MAYFIELD LEADING BY OVER 150,000

DEMOCRATS RUNNELS SHOW GAIN IN NORTH

(By Associated Press)
BOSTON, Nov. 8.—Chairman Walsh of the Democratic National senatorial campaign committee, said today that the election returns from the country cannot be construed otherwise than as a repudiation of the republican administration and the republican party.

NEW YORK, Nov. 8.—Republican majorities in the senate and house were sharply reduced, but the republican managers declared that they would not be wiped out. At noon twenty-five states had completed returns. The vote for congress stood: republicans 185; democrats 187; socialist 1. A majority to control is only two and one-eighth.

The friends of Gaston, opponent to Senator Lodge, were talking of asking for a recount. In Indiana, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Michigan, and West Virginia democratic senators replace republicans. The republicans will replace democrats in Nebraska and possibly in Ohio.

The democratic victory in the Ninth Congressional District in Virginia, replaced republican rule in that district for twenty-two years and placed Virginia with other Southern states, sending a solid democratic delegation to the house.

RUNNELS HOLDS LEAD IN COTTON

The ginner's report announced by the Census Bureau, showing the number of bales of cotton ginned in the respective counties up to October 25th, places Runnels county in the lead in this section of the state, and also shows a marked increase over the 1921 ginnings for the same date. Here are the figures for Runnels and her neighboring counties:

The above figures represent ginnings up to Oct. 25th. Since that date considerable cotton has been ginned and the Runnels county figures are crawling up towards the 40,000 mark.

Williamson, Hill, Navarro and Collin counties led the state with 74,086, 64,454, 61,962 and 59,876 bales in the order named.

The total ginnings in the United States for the present season was announced Wednesday morning, the report showing the number of bales ginned up to Nov. 1, at 8,139,839 as compared with 6,646,354 for the same date last year.

The crop condition was reported at fifty per cent as compared with 42.2 per cent at last report.

Total production for the year is estimated at 10,135,000 bales against the total crop of 6,538,000 bales last year.

The government report had a bullish effect on the market, the price advancing fifty points during the morning trading.

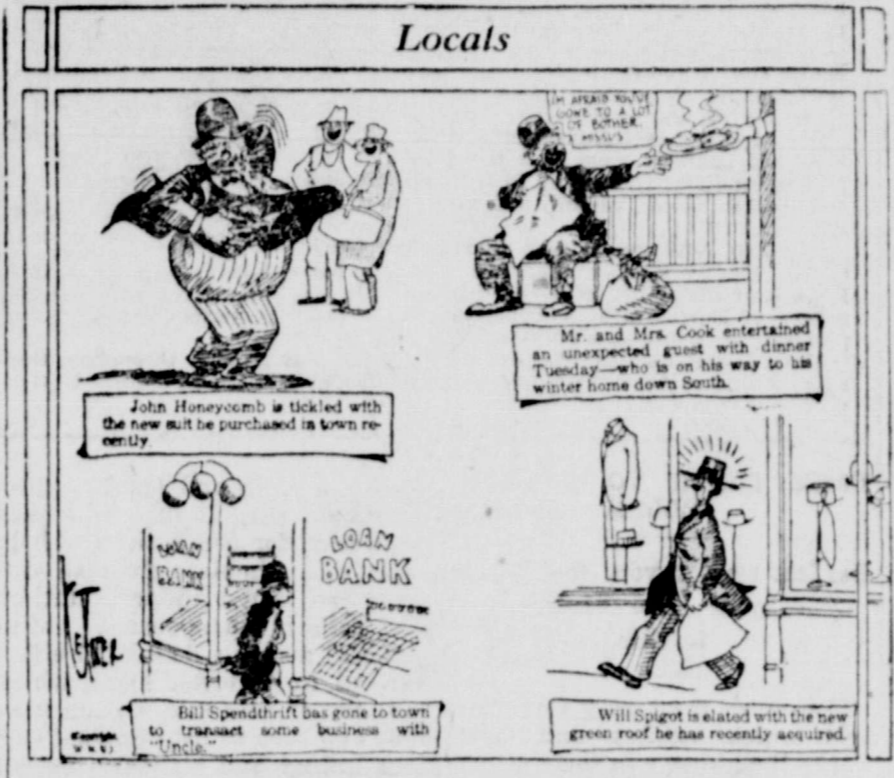

WILL KEEP UP FIGHT ON EARLE MAYFIELD

(By Associated Press)

DALLAS, Nov. 8.—Notwithstanding the overwhelming majority given Earle Mayfield for United States senator yesterday, efforts will be made to keep him from taking his seat in the senate, according to State Republican Chairman R. B. Creager today. Mr. Creager said that the republicans will not permit him to be seated, and indicated that further fights in the state courts will be made in which the charges that Mayfield's campaign expenditures exceeded the legal limit will be renewed.

AUSTIN, Nov. 8.—Application for a writ of error from the decision of the Dallas Court of Civil Appeals in the Groesbeck injunction suit, which sought to keep Earle B. Mayfield's name off the ballot, was received by the state Supreme Court here today. The Supreme Court immediately took the application under advisement.

WINTERS, Nov. 8.—A white man by the name of Tolison was severely flogged near this city early last night, the brother of a fourteen year old girl, whom the man attacked, doing the flogging while a half dozen other men looked on and saw the job well done. The flogging took place a short time after Tolison had carried the girl a mile from town, where he attacked her and where she jumped from his car and made her escape. Owen Ingram, who was coming into town, picked the girl up and brought her to her home. It is alleged that the man decoyed the girl into his car by offering to take her to a fire which broke out in the edge of town about seven o'clock. When the fire alarm was sounded it is said the man yelled out, "come on and let's go," and when the girl got in the car with him he went in the opposite direction from the fire, and the girl jumped from his

DALLAS, Nov. 8.—Earle B. Mayfield's majority over George Peddy, republican candidate for the United States senate, will be more than 150,000, according to incomplete returns from Tuesday's election, and which brought one of the most bitterly contested political disputes in the history of Texas to a close.

The result of the election makes Mr. Mayfield, who is fifty-one years old, one of the youngest members in the United States senate, and comes following a multitude of court proceedings which were cleared up just the day before the election when the supreme court ruled that his name should go on the ballots.

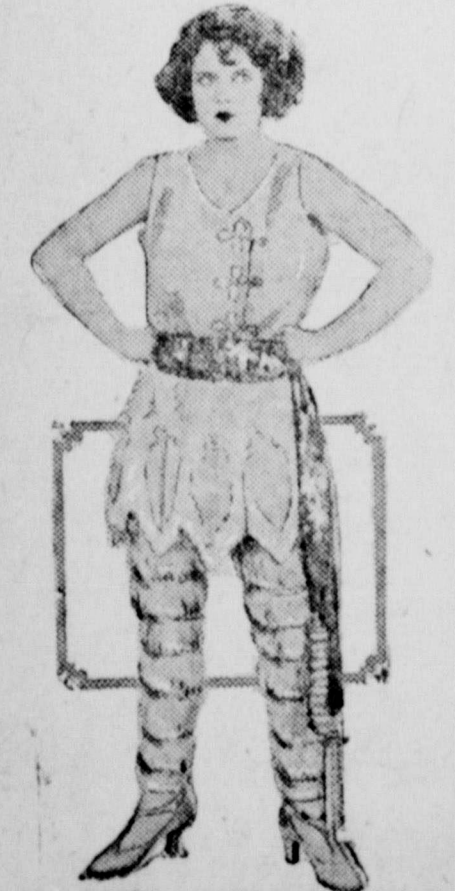

COSTUME BLOUSES IN BOTH STAPLE AND NOVEL FABRICS



ALTHOUGH we have with us this fall many novelties in blouses made of those fashionable new materials that are attracting universal attention, the major part of blouse collections reveals crepe de chine and crepe satin as holding first place in the regard of buyers. The new materials have brought in new developments in the styles and the heavier weaves lend themselves to those smart coatee and jacket models, in overblouses, that have long coat-like openings at the front, or the surplice front in which one side crosses over the other. Nearly all the coatee styles are long sleeved with the sleeves flaring toward the wrist. Usually they are bloused, at a low waistline, and the peplum is short or replaced by a hip band.

Novelty materials, with their broken surfaces, cloly, printed velvets and jersey cloth, suggest themselves as appropriate for the coatee styles in costume blouses and require little in the way of decoration. For costume blouses of crepe de chine or crepe-satin, embroidery is the most important trimming, either of silk or beads, and in many cases wrought in all-over patterns that imitate matelasse. Braiding is also used on these smooth-surfaced blouses and soutache braid gives decorative effects that are very like embroidery. Among the simpler and more conservative styles, models similar to the overblouse pictured here find themselves entrenched in popular favor. This blouse is of crepe de chine with round, uncollared neck and three-quarter length sleeves. Its short peplum is cut into wide, shallow scallops at the bottom and the sleeves are finished in the same way. Bugle beads, in parallel rows, outline its edges and mark off wide front and back panels that are brightened by scattered motifs of the beads.

A few tulle styles have been presented, but have not met with the recognition compelled by the coatee and jacket styles, which are the most promising of new arrivals. Novelty and velvet materials are shown combined with crepe de chine and with georgette crepe in blouses cut on lines similar to the model pictured, and the result of these combinations of sheer and heavy fabrics will delight the needlewoman who undertakes to make her own blouse.

Sometimes a heavy material makes the body of the garment while the sleeves or a portion of them are made from the lighter material.

ritory will know the activities of the organization. A budget of \$150 is being raised by the energetic organization to finance a magnificent 65-piece band. Armistice Day will be celebrated in a unique manner.
