### Come Help Bogata Dedicate It's Dream

This Saturday, April 10th, 1993 Bogata will see the culmination of a dream. Thomas Park will be dedicated officially.

The dream has been pursued over a number of years, and the finished result is worth all the hundreds upon hundreds of hours of effort it has taken to make it come true.

The festivities will begin with a musical concert from 10:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. by Wade White and the Plainlabel Band.

At 11:00 dedication ceremonies will begin with the Texas National Guard Color Guard presenting the colors.

Michelle Bryson will sing the National Anthem and Invocation will be by Reverend Mark Jones, Pastor of the Bogata Assembly of God Church.

James Wood will give the welcome.

State Representative Tom Ramsey will present a flag to Thomas Park.

Special guests will be introduced by Bogata Mayor, The Honorable Mildred Eudy.

Red River County Commissioner Tommy Corbell will introduce the Dedication Speaker.

The Dedication Address will be given by Honorable Judge Webb Baird, District Judge.

Jerald Vickers Ballfield Dedication will be by former Bogata Mayor Travis Harbison.

Judge Webb Baird will make the Presentation of Bogata Proud Community Award.

Mayor Eudy will recognize past and

present Park Chairmen.

Special Lions Club Presentations will be made by Jack Dodd, Bogata Lions Club President.

Benediction will be by Rev. Bob Bush, Pastor of the Bogata First Methodist Church.

After the dedication ceremonies there will be hot dogs and soft drinks for all. Everyone is urged to attend this important event.

Everyone is urged to bring their lawnchairs to help provide adequate seating.

Thomas Park began back in 1985 when the Bogata Lions Club began the restoration of the old Community Center Building. The roof was collapsed on the building, and the inside had been vandalized.

The Lions were meeting the school cafeteria, and their first project was to provide the community center as a meeting place both for their organization and for others needing a meeting place.

Their second stage of the project was to build a little park. They sold name plaques to go into a special sidewalk for \$15 in order to raise money for the park area and community center.

Work on this was in 1986 and 1987.

The Lions discovered that the Boy Scouts actually owned the community center. The scouts donated the build-

ing to the City of Bogata. This was in case the Lions ever disbanded, which would have meant that Lions International would have owned the building.

Mr. Donald Thomas, a Bogata native, liked what he saw happening. He donated the land for the expanded park which is being dedicated this Saturday. He helped secure a \$90,000 matching funds grant from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. Through donated labor and machinery, fund raisers and much work the park slowly became reality.

Volunteers from all around pitched in to donate time, money or whatever they could. Fund raisers have included talent shows, bake sales, barbecues, and solicitation of donations. Organizations and individuals have done their best to provide the money to make the park complete.

Thomas Park now features a baseball practice field, a soccer field, pavilion, concrete walking track, benches and picnic areas, water fountains and beautiful landscaping.

There is, leaders say, no way to adequately thank the multitude who have brought this dream to fulfillment.

Saturday, April 10th the Park will shine at the dedication.

It is truly a jewel in Bogata's crown, a relaxing place for young and old and a tribute to the spirit of the community.

Now, funds and help must be found to maintain it. If the spirit continues as it has during the park's creation this won't be a problem!

This week I visited in the lovely home of Jone and Jerry Clemmons of Talco. Jone is the cook I asked if I could feature this week, but when I asked her what she enjoyed cooking most, she said, "I don't like to cook." She quickly reassured me by telling me that she cooks all the time, and for many people. There are just other things she enjoys doing much more than cooking. I think I appreciated her honesty.

Jone is the Talco City Secretary and has been for about 15 years. Jerry is retired from TU Electric.

The Clemmons have two sons. Craig works at Kimberly Clark in Paris, and his wife Kristi is a teacher in Bogata. They have two daughters, Kayla, who is 4, and Keylee is 14 months old. Kyle Clemmons graduated from ETSU and works at Talco State Bank. His wife, Robin, is a dental assistant in Mt. Pleasant.

When I drove up, I noticed these odd looking chain link fences being finished in the front yard. I asked Jone what they were for. She laughed and said, "Come on in and I'll tell you." It seems that they, Jone and Jerry, are about to start raising Ostriches. They have been to seminars and studied for months so that they will know exactly what they are doing when they purchase these exotic birds. I plan to follow up on this at a later date.

After I learned that Jone doesn't

like to cook, I asked her what she does enjoy. About that time, a puppy fell in the swimming pool. Jone said that besides playing with her grandchildren, she enjoys working in the yard more than anything. Jone kept on talking while she got a towel for the puppy, and told me that she had had the same experience the pup had only at the time she was on a riding lawn mower. And her pride suffered quite a bit.

The Clemmons family is active in the Calvary Baptist Church, where Jone is Church Treasurer.

Jone said that when she does cook, she does lots of grilling, especially briskets and chicken. Jerry is the grill and stew cook in the family. He makes elk stew from their hunting trips to Colorado. Jone's recipes are a Fruit Salad that she got from her sister-in-law in New Mexico, Crockpot Beans, and her mother, Maggie Williams' Pineapple Pie. She doesn't like carrots, but knows she should serve them, so on the way back from one of their hunting trips, they stopped at a restaurant, where they were served carrots that she enjoyed, and she asked them for their recipe. She is also sharing that with us.

I really enjoyed my visit with Jone, and plan to go back when they get the ostrich business going.

- Fruit Salad**  
By Jone Clemmons
- 1 can peach pie filling
- 1 can mandarin oranges
- 1 pkg. frozen strawberries
- 1 can pineapple chunks
- 1 banana, sliced
- Mix all ingredients and refrigerate.
- Crockpot Beans**
- 3 cans jalapeno pinto beans
- 3 cans lima beans
- 3 cans pork and beans
- 1 bell pepper
- 1 onion
- 1 cup catsup
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 4 slices cooked bacon
- 2 tablespoons bacon grease
- Saute onions and bell pepper in bacon grease. Put all ingredients in crock pot and cook on low 4 or 5 hours.
- Marinated Carrots**
- 3 lbs. carrots, sliced and cooked
- 1 onion-diced
- 2 bell peppers, diced
- 3 cans tomato soup, do not dilute
- 3/4 cup oil
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 3/4 cup vinegar
- 3 teaspoons dry mustard
- Drain carrots. Mix all ingredients and pour over carrots. Mix and refrigerate overnight.
- Pineapple Pie**
- 1 cup sugar
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 1-12 oz. can of milk
- 1 large can of crushed pineapple
- 2 tablespoons margarine
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 3 eggs
- Put egg yolks in cup. Beat with part of the milk. Mix sugar and cornstarch together adding rest of the milk and egg mixture. Cook in microwave for 8 or 10 minutes. Take out and stir. Put back in microwave and cook another 4 or 5 minutes. Add butter and vanilla, pour into cooked pie crust.
- For meringue: Beat egg whites, add 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar and 1/4 cup of sugar. Beat until stiff.

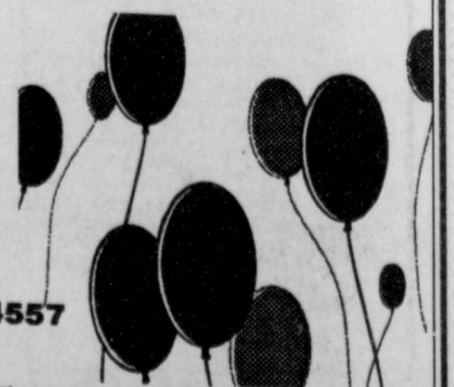

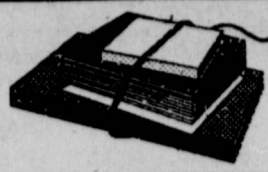

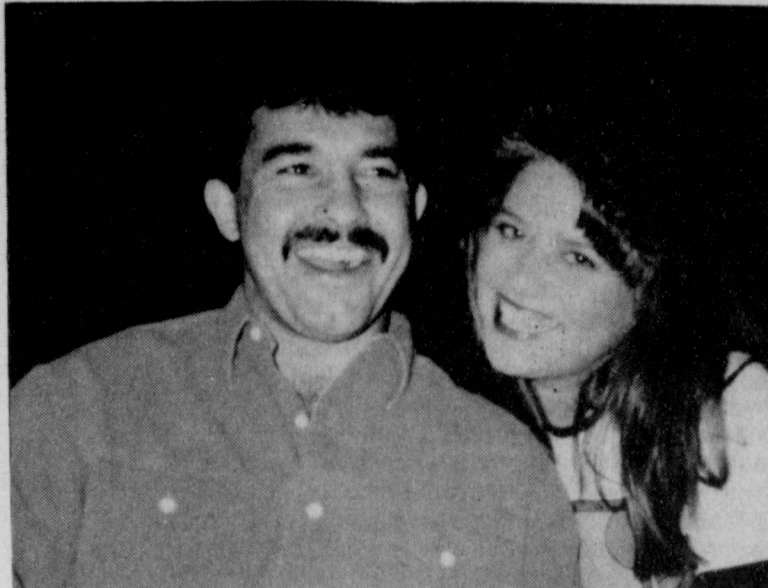

**Postmaster Advises Public To Avoid Last Minute Rush**

Bogata Postmaster Ronald Thurman encourages the public to mail their Federal Internal Revenue Service tax returns before the Thursday, April 15 deadline and avoid the last minute rush to the post office.

Thurman reminds postal customers to use adequate postage (29 cents for the first ounce and 23 cents for each additional ounce up to 11 ounces) and have a legible return address when mailing tax returns. "The Internal Revenue Service will

not accept postage due mail, and this mail will be returned to sender. Because local postal authorities are prohibited from opening First-Class mail, all local postage due mail without a return address must be sent to the U.S. Postal Service's regional Dead Letter Office in Atlanta, Georgia to be opened. Mail sent to the

Dead Letter Office may take several weeks to be processed and returned to the sender," the postmaster advised.

On the April 15 deadline, Thurman says that many larger post offices throughout the country will provide midnight collections for the many thousands of tax filers who wait until the last minute to mail their returns.

Locally, the Bogata Post Office, located at 141 North Main Street, will cancel all IRS mail dropped into both collection boxes on the 15th with a 15th postmark.

"If you have any questions about the amount of postage required for your tax returns, call or try to get to your local post office early and we will assist you in getting those tax forms in on time," Thurman said.

Authorities said the matter remains under investigation.

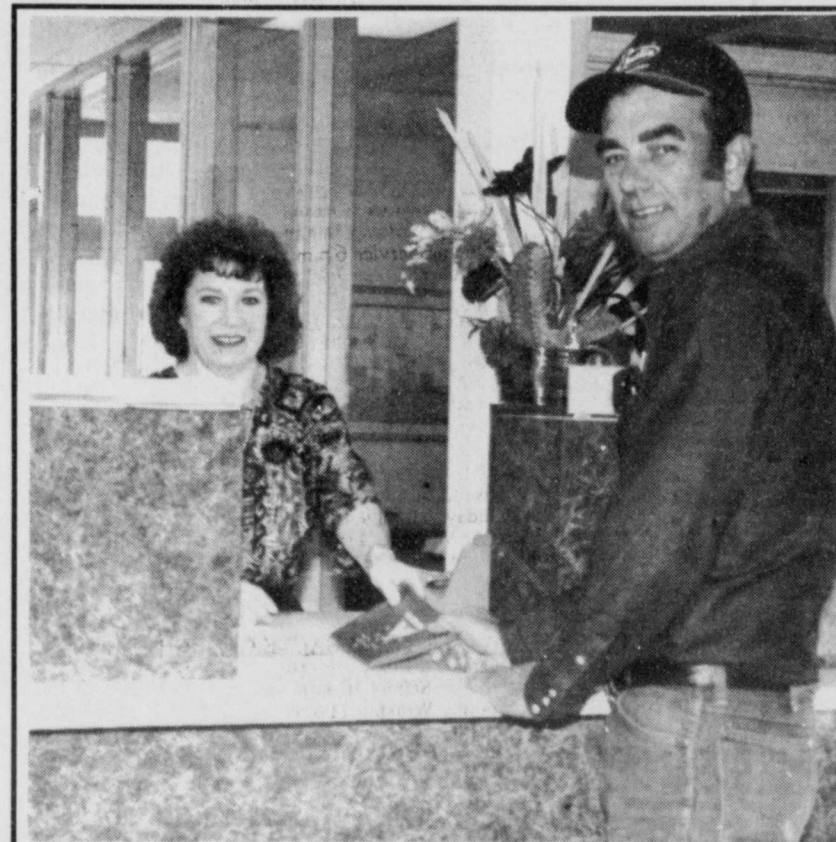

**CLEAN-UP ORDINANCE #92-05 THE STATE OF TEXAS**  
City of Bogata  
County of Red River

An ordinance establishing regulations covering the cleaning up of all property, declaring certain building conditions a health hazard and unightly, declaring same to be unlawful, providing for notice and abatement and the fixing of penalties; making it unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to permit weeds, brush or any objectionable or unsightly matter to grow on their property; prohibiting the growth of cultivated crops within the right-of-way of any public street or easement; making it the duty of any person, firm or corporation to cut and remove all such weeds, et cetera; providing that the cutting and removing of the weeds, et cetera, every thirty (30) days constitutes compliance with this ordinance; providing for notices to owners or other persons violating the terms of this ordinance; authorizing the city to cut such weeds, et cetera, and charge the owners of the property for the cost of cutting such weeds, et cetera, and if charges are not paid the city may file a lien against the property by filing a statement with the County Clerk; providing a savings clause, making and providing for a penalty not to exceed two hundred (\$200.00) dollars for each offense, repealing all conflicting ordinances and containing a severability clause.

**WHEREAS**, the City Council and the Mayor of the City of Bogata, Texas, have the responsibility to the health, safety and well being of the citizens of the City of Bogata, Texas; and
