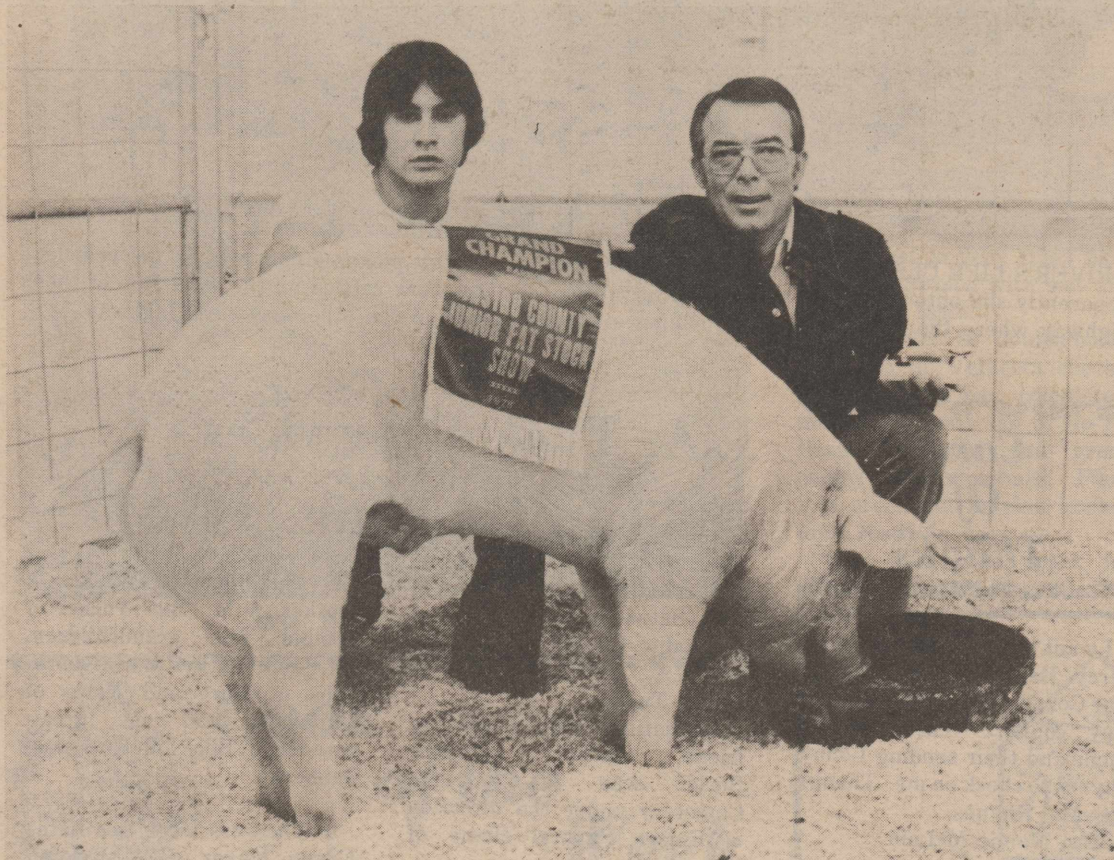


Local Youths Grab Big Wins

Future Farmers of HHS grabbed three of the top wins last weekend in the annual Castro County Stock Show. Eliazar Castillo showed his heavyweight Chester barrow to the breed championship and then saw it picked "best of the show." Farmers State Bank paid \$5.50 per pound for the Grand Champion Barrow, netting a total of \$1,265.

Kelly Jones' middle weight Duroc nudged his heavyweight entry for the breed championship and Reserve Champion

honors for the show. The heavy Duroc was picked reserve breed champion. Hart Oil and Butane paid \$4.75 per pound for the County reserve champion, totaling \$1,045.

Reserve champion lamb was a heavyweight medium wool shown by Vic Hart. Davis Aerial Sprayers paid \$3.50 per pound for the prize animal that brought \$409.50.

Mrs. Shirley Barnes met with the board and presented a five year plan for the accreditation program for Hart ISD. It was approved.

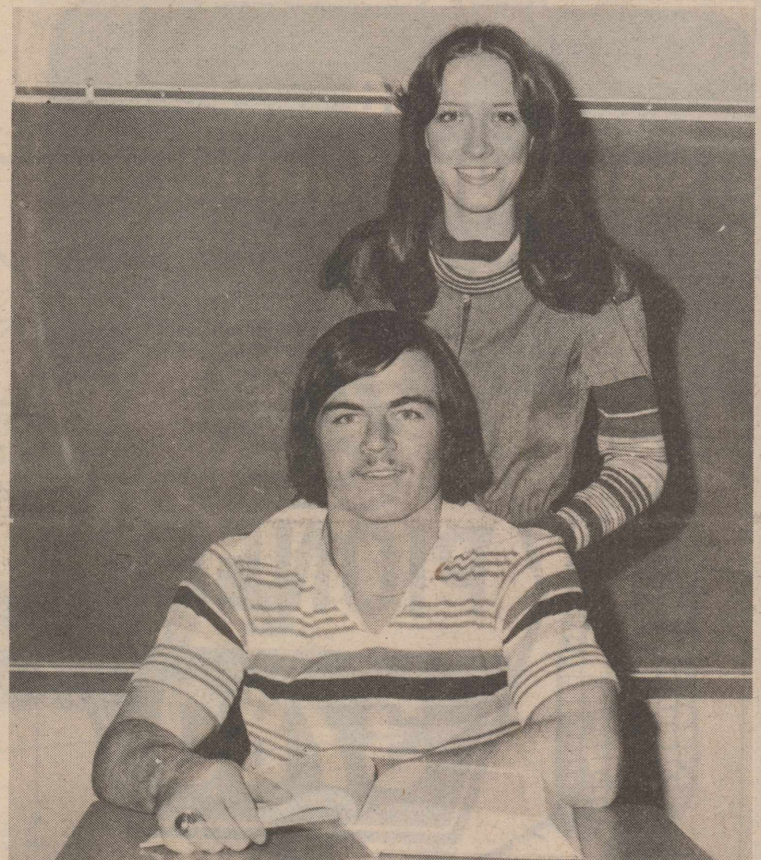
Steve Ragsdale, band director, also met with the board to

report on the band program. He received approval for the high school band trip to Colorado May 5-9.

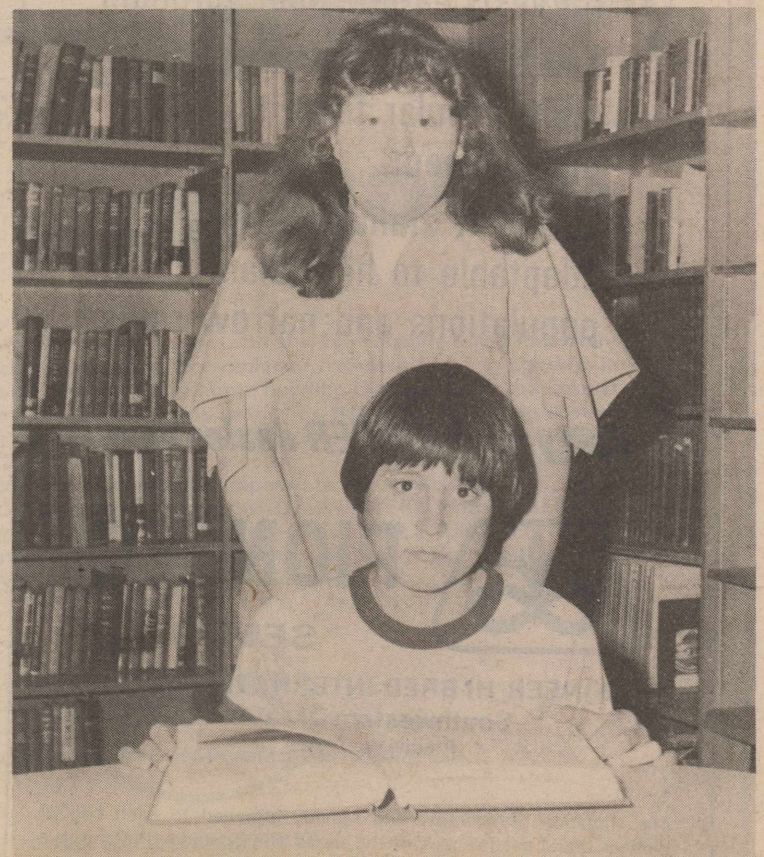
Resignation of Mary Cariker as Title I teacher aide was accepted. She will not be replaced for the remainder of the 1977-78 school year because of a drop in enrollment.

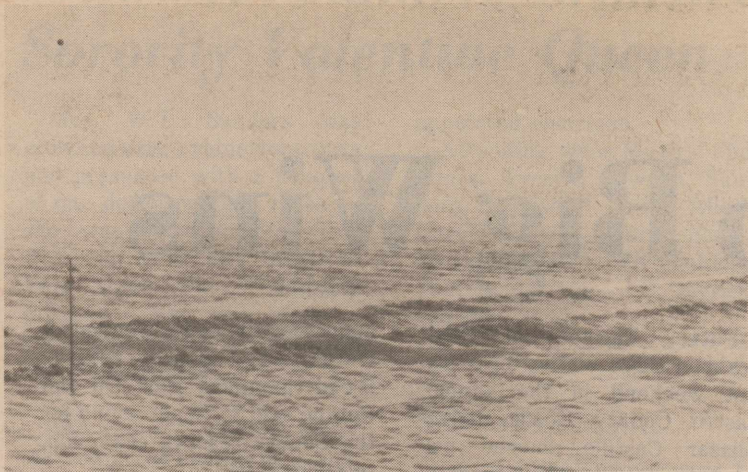

VEGETABLE SALAD

Volleyball Tourney Set

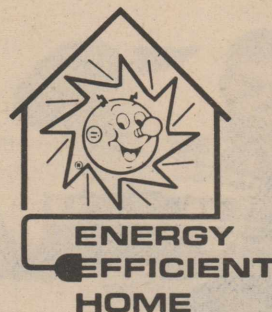
A volleyball tournament for local teams only will be held Thursday, Mar. 9 through Saturday, Mar. 11. Play will be held in the high school gym.

The tournament will be limited to eight men's and eight women's teams.

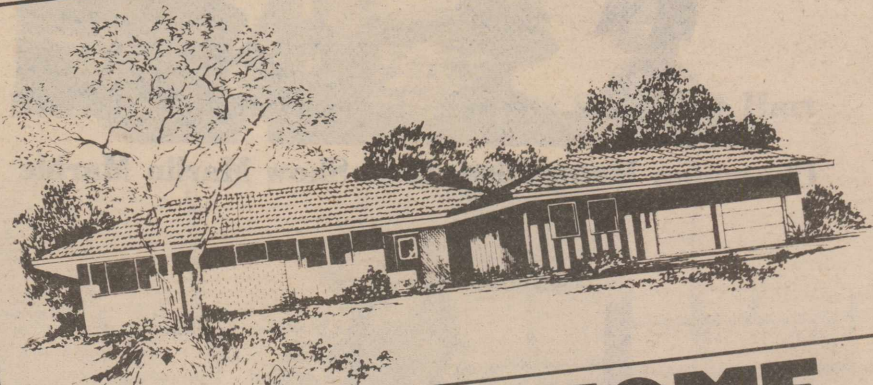
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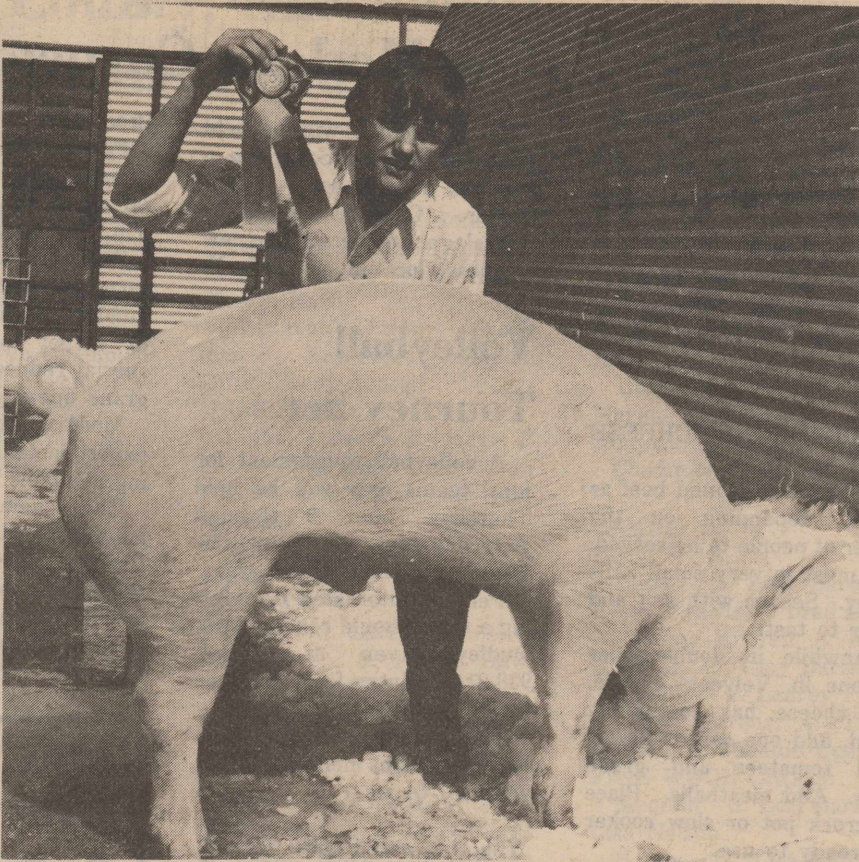
