COMMUNISTS RENEW SACCO-VANZETTI PROTESTS

ONE MAN HELD IN GENEVA FOR INCITING RIOT

(By Associated Press)
GENEVA, Switzerland, July 21.—Charged with inciting inflammatory posters on a city hall without legal authorization, a communist was arrested here today as an outgrowth of agitation against the execution of Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Vanzetti. The man was held in all pending further investigation.

POLICE PROTECTION OF AMERICAN DELEGATE AT MEET ASKED

(By Associated Press)
GENEVA, Switzerland, July 21.—The American delegation to the biennial meeting of the International Workers' Order of America, which is being held here today, has asked the Swiss government for police protection for the delegates.

Protests Increase

In the meantime an increasing number of protests against the ending executions is being received by the American legation at Geneva and other points. The American consulate has requested protection for Hugh Gibson, head of the American delegation to the biennial meeting of the International Workers' Order of America, here today. Mr. Gibson has previously declined police escorts or protection.

Paper Repeals U. S. Action

The conservative Journal de Geneve, which is widely read in Europe, has printed a leading editorial declaring that Sacco and Vanzetti are condemned, not because they are murderers, but because they are revolutionists. After declaring that the case gives the impression that the men were condemned because they were Italians, the paper continues: "Unhappily it is too true that in the United States poor immigrants are often considered as being human beings of the second category."

New Hearing In Case Concluded

BOSTON, July 21 (AP)—The advisory committee appointed by Governor Alvan T. Fuller to make an independent investigation of the Sacco-Vanzetti case today concluded its hearings. Arguments by counsel for the two men under sentence of death for murder and by representatives of the state will be heard beginning Monday.

WASHINGTON, July 21.—The Interstate Commerce Commission today gave conditional permission to the Waco, Beaumont, Trinity and Sabine railway in Texas to proceed with the construction of 200 miles of additional line.

TO ARRANGE TRackage

The Sabine company was ordered, however, to try to arrange for trackage rights over other railroads now operating in the territory and to obtain use of existing rail and terminal facilities in Beaumont and Port Arthur. In case it is unable to effect the arrangement, the commission ruled that it might retain all of the earnings from the new construction, without being subject to the recapture clause of the transportation act.
