## Weekend Weather Far From Wonderful

The weekend weather didn't exactly fill the bill for most people as flooding, heavy rains and high winds lashed the area.

Between last Thursday, April 11 and Sunday, April 14, over four inches of rain were reported.

High winds and heavy clouds

threatened Saturday, uprooting some trees and causing wide spread flooding, especially in the Sulphur River bottom area.

Creeks covered bridges and some roads throughout the area.

No severe damage was reported, and reports of marble sized hail

proved to be short lived enough that no damage was reported from that.

However, the heavy deluge and flooding has damaged newly emerging crops, washing them and in some cases they will require replanting.

The spring forecast for the next few days includes more rain, so the area may well need to expect more of the same.

## Statement of Intent to Change Rates

In accordance with the regulations of the Public Utility Commission of Texas, Texas-New Mexico Power Company announces the Company's intent to change rates for its entire Texas operations. The effective date of such change is May 17, 1991. All classes of customers will be affected by said proposed changes. The proposed rates will produce an increase in gross revenues to the Company over test year revenues adjusted for test year customer growth and weather and annualization of test year rate increases of \$35,836,827, or 9.63%. TNP is proposing an alternative rate base treatment for Unit 2 of TNP One, the second unit of the Company's generating facility located in Robertson County, Texas. Under this alternative, sale-leaseback treatment will be given to Unit 2, thereby including a lease payment in the cost of service, as opposed to traditional rate base treatment. If adopted, the sale-leaseback plan results in an increase in gross revenues of \$31,210,197, or an 8.38% increase over adjusted test year revenues during the first year of the plan. Texas-New Mexico Power Company provides electrical service to more than 165,011 customers located within the state of Texas.

A complete copy of the requested rate filing package is on file with the Public Utility Commission of Texas in Austin, Texas, and with all cities served by Texas-New Mexico Power Company which have retained original jurisdiction. You may inspect a copy of the filing during normal business hours at each business office of Texas-New Mexico Power Company in your area.

Persons who wish to intervene or otherwise participate in these proceedings should notify the Commission as soon as possible. **Chicken & Spaghetti (Hot & Spicy)**  
Sauté: 1 cup chopped onions and 1 cup chopped bell pepper.  
Add 2 cans cream of mushroom soup; 1 can tomato soup; 1 can Rotel tomatoes and green chilis.  
Cook 2 small boxes elbow spaghetti as directed. Drain, rinse and mix with soup mixture (leave salt out).  
Add 2 cups boned chicken (boiled); or 3 cans Swanson's light and dark boned chicken.  
Season to taste with Tony Chachere's creole seasoning. Heat well, then top with cheese slices.  
If more liquid is needed, add tomato sauce or juice. Serve with garlic toast and salad. Serves approx. 15.

**Peach Cobbler**  
Mix 1 cup flour, 1 cup sugar, 1 cup milk; 2 heaping teaspoons baking powder.  
In a long pyrex baking dish, melt one stick margarine. Pour one large can of Del Monte peach slices in heavy syrup onto dough mixture. Sprinkle 1/2 cup sugar on top. Bake at 325 until browned.

**Mexican Pie Casserole**  
Sauté 1/2 cup chopped onion and 1/2 cup chopped bell pepper in margarine.

**Brown 1 lb. hamburger meat with onions and peppers, drain grease off.**  
Add 2 cups cooked rice and a small jar of picante sauce. Salt to taste. If you like, sprinkle in chili powder. Let simmer approx. 10 minutes. If more liquid is needed, add tomato sauce or tomato juice.

**Very Moist Baked Potatoes**  
Wash and puncture medium-sized red potatoes (red tastes better to me and are more moist). Place in sandwich bags (plastic). Bake in microwave until soft.

**Strawberry Salad**  
2 pkgs strawberry salad; 1 pkg frozen strawberries; 1/2 cup chopped nuts; 1/2 pint sour cream; 1 small can pineapple, crushed.  
Dissolve jello in 1 cup boiling water. Add frozen strawberries while jello and water are hot. When mixture begins to thicken, add pineapple and nuts. Spread 1/2 of the mixture into dish and top with sour cream then put remaining jello on top of sour cream and chill until set.

**Mexican Chicken & Honey**  
Cut up fryer, dredge in honey. Pour picante sauce over chicken and bake until tender, about 45 minutes to 1 hour.

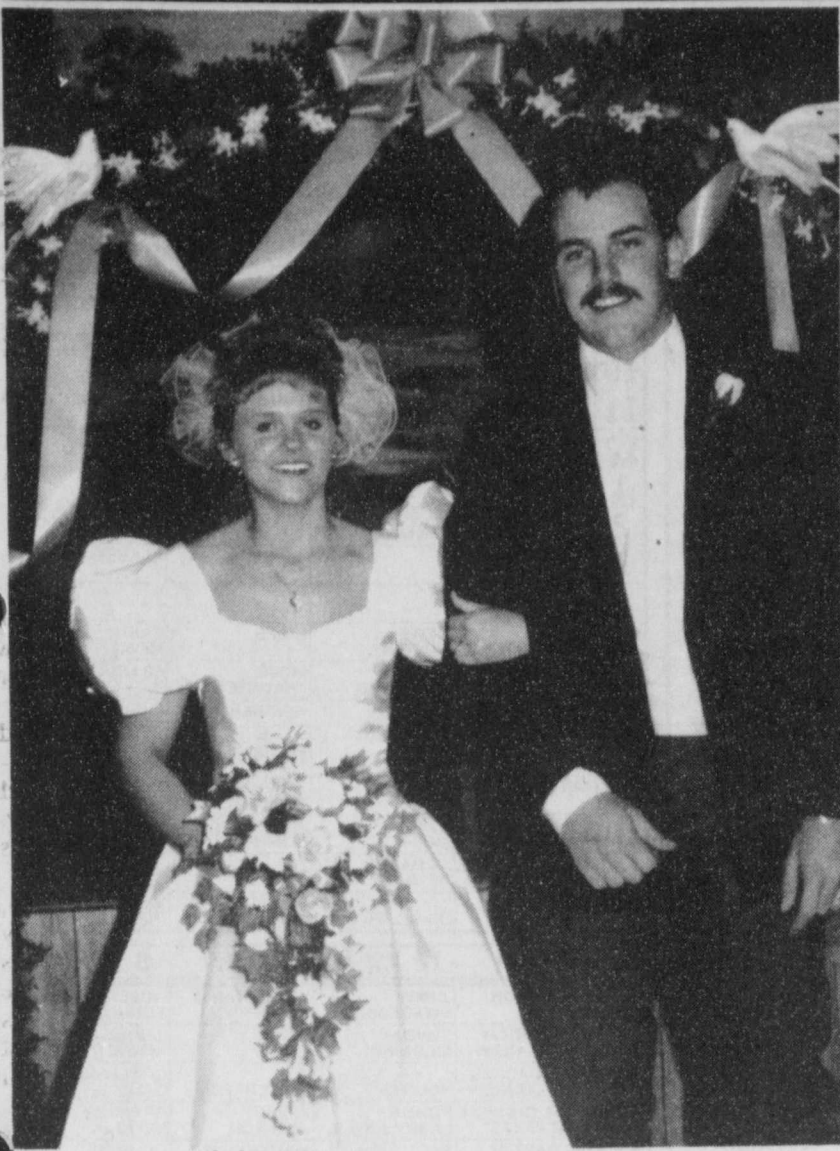

The groom is a 1987 graduate of Rivercrest High School. He attended Paris Junior College and is employed by Ward Pipe Insulation of Bogata.

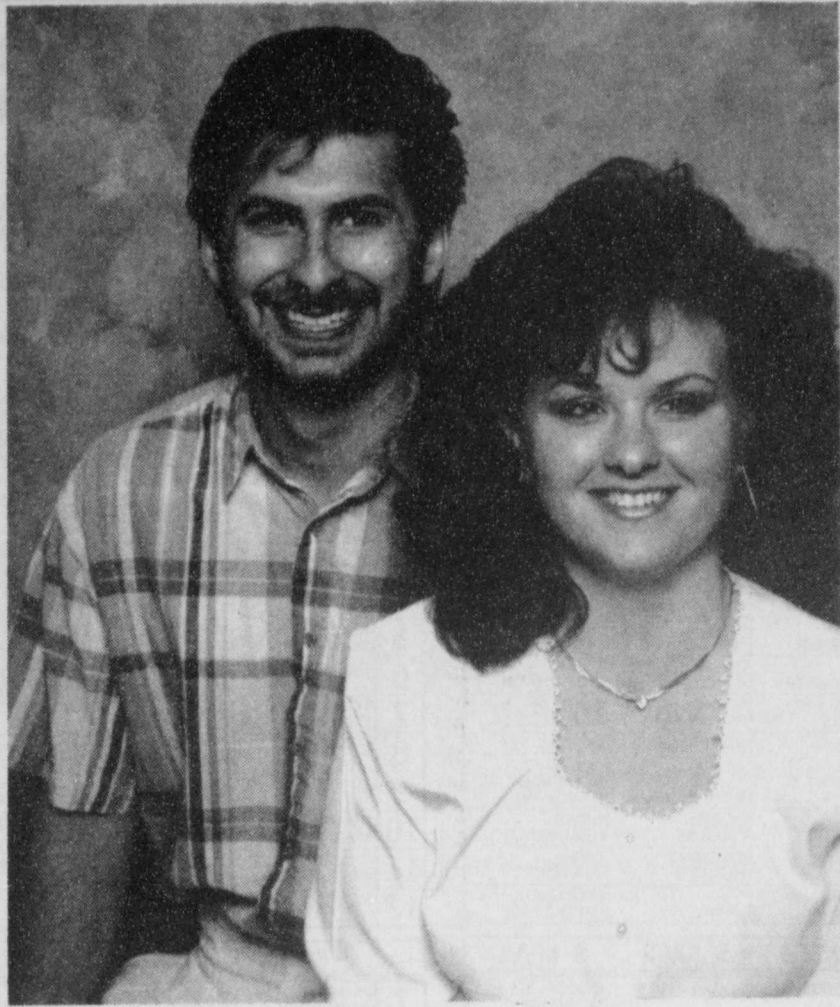

The electric arcing demonstration will be presented at 10 a.m., at noon and at 2 p.m., using live electricity to dramatically demonstrate the dangers of electricity.

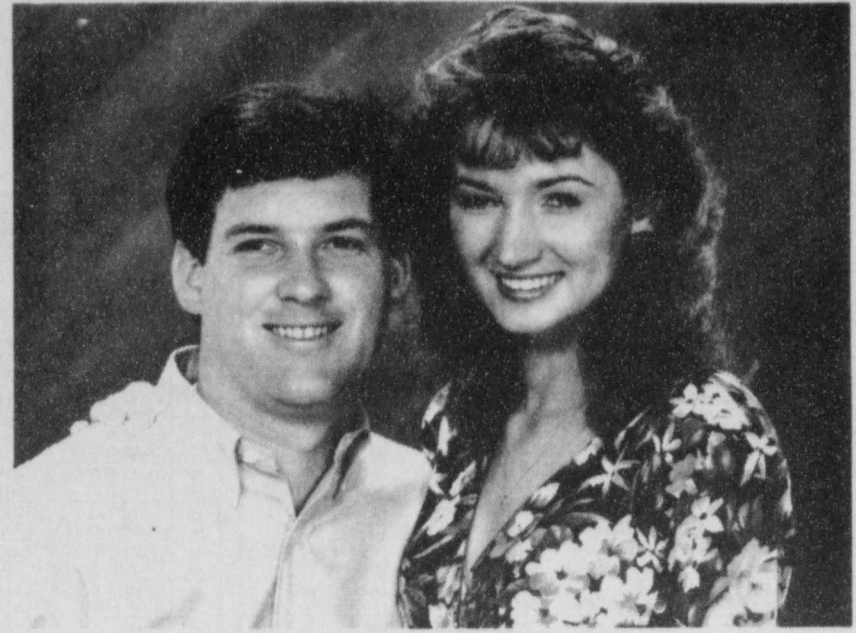

 DEDUCTIBLE INTEREST - 1991

**W**ith the constant changes in tax law, you may be wondering just what interest expense will be deductible this year. Here's a brief rundown:  
**Home acquisition loans and home improvement loans.** You may deduct 100% of interest paid on debt incurred to buy, build, or substantially improve your principal home and second home as long as the total acquisition debt does not exceed \$1 million.  
**You may also deduct points (fees charged regularly in your geographical area to obtain a loan) incurred to buy or improve your principal residence. The points may be deducted in the year you pay them as long as you put up cash in the deal at least equal to the points charged. Otherwise, they must be deducted pro rata over the life of the loan.**  
**Home equity loans.** You may deduct 100% of interest paid on debt secured by a mortgage against your property as long as such debt does not exceed the lesser of \$100,000 or your equity in the property. You may use the borrowed funds for any purpose and the interest will remain fully deductible.  
**Investment loans.** Your deduction for interest paid on debt incurred to buy investments is limited to your net investment income. Interest that is disallowed because of this limit can be carried over and deducted in later years, subject to the later years' limits.  
**Business loans.** You may deduct 100% of interest paid on business loans.  
**Personal interest.** You may deduct interest paid on your credit cards, personal lines of credit, or auto loans. If you consolidate your otherwise nondeductible loans into a home equity loan, you may be able to fully deduct the interest. However, you must be prepared to pay the refinancing costs such as points (deductible ratably over the life of the loan), appraisal fees (not deductible), and loan processing fees (not deductible).

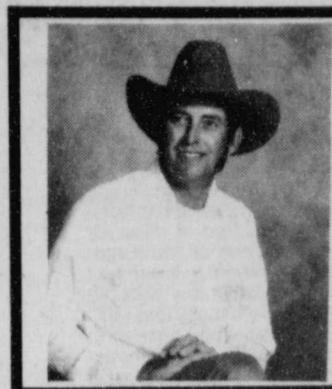
