

Ambulance Service Back to Normal

County, city and hospital elected officials approved the leasing of an ambulance during a special joint meeting held Monday morning, and began procedures for purchasing a new ambulance for the Post EMS Association.

Members of the Garza County Commissioners' Court, Post City Council and Garza Memorial Hospital Board discussed

various options to alleviate the immediate problem of ambulance service.

As reported in last week's Post Dispatch, the EMS has been hampered by mechanical failures on both ambulances, with one completely out of service and the other recently suffering a break-down while transporting a patient to a Lubbock hospital.

After discussing the alternatives, County Judge

Giles Dalby suggested the immediate leasing of an ambulance to take the pressure off the situation, then prepare bids for purchasing a new ambulance.

The leased vehicle was to have been in service Tuesday evening, with EMS member Ronny Ammons authorized to fly to Dallas Tuesday morning and drive the ambulance back to Post.

The lease is for a period of at least one month at the rate of \$1,500 per month and the leasing company will apply one-half of the lease payments toward the purchase of a new ambulance if that company is the successful bidder.

The estimated cost of a new ambulance will be \$42,000 and each government unit is to include the shared portions in this year's budget.

At their special Monday night meeting, August 12, the Post City Council voted to apply to the Texas Department of Community Affairs for a \$25,000 planning grant to produce plans for upgrading housing and public facilities, coordinated with proposals for growth of commerce and industry being supported by the Post Economic Development Corporation.

Although this meeting was a public hearing, the council agreed to hold another public hearing open for any questions or comments on this grant application in connection with the August 19 meeting at 1:30 p.m. in City Hall.

This meeting is for the purpose of receiving public comments on the next year's city budget.

Dispatch Publishes Court Records

Beginning this week, The Post Dispatch will publish the judgements in the Municipal Court of the City of Post and Garza County District Court.

The official records, public information available through the Texas Open Records law, will include the date of the judgement, the name of the person found guilty, the offense and the amount of the fine.

The purpose of publishing these official court records is to provide the community with important public information consistent with responsible journalism.

Names of juveniles will not be published.

Only the names of those people who are found guilty or who have pleaded guilty will be published.

It is a matter of fairness that those charged with an offense, but not yet declared innocent or guilty, not have their names published.

It is our concern for fairness that only the names of those found guilty will be published.

It is not the decision of the courts nor of any elected official that these records are being published, it is solely the decision of The Post Dispatch.

Providing official court judgements is a standard practice by most newspapers and The Post Dispatch will follow these standards.

The court records will be inclusive, there will be no exceptions and all cases with judgements will be published.

The records begin with judgements as of August 1, 1985.

Nine Post employees of the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation have been honored for their safe operation of state owned vehicles.

Collectively, the nine employees have driven a total of 85 years without a accident.

The group is among 407 Highway Department employees from the 17-county Lubbock District who have been honored this year for safe driving, or for years of service with the department.

"Our department employees set a fine example for motorists we encounter during the work day," said William M. Pope, District Engineer.

"It is significant when our highway employees receive these awards because they are exposed to a lot more than the average driver, often operating large vehicles under inclement weather or other hazardous driving conditions."

Gutierrez were recognized for their years of service to the department.

Bagby and Fry have worked for the highway department for 15 years each, and Gutierrez has been with the department for five years.

Commissioners Lower Tax Rate

The Garza County Commissioners' Court set the 1986 tax rate of 14.5 cents per \$100 evaluation, which is down from last year and below the tax assessor's certified rate of 15.8 percent.

Revenues are expected to increase in the new budget, but the tax rate to taxpayers will be lowered.

Commissioners reviewed the budget during the regular meeting Monday.

Also included in the budget was a request from the Garza County Fair committee, represented by Jack King.

The fair committee requested \$2,500 to cover expenses, but King explained that anticipated revenues from various fund-raising projects are expected to offset the expenses.

Commissioner Ted Aten's request to not be included in the regular pay increases was rejected by the commissioners.

Aten had asked that the extra funding be put in the road fund in his precinct.
