SMALL BALLOT FOR ELECTION SATURDAY

The run-off Democratic election Saturday this week probably holds less interest for voters than at any time in many years. Only two races are to be voted on in the state ticket, and none in the county or district races in Hale county. The two state races, incumbent Grover Sellers and Jesse Martin are candidates for attorney general, and incumbent Rich-Critz and Gordon Simpson are opponents in the race for associate justice of the supreme court of Texas. All county races were settled in the July voting. In the commissioners' race, R. A. Daugherty and R. E. Wilson are opponents in precinct 2 (the Lakeview-Petersburg region), and in precinct 4 Julian B. Smith and J. R. Clark are on the ballot. (J. L. Mann was elected in the first balloting as commissioner in this precinct, No. 3.) He succeeds L. M. Rankin who did not seek re-election.

BALLOTS TO BE MARKED IN FOUR BOXES IN AREA

There are four voting boxes in this area, two in Abernathy and one each at New Deal and Lakeview schools. M. Z. Holland will have charge of the Hale county voting box in Abernathy, at the fire hall by the city water tower. The Lubbock county voting box in Abernathy is to be at Thompson & Wolf building on the west side of the highway in the south part of town. Frank B. Lovelace is to have charge of the polls. W. O. Fortenberry is to be the presiding judge in the election at Monroe. Voting will be conducted at the New Deal school. T. E. Lutrick is to be in charge of the polls at Lakeview school building. Polls will open at 8 a. m. and are to close at 7 p. m.

Rites Are Held For Mrs. Parrack

Last rites for Mrs. J. B. Parrack, about 50, of near Abernathy, who died Wednesday night last week in the office of Dr. H. E. Williams, were held Saturday afternoon at Sanders Funeral Home chapel, Lubbock, with Dr. C. A. Bickley, Lubbock minister officiating. Mrs. Parrack died a few hours after returning from Hedley where she reportedly visited the grave of her late father. Her husband said she complained of a "splitting headache" and said she would take headache powders. Instead, officials and physicians said they were informed, she took strychnine by mistake. Parrack rushed his wife from his farm six miles east of Abernathy to the physician's office, and she died here soon afterward, at 10:15 p. m. Hale County Attorney Ernest Tibbets, Ted Andrews, deputy sheriff, and City Marshall O. Rutledge of Abernathy determined no inquest was necessary after a conference with M. H. Rankin, justice of the peace, it was announced. The Parracks had lived near Abernathy three years, relatives said. She is survived by her husband; a daughter, Mrs. Carl Prestbridge of Beaumont, and three grandchildren.

Dear BFD: I have just finished reading the Abernathy Review and I enjoyed it very much. I saw the article about Pfc. Wm. H. (Colonel) Webb returning to the states. I will be glad when that day comes for me. What a happy day that will be! ... Well, Buford, I just received my PX

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rations, including some cigars. You should be here; we would have a smoking good time. We would have to smoke them in the daytime. We can't smoke them at night where I am now located. This Burma is a funny country. Every time you stick your head out of your foxhole, some Jap always takes a shot at you ... I used to be a cook, but I am no more. I am now a combat man. We have been fighting Japs for about two months, and we were on the front line most all of the time. Brother, it is not a bit funny! We are back now for a rest and I hardly think we'll do much more fighting, I hope! ... Tell everyone hello for me, and give my regards to the Men's Downtown Bible class at Rita theatre. He thought they were "Texas mosquitos." That's a favorite Yankee joke ... Things are going pretty good with me now and if things stay on the good side, I may get a few days at home in a couple of months. Tell everyone hello for me and eat lots of home-cooked meals for all of us boys. I don't know which I miss most, my wife, or her cooking, ha, ha! See you later, Buford. As ever, Curtis. (Pfc.
