New Hospital Wings To Be Done By '74

Directors of Root Hospital District were told Thursday night that two new additions to the hospital probably will be completed by this time next year.

Architect Don Hampton of Sweetwater showed plans for the new patient and lobby wings to the directors and Mrs. Marlon Bassham who donated \$100,000 to help building the additions. There will be a complete basement under the patient wing, Hampton pointed out.

The architect said he hopes to have everything ready to start taking bids by the end of February and after bids are taken, construction should begin and be completed within 8 to 10 months.

The new wings will be built onto the east side of the hospital.

Another new addition to the hospital, a laboratory wing, is

now under construction and hospital administrator Charles Root reported to the directors that several doctors (specialists) from Abilene have expressed interest in coming to Colorado City twice a week when the facilities are completed.

Root reported that hospital usage during November is higher than last year with 120 patients admitted for 773 inpatient days compared to 102 admitted for 546 inpatient days in November last year.

The number of births in November was up to 26 compared to 20 last year.

The hospital board also voted to turn over a number of delinquent accounts to a man in Midland for collections.
