Kelton's Robotics Team Advances to Nationals



DEAN'S LIST AWARD FINALIST: Mark Herndon is state finalists for Dean's List Award. Mark, a member of the Kelton Robotics Team received the award at the end of the State Finals in Lubbock on Saturday, February 17, 2018. He will have the opportunity to move onto nationals and maybe world FTC Robotics competition. This award is as prestigious as the national scholar award. The award reads: Mark Herndon has been nominated by his peers as a *FIRST* Dean's List Award Finalist. This award recognizes his exemplary passion and effectiveness in achieving the mission of *First*. It is the goal of the Kamen family that Dean's List Award Finalists continue their great work with *FIRST* and help to build a strong First Alumni community.

Super-Regional Championship Tournaments are events to which Teams advance through high achievement at a state or regional Championship event. Free ECG Screen For Wheeler I.S.D.

Through a grant provided by the Cody Stephens Go Big or Go Home Memorial Foundation, Wheeler ISD students in grades 6-12 were able to receive a free ECG screening. This grant partners with Who We Play For, a 501 (c) 3 nonprofit organization, to screen athletes and other students with an ECG or EKG. An ECG can detect issues in the heart that can be missed in a standard physical. Cody Stephens died in 2012 from an undiagnosed heart issue and his family started this foundation. The test is painless and private. After the test is done the information is transmitted to a cardiologist for review. If the cardiologist warrants further investigation, the student and their family are notified to get further testing and evaluation.

Community Care: Determined—Knowledge and Projects – Community Fuel

Individuals who can acquire, retain and effectively apply knowledge are an invaluable asset. A quick review of America's history reveals innumerable people who have done so and made significant contributions that helped make America a world leader. A profound example is Project Apollo and the numerous individuals who were involved in the effort. Each one had knowledge and skills that had been gained and then applied to make the impossible, possible.

For those who do not recall the details, Project Apollo, was the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's (NASA) third human space

flight program that placed men on the moon. Project Apollo did not originally have that amazing feat as a goal; however, that objective was established by President John F. Kennedy in a 1961 address to Congress. In his speech, he declared the intent of "landing a man on the Moon and returning him safely to the Earth" by the late 1960s.

The goal was realized in 1969, only 8 years after it was first established. There was a total of 17 Apollo missions, however, astronauts Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin landed a lunar module and walked on the moon's surface during the 1969 Apollo 11 mission. Project Apollo ended in 1972.

Throughout the ages, ad-

vancements within civilizations have occurred because their members have gained and then applied knowledge for a betterment of society. Many of those advancements have been in the form of projects, like Project Apollo.

Projects can vary greatly in their aim; however, virtually all share common factors. They are usually temporary, planned endeavors designed to produce a unique product, service or result. They normally have a specifically defined beginning and end and are begun to meet unique goals and objectives. They are also typically to create beneficial change or to increase value and have constraints of time, staff and funds.

Because projects frequently involve the work of numerous people, they are complex and require careful attention to details to ensure success. This is especially true with voluntary efforts that are motivated by passion for the project's stated goals, rather than paid monetary compensation.

The complexity of projects gave rise to the field of Project Management. The benefits of project management are so evident, the methods are used in many modern professions, including community development. In recent years, many colleges and universities have developed certifications and degrees for people seeking knowledge and skills in the field.

The advantages to small towns who choose to pursue project management methods are vast and include these factors, among others: thinking ahead and preparing for the future; identifying issues that need to be addressed; clarifying goals and developing a vision; creating tangible plans that are shared with entire community; insuring all team members have access to pertinent project information; assessing and making the best use of all available resources; motivating and unifying the community and its members; developing community spirit; insuring achievement through specific assignments; completing effort with the best possible results.

Although project management is not rocket science, NASA certainly utilized its components to put men on the moon. Those who are unfamiliar with project management may fear learning about it as much as studying astrophysics, however, at its core, the practice revolves around basic organizational and communication skills.

There are even computer apps that streamline the process of embracing this proven effective method of establishing, planning and accomplishing community goals. The question is: Could project management help your community accomplish a declared goal that remains unfinished?

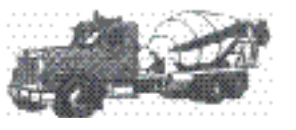

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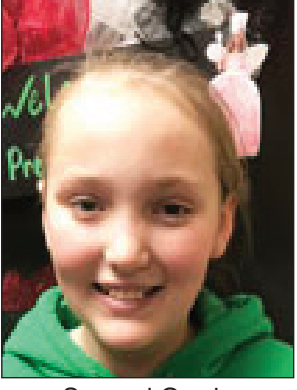

The Wheeler County Soil and Water Conservation District will be taking tree orders from now through February 22, 2018. Seedlings are sold in quantities listed. Lots will not be broken to facilitate the sale of individual seedlings.

Bare root species available are, American Plum, Bur Oak, Chinkapin Oak, Pecan and Shumard Oak. They are sold in multiples of 25 and priced at \$45.

Containerized species available are Afghanistan Pine, Baldcypress, Catalpa, Cedar Elm, Fourwing Saltbush, Green Ash, Italian Stone Pine and Oriental Arborvitae. They are sold in multiples of 25 and priced at \$65.

Payment must accompany order; no trees will be reserved until payment is received and all sales will be final; no cancellations or refunds.

If you would like to place an order, please come by the Wheeler County SWCD office at 1410 S. Alan Bean Blvd., Wheeler, TX. Trees will be available for pick up in March of 2018. 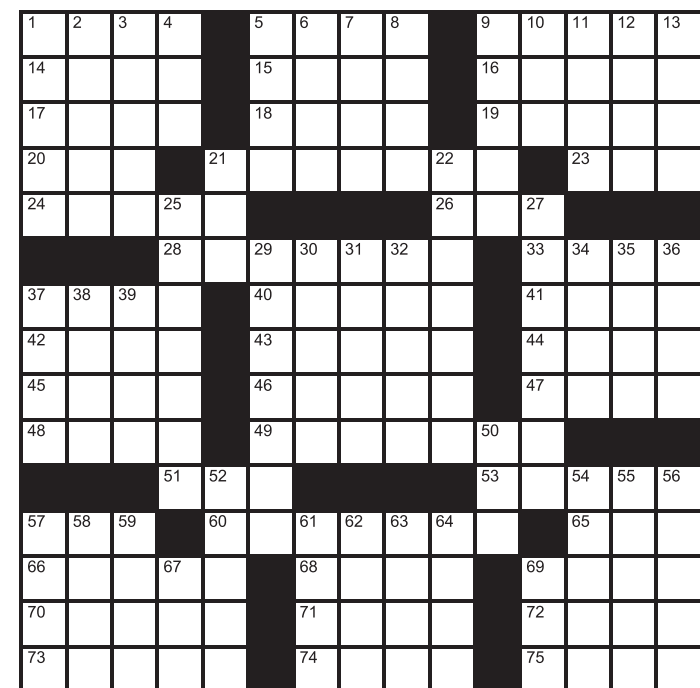

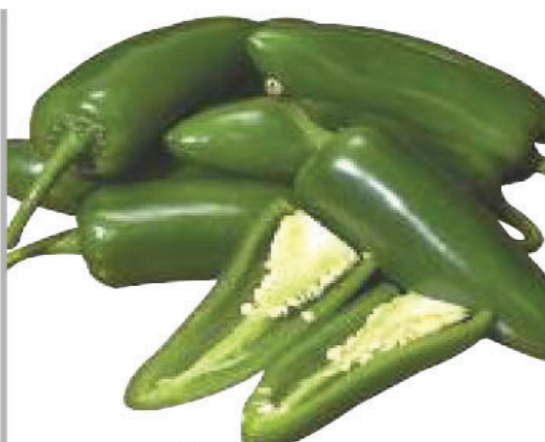
