Feil, Blaylock get nod in county commissioner races

Democratic voters in East Coke County were in the mood for a change this year, as newcomers Robert Feil and Bobby Blaylock defeated incumbent commissioners Bill Wheat and George Snapp. Wheat's race was close enough to allow a run-off election. However, in a phone conversation with Mr. Wheat on Wednesday morning (March 8th), he declared that he had conceded the race to his opponent, Mr. Feil.

The numbers in this contested race broke down like this -- Commissioner, Pct. 2, Bill Wheat - 53, Robert Feil - 63, and Clint Porter - 25. Commissioner, Pct. 4, Bobby Blaylock 71, George Snapp - 64.

Other uncontested races in the Democratic Primary yielded the following vote totals: County Judge, Roy Blair - 307; County/District Clerk, Mary Grim - 335; County Treasurer, Phelan Wrinkle - 298; County Tax/Assessor Collector, Josie Dean - 306; Constable, Pct. 1, Marshall Millican - 122; Justice of the Peace, Pct. 1, Joan Davis - 127; and Justice of the Peace, Pct. 2, Grady Coulter - 228.

In the amendment elections on the democratic ballot, county voters favored both amendment referenda.

The Republican Party in

Coke County seems to have swelled to five times its normal size in this primary, as a total of 250 voters cast ballots in the Republican Primary. According to election judge Mary Grim, that figure is approximately five times larger than the 50 or so Republican ballots that have been cast in previous elections.

Most of the interest in the Republican Primary was the hotly contested State Representative race for District 72, which includes Coke, Mitchell, Scurry, and Tom Green counties. Incumbent Scott Campbell is facing a strong challenge by Drew Darby and Kevin Housley. Despite election computer problems which delayed results in several counties, the most recent results indicate that Drew Darby leads with app. 40 percent of the votes cast, with Campbell standing at 33 percent, and Housley at 26 percent. Campbell and Darby are headed for a run-off election which will be held on Tuesday, April 11.

Other local Republican race vote totals include County Judge, Hal Spain - 166; County Treasurer - Andra Arrott - 171; and County Chairman, Kathy Pentecost - 171. All four Republican Primary ballot initiatives were approved by county voters by a wide margin.

Of interest in this election is the mandatory use of the "newfangled voting

machines" in every precinct throughout the state. Election Judge Mary Grim stated that we had very few, if any problems, with the machines in Coke County. This was not the case elsewhere. Problems were widespread, with delays reported from Concho, Runnels, McCulloch, Irion, and Tom Green counties.

RL city service rate increase announced

Robert Lee city service users will see an increase in rates this year. Municipal budgets across Texas have taken a hit in the last several years from several sources over which the cities have no control.

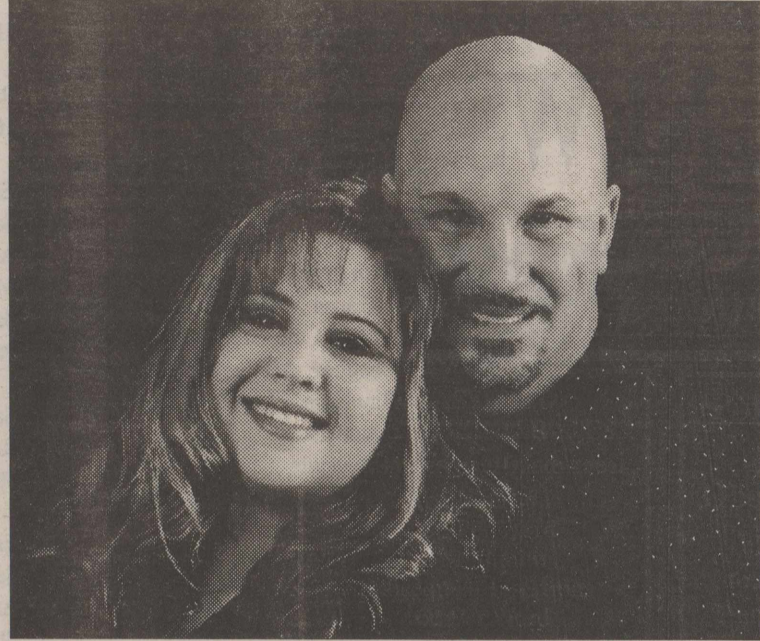
In the general fund which is tax supported, 14 out of 23 line items on the budget are fixed. These items cannot be adjusted by the City. Audit, dues and licenses, insurance, law enforcement, office expenses, utilities and retirement are some of the items.

The water department is fee-supported. Mayor White stated that in 1980 the cost of producing 1,000 gallons of water was \$1.09. Today the cost is \$3.00 per thousand. Almost all of the items in the water budget are fixed. Chemicals have jumped from \$20,000 yearly to \$30,000 since 2002-2003. This is due to a change in test protocol. Water sample testing has jumped from \$2,400 in 2003 to a projected \$6,000 due to more stringent requirements by TCEQ and EPA. Over the past two years, the City has operated at a loss due to meeting water regulations.

To meet future demands, engineering studies will be required. Further action will be needed to upgrade the water system in order to prevent sanctions. The staff is working diligently to maintain existing equipment, replace worn out items, and prepare for future mandates.

The sewer department has been subject to the same increase in fixed costs. Of the \$16,500 budgeted for capital improvements, 83% of the cost is due to mandated requirements. There has been no increase in sewer rates since 1999. The increase in fuel costs hit the City hard when it was required that sludge be removed from the drying beds and taken to San Angelo. Budgeting for future expenses must include preparing for upcoming regulations and demands.

The state has required that the landfill be covered weekly. Also, requirements will include closer supervision of the landfill during operating hours. The City is required to keep the road from the gate off of Scott Road to the

landfill free of litter and trash and prohibited items. A few landfill users who abused the rules of landfill use have accelerated the addition of more regulations and charges.

The Robert Lee City Council is aware that many citizens are on fixed incomes, many no longer receive increases in pensions, many no longer receive raises, and many are working in temporary positions. However, small, rural governments are required to meet the same regulations that are required in large cities.

A Texas Municipal League report of city water rates shows a range of charges on 5,000 gallons of water to

be from \$9.50 to \$25.30 to \$45.69 in cities of similar size to Robert Lee.

Proposed rate increases will include the following: Base water increase from \$13.50 to \$15.50. Cost of water per thousand gallons is from \$1.85 to \$3.35. A sewer rate increase on the cost per thousand gallons is from \$.05 to \$1.50. An increase of \$.85 is placed on the administrative fee for trash collection. An increase in the disposal fee at the landfill is proposed. City users will be charged \$10.00 per load. A new rate schedule has been set up for commercial and out-of-town and out-of-county users. A newsletter will be mailed to all customers.
