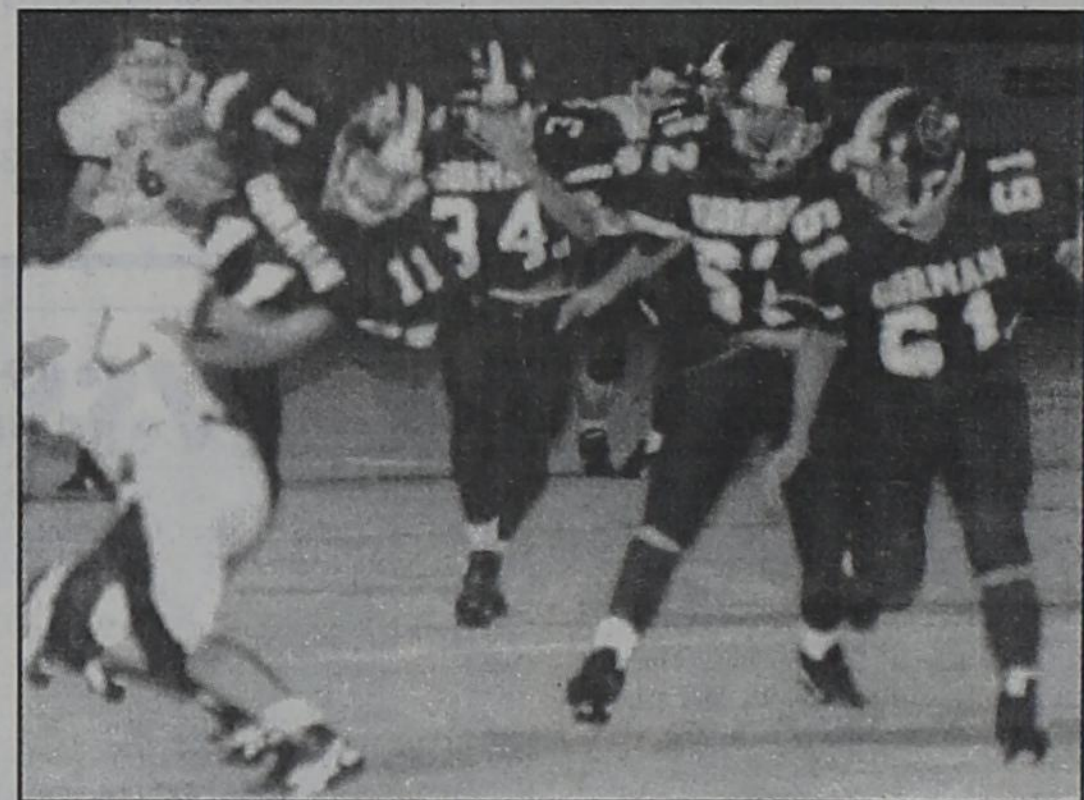

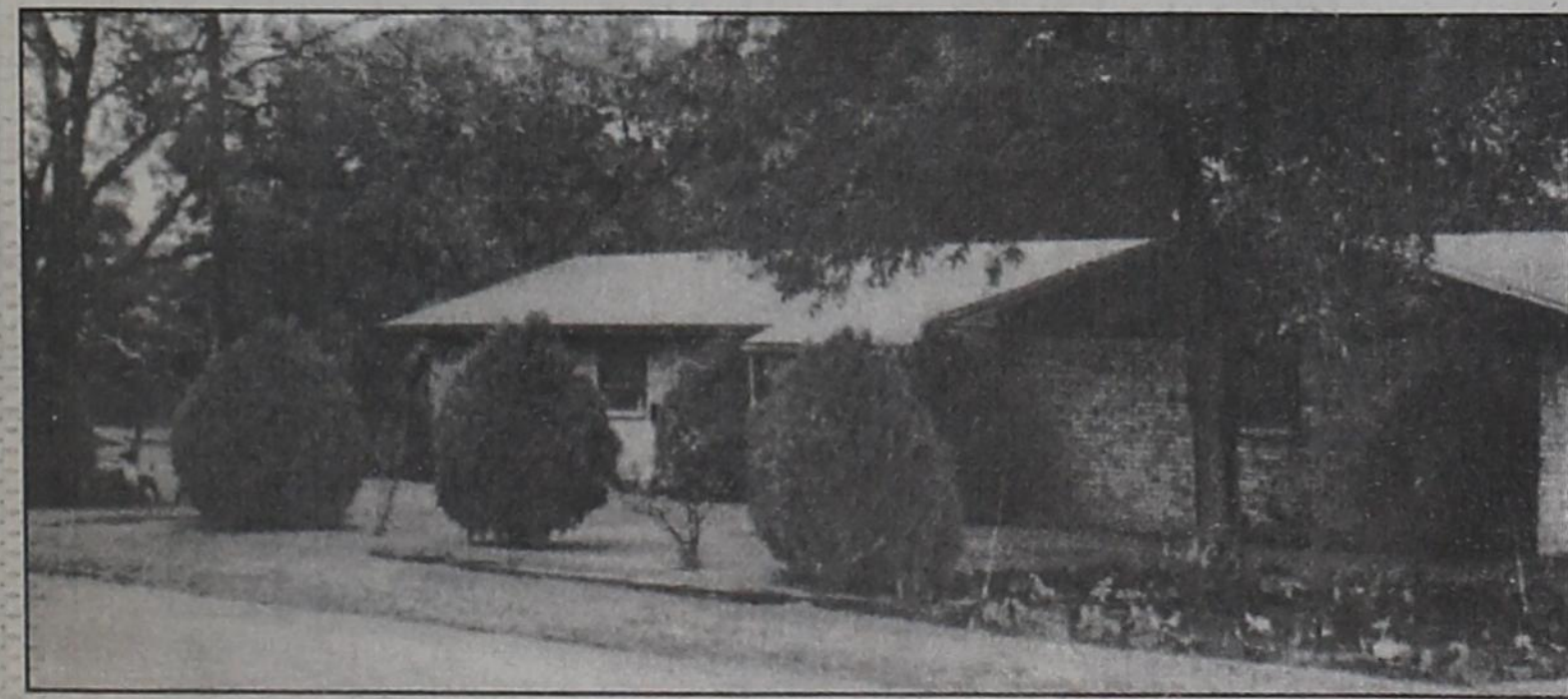
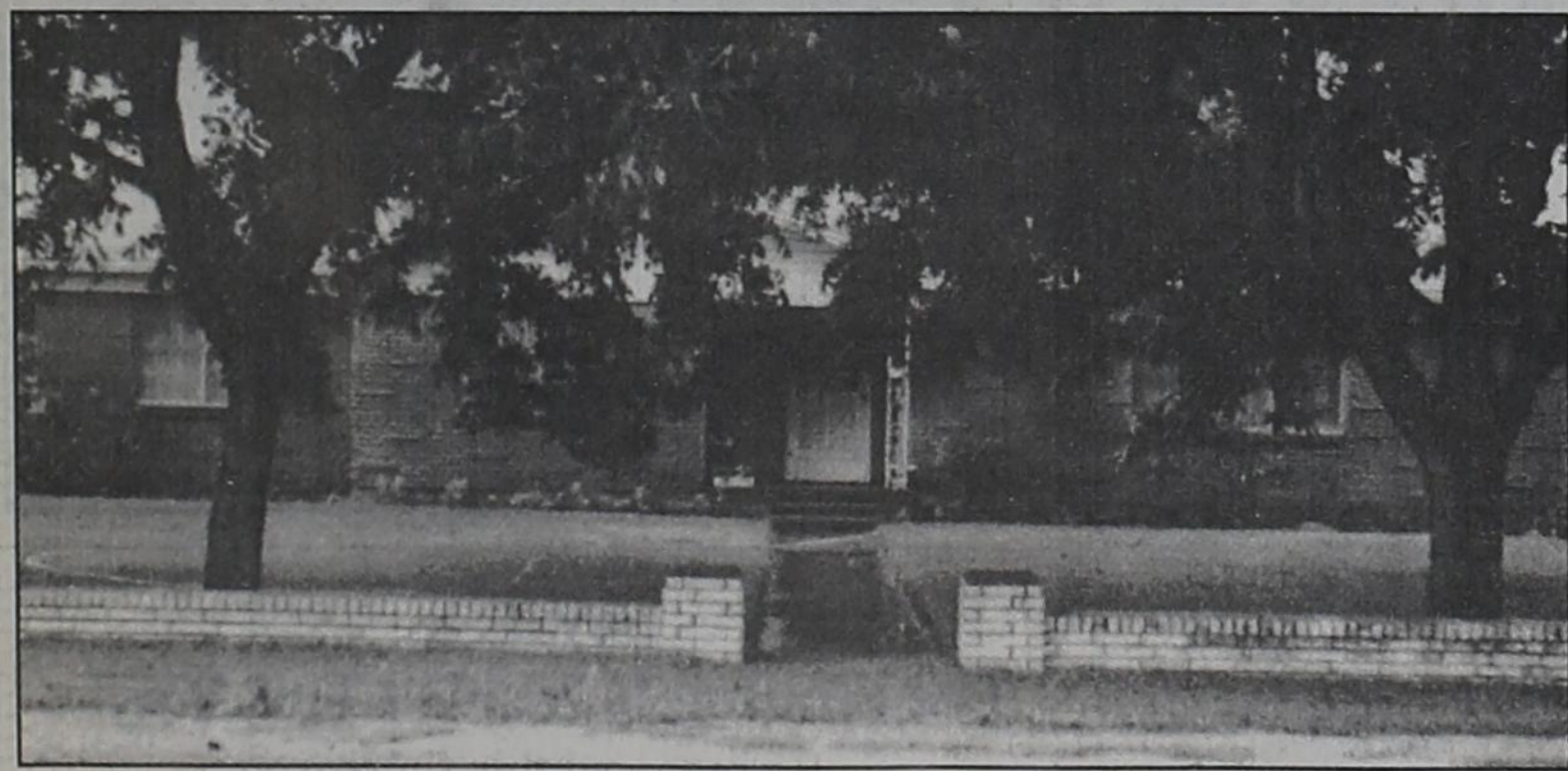
