

FISHER COUNTY EVALUATION FOR 1972 UP 2 1/2 MILLION

Al Finch, Fisher County Auditor, gave a report to the County Commissioners on Monday morning concerning the 1972 total tax evaluation for Fisher County. According to Finch, Pritchett and Abbott was estimating the 1972 county evaluation at approximately 33 million dollars. This figure is up approximately

2-1/2 million over the 1971 evaluation.

Computed on our 95¢ per \$100.00 evaluation, the ad-

ditional 2-1/2 million dollar evaluation should mean an increase of \$23,750 in revenue to the county.

One of the major suggestions at Monday's meeting was presented by Thurman Terry after a discussion concerning the need for additional office space for County employees. Terry suggested that Sellers and Lovett, architects, be called to prepare a study on the feasibility of constructing a new court house.

All commissioners were in agreement on calling the architectural firm and all also seemed convinced that any additional money spent on remodeling or repairing the old court house building would be a waste of the tax payers money.

The Fisher County Court House has had a space problem for several years and the persistent problem of bats in the ceiling appears to be one that will not

get better. The sickening odor from the bats fills the Court House halls and no method of extermination seems likely.

In other action by the four Fisher County Commissioners at Monday's meeting they approved a request by the County Agent, Richard Spencer, for a new pick-up.

Thurman Terry presented a motion that was seconded by Wayne Porter to put up a \$50.00 water line deposit for the Capitol Voting Box.

In the final action of Monday's meeting a bid from F&M Chevrolet on a 1971 Chevrolet pick-up was accepted for Junior Kiker's precinct #2.

Thus as of July 1, 1971, any registered 18, 19, or 20 year old may vote in any election—federal, state, county, city, or other political subdivision.

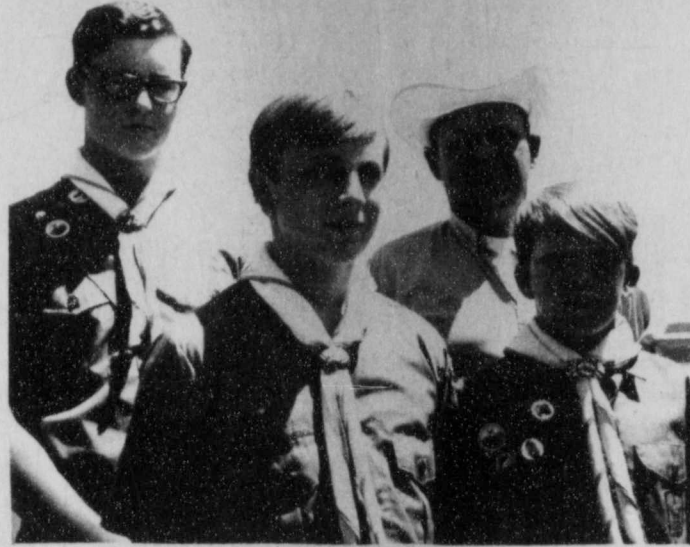
